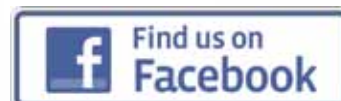

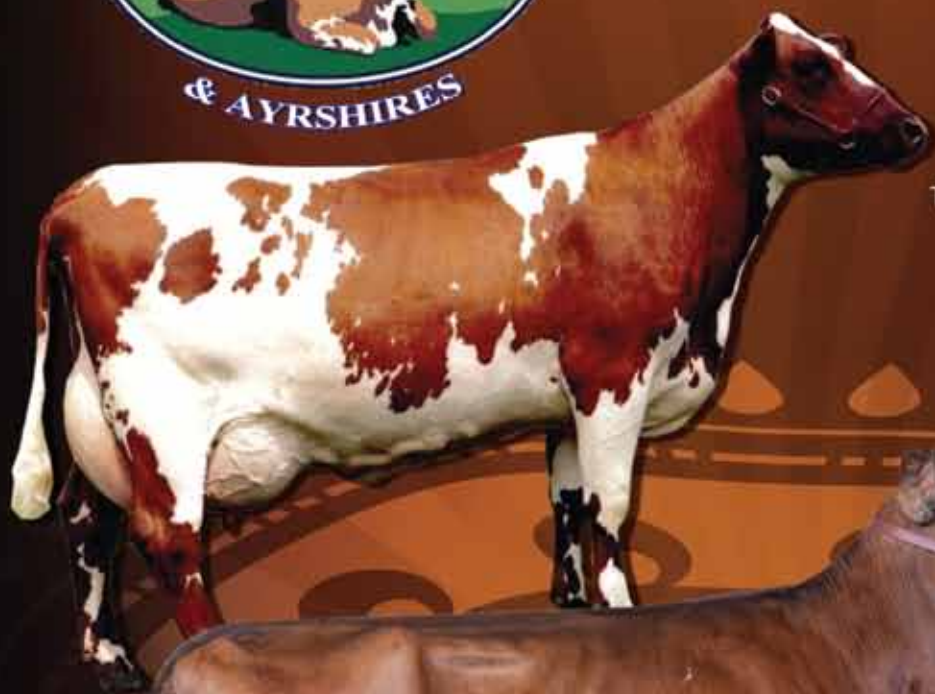

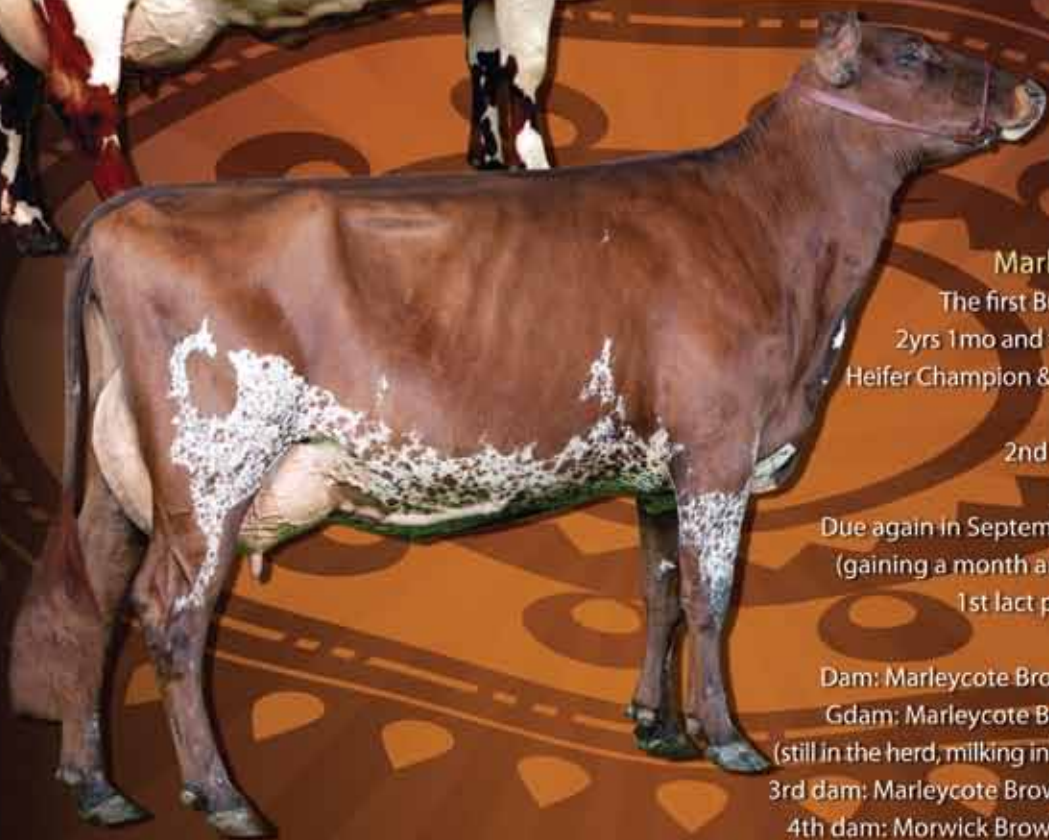

# Breed Manager's Report

For my first report to you as your Breed Manager, I sit here wondering where to start? Firstly I must, on behalf of us all, thank John Cochrane for his involvement and achievements within the Ayrshire Cattle Society over the last eight years, and we wish him well in his future endeavours. At the same time, can I also welcome our new office manager, Claire Kimm. I have no doubt that Claire will be a huge asset to us all.

So, what a time it is to be an Ayrshire breeder! On all of my recent travels, I have received nothing but admiration from so many within our industry on the achievements we have made over the last few months. Looking back to April when we held our annual Young Breeders gathering in Loughborough, I think all of us involved will remember the most amazing time we all had. Then in May, we had a most fantastic conference in Cornwall, for which the entire Cornwall club should be congratulated on organising everything to perfection! June brought us the Royal Highland Show where we were treated to a great display of Ayrshires and Red and Whites and also a great gathering of breeders from all over. More recently we had the dairy show at Livestock 2014. Sixty three in milk cows full of quality, twelve young breeders who worked tirelessly and professionally, and the most amazing results - winning all of the supreme interbreed championships. Has that ever been done before at a national show? At the same time we hosted the World Federation meeting, followed by farm tours throughout the Midlands and Derbyshire which were enjoyed by all of our visitors from all over the world.

I have to say that the support and work we get from our breeders is second to none! Every single person involved in all of the above put their heart and soul into everything they did to make each event a success, which is what makes this breed and its members so special.

We have so much more to plan and look forward to for the rest of the year. At the beginning of September we shall be hosting a judging school at East Church Ayrshires in Honiton, Devon. Another great show is expected in October at the South West Dairy Show, and, with a new venue, later that month we also have the All Breeds All Britain National

Calf Show at The Three Counties showground in Worcestershire. Keep an eye on the website diary for the dates!

What else am I doing or planning? Well, by the time you read this in the summer journal the new proofs will be done. This includes a new PLI base change which changes the way the PLI figures are worked out. Less emphasis will be put on milk and more on longevity and health traits including calving ease. Don't be alarmed to see figures drop as they will do across the board and across all breeds. I can't stress enough to you all how important it is to record the details of calving when registering your pedigree animals and to be honest with calving ease. If you enter all of your registrations as easy calving with no assistance it is presumed that that information is unreliable and your herd will be excluded from evaluations. With a small breed like us, we can't afford any exclusions!

I will also be working with CIS and CDI to try to provide an "Ayrshire Complete" package where you as members will pay one price for your registrations, milk recording and classifications. This has the added bonus of you choosing your classification dates. I will keep you updated on this. Registrations have been good to this point with several breeders who had "got behind" having now caught up. On top of this, we are getting more enquiries to start grading up commercial herds which has no doubt been brought on by the better milk prices earlier in the year. I will also be looking at the qualifications for the brood cow status over the next few months. If you have a family that you believe may have reached that status please contact Lesley on her email address [registrations@ayrshirescs.org](mailto:registrations@ayrshirescs.org) and she will run them through the system to see if they qualify. Club cows are now picked up automatically so keep a look out in our breed journals for members of your herds reaching these landmarks! The council meeting in October, you should all remember, will be looking for decisions from you to be made for the future. A new breed uniform which was trialled at the Livestock show, an All Britain competition to replace the photographic competition and there will also be further discussions on the possibility of replacing Council with a smaller board in the future. You will have been made aware of all these subjects by your council representative and I urge you to give them your thoughts and opinions so that decisions can be made and that we can then move on to build further on our success, promote the Ayrshire cow and work on increasing on our membership.

## Obituaries

### Gilbert Martin

Gilbert Martin was born on 3rd October 1931. His father, also Gilbert, had come down to Essex from the Isle of Bute and moved to Easthampstead in Berkshire in the 1940s. The Martin family continued to develop the Barnes herd and gained a considerable reputation for their show successes both at regional and national level. They were the first of the Ayrshire breeders in the south to target Ayr Show and particularly the Quey Derby. Gilbert was fascinated by the breeding side of the Barnes herd, an interest which had started at a young age with the breeding and showing of English rabbits. He gave a great deal of his time training young farmer stock judging teams and brought Berkshire to the forefront at national level for many years. He leaves a wife, Diana, and four children.

### Denis Williams

Denis Williams, of the renowned Tregonwell Herd from Manaccan in Cornwall, passed away suddenly in June aged 86. His wife Daphne,

passed away last September just before their 55th Anniversary. Denis was born in 1927 on the day that his parents moved into Tregonwell Farm. He had a great sense of humour, and used to play the saxophone in a band. Denis and Daphne were married in 1948 and bought their first Ayrshire the same year. They won their first championship in 1952 with Galley Lane Jenny. By 1975 the herd had grown to 125 cows and in 1977 they took to the show ring again, winning many championships in both breed and interbreed classes. Denis was very proud of winning a three day economic milking trial in 1990. Denis was a past Ayrshire Council member, member of the Royal Cornwall Show Council, sat on MMB and milk records committees and was a past Chairman and President of the Cornwall Ayrshire Breeders Club. Visualising a slump in milk prices, they decided to sell the Ayrshire herd in 1998 and then set up a beef herd for their son, Malcolm. In retirement, Denis and Daphne loved to travel and go on cruises, enjoyed gardening and restored four vintage tractors, which they took on local rallies and road runs.

Denis and Daphne are survived by a son and daughter in-law and son in-law, five grandsons and one great grandson, and, oh, seven cats!

# Profitable Lifetime Index - £PLI

**£PLI has undergone a significant change this August and should now be better equipped to help cattle breeders improve their herds to meet the UK dairy industry's long term demands**

The new £PLI recently launched, places an increased emphasis on health and fitness at around 68% of the total index and reduces the emphasis on production. Within this shift, there is a greater emphasis on female fertility and a new figure has been added to reflect the costs of maintaining the cow (see pie chart). In the past there has not been any means to account for the amount of costs to feed a smaller cow compared to a larger one. However, after much research at Scotland's Rural College, an accurate prediction of maintenance costs can now be made using traits which are routinely measured during type classification. This means that a smaller cow will have a higher PLI than a larger cow if they are both genetically capable of giving the same amount of milk at the same level of fitness.

With more evidence than ever before supporting the value of PLI, UK producers are strongly urged to use the index as their primary selection tool. Do not be tempted to be led by other countries rankings that have been designed for different local conditions with other markets and farming systems in mind. Despite the fact that some animals may rank well on both the UK and foreign country indexes, it is known from research that using a foreign index ultimately gives UK breeders suboptimal results. The PLI has been designed for use on our own national herd producing milk for sale to domestic buyers so there's no question that it should be used by UK cattle breeders.

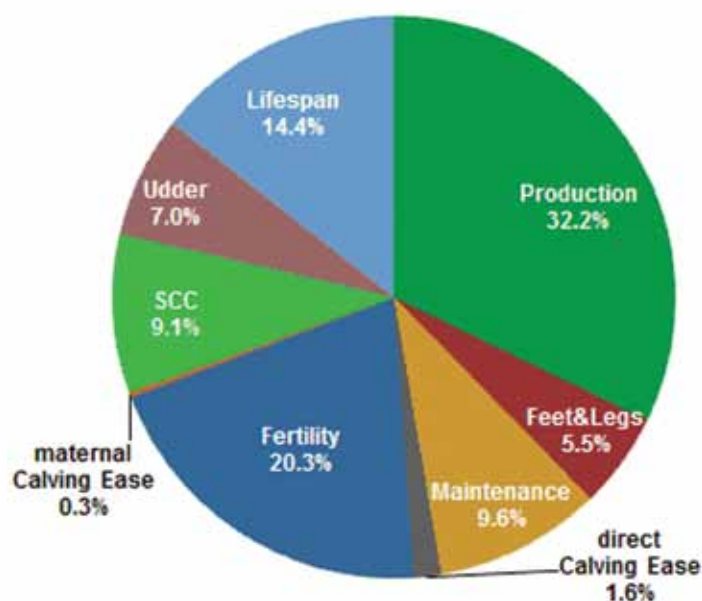
## An explanation of £PLI

The £PLI is a within breed genetic index developed specifically for UK dairy farmers. The £PLI value represents the additional profit a high £PLI bull is expected to return from each of its milking daughters over her lifetime compared to an average bull of £0 PLI.

The index has been developed to provide an initial screen tool to ensure bulls used on farm meet specific criteria. It is then recommended specific emphasis is placed on the management traits that require attention on individual farms. The main updates introduced in 2014 are shown below.

## Relative weighting of traits within £PLI

- Promote yield and maintain milk quality
- Increased emphasis on fertility



- Improve functional type - feet & legs and mammary
- Increased emphasis on longevity
- Reduce maintenance costs
- Improve udder health
- Improve calving performance

All breeds evaluated with £PLI are within their own breed base so across breed evaluation is not directly possible.

With the recent changes, we see a change in the top rankings for the Ayrshire breed as shown below from sires from our very own Cattle Services (Ayr) Ltd.

# Conference 2014

**Devas Herd Visit**

For those that have never visited, the country lanes are so narrow that even the coach could not get there and we were taken by minibus or Shank's pony (walking). On entering the field, the star of the herd, Devas Fenela 23 EX 94, a daughter of Pant James Bond, was waiting to greet us, just the kind of cow that the breed needs. Other mature cows that took the eye were Brocklehill Bank Book daughters and the homebred Devas First Valentine ones. Palmyra Jerrys Rhythm had done well and although the first calved heifers had been outwintered and the constant rain had been hard on

them, there were some really good cow makers among them, including a nice 85 point Highway Tourist daughter. After a sumptuous hog roast, we headed for the buses. Next visit was to the Gadles herd of Trevor Howe and Julie Prisk, a herd I know fairly well as in my role of Breed Development Manager, I monitor it. When I first went there, it was dominated by foundation cows from Andrew Meikle's good herd, solid trouble free cows just lacking in index, but with skill and a little bit of advice, Trevor has developed it, and we are now looking there for bull mothers, especially descendants of twin sisters Saphire 5th and 6th.

Now we have high indexing daughters and granddaughters by bulls like Lagace Modem, Carmelglen Edberg, B Jurist, Walnut Conn and R Ascona. No matter the sire used, the family's functional type still shows through. Most of the in milk heifers were by Ardmore Crown Napier, and what a good job he had done, and as well as UK sires like Panache, Trevor is considering bulls like Gunnerstorp and is already milking Obliques to keep the ball rolling.

The first visit of the second day was to the Jendale herd of Paul and Penny Jenkin which is always popular not just for the cows, but for the beautiful peaceful situation of the farm. It was four years since my last visit, and this time it was the many daughters of the homebred sire, Cornish Performer (an Auchensale Star Performer son, out of Peach 118 by Bankend Waterloo, the stand out cow on our last visit four years ago) that were the real cow makers. Others that took the eye were an outstanding third lactation Auchensale Star Performer, a really nice Rhythmajig and Tryst daughters again from the Peach family. Cornish Performer himself was in the



pen and what an impressive bull he is. Time for a welcome cuppa and a scone or two or three! The next visit was a first for many of us. This being to the Blackrock herd of Packer and Rowe, one the older herds in Cornwall. Morris Packer had in the 80 & 90s contributed much to the Society, especially on constitution and rules where his attention to detail was invaluable. This herd has been built on Hunnington bloodlines, and this typical Cornish steep banky farm needs their kind of cows with locomotion and hardiness. Many of the older cows were by Hunnington Triple Winner, Hunnington Fragyson and Hunnington Admiral.

After another food overload, this time with Cornish pasties, a Cornish favourite, and some of the local ale, we were in good form to view the herd. When a herd has been home to one of the most successful bulls of the last twenty years, namely Rosehill Blackthorn, as they age they leave a big void to fill, and many of us wondered how it could be filled.

My favourite cow in the field was a ninth lactation Triple Winner daughter with a super udder and the kind of body that was a classifier's dream. Another special one was by Cuthill Towers Sir Adam. Unfortunately they had never been classified. Of late, much more AI has been used and I noticed two outstanding in milk heifers by Green Lane Prodigy, while many of the in calf heifers were by Crown Napier. Of interest were four daughters of the sixties sire, Bankend Legacy, now confirmed as being a carrier of the much coveted A2 gene, and good heifers they were. All of us had been looking forward to visiting the famous Rosehill herd of our past president, Colin Christophers, and family, and heavy rain earlier in the week had dampened that spirit, but as we approached the farm, it was evident that mother nature had been good to us, and we could see the herd grazing in the hot sunshine as we walked along the farm lane, the coach again being redundant.

We need not have worried as their place had been taken by daughters of the homebred Viagra, Slightly Magic and Rhythmajig plus three outstanding Jurist daughters from Magenta and Velour, augmented by an outstanding group of heifers including some really special ones by Reality. Other heifers that stood out were VG Ristourn and Orraryd heifers. My personal herd favourite is the 96 point Velour, with Magenta not far behind. Velour like me, is beginning to feel her age, but is still full of spirit and determination and it made my day to spend it with an icon who has given me so many highs in the show ring over the last few years. As I was about to leave, she allowed me scratch her tail end, something unheard of in her younger days. A fitting end to a fantastic conference.

# Rosehill Ayrshire Genetics Tops Conference 2014

The embryo sale always delivers top prices and this year was no exception. Top price again went to the Rosehill herd of Colin Christophers and family with a choice package of sires out of the great **Rosehill Magenta EX 94**. Magenta has already achieved the two star brood cow status and has produced in excess of 80,000 kg of milk to date. There is a good chance that the resulting embryos will make a seventh successive generation of VG and EX cows. Arthur Lawrie, Cuthill Towers paid £780 each and chose the sire Palmyra Tri Star Reality package to take home. Next top price was the international package from Lashburn Ayrshires who consigned a package of embryos out of their young cow Lashburn Million Dollar Baby x Forever Schoon Eiffel. **Lashburn Million Dollar Baby** who was nominated as All Canadian 2013 is a Jelyca Oblique daughter out of the great Faucher Medalist Mona EX 94 4E and a granddaughter of the world famous Faucher Kellogg Lorna EX90. These made £600 each to Peter Berresford for his Heydale herd in Derbyshire.

Yet another very successful Conference Sale was held at the Falmouth Hotel which is in the sea side town of Falmouth, Cornwall. Cattle Services supplied five packages of semen to sell which got the sale off to a great start. Auctioneers for the evening were Mark Davis and Mark Bromell from Kivells Auctions in Devon, and what a fantastic job they did creating an atmosphere which really got people in the mood to bid!

The first lot and making the most money was Rosehill Blackthorn. Blackthorn has sired some great progeny over the years including the **EX 96 Rosehill Black Velour**, the world renowned **Rosehill Black Magenta EX 93** and the young sire that is making a huge impact in the Knowe herd **Richaven Provider EX 95**. Thought to be the last available on the mainland, these five straws sold to a record price of £120 per straw to Philip Reed for his Rhos Herd in Wales.

Next top price made was £105 per straw for the proven breeder **Celandine First Lord**. This Bankend Lord Ontario son out of the four star brood cow Changue Celandine 21 optimises what many believe as an ideal breeding tool. These sold to Blaise Tomlinson, for his Sandyford herd in Loughborough. Martin Parkes secured ten straws of **Townhead Dahlias Juror** for his Highway herd in Worcestershire for £45 each. As well as being a component improver for both butterfat and protein, he also dramatically improves on somatic cell counts.

Paul Jenkin, Jendale herd from Helston paid £25 each for ten straws of **Bankend Nucleus**. From the great Wren family at Bankend and sired by Pant Great Scot there is not much in this pedigree that you cannot admire. Ronnie Irwin, Craigtown in Northern Ireland also paid £25 each for **Langside Impact**. Again this sire has a good number of excellent daughters with many in the Langside, Killoch and Croftside herds.


Three lots then went on to make £500 per embryo. The first was from Mike Windel's Wroughton herd in Swindon. A package out of the popular **Wroughton Janet 2 EX94** X Haresfoot Panache. The last four generations of this family have averaged over eight lactations. Behind these embryos there are two generations of EX 94 and a sire stack of Celandine First Lord x Mawdesley Bright Beam x Pant James Bond x Brocklehill Bank Book. Colin Christophers purchased these for his Rosehill herd. Then it was an international bid which secured the **Flintstone Conn Ella VG88** x Palmyra Reality Gibbs embryos from the Smartmove Syndicate. Conn Ella has produced a top yield of over 9100 kgs in her second lactation and produces high quality milk with proteins averaging 3.6%. Again they made £500 to Klaus Johansson from Sweden. At the same price, came a joint purchase from Gilmour Lawrie, Brierside, and Steve Bailey, Beeline for the Burdette sired embryos out of the **EX 93 Heydale Winsome 110**. Winsome 110 EX 93 3E is a fourth generation VG/EX who is now in her sixth lactation, and has produced three lactations of over 10,000 kgs as well as her only milking daughter having already achieved an EX 90 status.

And finally, another joint purchase from Blaise Tomlinson, Sandyford, and Alan Timbrell, Millford, as they took home the Reality Gibbs sired embryos out of **Marleycote Sea Lily 14 EX93**. Sea Lily now resides in Northern Ireland in the capable hands of the McLean and Crummie familys and has just produced a huge yield of 12,621 kgs of milk in 305 days. This package was sold for £380.

A big thank you to all consigners and purchasers from all of the above. Your continued support is very much appreciated. Also a huge thank you to the two Marks for some of the best auctioneering ever seen in Falmouth!

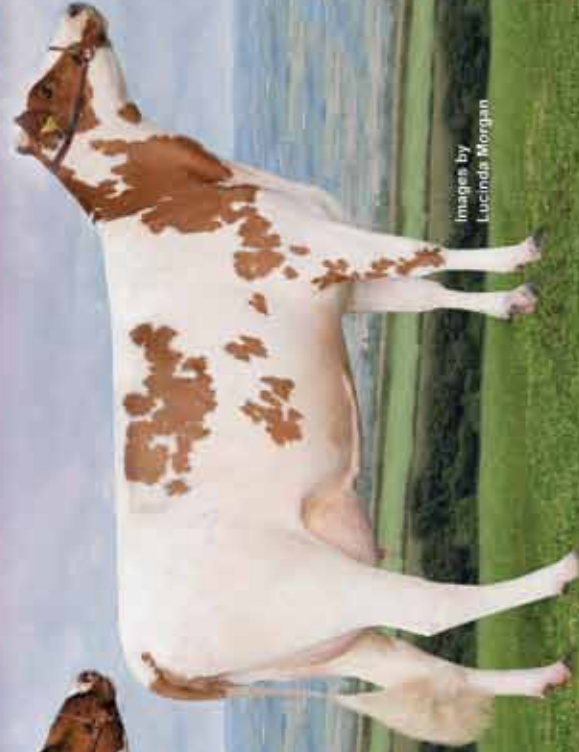



With a few sun burnt faces, delegates arrived back to the hotel in time for a quick change into their cowboy and cowgirl costumes and met in the bar before the evening entertainment was revealed. On entering the conference room, the members were met by a rodeo bull (not a real one) and a tin can alley with prizes for all. Much amusement followed with members trying to stay on the bull as long as possible - until our president Colin Christophers had a go and duly ripped off one of the bull's horns! After dinner members danced away to a Ceilidh which was great fun for all. Eventually in the early hours once the entertainment had finished, a large group decided to taxi into Loughborough to recruit some new members!

## Edward's C.S.A. News

Our recent sire brochure with its new layout and comprehensive coverage of the quality and wide ranging genetics we offer appears to have been very well received. This in turn we hope will lead to further increases in our semen sales. Going on past experiences the majority of these come in the last quarter of the year, so hopefully customers will have it to hand when they are ready to order.

The latest bull proofs produced by Dairyco Breeding + were made public on August 12th. Within these, the PLI has been significantly revised to include a greater emphasis on functional traits - fertility, longevity, calving ease etc, with a lesser emphasis on production. This has changed the rankings of many bulls - some hugely, elevating the likes of - **"Napier"**, **"Marshall"**, **"First Quality"** and others to or near the top of the PLI leader board. This is very pleasing and satisfying for I have often commented on daughters of these bulls based on my experience and observations as being "farmer friendly" and of the type that keep you in business. Now given credence by these latest evaluations, these figures by their nature are not static and are subject to change with every proof run. It is then very difficult to have the latest proofs in our sire brochure as we only produce this once a year, though they are updated regularly and are available on our website or by discussion with myself.

Semen sales for the first six months of the year have been much on par with last year, coming from more than sixty bulls, varying from the odd ten straws to several hundred per bull. **"Napier"** and **"Prodigy"** head the sales list of proven sires, while **"Panache"** and **"Hilltown Oblique"** are the most popular unproven. The four Rosehill bulls - **"Rhythmajig"**, **"McCoy"**, **"Vitality"** and **"Manderville"** were not far behind, with the young **"Furtado"** proving to be very popular. We have decent stocks of his normal semen, but the limited amount of sexed we were able to collect, will be sold out very quickly, and with little chance of there being any more. We currently have sexed semen also available from **"Prodigy"**, **"Hilltown Oblique"**, **"Vitality"** and **"Manderville"**.

Details of our next offering of young bulls should be posted out by the end of August/early September. Again, we ask for your full support and that you use the semen as quickly as possible and without selection. We are also well forward with our selection of young bulls for a spring offering. The results of blood tests and herd health records will again be a deciding factor, as to which we can proceed with.

Exports are again on the move with orders already away to three countries, with further orders and enquiries to hand. We will as always make every effort to exploit these to their full potential. Having said that, there can be many hurdles to clear before enquiries turn into sales. We have to remember that not all semen collected qualifies for export - different countries have different criteria, priorities and health restrictions. For example, entry of our semen into South Africa and North America is now restricted because of Schmallenberg and Blue Tongue. South Africa is a case in point. A few years ago I visited there on behalf of C.S.A., and forged a link with a semen marketing company to market our semen in South Africa. This has worked very well with them taking substantial amounts of our semen each year following. Now with these restrictions in place, they are sourcing Ayrshire semen from elsewhere. If and when this door is fully open again we will have to try and re-establish ourselves into this market - it may not be easy.

The thirty plus breeders from around the world who were here in the UK for the Livestock Event and World Federation meeting had to be suitably impressed with the quality and performance of the breed at the show, especially the judge, Mr Selwyn Donald from New Zealand, who often expressed his admiration of the cattle in front of him. The quality throughout the classes was exceptional, with daughters of Cattle Services sires an integral part of this. Our breed winning all the interbreed classes judged by a panel of breed judges was the pinnacle of the show. Congratulations to all involved.

Thanks also to the breeders who opened their gates for the herd visits on the few days following the show. Bringing the opportunity to view more daughters of C.S.A. bulls and their herd mates in their usual surroundings was an added bonus, giving a more complete view of the types of Ayrshire that make up the UK herd, hopefully stimulating more interest in the semen we can supply. A point made by a few of these visitors was that they had expected to see more in-milk daughters of our leading proven bulls like **"Napier"**, **"Mandella"** and **"Prodigy"**, so impressed were they with the ones they had seen. **"Mandella"** semen does not qualify for export to South Africa so that door is closed. A breeder though from South Africa said that if I could find a way of getting **"Mandella"** semen to him I could name the price and he would take every straw we had. Sadly I can't - such is life. We can though fulfill orders here in the UK.

Semen marketing as with any other business is very competitive, with details of many different breeds and semen from bulls within them, together with their claimed advantages readily available to UK dairy farmers. I will only reiterate the point I have made many times before that when you support Cattle Services you are availing yourself to the most comprehensive choice of Ayrshire genetics, pure and blended, mostly bred and proven in the UK. You are helping to ensure the future of the British Ayrshire, with every penny of profit we make from semen sales used in many ways for the furtherance of the breed: eg operating a young bull proving scheme (no young bulls tested - no proven bulls in the future); advertising; promotion; show attendance, etc; and supporting clubs with sponsorship and the Society's many activities, such as the young members programme - today's young members = tomorrow's leading breeders.

We are now well through the summer show season where many breeders have successfully flown the Ayrshire and Cattle Services flag at these events. Our thanks and congratulations to them all - they are too many to mention in detail, as I would no doubt miss some if I tried. I will though say well done to a young breeder from Lancashire - Andrew Rimmer - for the successes he has had with his young **"Napier"** cow, which includes breed champion at the Great Yorkshire.

Positive news is always welcome, and none more so than the recent article in a farming magazine where the **"Wroughton"** herd of Mr Mike Windel and family was featured, having been placed first in the N.M.R. annual production report on rankings for the Ayrshire breed. Being a strong supporter of C.S.A., a large percentage of the herd are by Cattle Services sires, including the home bred **"Lord Winston"**. We send them our thanks and congratulations.

The Autumn Dairy Show season will soon be with us. We have stand space booked at the S. West Dairy Show; Welsh Dairy Show; Agriscot; and the Ulster Winter Fair. Please visit us at these events if possible - all are welcome. Our thanks go to breeders who make their bulls available to us, and to all our customers for their valued support - which we look forward to continuing through the remainder of 2014 and beyond.

# Ayrshire Diary.....

**From Annabell Armstrong, Plaskettlands**

What a start to spring we had at Plaskettlands, after weeks of draining, digging holes and finding elusive drains, you know the ones; they're the ones that you know are in the field somewhere! The entire crop went in well and grew well early on, and we have had bumper crops of first cut silage and hay this year. We have all our own equipment and so don't need to rely on contractors which makes the job a bit easier. All we need to do now, is figure out a way to keep the crows off the wrapped bales between wrapping and bringing them in. That's a work in progress, but Michael has all sorts of weird and wonderful ideas. The potatoes have been growing a treat, but we were late at getting them planted this year due to waterlogged fields. They were a fortnight late at going in, but were ready a fortnight earlier than last year. Van loaded, and off to market we go, with four markets a week at the moment. # World Federation Meeting 2014

## **On the 3rd July we hosted the World Federation Executive Meeting at Stoneleigh Park, in conjunction with the Livestock Show.**

This is a bi-annual meeting held to discuss world Ayrshire topics. Each WAF country has three representatives which makes up a World Ayrshire Federation Committee and Ayrshire Canada provide the secretary, who is Lorna Bender. The current President of the Federation is Mary Creek from the Palmyra Herd in the USA. The representatives for the UK are Arthur Lawrie, Colin Christophers and myself. I was unable to attend the meeting as I was busy with my duties at the Livestock Show, but we were very fortunate that although John Cochrane had resigned from his post as Breed Secretary, he agreed to organise the event and represent us at the meeting, which he very ably did. John was assisted by our vice president Robert Adams who was the "official tour guide and courier". A huge thank you to both John and Robert for all your hard work.

Delegates started to arrive at Stoneleigh Lodge from Monday through to Tuesday evening. Wednesday was spent at the Livestock Show and Thursday saw the actual meeting. Farm visits were then held for the following three days.

Approximately half of all of the costs were covered by sponsorship, and at this time we must make a special thanks to our main sponsors, Cattle Services (Ayr) and GEA. The GEA headquarters are located at Stoneleigh Park, just across the way from our hotel and they very kindly held and sponsored a reception on their rooftop patio before we headed over to the Jersey Pavilion for our meal on the Wednesday evening. Cattle Services sponsored the reception and main meal as well as other costs on the Thursday evening. Other sponsors were Blue Merle, Keenan and RABDF.

The meeting covered many current Ayrshire and dairying topics. Discussions took place on genomics, polled genetics and animal welfare issues across the world. She also informed us of an EU funded university based project which she thought could be extended to include Ayrshires in the genomic work that is currently being done.

A discussion was held on how successful the youth tours had been, which had previously been held by New Zealand, Canada and the UK.

Similar events will be held in the future with the first one being hosted by Finland in January 2015 with the next in Sweden. There was a general agreement on how effective it was to get youth interacting within our breed, with their enthusiasm and modern technology the Ayrshire world can be a much smaller place.

We were also given an update from Mary Creek on the World Conference which will be held in the USA from the 21st September through to the Madison Show, ending on 8th October 2016. The 2020 World Conference will be held in Australia.

After all of the formalities of the meetings, a few of the delegates headed home, but for the rest it was the start of a several days of herd visits. On Friday morning we headed off to the Highway herd in Worcestershire, by kind permission of Martin and Jane Parkes. Again the sun was shining and the herd was looking in fine form. One of the highlights here was to see the EX 95 Highway Banana 15. Now in her eleventh lactation, she still looked as youthful as ever and it was clearly visible as to why she scores EX 97 for legs and feet. From here we then headed towards Bromsgrove to visit the Hunnington herd, but stopped off for a most delicious lunch at a nearby pub kindly organised by Hazel Window. The Hunnington herd was looking great and the show team from Livestock were none the worse off after all of the success. The Mandella daughters really impressed our visitors, and so too did all of the fresh calved heifers entering the herd. She won for her superior mammary with a higher and wider rear udder than the second place cow from the same herd, **Sandyford**





**Bunty Blizzard.** Third in this great class was the Royal Cornwall Show champion, **West Berriow Modem Fairystory**, from Arthur and Debbie Walters.

The Intermediate cows having had three calves produced ten cows for Selwyn to inspect. With what Selwyn declared to be a close placing it was Lisa Window leading **Hunnington Fragrance 55**, by Castern Tornado, who took the win over the Hunnington BBK Easlad daughter **Sandyford Diamond 45** from Blaise Tomlinson. Eleven senior cows were a pleasure for all to view, and with the world famous **Sandyford Clover 10**, who is the highest classified cow in the country, included in this line up, was it to be a foregone conclusion? Well yes, she was duly pulled

into first place. Looking in great form as usual, Clover has now produced 100 tonnes of milk in her eight actations, still giving 42 kgs daily and having calved 300 days. Selwyn Donald admitted he could talk forever on this cow. Second place to Clover was again an Hunnington entry, this time, **Hunnington Monica 64**, and yet another Mandella daughter. The Red and White class was next, and although not so well supported, we still saw four good cows and heifers. Champion for this section was Arthur and Susan Lawrie with the heifer **Cuthill Towers Classic Serina**. Second to her was **Middle Jean HYB** from J Whiteford & Sons. The breed championship line up was, can I say, one of the best many of us had ever seen. Our breed Judge Selwyn Donald made this into a great spectacle and promoted our breed to the fore! Champion went to





the great **Sandyford Clover 10** from Blaise and Deborah Tomlinson, Reserve Champion was **Hunnington Fragrance 55**, from Chris and Lisa Window and Honourable Mention was **Sandyford Mayflower 14** again from Blaise and Deborah.

#### DAY TWO.....INTERBREED CHAMPIONSHIPS

This was to be a day like no other for the Ayrshire Breed in the UK. First up was the heifer Interbreed Championship. Ayrshire entry **Hunnington Fragy 16** was looking even better than on day one and after being displayed in front of all of the breed judges it was time for the results. As Lisa walked Fragy towards the judges the scores were shown. 10s down the line from all judges, which gave her both Exhibitor bred and Supreme overall champion.

Next in was Clover, and with the atmosphere tense again the judges gave her the highest scores which gave her the exhibitor bred Interbreed Champion to a huge round of applause. For the overall supreme, the Holstein Champion entered the ring in place of the Reserve which would see judges with different scores from the previous class. The drama continued as Clover and the Holstein ended with a tie. They could not be split as they had the same amount of 10 scores so after some

deliberation it was decided that the Holstein Judge, Hugh Neilson, and the Ayrshire Judge, Selwyn Donald, should now make the decision. It was unanimous that Clover should be crowned Supreme Champion for Blaise and Deborah Tomlinson.

The Livestock Show also hosts the famous past Royal Show Bledisloe Trophy for the best team of four cows of each breed. This came next. Representing the Ayrshires were **Sandyford Clover 10**, **Cuthill Towers Miss Blondie 2**, **Sandyford Diamond 45** and **Sandyford Mayflower 14**. "Breath-taking" was the only word to describe this team. As they walked towards the judges it was a top score of 10 from every single judge which gave the Ayrshires the win and the famous Bledisloe Trophy for the second year running.

Normally I would end this report here, but I must thank so many for their involvement in this show. Firstly our Judge, Selwyn Donald, for the most professional and accurate performance of judging and also promoting our breed for everyone to see. Secondly to the Ayrshire young members who prepared and showed 19 Ayrshires to the highest standards for breeders who wouldn't have been there otherwise. And lastly, to all of the Ayrshire exhibitors who came along to support what I believe we

## Ulster

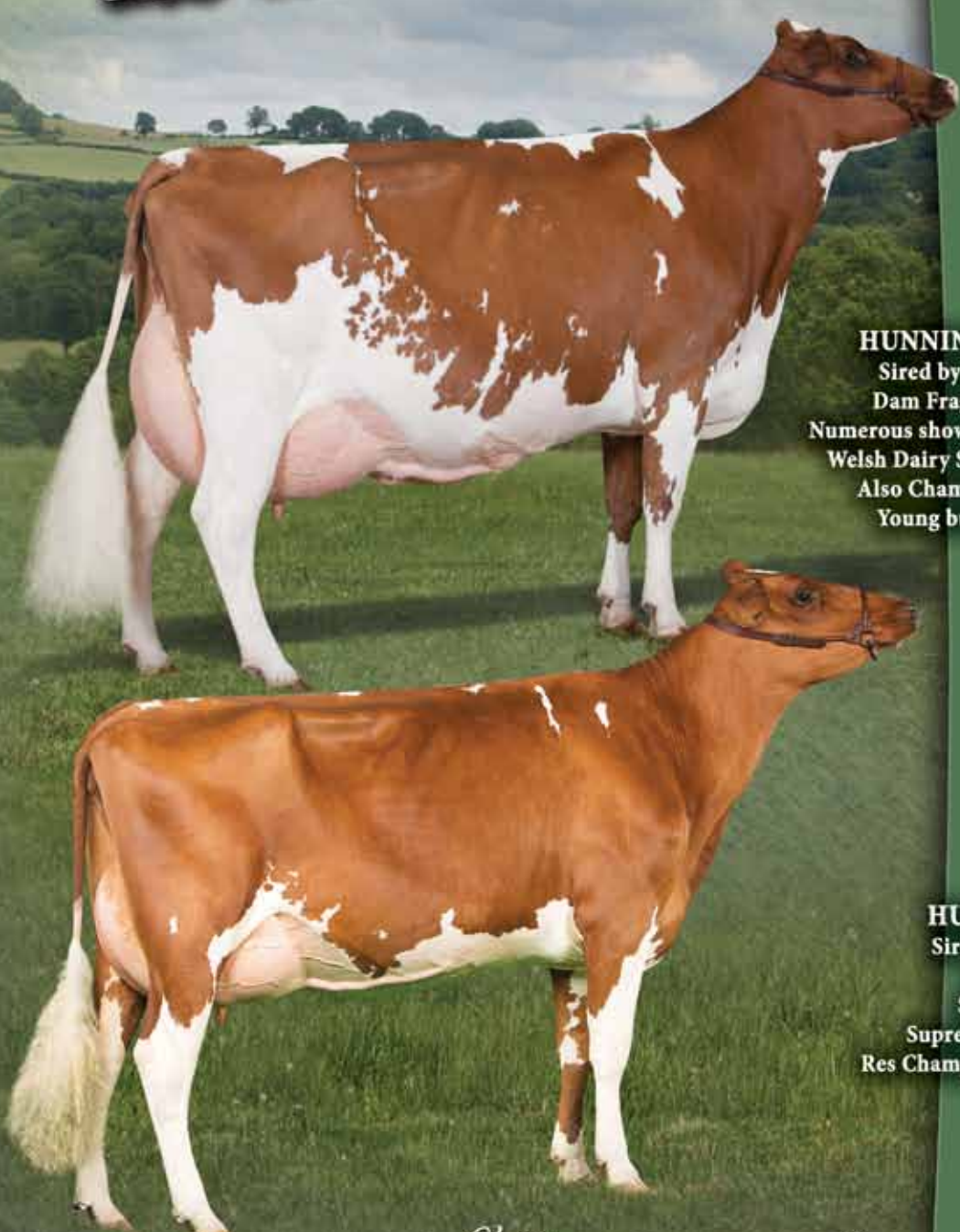

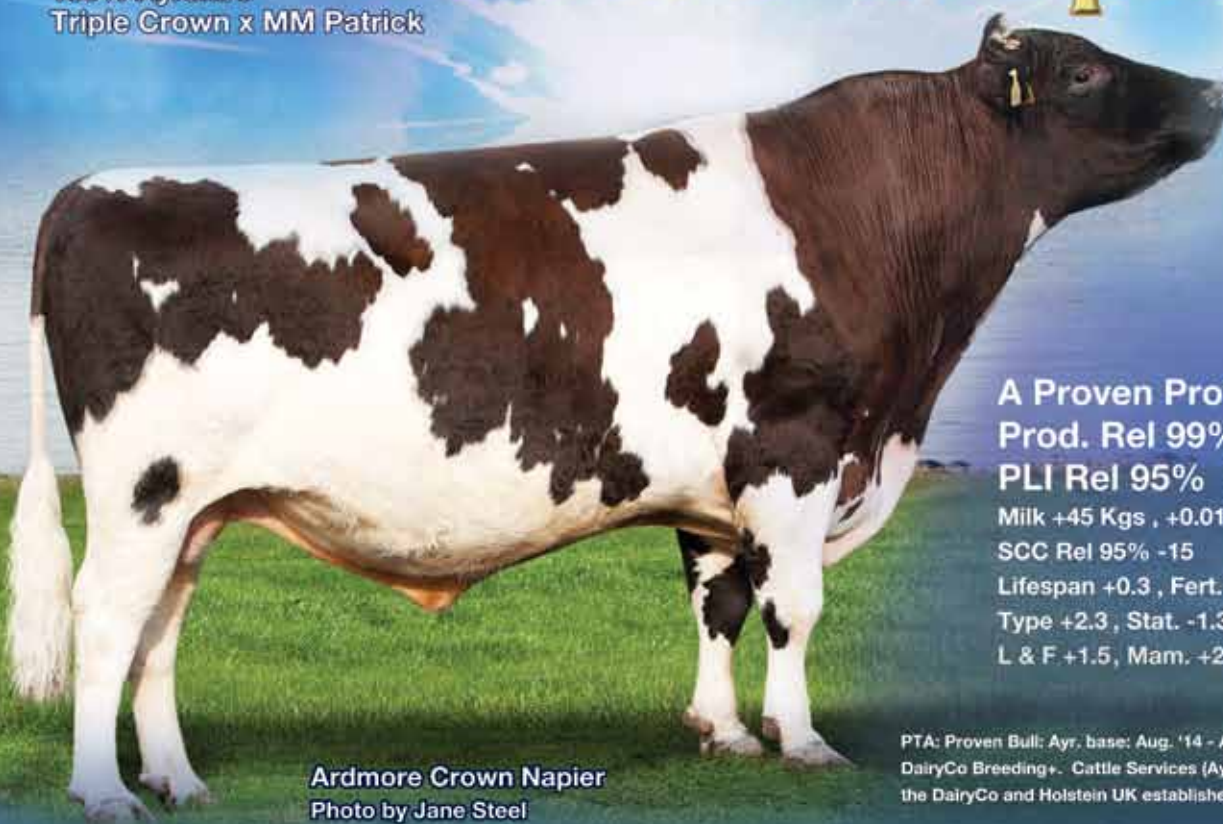
