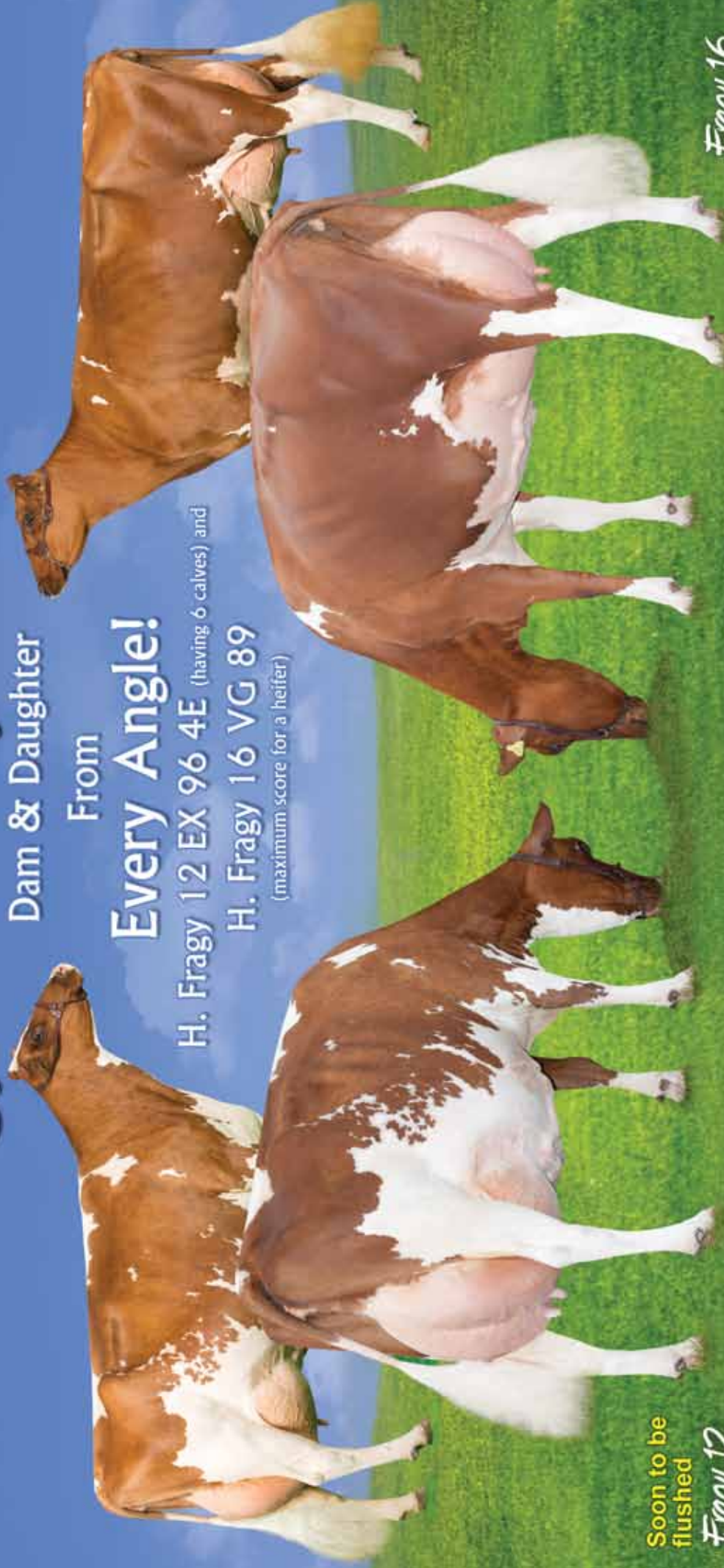

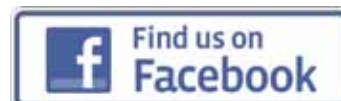

# Breed Manager's Report

At a time when our industry yet again is pulling on the purse strings I understand how difficult things are out there for many, and all I can say is hopefully there will be an upturn soon and encourage and support you as best I can. This leads me to bring you the news that we as a Society are putting a freeze on additional registration fees for all overage animals until 1st November 2015 and shall backdate from the 1st July 2015. This will be a one off offer to enable you to get caught up on your registrations and on the condition that you then register in the future on time. With this catch up we will also offer monthly payments to suit you, but you must contact me to have this arranged before your catch up. I hope you feel that as a Society we are doing our best to help you during these difficult times.

Much has been going on since the last journal. Yet another very successful Young Breeders Gathering this year, held in the beautiful county of Devon, and I must thank the Devon Club for their hospitality and hard work during the event. Congratulations to this year's winner of the Hugh Stevenson award, David Lawrie, and also to the junior award winner of the John Cochrane Trophy, Laura Partington.

The conference was again a huge success with a superbly well run event from start to finish. The Cumbrian Club should be commended for their huge efforts and achievement in making this yet again a spectacular event.

Show season was then soon upon us and much success for the breed has been made all over the UK. I have had the pleasure in witnessing many of these displays of our breed and all exhibitors, be it at regional or National events, and you should be proud of the quality of stock presented at all of the shows. Our first "National Show" held at the NEC in Birmingham was a huge inspiration for many to see, with superb numbers and quality, and the professionalism shown from all, especially our Young Breeders, is something that we as a breed can be proud of. This event is a huge shop window for us to display what our breed can offer and we certainly did that.

Many other projects are happening behind the scenes so to speak. Council gave the go ahead to design and develop a new website with some of the money gifted to us by the late Frank Renshaw. This has now all been designed and is in the process of development as I speak. I am sure this will help us promote both Society and Cattle Services further in the future, with complete access from smart phones and tablets helping us to achieve a bigger audience.

The new qualifications for the Star Brood cow awards are now active and working. The qualifications are printed in this journal. If you have animals you suspect qualify for this award then please email the animal names to Lesley where she will run them through the system in order for the award to be obtained. Back in June of this year I represented our breed at the European Red Breeds meeting in Latvia. Red breeds are very dominant throughout much of Europe, and this meeting is a chance to get together, to promote ourselves and discuss how we can learn from each other. Countries represented were Sweden, Finland, Norway, Germany, Latvia, Lithuania, Poland, Estonia, Denmark and ourselves. We each did a presentation on our breed, and I can honestly say that there was much interest in my PowerPoint presentation, with many questions and discussions on Ayrshires throughout the two day conference. One of the biggest subjects, and many talks were had on it, was the development of genomics with in the Red Breeds. The majority of the European Reds are made up of different bloodlines and are evaluated in similar environments, which has given them an advantage in numbers to be able to get a reliable base to work from. I had some very interesting discussions with the genomic experts from Viking Reds who confirmed my issue that, as such a small breed without the numbers needed, we will take a long time before we can get information that can be of use to us. The organisation Viking Reds have tested over 18,000 DNA which has given them a solid base to work from, with good reliability figures. Cost is our biggest obstacle. At the cost of about £56 per DNA and 10,000 samples needed to get the reliable information needed, need I say more? However I am to be in the process of looking at the possibility of an EU grant to help us fund this in the future. I shall keep you updated on that.

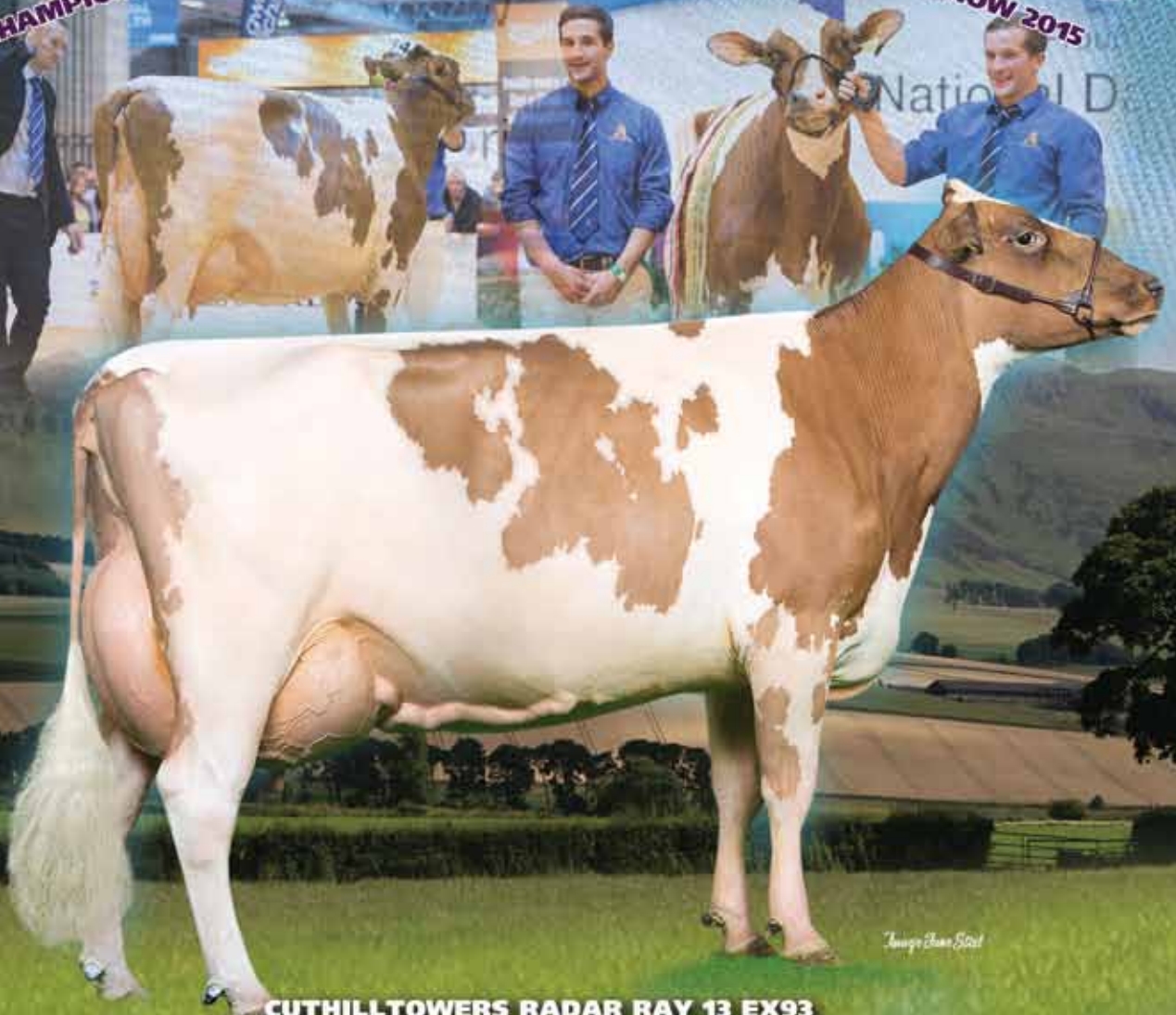
As many of you will know our show ring rules take a slight change as from **1st January 2016** to bring the show ring in line with our registration system. All animals must have a minimum of **51% Ayrshire** blood to be eligible to be shown in an Ayrshire class. Letters will be sent to all show organisations to inform them of this rule change. At the same time I ask you all to check your pedigree registrations for any missing information. Sometimes where there is missing ancestry for whatever reason, the percentages of these animals can end up being incorrect. Now is the time to address any problems to be corrected if proof can be shown. Please direct any discrepancy directly to me to make any changes necessary. Going forward there is much to look forward to including two judging schools, the first in Campbeltown on 29th August and the other in Bolton on 22nd September, details will be displayed on the website, and the young breeders need to start hunting out their entries for the All Breeds calf show, which will be again held at the Three Counties Showground on 17th and 18th October.

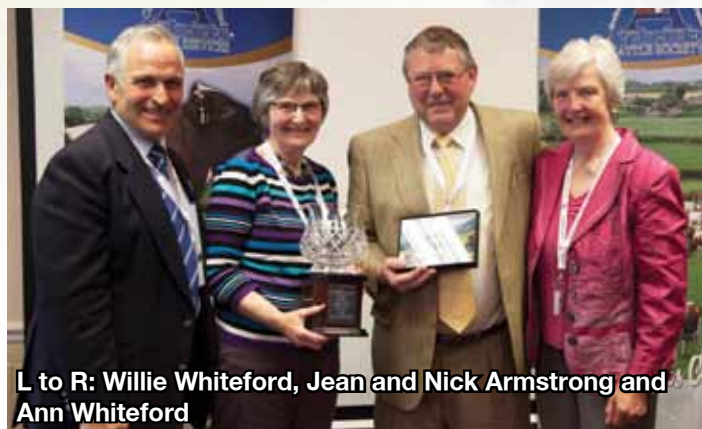
The Murchland Trophy was bequeathed to the Ayrshire Cattle Society by the late Miss Agnes Murchland in memory of her uncle, William Dunlop whose famous Gree herd based at Fenwick, Ayrshire had a big influence on the breed in the last century.

The Sandyford herd of 168 cows achieved an average yield of 8,743 kgs of milk at 4.20% fat and 3.41% protein, and this is the fourth time the herd has won this prestigious trophy. They were also the first herd to win this award in 2009.

## Obituary - Willie McHarg

Born at Drumsuie near Coylton in 1928, Willie, who sadly lost his mother when he was only five, grew up alongside his brothers Dick and Jim. Having finished his education at the local school he went on to work with his father and brothers at Drumsuie, before they moved on to what was to become the family farm at Broadhead near Auchincruive. He met his future wife, Jean Dalgleish, through the Young Farmers organisation, and they were married in 1951 and eventually settled into what was to become their family home at Crofthead, where in the years that followed they were to celebrate the births of their children – Nan, Martin, Jean, Sheila and Isabel. A man who worked hard to provide for his wife and family, who always gave a hundred percent in anything that he did or was

Willie was a weel-kent face at many of the local shows, and more especially the show at Ochiltree where he had not only been an active member on the committee, but had been an honorary President. Willie was also a keen card player and taught not only his own children, but also his grandchildren, to play whist and nap, but although they would gather around the table to play on a regular basis, he stuck strictly to the old Presbyterian maxim that you didn't play cards on Sunday. Willie received the respect of those who had the privilege of knowing him. He would often invite, or arrive home with, friends to the house where they would be the recipients not only of a warm welcome from Jean, but what some folks have come to call Willie's own special brand of special Crofthead hospitality, which invariably came in the form of an extra large dram or two.

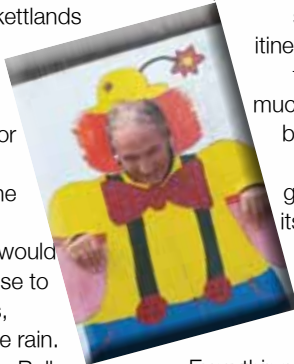
# Diary Of A Conference Hosting Club Secretary!

The first hint we got about the 2015 Conference was in April 2012, Rodney got a phone call from Robin Barr, the then Vice President of the Society, asking him to second Willie Whiteford for the position of Junior Vice President of the Ayrshire Cattle Society. He came off the phone and thought what an honour it was to be asked to do such a thing and I thought oh B.....! that's three years till the Cumberland Club host the 2015 Conference. Of course we had to keep this bit of news quiet until the AGM which was being held in Kent, and as soon as we arrived there you start to look at Conferences a whole lot differently.

In Rodney's role of seconding Willie he said he didn't know where to start to say something nice about him, and so decided Google was a good place to look! Well I can tell you in the following three years I came up with a lot of ways to describe Willie, and most of them aren't printable! The phone number for Middle Farm was quickly memorised and has been dialled on a regular basis. The first year a lot of thinking was done by club members as to fund raising and sponsorship. Willie and Ann were keen to stress that the Conference was the club's and not theirs, and input was welcomed from all club members. It was also decided to make the Conference an inter county conference and invite the Baynes family from Marley Cote to host a visit alongside the four farms from Cumbria, Thackthwaite Hall, Rosewain, Plaskettlands and of course Middle Farm.

The first fundraising event was a BBQ and Duck Race hosted by the Mattinsons, ducks and tickets were sold for the BBQ. On the day it took three Mattinson and two Armstrong gentlemen to erect a couple of gazebos for the catering, of course Margaret and I had plenty words of advice as to how to do this, but we were swiftly told we would be paddling with the ducks if we didn't find something else to do! The weather on the night was just right for the ducks, and four races were held while Rodney and I BBQd in the rain. This was swiftly followed by the entertainment of a Rodeo Bull. Various guests were keen to show off their rodeo skills and some were not. We were lucky enough to be undercover, and this was a welcome diversion from the weather. There is a video of Willie on the bull in circulation and this can be viewed for a small fee!

This brought us into 2014 with 17 months left until conference week. This was when we started talking to prospective sponsors and sowing the seeds for sponsorship, and in the next 18 months hundreds of letters and emails were sent, these were then followed up with phone calls and more emails. I knew I'd had a busy day when I ran out of printer ink and envelopes. It is a sure fine way to keep reps and salesmen out of your yard when they give you their business card and we gave them a sponsorship letter in return. March 2014 saw a couple of fundraisers. We had a long chat at one of our meetings deciding how we could inflict pain on Willie and make money out of it. It was suggested that we wax Willie from head to foot and sell tickets for the spectacle, but Willie wasn't keen and Ann said no, and it was decided to loose him and sell squares for Where's Willie. We received a lot of suggestions as to where people would like Willie to go but eventually he was found close to home. The next meeting was booked for March 17th, this of course is St Patrick's Day, and the meeting was put on hold and 30 club members and friends



held an Irish supper and quiz night. By this time the hotel and coaches were booked and deposits needed to be paid. This was followed by a brilliant night with club members Mike and Shirley. Mike decided he would have a sponsored Locks Chop and share the money between the Conference fund and the Addington Fund. The beard was the first to go and then the hair swiftly followed, I think we have all got used to the new Mike now - but I think the odd cow may still be a bit confused. Then it was Willie's turn, a set of stocks were to be found and an afternoon of fun was to be had at Middle Farm. The Stockjudging was held first with six classes to judge, one of these being a class of ducks. The master judges for the afternoon were the Mattinson boys, Philip and James. All was going well until the placings and results for the ducks were being given out. The judge admitted he didn't know much about ducks but he chose to judge them like his women, with a firm breast and nice legs! Then it was Willie's turn to be placed in the stocks. A lot of fun with wet sponges was had and Ann and I took great pleasure in hitting the target more than once.

This brought us into September 2014, eight months to go. Meetings were held on a regular basis now with plans and ideas being discussed, this was made easier by Ann's wonderful hospitality. The Journal Advert was also needed; this is when it all starts to get a bit real. The dates were now confirmed and an itinerary was also to be included. # Conference 2015



The 2015 North of England conference was held in Cumbria, home of the now past President, Willie Whiteford. We were based at the Crown Hotel at Wetheral, which was an ideal location with superb facilities. Day one kicked off with the Presidents' meeting followed by Council, both ran smoothly which allowed us to keep to the timetable to start the AGM on time. Some 120 breeders, members and friends sat into witness the reports on the past twelve months, the new posts for the current year and the presentations of prizes and awards. An evening drinks reception was hosted by New Breed UK, followed by a superb barbecue dinner which concluded day one.

Day two soon arrived and it was a case of "on the buses". First stop was Thackwaite Hall, near Wigton, home of the Sanderson herd of David and Christine Sanderson. Christine welcomed us all to Thackwaite Hall and gave us a brief insight to the farm and how things work. As we walked out to view the herd the wind picked up (by that I mean the weather), what a sight, with 180 cows grazing before us. We didn't have to walk far before we found the great Middle Georgette MM EX 95 5E, a phenomenal producer of large yields of high quality milk. David and Christine bred a bull from this great cow, Sanderson George, who, with 45 daughters, is making a huge impact in the herd resulting in the type of cow that they both had wished to achieve. Another cow to catch the eye was the EX 93 3E Waxham Biscuit 20, who has recently reached the 100,000 kgs lifetime yield, who was purchased from Norfolk after they had lost their original herd to foot and mouth in 2001. Biscuit 20, who is still in tremendous form, has also bred David and Christine a bull used extensively within the herd, Sanderson Breakaway by Nelson. This is a great herd of cows with a lot of strength and super bodies. After a welcome cup of coffee we took the short drive to Rosewain Farm, home of Troutbeck Ayrshires. Here we were met by hosts Frank and Margaret Mattinson and their sons James and Philip. The farm was spotless and a place that I heard one delegate say "you could work here with your slippers on and not get them dirty". By this time over 160 delegates, sponsors and friends were present. We all congregated inside one of the barns where we were given a detailed overview of the farm by Frank, before sitting down to the most delicious lunch of a roast beef dinner

followed by the most scrumptious selection of cakes. We then wandered out to battle the wind yet again to view the 250 cow herd, we did not have to go far before recognising a familiar great cow, Myerscough Jess 123 EX 92 3E LP80. Jess has many daughters and granddaughters in the herd and the evidence is there that she is breeding really well. The Mattinson's have used Red and White genetics to breed a cow to suit their system whilst still keeping the attributes of the Ayrshire breed; many daughters of the Dutch bull Poos Stadel Classic were consistent in type with good legs and feet. Another trait which had to impress everyone was the quality of udders, and in particular the rear udder height. Most of us then returned through the tunnel under the train track to the farm buildings, except for one delegate who thought he may like a better view of the trains! We then viewed the calves and stock bulls before boarding the buses to head to the last port of call for the day, Plaskett Lands.

The Armstrong family, Joe and Kathleen, Rodney and Annabell and family run the Plaskett herd of Ayrshires. A welcome was followed by that special presentation to Joe for his lifetime achievement to the breed, and then off to look around the cows. The herd are full of robust cows which was evident as we walked around, hardy looking cows with tremendous legs and feet giving super locomotion. Many were amazed to see cows who looked like they had had four or five lactations, but no!, a good number of these cows were eight to twelve lactations, and looked like they will be around for many more to come. These were mainly Round Bush Edward daughters, a stock bull who really stamped the Armstrong's herd. The EX 96 3E Plaskett Jolly 191 is one of these daughters, and so too is Plaskett Jolly 190 EX 92 2E, who was the Cumbria County winner of the all breeds Genus Long Life Cows competition in 2014, both were a pleasure to see. Many delegates really admired Jolly 191's daughter, by Stamford First Prize, Plaskett Jolly 197 EX 93 3E who looked in great form, and much interest was shown in her son by Hilltown Oblique. On view for us all to see was their newest stock bull Hunnington Flash (jointly owned with Jim McGarva at Horseclose) out of Hunnington Fragy 12 EX 95 3E and by Castern Tornado, it shows the vision at Plaskett to use genetics from the strongest and best cow families. After very welcome refreshments we headed back to Wetheral for a little free time before

dinner. The ladies trip during the day had resulted in many shopping bags after a day out in Carlisle! The evening started with a drinks reception, sponsored by Carrs Billington, which was appreciated by us all, followed by the dinner and what a surprise to have such talented singing waitresses and chef, a real treat! Following dinner was the annual conference sale, supported again with great consignments, which in turn was rewarded with a good trade.

Day three started another wonderful breakfast before we headed off in the direction of Hexham, to G G Baynes & Son and their Marleycote herd. David Baynes gave us a brief insight to Marleycote Walls before we headed out to view the herd. On the way out it was a thrill to view the robotic milking units in action in an ideal unit of cow comfort and facilities. Ayrshires and Shorthorns are milked at Marleycote, under Richard's management, with an aim for cows to last seven to eight lactations, and to average 8,000 litres with minimal health problems. Early indications would suggest that they are well on their way to achieve those goals. It's always a pleasure to meet up with Morwick Fawn 3 EX 94 7E LP 80 1 Star. Due to calf any day with her tenth, Fawn was looking in superb form, and it is also evident that Fawn is breeding her great traits through her four milking daughters. Another cow well worth stopping to view was the homebred Marleycote Annette EX 94 4E, sired by the homebred sire Marleycote Winton Robbie. We were also able to view the reserve breed champion at the 2014 UK Dairy Expo, Marleycote Brown Nell 20 VG 87. Many also had a look around the family's on farm processing unit with a tour from Paul Baynes. We were then treated to a lovely hog roast and refreshments before boarding the bus for the journey to Middle Farm. The sunshine was still out to greet us at Middle where we also met up with the ladies, who were now full of knowledge following embroidery and jewellery demonstrations. We went straight out to the field to view the Whiteford Red and Whites and Middle Ayrshires, a herd built from blended genetics to suit the cow that the Whiteford family strive to breed, by using mainly stock bulls from leading cow families. Some great examples of the breeding at Middle were on view, with families such

as Mollie, Tripova, Mitzy Emerald and of course the well-known Jessie family. So many cows to view, and I am sure many were missed on the walk around, but again here we had cows built to last, with good udder conformation. Willie had arranged a little competition to identify the best heifer and best cow in the field, which was duly won by Peter Berresford. Delegates then gathered in the beautiful surroundings of Ann's garden for a little refreshment, and entertainment organised by Willie, Cumbrian wrestling! A demonstration followed, which was very interesting, with much support from the crowd. Then the office manager, Claire, was thrown to the centre of the ring with Wilma Benson to wrestle each other to the ground. A two nil victory for Claire! (I would suggest that in the future all invoices from Claire should be paid on time!) Then the battle of the titans - David Sanderson and Andrew Broadly - resulting in a lot of laughter and testosterone with Andrew being crowned the winner.

Back at the hotel we were all to change in time for boarding the coaches, as the evening reception at the Garden at Eden was a short bus journey away. What a treat to be hosted in such fine surroundings. Keenan very kindly sponsored a drinks reception, followed by a fantastic dinner. Our guest speaker, Lord Plumb (an ACS Honorary President) gave an entertaining after dinner speech, which was followed by a Cellidh band which proved very popular; it was a great night, with many antics on the bus journey back to Wetheral in the early hours. 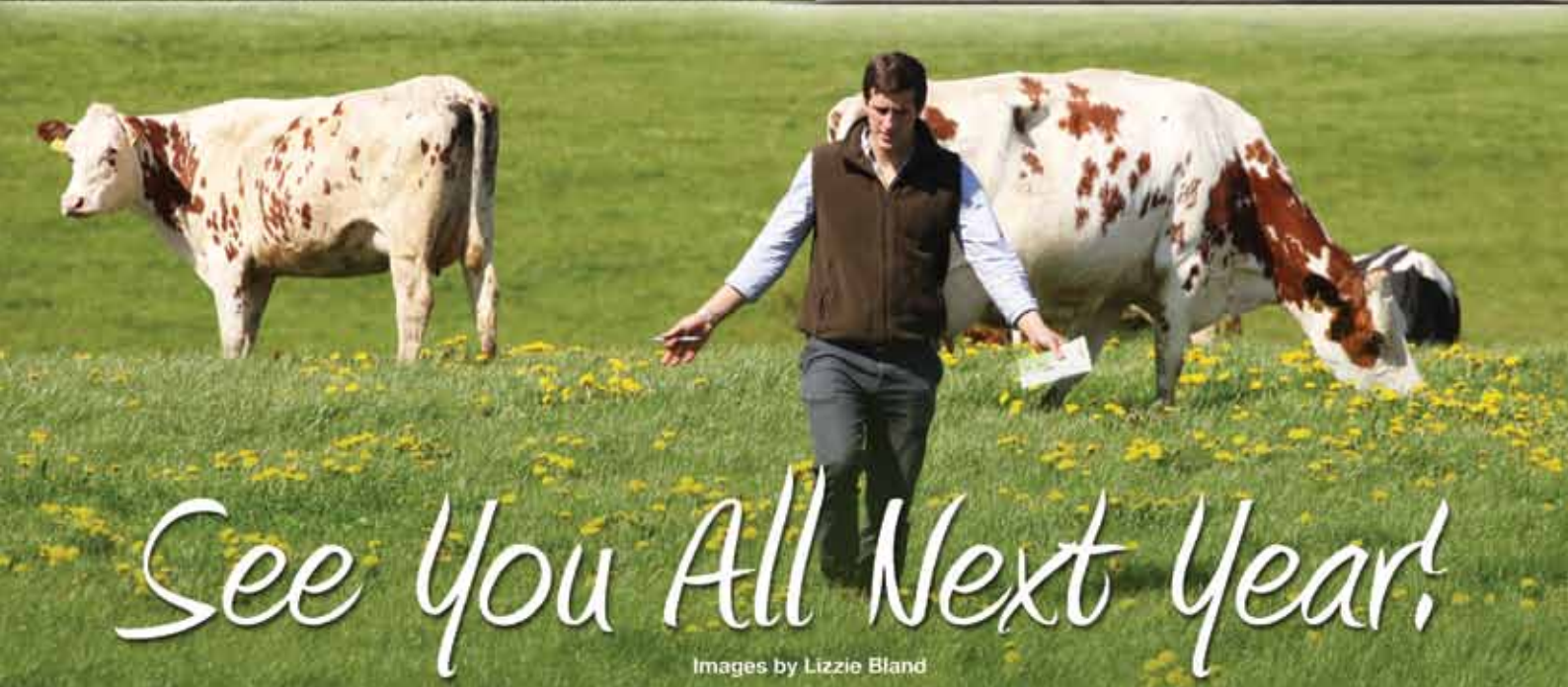
First up were the consignments of semen put forward by Cattle Services. Top price in this section was for ten straws of the great Cuthill Towers Autumn Gold. The newly appointed Junior Vice President, Philip Williams, paid £65 per unit to use in his Willhome herd, where so many great cows of this sire already reside. Next top price was £60 per unit for the Canadian sire Bonnie Brae Heligo, Blaise Tomlinson secured this package for use in his Sandyford herd. Rodney Armstrong from Plaskett Lands purchased ten units of Round Bush Commander for £42, Paul Jenkins (Jendale) paid £40 each for Brocklehill Border Scot and President Robert Adams purchased Ryecroft Rajah for £34 per unit.

Again this year's embryo sale was full of quality with some superb packages put forward. Leading the way with the top price was Pam Coryn and John Pollard's package of Pam Ayrs Dream Hawaii EX95 3E x Haresfoot Panache, which sold at £640 per embryo as a joint purchase by Peter Berresford for his Heydale herd and Stuart Baxter for his Erne herd in Northern Ireland. Gilmour Lawrie, Brierside, paid the next top price of £540 each for the Rosehill Real Black Magenta VG88 x Kamouraska Rockstar package consigned by Colin Christophers. Robert Adams was again successful in his bidding, securing the package from

Chris and Lisa Window for £480 each, for his Bigginvale herd, which was out of Hunnington Fragrance 50 EX91 2E and sired by Hunnington Mandella. The consignment from South African JD Marais for Heydale Dream Bronara x Whitecroft Furtado sold to Sweden for £420 each, to breeders Klaus and Anja Johansen who are now regular and very welcome visitors to our conferences, and for the same price John Adamson, Swaites, purchased the Haresfoot Napier Punch EX94 2E x Nexus Dreamer package from Geraint Thomas.

Three live heifers were offered for sale this year. The first two forward did not meet their reserves, which were sensible realistic reserves, and it would have been wrong to let good animals sell for less than their real value. However the final lot, put forward from Blaise Tomlinson, which was a choice from three ET daughters sired by Palmyra Tri Star Reality out of the EX95 6E Middle Punchs Emerald Blend, saw bidding from all directions which ended in a purchase by the Celtic Dreams Partnership of James Lawrie and Stuart Williams for £4800. Many thanks to all of those breeders who consigned some of the UK's top genetics for this sale and we wish all of the purchasers much luck with their investments.

# An Interview With Robert Adams

**Duncan Hunter recently met up with the Society President, Robert Adams, to find out more about Robert, his farm and, of course, his Ayrshire cows.**

**DH - Robert, tell us a little bit about yourself and your family.**

**RA** - Well, first I shall introduce my family. Many of you will already know my wife Jennifer who is a partner in the business at Shirley Park Farm. I have six children. My eldest is Victoria who has a suckler and sheep farm in Wales. Then there is Christopher who farms near Stoke on Trent with his wife Andrea and runs the Tessvale herd of Ayrshires. At home are my other four children, Joanna, Andrew and Richard are all partners at Shirley Park Farm, and our youngest daughter, Nicola, is a vets nurse and also has her own cattle and sheep. We also have another farm called Town End Farm, situated at Alstonefield. Here in partnership with Joanna, Andrew and Richard we run a herd of Belted Galloways and this is run as a totally separate business from Shirley Park Farm.

**DH - Maybe you can tell us a little about both farms.**

**RA** - At Town End Farm, where we have the Belted Galloways and sheep, there is approximately 270 acres of mainly hill land where 30 Belted Galloway cows and young stock are farmed, along with a large number of sheep. Of these surplus heifers are sold and all of the rest are done as boxed beef and sheep. The farm is totally organic. At Shirley Park Farm there are about 490 acres and again is totally organic. The location is near the village of Rodsley, near Ashbourne in Derbyshire, where 130 milking Ayrshires along with all young stock are reared on farm including all males who are finished on the farm.

**DH - Your herd of Ayrshires carries the Bigginvale prefix. Where did the prefix come from?**

**RA** - It was where my father Ben Adams originated from, a place called Biggin near Ashbourne. My father milked Dairy Shorthorns and British Friesians whilst at Biggin. In 1950 Ayrshires were introduced, from purchases at Castle Douglas and Annan, when the move to Shirley Park Farm took place.

**DH - You are known for your passion of the Ayrshire cow. What gives you that passion?**

**RA** - Well really it is the life style that they have given me. The profitability that the breed has given us, along with hard work, has allowed me to achieve so much and all because of the Ayrshire breed. Simple but effective has always been my motto!

**DH - Which of the families at Bigginvale is your favourite?**

**RA** - It has to be the Marvellous family which are now owned by Joanna, also the Cherryshine family will be the most reliable and consistent profitable animals, and then the Butterpuffs who always have great conformation, and many of these have been shown over the years.

**DH - You have been a big supporter of both local and national shows over the years. Which cows have been your biggest success in the show ring?**

**RA** - In the early 70s we had a Pant Simon daughter, Bigginvale Peg, who won five Interb. Championships in her time. Then of course in the late 80s we had Bigginvale Brown Girl who won the Interb. Championship at the Dairy Event at Stoneleigh. That was a real highlight for me.

**DH - Over the years many sires have been used from both AI and stock bulls. Which have made the most impact from both the past to present?**

**RA** - There have been several. Going back I have to say Pant Simon, along with Bonnie Brae Heligo, had a huge influence within our herd. Stock bulls from that era were two bulls from the Killoch herd, Power Drill and Propeller, and we had great success with both. Our home bred bull Bigginvale Marvellous, who was a Monteith Star Jewel son out of our Marvellous family, left us with the sort of cattle I like to breed. Recent AI sires have to be Ardmore Crown Napier and East Church Ambition as they have bred daughters that suit our system well. Our aim is to breed medium sized cattle to have the availability to sell our surplus heifers. Twenty are sold each year to a regular customer base.

**DH - From what I hear, Robert, since taking on your presidency in May of this year you have already travelled many miles around the country. Where have you been so far?**

**RA** - Goodness, let's see. In Scotland I have visited Edinburgh, Campbeltown, Dumfries and Stranraer; I have been over to Ireland to the Balmoral show; South Wales, Yorkshire, the Midlands, Devon and Cornwall... I may have forgotten somewhere but this should give you a general idea. When I am in an area I do my best to visit as many breeders' farms as possible and this is the highlight for me.

**DH - During your presidency year what most would you like to achieve?**

**RA** - To do what I can to develop the breed further. By supporting the development that our Breed Heritage committee has made and will continue to do so, and to support and encourage our youth where I can - I am very passionate about that!

**DH - Do you have any spare time Robert? If so what do you like to do?**

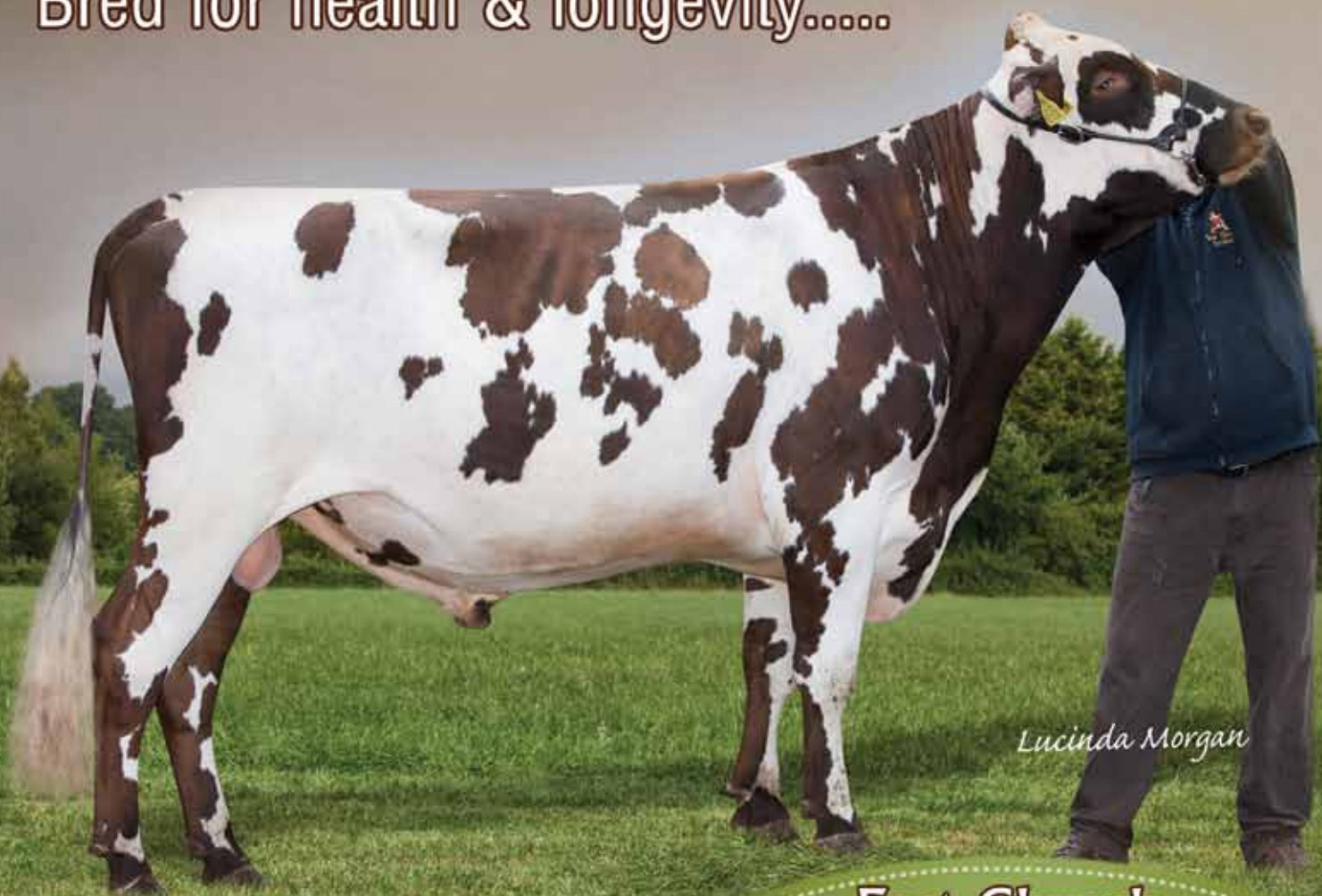

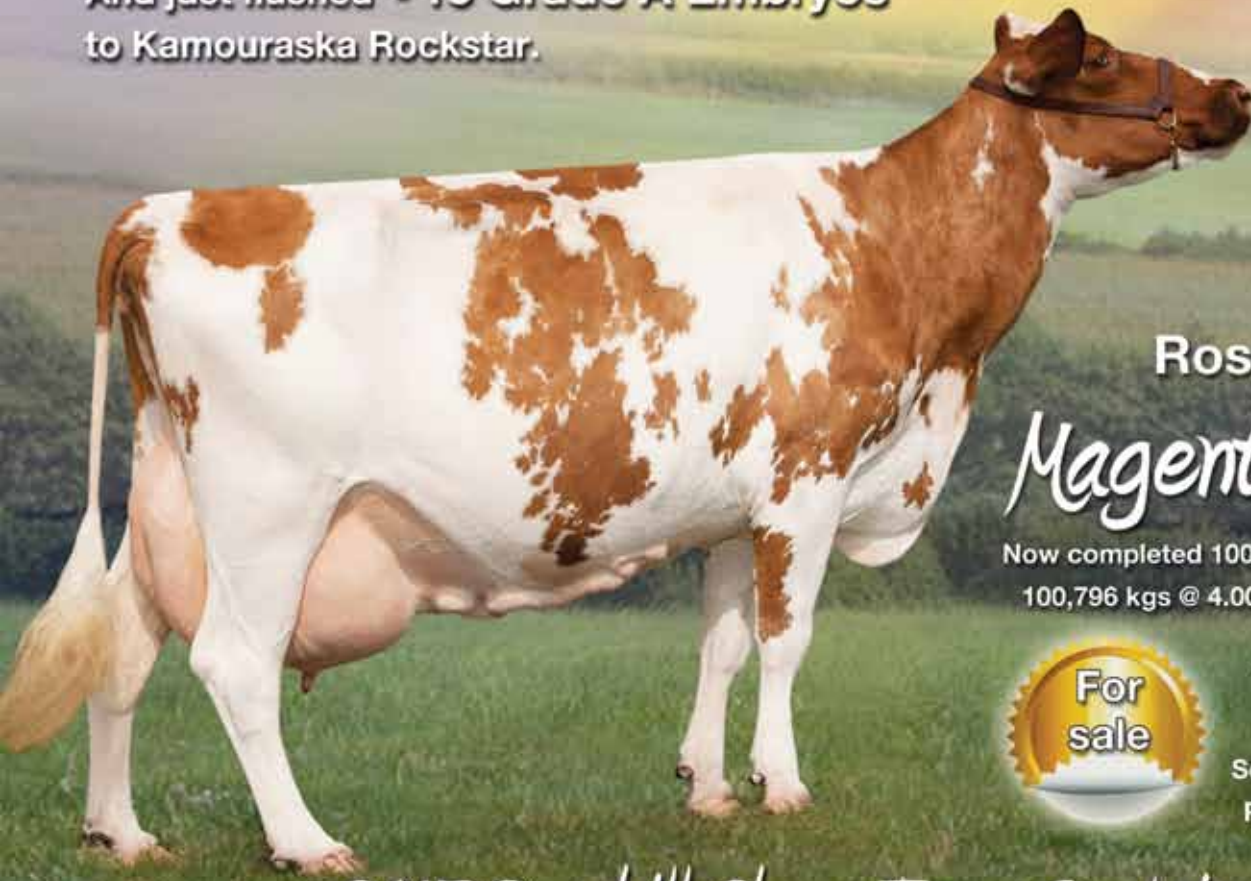

# Hugh Stevenson

I am conscious most of you who read this will never have had the chance to meet my brother, and that Hugh Stevenson is just a name on a trophy.

Hugh was 18 when he was killed in May 1997 in a road accident that saw all three other occupants of the car walk away with minor injuries. Not a day goes passed even now that we all don't think of him. What would he be doing if he were still alive? Would he have married and have a family? Would he still be farming? Or would he have realised his dream to become a professional footballer? Of course no one knows the answer, but one thing we do know is that he would be loved and respected by all that knew him, and the world is poorer without him.

It's hard to believe that he has now been dead as long as he was alive. Those who knew him, loved him. In fact I can honestly say I don't think there was anyone who disliked him. He was just that kind of guy.

Hugh was someone that was well liked by all generations. No matter how good he was at something, he always insisted he needed to improve. He often talked to those much older than him, to soak up their knowledge and get any little piece of information that would give him the edge. He had a real thirst for knowledge and a respect for those more experienced than him. He was a real team player, recognising everyone could contribute something, and always seemed to get the best out of people. Even as a young boy he would always go and speak to those who were by themselves, making a friend and ensuring no one was left out.

The commitment Hugh had was unsurpassable. Whether it was clipping cows and preparing them for the show ring, helping to run the farm and look after the herd, or on the football pitch, he spent many hours of his own time just making sure he was as well prepared and as good as he could be. He would set up his own training schedules, ensuring he kept fitter than everyone else. He would wash cows down just once more and would ensure they had the very best of care at all times, not just in the run up to the shows. His passion for life, and for being the best that he could be in all that he did was clear for everyone to see.

Hugh didn't always have the best of everything, and was always encouraged to do things for himself, but he always made the most of what he had. He was never scared to take on challenges, seeing this as a chance to learn, rather than the likelihood of defeat.

Whilst Hugh was competitive, this was never at the expense of friendship or enjoyment. He was really dedicated to everything he did. Nothing was ever just a phase for him. Once he decided to do something he gave it 100% and saw it through to the end.

His love for animals of all shapes and sizes was clear from a young age. I think the animals just knew they could trust him, and he always seemed to build a rapport with each animal, and treated each one as an individual. Ayrshire cows were a passion of his, and although he grew up in a time where Ayrshire cows weren't "sexy" and the Holsteins were the "in thing" he didn't succumb to peer pressure, and his dedication shone through. His determination kicked in to prove people wrong, and show the critics that Ayrshire cows could be just as "modern" as Holsteins and were worthy of their place. I wonder what he would make of today's Ayrshire cow.

The trophy was presented by my Mum and Dad and the competition set up in his memory as a way of keeping the spirit of Hugh and everything he stood for alive - the drive to always improve, the absolute dedication to whatever he turned his hand to, the 100% he gave everything, the love of Ayrshire cows, the comradery with people of all ages, and above all his love for life and having fun. It is great to hear the competition is hotly contested and going strong. It is also great to hear of the funny stories from the social side of it, the comradery, and the friendships, which is what I will always remember my brother for most of all. Hugh was an inspiration to all who met him and I hope that although you did not meet him, you are now inspired too. Be the best that you can be, don't be scared to try new things, never give up, and do everything with a smile on your face. You just never know what is round the corner or what is planned for you in this life, so enjoy every moment.

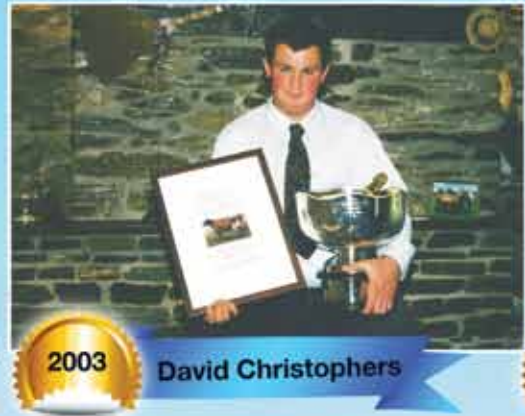

Now Hugh was lucky because at this time Murray also had some Holsteins that were doing extremely well – i.e. Shalama Inspiration Kimo, Champion Heifer at the National Holstein Show 1993- but Hugh's heart truly lay with the Ayrshires and it was around this time that toplining and body clipping arrived!

Anyway, show day came and went with the usual drama, but Hugh and I focused on the next day as that was the Presentation Class (showmanship) and stockjudging day. So first up was the Presentation Class, and I was in the seniors first. Now my old pal Salvador, Glencairn Ayrshires (Timbrell calls him Pedro if that rings any bells) said he would give me my tie a Windsor knot which would bring me luck, and Hugh said if that's true he wanted one as well and we duly won the Seniors and Juniors respectively and Hugh, bless him, insisted it was all down to Salvy's Windsor knots.

Let me say this, I am trying to give you all my insight to the commitment, dedication, humour and fire that this young man had in his belly which made him the lovable young man he was. I do hope at this point that all Ayrshire Young Breeders realise it is an honour to compete in this competition, never mind winning it, and I think it would be appropriate at this time to salute the Stevenson family for creating something so positive from such a tragic loss. # Edward's Cattle Services Update



For any business to be successful “positive thinking” with an “optimistic outlook” while at the same time working within the sphere of financial responsibility has to be at its core. These have certainly figured strongly in both my own and my co-directors’ approach to the management and day to day running of Cattle Services, as I am sure will be the case with the majority of our dairy farming friends and customers within their own business. Unfortunately, the cloud of concern and uncertainty currently hanging over the dairy industry, brought about by the continued reduction in the price farmers are paid for the milk they produce make any optimism for the future difficult to justify. There are though a small percentage of producers receiving a price for their milk much closer to what they require for their business to be sustainable. These in the main are either farming organically, or on special contracts where they are able to meet the stringent requirements demanded by the dairy they supply. Being a semen marketing company, our only source of income is from the semen we sell, this by its very nature is mainly Ayrshire semen to Ayrshire breeders. We also sell some into the wider cross breeding market, plus exports to some countries. However, these are very dependent on health restrictions which can change from time to time. We also supply other A.I. companies both here in the UK and abroad, and also to a small number of private technician operatives.

Contrary to the problems and uncertainty within our industry, I am able to report that semen sales for the first six months of the year being very similar to the same period last year, and have continued in the same vein during July and in to August. Hopefully we can build on this for the rest of the year, which brings me on to two words I used at the beginning of this article – “positive thinking”. 2015 is Cattle Services’ 50th Anniversary. To celebrate this we have decided to introduce different initiatives to reward customers for their business, and hopefully increase sales and improve cash flow. Looking at previous offers, the most popular was without doubt the “one price fits all” offer. In view of this, we have decided to relaunch this from the 1st October for 50 days. Normal semen from any bull currently available from our stud will be priced at £10.00 per straw, including delivery to your tank or technician – the one stipulation being orders have to be for at least twenty straws per bull, with no upper limit, and no restriction on the number of bulls ordered. Sexed semen will be priced at £20 per straw – the same stipulations apply.

Let me now refer to other words I used at the beginning of this article – “optimistic outlook”. I suggest that as long as there is a demand for milk produced in the UK, I believe there are good reasons for optimism. As a breed, our Ayrshires stand up to economic scrutiny as well as, and often better than, other dairy breeds. Cows need to calve to come in to milk, so let us consider the options there are for this to happen – breeding opportunities:

1. By using top quality, widely proven AI sires – this should offer the best guarantee for herd improvement, but because of the cost this may not be suitable for everyone.

2. By using cheaper AI semen – the downside to this is that somewhere in the proofs and pedigrees there will be weaknesses in either type or production, restricting any herd improvement.
3. By using natural service – ok if you have safe handling facilities – otherwise can be very risky.
4. By using beef semen – probably the cheapest short term option with the benefit of increased calf value – in the long term herd replacements could become more scarce, and consequently more costly.
5. By using sexed Ayrshire semen and some beef – on paper the most appealing option – the narrowing of bloodlines and the initial cost of sexed semen does concern some breeders.
6. Using Cattle Services special offers – with this you keep your costs down while using the bull of your choice from the widest selection of proven and young sires available in the UK.

These of course are only a brief summary of different breeding options – many other circumstances have to come in to play when rethinking breeding decisions – size of farm; location; availability of markets; labour and family involvement; etc.

We firmly believe that our “one price fits all” and the quality of our bulls, both proven and young, make for a fantastic opportunity for our breeders and customers. Let us all work together by giving your support to this initiative. Comprehensive details of our bull stud are available on our website, and a new sire brochure should be posted out by mid September, so I do not intend to go in to great detail here. Just a few relevant points – included in our bulls available are the global favourites – “**Napier**”, “**Mandella**” and “**Lord Winston**” – a recent report from Sweden on a newly calved “**Lord Winston**” daughter, the first to calve in Sweden, drew very positive comments from the breeder. I quote: “she has good type, is very calm, a fast milker – only two weeks calved, she is producing more than I expect from my Swedish bred heifers”. – A mention for one of our new young stars – “**Haresfoot Simply Perfek**”, whose first calved daughter in the “Coombe” herd “**Coombe Perfek Peach**” was breed champion at the Royal Cornwall Show, Supreme Dairy Champion at Launceston and first prize junior heifer in-milk at the National Ayrshire Show. “Simply Perfek” daughters look very milky.

The show season will soon be at an end We have stand space booked at the South West Dairy Show; the Welsh Dairy Show; Agriscot and Ulster. If you are able to be at any of these please give us a call – enjoy our hospitality, and catch up with the latest news. All are welcome.

# National Ayrshire

Yet again Ayrshire Breeders came out in large numbers to support the 2015 National Ayrshire Show at the NEC in Birmingham. A superb entry of top quality Ayrshires were paraded in front of our judge, Mr Iwan Thomas from Llanelli, Carmarthenshire.

With 16 heifers forward the class was split into juniors and seniors. First up we saw a great class of juniors showing youth and quality right down the line. In a very close contest Iwan selected **Coombe Perfek Peach**

as his winner, over **Heydale Dream Shelly**, for her overall balance and mammary development. This win was special for the Ayrshire Young breeders who had prepared this heifer for the event. Next up came an equally great class of senior heifers and this time it was the turn of **Sandyford Ristourn Russet VG 85** to take the red ribbon over **Hunnington Sailorgirl 141**. Iwan explained that it was the overall dairyness of Russet, her udder texture and bone quality that gave her

the win. The top two from each of these classes were then paraded before all to determine our junior champion. Four outstanding heifers who showed the outstanding traits of the Ayrshire breed. Iwan wasted no time in tapping out his junior champion **Sandyford Ristourn Russet VG 85** followed by **Hunnington Sailorgirl 141** in Reserve. The junior cows (having all had two calves) then proceeded to enter the ring where Iwan again was visibly impressed with another large entry of great young

cows. A handy winner, as described by Iwan, was **Hunnington Fragy 16 VG 89**, last years Interbreed Heifer Champion at this show, oozing dairy quality from nose to tail with an outstanding mammary. Fragy 16 is sired by the ever impressive Hunnington Mandella and so too was the second placed animal **Haresfoot Mandella Barbara VG 87**, where Judge Iwan Thomas praised her for her superb udder showing great veination and udder texture.





The intermediate cows were again a pure spectacle and a pleasure to witness. Cows in this class all showed great mammary and superb wearability. Winning this class was James Lawrie with **Cuthill Towers Radar Ray 13**, a cow showing great body traits with strength and power with perfect bone quality, a great rump structure and a beautifully balance mammary. Second to her was **Sandyford Buntz Blizzard** who showed tremendous capacity and power throughout.

The senior cows were a tribute to all of their breeders and the breed, showing longevity and wearability. Iwan admitted that yet again it was a very close placing, and ended with **Barr Sandy Rose 56** taking advantage for her extra width and depth through her front end, over **Hunnington Fragy 12** in second.

The class put forward for animals in our Red and White herd book only had the one entrant, **Cuthill Towers Mystic Molly 7**, but what a great young cow she is. The importance of this class for the future for our Red and White breeders will hopefully bring more entries in future.

A new class introduced this year was the Breeder's Group of Three and what a spectacle it was. Again it was the Cuthill Towers team who took the win from the five breeders groups forward. Iwan praised the winning group for their qualities through each animal and described them as a beautifully balanced group.

The championship line up was next on the agenda. With 12 Ayrshires paraded in front of Iwan and the huge crowds the suspense was growing. Iwan described each animal and promoted the breed splendidly. His top six animals were then lined up in the middle of the ring as contenders for his grand champion. There was a huge cheer and round of applause as Iwan approached and tapped out his Grand Champion - **Cuthill Towers Radar Ray 13**, followed by the Reserve **Hunnington Fragy 16** and Honourable Mention **Sandyford Ristourn Russet**.

The Interbreed championships for both the heifers and cows contained super individuals from all breeds. Representing the Ayrshires was heifer champion **Sandyford Ristourn Russet** who won the Reserve supreme

award. In the Interbreed cows our champion **Cuthill Towers Radar Ray 13** also took the Reserve overall spot.

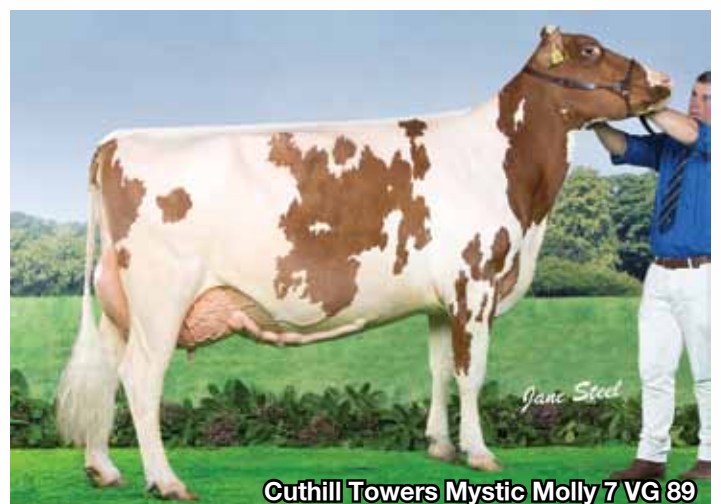

The Reserve Overall Champion was also from the East Church herd, and it was another daughter of East Church Ed out of the Barn Owl family which sold at 1700 gns to Hugh Cotton, Pembrokeshire. Colin Christophers and family sold a consignment of fresh cows and heifers from their noted Rosehill herd which topped at 1680 gns for the third prize heifer **Rosehill Prime Veronique** sired by De La Plaine Prime out of EX 92 dam, and sold to Robert and Anita Cornsuh for their Butterbesley herd. Dry cows topped at 1250 gns for **East Church Admiral Special Rosemary** by Hunnington Admiral due in June from Simon and Rosie Pery-Evans. # A Golden And Breed Changing

Started fifty years ago as an accounting exercise to enable the Society to carry out some clerical services for outside bodies, Cattle Services changed in 1970 to become one of the biggest influences in the Ayrshire breed development, not only in the UK but throughout the World.

The first Ayrshire World Conference was held in Canada in 1969 with a large UK party in attendance, and to say delegates were impressed with the progress Canadian Ayrshires had made in type and yield would have been an understatement. The Canadians had developed type classification, and also the basic contemporary comparison method for yield evaluation, rather than depending on shows and individual high yields to select future breeding sires for proving schemes, and this had given their national yield a huge boost.

The unanimous recommendation on the delegates return was that semen from some of the leading Canadian sires should be imported, and that was the start of Cattle Services in the semen business. Donholm Commander Jack's Choice plus three Selwood sires, New Year, Royal Welcome and Greta's Boy, were the first imports, and history shows what a dramatic effect they had on the breed by not only producing high yielding daughters, but also sons that would go on to be used in natural service, with many being selected for progeny test and coming out with flying colours. One of the many successes for Cattle Services was Wheatrig Lena's Commander who had a huge home use, having 2215 registered progeny, but also gave the company a foot in the lucrative export trade. Lena's Commander's many outstanding sons and daughters have also done great work for the breed, notably Ballyclan First Command and in turn his son **Meikle Laught Triple Crown** and grandson **Ardmore Crown Napier**.

In the late sixties and early seventies the milk marketing boards had a stranglehold on the AI business, but it was a twist of fate that gave Cattle Services a start in the domestic AI business with **Bankend Legacy**,

one of their most outstanding sires. Legacy had been selected for progeny test, but the Scottish MMB proven bull selection panel deemed the progeny conformation not good enough which upset the owners, R Dunlop & Son, Midkeltion, as the production was outstanding, so Cattle Services took him on and history proved it to be a good decision. Progeny of Legacy won the National Dairy Event award for the highest yielding progeny group three times in four years, and better still progeny on many farms earned credits for lifetime production, so for long life and high production conformation was not so bad after all. Legacy recorded 2935 registered daughters and probably even more in commercial herds. Other outstanding CSA sires of the seventies were **Townhead Diadem**, **Halmyre Urr Favourite Lad**, **Pant Simon** and **Pant Shield**, all of whom made a lasting improvement to the breed in both yield and conformation.

Semen and livestock exports also became a feature of CSA in the seventies with many young bulls and heifers to Kenya, and cattle also going to Brazil, the Falkland Islands and Zimbabwe. Semen was also exported to these countries plus Australia, Canada, Czechoslovakia, Germany, India,

Mozambique, New Zealand, Russia and South Africa. Kenya is one of the jewels in the Ayrshire crown, with the breed particularly suitable to the high altitude conditions and high sun factor, with the relationship starting with a visit to Scotland in 1972 by the late Reuben Chesire, the then chairman of the Kenya Ayrshire Cattle Association and later World Federation President. Over the years CSA exported many young bulls to their main AI centre at Lower Kabete, and also bulls and heifers to private breeders. A lot of these exports have had a lasting effect, with many of their present day proven bulls and bull dams going back to Pant, Brocklehill and especially Cuthill Towers prefixes. With Kenya's Ayrshire population now just on the three million mark, it is one of the largest and fastest growing in the world, and nearly all by AI.

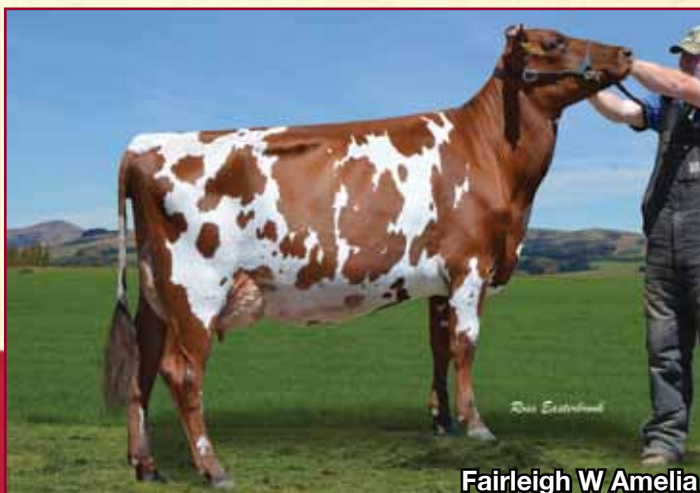
The actions of CSA not only benefited the breed at home and worldwide, they also gave a worthwhile financial return to the Society. Starting from the first imports in 1970 there has been an improving financial return to the Society every year, and as an example in 1978 it was £8,000 and by 1983 it reached £18,900 and today it is in excess of £24,000 per year, but the main criteria remains breed improvement.

One of the largest milestones in the success of CSA was in 1982 when Edward Evans, who had been a classifier with the Society since 1972, took more responsibility for CSA and, with his beautiful wife Margaret, has been responsible for the continued promotion and successful progress to the present day. Always a giver of sincere and true breeding advice Edward has the massive respect of all Ayrshire and Red & White breeders, and has continued to build the business although exporting is tougher than it used to be with all the long lasting health regulations. Under Edward's leadership CSA has been at the helm of the successful progeny testing of the most promising young sires in the last thirty three years, leading to increasing market share and continued exports. Recent major show successes in New Zealand have been sired by **Haresfoot Elegant, Hunnington Admiral, Ardmore Crown Napier**

**(Pukekaraka Crown Lady), Wroughton Lord Winston (Fairleigh W Amelia) and Cuthill Towers Rambo.**

As a measure of progress since CSA imported the first semen from Canada, in 1970 the national Ayrshire production average was 3455 litres and in 2014 was 7043 litres, a huge 103% increase. Certainly not all of this can be credited to CSA as management techniques, nutrition advice and changes to evaluation formulas have all played their part, but all connected to CSA have played a major role to the huge benefit of the International Dairy Breed. In more recent times CSA has been at the helm of marketing some very successful blended sires, notably Brierside Jubilant Scot, and a number of others using Horizon Ranger genetics which have performed so well on the Ayrshire breed. The company is also very forward looking, providing sexed semen from its leading sires and cooperating with other large semen companies to boost exports, CSA is currently supplying semen to Australia, New Zealand, Finland and Sweden with firm enquiries from the US, Canada and all parts of Africa.

Edward Evans and past and present directors have been responsible for the success of CSA, and they, along with the present chairman, Alex Kirkpatrick, can take well deserved credit. After a hugely successful first fifty years Cattle Services can look forward to an even better next fifty years.

**Production:** Three daughters must have a £PLI 50 or above and each daughter with a £PLI 50 or above earns one point.

Each daughter with lifetime production awards earns points as follows: **40,000 kgs earns one point, 60,000kgs earns two points, 80,000kgs earns three points, 100,000kgs earns five points and for every 10,000 kgs over 100,000 kgs gains one extra point.**

Each daughter with an SP (Superior Performer award) earns two points.  
Each son with a PLI of £50--£69 earns one point (minimum rel. 75%).  
Each son with a PLI of £70-£99 earns two points (minimum rel. 75%).
