## Type Classification Service

We have received notification from NBDC of an increase in their pricing structure, effective from 1st March 2018, for the Type Classification Service. These will have been implemented on invoices as from 1st April 2018.

Flat rate fee of £70.00 for visits of 1 - 10 animals

Flat rate fee of £108.00 for visits of 11 - 15 animals

For visits where 16 - 100 animals are inspected - £7.00 per animal

From 101st animal to 150th animal the headage fee will reduce to £3.50 per animal

From 151st animal upwards the headage fee reduces to £2.50 per animal

Single Bull inspected alongside females - £15.90

A Classification special visit (defined as a non-scheduled visit outside the regular cycle agreed for that herd) £210.00 (to include the first 20 inspections)

Special Bull visit £108.00

Cancellation charge of less than 3 days notice will incur a charge of £108.00

For herds using the "Complete" service the TCS element of the monthly subscription fee will rise by 2p per head, for all herd sizes. For example a 100 cow herd, the new monthly TCS fee will be 0.28, 200 cows will be 0.24, etc.

# Jane's Spring Blog



**Hi, I'm Jane Barnes, married to Mark Barnes and, with our children Charlotte & Harry, we farm at Somerby in East Leicestershire. Our 180 cow 'Somerby' Ayrshire herd produces milk for Blue Stilton at Long Clawson Dairy. For the past 15 years or so I've also give talks to groups - "Tales from a Dairy Farmers' Wife" - which is all about my life on our family run farm, telling amusing stories and real life anecdotes.**

Rearing calves is just the same as rearing children!

It was in 2008 that Mark and I decided to buy our first five pedigree Ayrshire cows from the Dudley Wood herd, and what a lot has happened since then. When those first five heifers were the only red and white cattle amongst a herd of black and whites it was clear they had a friendship, how they stuck together when grazing, following each other when coming in to be milked and through the milking parlour! They were the best of pals and I still notice that friendship when our own homebred calved heifers go through the milking parlour today.

When I tell my tales about our herd to audiences, I often find it easier for them to understand by relating how a cow's life is similar to our growing experiences. When they're born, they come into the 'nursery' to be fed and cared for for the first couple of months then, when they're weaned, the group go outside to the big wide world (a field) just as we send our children off to primary school. After the calves reach their first birthday they move on to the next stage of 'growing up', I relate this to the teenage years and puberty, and finally, after flirting with the bull, becoming pregnant for the first time, and so on! It always makes my audience titter with laughter at the similarities.

Talking about our seven bulls always creates hilarity during my talks. The eldest Ayrshire is 'Billy Beaumont' (big and strong after the Leicester rugby player); 'Quaker' (short for Earthquake as his mother is called Seismic!); 'Buster' next years' new boy; 'Desmond' and 'Benjie' who are only six months old. Then there's 'Eric' and 'Ernie' our AA and Limousin beef bulls!

Often I relay this lament in my talks, regarding the choice of using AI or using our stock bulls. Alas, I cannot take credit for this poem. It was sent to me after one of my talks and sadly it does not say who the author is.

## The Disgruntled Cow

Though I've just given birth to a heifer  
Of pride and of milk, I am full  
But I am sad to relate  
That my lactating state  
Was not brought about by a bull!

I have never been naughty, I swear it  
In spite of the calf that just been born  
Like the David Brown Tractor  
I'm Virgo Intacta  
I've not had a bull by the horn!

How dismal the fields & the meadows  
The byre seems gloomy and grey  
For the one bit of fun  
In the year's dreary run  
Has by science been taken away!

If what I've heard is the truth sir  
Unnatural though it may seem  
A cow's female passion  
Is all out of fashion  
And bulling is only a dream!

I know that a farm is a business  
In which we must all pull our weight  
So I'd pull and I'd pull  
For a strongly built bull  
For this phoney arrangement I hate!

It mustn't be thought that I'm jealous  
There are things that a cow shouldn't say  
But these young AI tarts  
Who handle our parts  
Still get it the old fashioned way!

Just before Christmas we celebrated Harry's 21st and, as every parent states, how unbelievably fast those years have passed. So in his 21st year, he is such a lucky lad to have this opportunity; as some of you already know, we are moving out from our village location and rebuilding our new farm on a green field site, to secure & expand our business for the future, so he will be the fourth generation to milk cows on our land, which we are all proud of. Hopefully by the time you're reading this our milking & cubicle sheds will have begun to be erected, and we'll see the new farm emerging out of the ground, on top of a hill. Although it's the same land, the original farm is named Southfields, and this will probably stay with the original farmhouse and cottage in the village. So I've been thinking of a new name for the farm.

The new farmhouse will be built alongside the new farm site in a field which over the generations has always been referred to as Alma Bank. Having asked village elders and family members alike, why this hill was so named, their replies referred to 'The Battle of Alma' which happened during the Crimean War in September 1854. Strange as this may seem the story goes like this: Following a meet of the Cottesmore Hounds, a keen Victorian huntsman and soldier was galloping below this hillside and, looking up towards the sheer face of it, remarked how it reminded him of the hillsides along the River Alma, where the battle took place. And so the legend lives on. We now have a new name 'Alma Bank Farm'. It's now being registered at the local Council as our address and will have a much needed new postcode.

# Breed Manager's Update



**Hopefully we can now look forward to a dry spring and forget the floods, storms and the 'Beast from the East' which graced us during the winter. Feed and straw has been in short supply and costs have been high, but as history shows us Ayrshire breeders are made of tough stuff and will survive and prosper again.**

2017 was a good year for our breed and Society with a rise in membership and registrations on the previous year, and that trend has continued during the first couple of months of 2018. The value of registered animals for TB compensation is currently substantially more than non-registered animals, so I urge you all to make that small investment at the time of birth of your calves to protect yourselves financially should the inevitable happen. Feel free to contact me to help you.

I would like to touch on the subject of Classification. Classifying can help you hugely with your breeding decisions for the future; highly graded animals are proven to have a considerably higher value than non-classified animals. Specific strengths and weaknesses are highlighted allowing improved corrective breeding decisions to be made, and the general standard of conformation to be improved across the herd. Cattle of a better conformation are proven to be more productive, less demanding and longer-living. It is very important that ALL heifers are put forward, as this enables more accurate bull proofs to be produced for you to base your breeding

decisions on for the future. If only the top end of a herd is scored the sires of those poorer animals are not being identified. We also need to be more accurate with our recording of temperament and milking speeds; please inform the classifiers on each animal inspected of the temperament: good, average or poor. Being a small breed if we only record the poor temperament all others are recorded as average, which gives us a false reading of this trait. Tell the classifier of the good-natured animals to help the breed. Help us to help your future.

We recently held a classification workshop with all the classifying team. This is a day where we evaluate the accuracy and consistency of the classifiers on the type scoring of our breed. Many discussions were had on all traits to give them a better understanding of the Ayrshire breed and what we strive to maintain and improve. We have raised the bar a little on the higher scoring heifers to ensure only the very best of the breed take the top end scores, this does not mean the points are not there, just that top scored animals must have the traits the Ayrshire strives to maintain. Older cows were also discussed and again the points will only move up if the traits determine it, otherwise an "E" will be added which highlights the length of time that animal maintained her EX status.

Many thanks to Blaise Tomlinson for hosting this worthwhile day, which we all felt was very constructive and that we have a good understanding of the breed's type traits evaluations.

Any issues regarding classification must be directed to me.

In 2017 a total of 2,415 heifers were inspected:

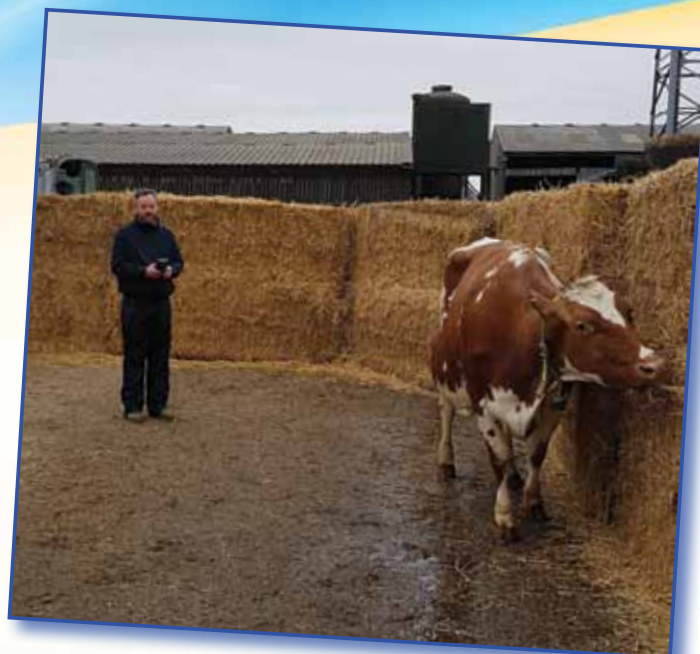
- 419 (17.35%) Scored Very Good
- 1,412 (58.47%) Scored Good Plus
- 462 (19.13%) Scored Good
- 111 (4.60%) Scored Fair
- 11 (0.46%) Scored Poor
- Average 81.35

This year we have a full diary of events where your support will be appreciated. The first being our Breed Open Day on Thursday 26th April at Blannicombe Farm, Honiton, Devon, by kind permission of Mark Evans, home of East Church Ayrshires. Here we hope to promote ourselves to commercial and cross breeders as a serious alternative breed for their breeding programmes. Mark has an Organic herd, so this will hopefully bring those interested in that sector along too. Feel free to come along and support, but please register for your complimentary lunch in plenty of time.

At our recent Council meeting a full discussion was had on the sale of Ayrshires around the country. We will be working with livestock markets around the country to make you aware of where sales of Ayrshires will be, for consignments and for purchases. We also would like to encourage you to use our website facility where you can submit animals you have for sale, you can add as much detail as you wish and even add photographs. <https://www.ayrshirescs.org/ayrshires-cattle-society/breeders-area/cattle-for-sale/submit/> or alternatively contact the office where they will be happy to do this for you. This is where we direct potential purchasers so make sure you promote your animals well.

We have accepted a very special new award for the 2018 National Ayrshire show, to be held at UK Dairy Day on Wednesday 12th September. The Chris Window Memorial Trophy will be presented to the Premier Exhibitor at the show. As you know Chris was a huge supporter of showing Ayrshires and exhibited a large team of cows at every show he attended, to promote his herd and the breed to the fore. We thank the Window family for this prestigious award and look forward to finding out who will win the Chris Window Memorial Trophy for the first time.

A Breed Heritage meeting was held in February, where we had a full and thorough evaluation of all animals on the watch list, and we are very excited about the future of our breed with the families we are working with and the animals we are monitoring around the country. We already have young bulls being born from our matings which have been picked up by Cattle Services for future testing. The females born are continually added to the watch list to work with in the future. We have drawn up a list of sires to use on matings for this current year and have included three older sires which still carry a lot of weight for today's breeding values.



We will carry out several female genomic tests during 2018 for us to evaluate the information we can gain and to start the ball rolling on adding to our genomic base. I apologise for the slow progression of implementing a service for you to test your own animals. I am constantly chasing the providers of the service which has so far been painful. I think we are nearly there and details will be with you very soon.

As a reminder, the Breed Heritage committee are Alan Timbrell (Chairman), Duncan Hunter (Manager), Michael Broadley, Geraint Thomas, Robin Templeton and Peter Drummond. Feel free to contact any of us with updates on your animals already on the watch list and any families you feel we should consider.

#### Our aims

- Highlight the best families the UK has to offer.
- Work with those families and enhance their main attributes for the breed.
- Accurately record all progeny for future use.
- Improve health traits in the Ayrshire Breed.
- Improve fertility in the Ayrshire Breed.
- Genomic test females.
- Enhance and protect the Ayrshire Breed for the future.

# Sam's News

Spring 2018 can't come fast enough, this winter seems to be dragging along at a very slow rate. On the plus side for Cattle Services sales are strong and interest in UK genetics continues to be very good. Already in 2018 we have had exports go to Sweden and Australia with others in progress. Within the UK, sales remain very strong with a big range of different sires selling. It has been great to see our sires performing well on the international stage, daughters of Hunnington Famous, Rosehill Real McCoy and Sandyford Triclo have all enjoyed success at shows in the southern hemisphere. At home great reports continue to be received for progeny of Cattle Services sires, in particular daughters of Gwynnog Primetime and Troutbeck Skyfall are calving in very well.



We have around six meetings a year, also present at the meetings are Johnnie Templeton, Claire Kimm, Duncan Hunter, the President, Philip Williams, and Vice President, Keith Davidson. All decisions that are made in the running of Cattle Services are very much a group decision.

Continuing the theme of focusing on bulls to suit a certain trait in this issue we will look at Production. At milking time there is no better sight than seeing cows fill up the jars or give a big yield on the milk meters. With the added pressure on margins now, everybody needs cows that can milk high yields and look good doing it. In the spring issue I have focused on three sires that can help you breed cows that will milk well. To understand the milk kg trait a bull with a rating of 200kg should produce daughters that give 200kg more milk in their first lactation than a sire with a rating of 0kg.

The top Ayrshire sires available from Cattle Services are as follows:-

#### Rosehill Real McCoy – 100%

Palmyra Tri Star Reality x EX93 Rosehill Blackthorn x EX94 Cuthill Towers Sir Adam x EX90 Lord Ontario  
The Number One Ayrshire sire for Production, his daughters are consistently above herd averages for production.

#### Caldervale Realisation – 75%

Palmyra Tri-Star Reality x EX95 Horizon Ranger Red x EX91 Bankend Lord Ontario  
Realisation combines great production with superb type, he also excels for fertility index and overall PLI.

#### Rosehill Vitality – 100%

Palmyra Tri-Star Reality x EX96 Rosehill Blackthorn x GP84 Bankend Nucleus x VG88 Wheatrig Lena's Commander  
As well as breeding great production, Vitality also sires cattle that win at major shows across the country, he is available in sexed semen.

For the blended Ayrshire bloodlines the following two bulls excel in production, Muirston Top Brass has a rating of 1181 kg for milk, he is a son of Tulip from a Horizon Ranger Red dam. The second is West Mossgiel Aramis, a Horizon Ranger Red son of an Indianhead Red Marker dam, he has a production prediction of 836kg.

By the time that you read this the four new future sires Brieryside Magic, Cuthill Towers Buster, Willhome Pams Horizon and Whitecroft Nectar will all be available. These sires all come from great cow families. It is interesting to note that the four dams of these bulls average an impressive 93 points. Looking forward this year two new sires are being lined up to enter stud, it is also hoped that they will have sexed semen available. Genomic testing is also in full swing with a number of very impressive young sires being tested which include a West Mossgiel Modern Reality x EX93 Des Prairies Potter, Hilltown Oblique x EX94 Kellcrest Ice Man, Hilltown Oblique x EX92 Palmyra Tri-Star Burdette and a Gunnarstorp x EX92 Ayr-Phoe Ideostar. Although these sires will still be under 50% reliable I do feel that it is a very important exercise for us to take as a Breed, in time the reliability will increase which will give us all more faith in using young sires with genomic proofs.

To keep everybody up to date with Cattle Services activities, Alex Kirkpatrick stepped down as Chairman in December and Arthur Lawrie has now taken on this role. Alongside Arthur the other directors are Blaise Tomlinson, James Brown, John Watson and Michael Broadley.

# Mark Evans, Blannicombe Farm, Honiton East Church Organic Ayrshires

## ‘A niche market for organic Ayrshire milk’



**TWENTY years ago Mark Evans sold the family farm at Hittisleigh, Devon, and took on the tenancy of 243ha (600-acre) Blannicombe Farm just outside Honiton in East Devon on the Combe Estate.**

In 2001, following two years of conversion with Milk Link, Mark Evans established a 250-cow organic herd, with 220 followers, producing 1.3m litres a year. Alongside the Duchy Home Farm at Highgrove these two herds supply Waitrose with all its organic Ayrshire milk.

“At the time I think many people thought I was quite mad to sell bricks and mortar to go and rent a farm,” said Mr Evans. “But I like a challenge; I could see there was an obvious opportunity in this niche market but a much bigger farm was required to achieve my objectives. To survive in the ever-changing world of dairying our small family farm would have struggled. It was only after moving we decided to convert to organic.”

Last year East Church Ayrshires won both the South West Ayrshire and Devon Herd competitions. This is the 70th anniversary of his family establishing the herd. At the time of the move, in order to increase herd size, cows were bought in from the Bigginvale herd in Derbyshire as well as herds in the south west.

Cows calve year round and are divided into high and low yielding groups with cows occasionally changing groups as yields alter during lactation. Mark, however, is reluctant to move too many around so that the social structure of the two herds remains stable and settled.

Milk yields may have dropped 1000 litres/cow since the move to Blannicombe but cows are achieving more of this production off grass.

Being organic both grazing and cutting ground at Blannicombe Farm, as well as the 61ha (150-acres) rented off the Clinton Estate at Beare, receive no artificial fertiliser or sprays. Fortunately Mr Evans and his three full-time staff are able to spread dung year round on this blue-marl clay ground, then, in preparation for silaging, the ground is harrowed and rolled.

First cut 130ha (320-acres) is made at the end of May, second early July 113ha (280-acres) and third early September 81ha (200-acres). Genus Power Start additive is used depending on conditions.

“As a general rule of thumb, cows do not graze cutting ground. The objective is to look after the permanent pasture so we tend not to reseed. The aim is 30% white clover in the pasture so we do stitch in grass seed mix when needed,” explained Mr Evans. “Cows graze extensively with high yielders offered the better ground, with the low yielders and young stock graze steeper ground; the Ayrshire is well suited to those conditions.”

It is a long winter with cows housed from October 1st to mid-April. Cubicles are bedded with sawdust. Young stock, bulls, dry cows and older cows (the breed is renowned for its longevity) are loose housed on straw.

Milkers are each fed 45kg a day of a mixed ration. It comprises 38kg silage, 3kg 21% protein meal from Mole Valley Farmers at £400/t and 5kg organic fodder beet. This converts to an average milk yield of 6000 litres a year at 4.35% butterfat and 3.45% protein. Cows are milked in an 18/18 herringbone parlour twice a day, with milk sold to Coombe Farm Milk Supply Group based near Crewkerne in Somerset. On average there is a 10p/litre premium over non-organic milk contracts.

Young stock are offered ad lib good quality hay and 2kg/day of an 18% protein meal. Calves are fed twice a day a total of five litres organic whole milk for 12 weeks. At weaning they are offered the 18% protein meal ad lib – as well as good quality hay which they have access to from birth.

There are 36 female breeding lines in the herd. “Having so many cow families gives masses of scope for breeding our own bulls to use in the herd alongside using top bulls from this country and Canada,” explained Mr Evans.

There are currently four stock bulls on the farm. East Church Patrolman, by Jellica Oblique, is in demand across the British Isles - as well as Sweden and Northern Ireland. His son East Church Roscoe is also used -



as is another home-bred - Heathcliffe (by Whitecroft Furtado) and a bought-in bull, Rosehill Pendennis, bred in Cornwall by Colin Christophers.

Heifers calve between 24 and 30 months old and bulling is detected using oestrus strips. If cows aren't served naturally Mr Evans does all the AI work in association with Cattle Services (AYR) and Semex. Milk production, conformation and longevity are key traits bred for.

Vet Tony Kemmish, from the St Boniface Veterinary Practice, visits every week for a herd health check. The herd suffers from iodine deficiency so all cows receive a mineral bolus when dried off two months prior to their due date.

"We have had real problems with fertility," said Mr Evans. "The calving index isn't wonderful at just over 420 days: We have problems sourcing good quality energy so cows weren't holding to service: Tony found egg quality was poor."

"He concluded cows were short of energy three to four weeks post calving in particular and so, in November, we decided to introduce fodder beet which has a very high energy content (21MJ/kg dry matter). We have made tremendous gains in just the two months we have been feeding it and we are planning to either grow it ourselves or under contract with another organic farmer.

"I will go to great lengths to get any animal back in calf – even if it takes me several months: They are worth far too much just to give up and barren out," said Mr Evans. "I believe many animals in other herds are culled needlessly. If every cost was taken into consideration – from rearing the heifer calf to getting her into the herd – she costs out at £1400 which is a lot of money. And I believe in persevering because Ayrshires give so many trouble-free lactations."

The herd was shut down last year with TB but a test at Christmas was clear. As a result East Church Ayrshires will be back on the showing circuit in 2018 with the Burke Trophy at Devon County high on the bucket list. This is a realistic dream as Mr Evan's cows have been awarded supreme dairy champion at Devon County and Royal Cornwall in the past.

In fact, this herd is in much demand from other breeders as much due to its genetics as its success in the show ring. Mr Evans sells 40 animals of varying ages each year at the Ayrshire Sale at Exeter Market. An open day, organised by the breed society, on April 26th this spring will be an ideal shop window for anyone interested in making a purchase the following month.

"The Ayrshire, in my opinion, is the ideal dairy cow. She is bred to milk, is clean boned, has excellent figures for mastitis, is good on her feet and legs so walks well and has great longevity. It is quite normal to have cows in their 12th lactation giving as much milk as their younger peers", said Mr Evans.

"Ayrshires are much smaller than Holsteins so are really suited to the organic system - a Holstein would not survive here. These cows have very large rumens so are excellent at converting forage to milk. But the farm is poor; it might be beautiful but is not without problems. It is steep, the soil is quite poor and drainage not great so our yield from forage isn't brilliant – somewhere in the region of 2000litres/year/ha.

"I will never make a fortune but I love what I do and where I live selling organic milk and pedigree stock. The latter is key to our survival and any cows and heifers which leave here to go into another herd are guaranteed to go on and perform well."

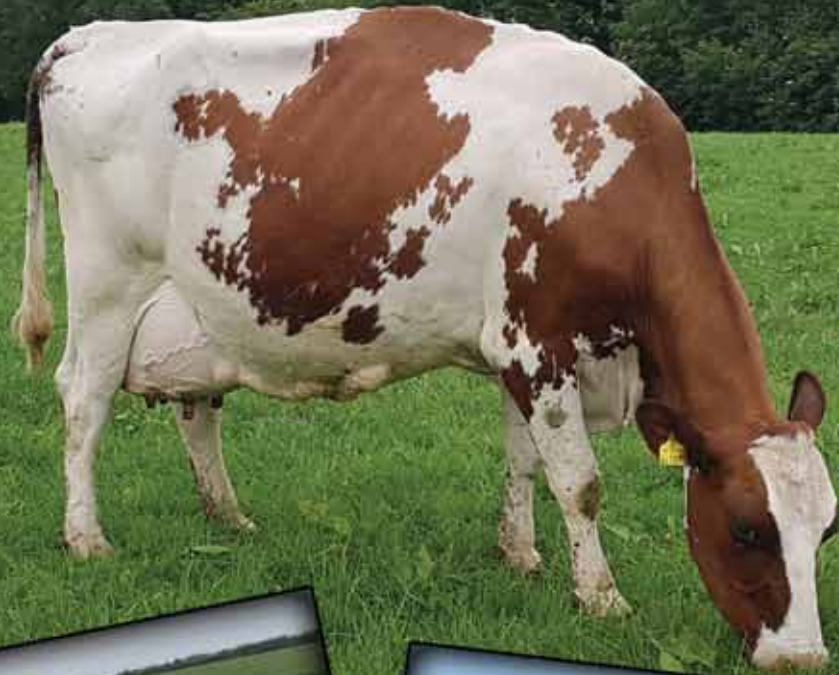

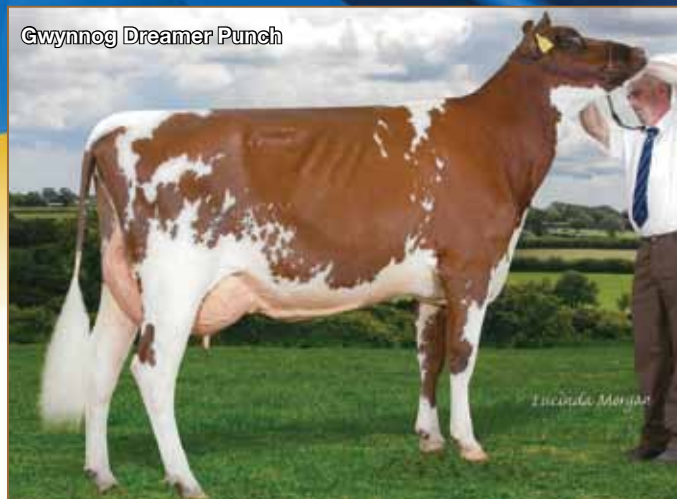

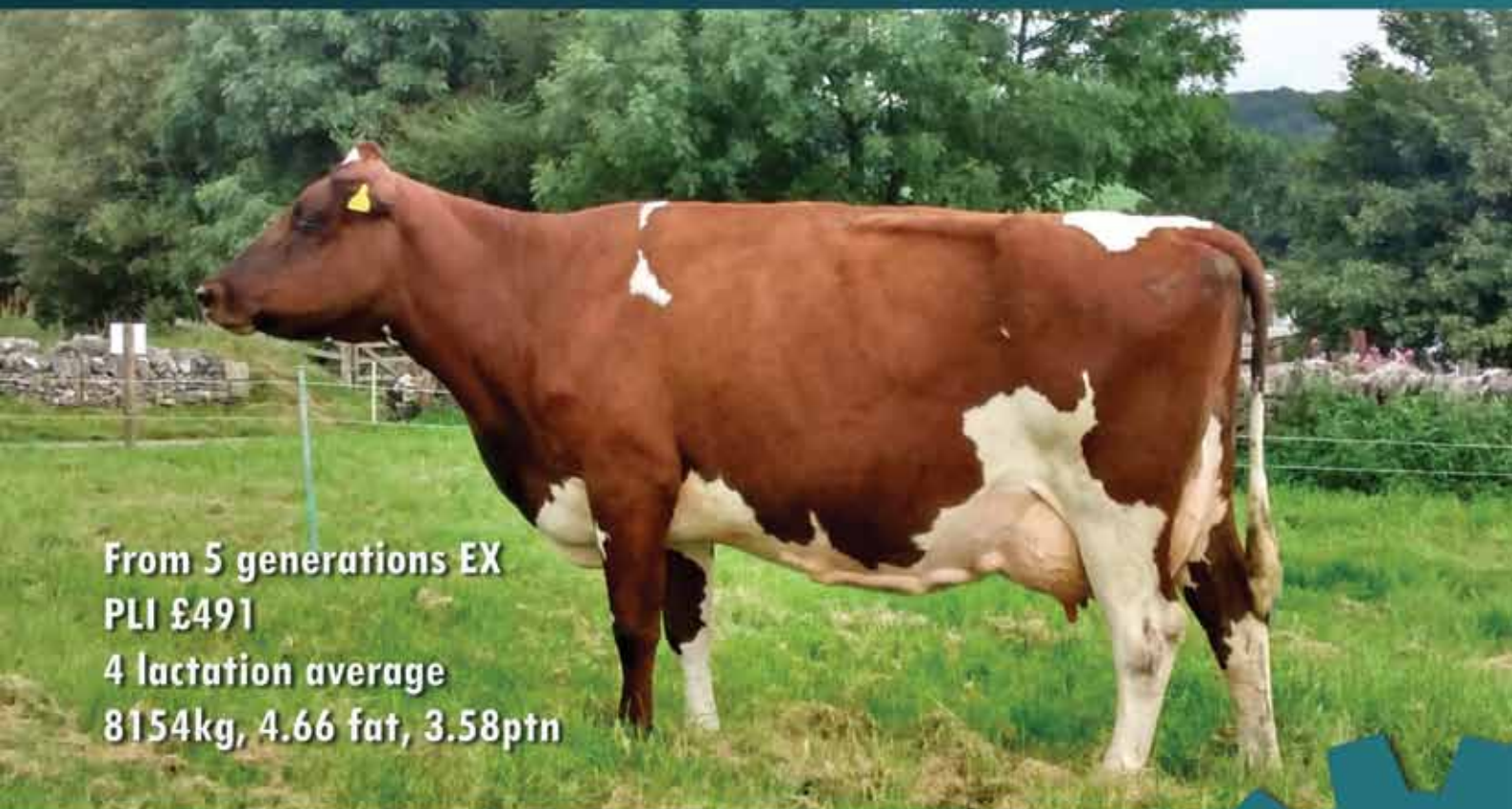

## 2018 Conference Visits

**It has been a great privilege for Philip to hold the role of President for 2017-18; on Wednesday 16th May the Williams family of the Willhome herd looks forward to extend a Welsh warm welcome to all the delegates of the Ayrshire Cattle Society Conference, to join them for a memorable. 'Willhome Wednesday'.**

The farm is now into its fourth Williams generation but it was in 1991 that Philip and Sharon purchased the farm - consisting of 125 acres - and in 1996 bought a further farm of 85 acres. The family rent a further 70 acres to run their youngstock. In 1984 the small herd of Holstein Friesians were graded up and it was in 1999 Willhome Ayrshires was founded. The current herd is 180 milkers and 120 followers (50:50 split). Our breeding aim has always been to create a 'profitable and functional cow with a bit of extra style'.

The cows are split into highs and lows all year round. In the winter they are all fed a basic ration of grass silage and cereal based blend, topped up in the parlour according to the yield, this continues during the summer evenings for the highs who are grazing during the day, while the lows are out grazing throughout the summer. Milk is sold to Glanbia Cheese Ltd.

1999 saw the purchase of our first Ayrshire as Stuart was interested in showing and we didn't have the extreme Holstein cow to compete in the show ring, so we opted for a different breed that suited our system. Within just a few years Ayrshire numbers increased to 50 milkers and followers and currently run at 90 cows and followers. Initially, we purchased many families from Knutsford and Parcgywn herds and more recently the entire Pam Ayr herd. Over the years we have tried to purchase individuals from families that take our fancy. From our current herd mix we have kept our sire use to a limited number to build up uniformity amongst the herd. Sires that we hold in high regard and will

appear in many sire stacks are Cuthill Towers Autumn Gold, McCornick Nelson and Legace Ristourn. Current sires in the flask include Willhome Challenger, Hunnington Famous, Hilltown Oblique and Cuthill Towers Majestic alongside our own stock bull Willhome Pams Horizon. We are also very excited to see our youngstock join the milking herd with a large number sired by Cuthill Towers Barney Rubble Ex95, and his first crop of daughters have calved well and all his stock certainly have a stamp!



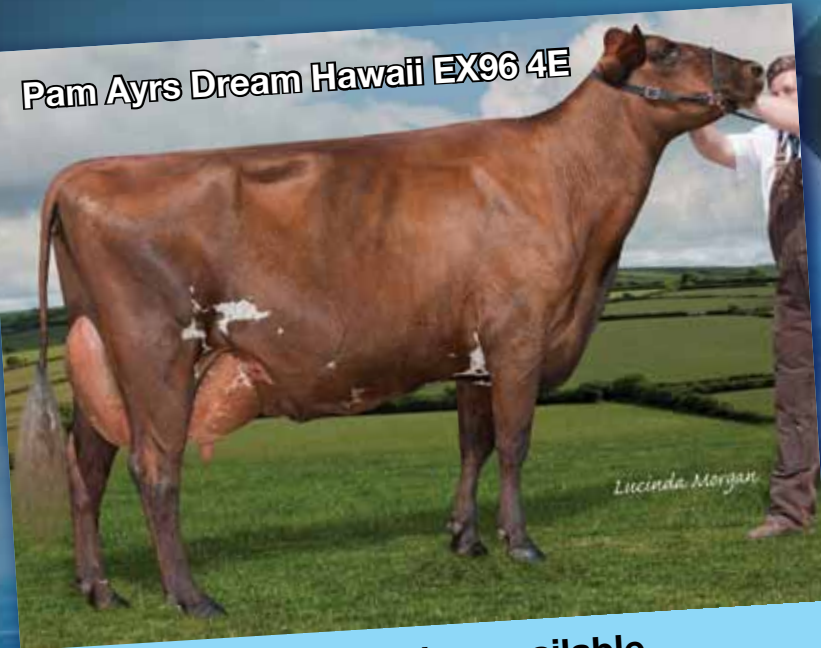

## 2018 Conference Visits

The Reed family of Phillip, Lorenza, Steffan, Rebecca, and Shaun are delighted to welcome delegates to the 2018 Ayrshire Conference on Tuesday 15th May to view their Rhos herd of 400 Ayrshire cows.

The farm is 164 acres with approximately 450 acres rented. The herd was established in 2004 with foundation stock from the "Gupton" herd. In 2007, the herd was increased with the purchase of HRH The Queens' "Windsor" herd. New bloodlines have been introduced along the way, namely Stretton, Knockenjig, Park Head, Haresfoot, Heydale and Sandyford to mention a few.

At Rhosygadair Fawr we milk about 400 cows in a 20/40 swing over parlour. Cake is fed in the parlour. The cows winter ration is made up of silage, wholecrop, home 'n' dry barley, fodder beet and 4 kg of blend. The cows graze from Mid April to October (weather permitting!!).

We use Cow Alert pedometers on the cows to show up any heats, and find this a very useful tool. Cows are served mainly to Ayrshire, currently Rosehill Vitality and the remainder to British Blue.

Heifers are served at around 15 months to the stock bulls to calve down at 24 months.

The family have had success in the show ring at the Royal Welsh Agricultural Show and various local shows, and are especially proud of our past homebred winners Rhos Frumpy EX93(3) and Rhos Aber Reality EX93(2).

Another show success has been Haresfoot Simply Red Pamela EX95(3). Her only daughter (sired by Hunnington Mandella) born on the 8th Feb 2018 will be offered at The Ayrshire Conference Auction on Wednesday 16th May.

Looking forward to seeing you all soon, and we hope you enjoy your stay in West Wales. Croeso i bawb.

# 2018 Conference Visits



The Thomas family welcome delegates to view the Gwynnog herd, in the heart of south Wales, on Thursday May 17th.

Geraint, Sheryl and family farm Tyreglwys Farm, on the outskirts of Llangennech, in partnership with Geraint's parents Rhys and Margaret. Geraint's great grandfather bought the farm in 1904, and it has been farmed by the family to this day.

The farm is of 300 acres where 250 are owned and a further adjoining 50 acres rented. It is a predominately grassland based farm where four cuts of silage are made, and the aim is to cut as near to May 1st as possible. The farm also grow fifteen to twenty acres of spring barley for feeding to the young stock as a mix of 50% rolled barley and a 19% heifer rearer compound.

The current herd size is 170 cows, where 100 or so are Holstein and around 70 Ayrshires, both breeds are of pedigree status. The cows graze on a rotational system from April to October, and are kept in two groups, where the highs are kept indoors all year round in the evenings but are housed day and night from 1st of September. The high group are fed a TMR ration in the evenings, which consists of silage, brewer's grain and a specific blend and then fed to yield in the parlour. Low yielders are on grass and feed

in the parlour during summer months, and while housed are fed silage and fed some feed in parlour. Calving pattern is predominately autumn.

The Ayrshire cow was introduced in 2001; with purchases of additional cow families over the years, and with home bred heifers, takes it to where the herd is today.

Families of interest in the herd are Punch, Jinks, Sailorgirl, Sandy Rose, Linnet, Macey, Ella, Joybell, Irene and Honesty. The aim is to establish these families within the herd and to sell and promote heifers and cows; to achieve this we are using sexed semen on our heifers and are looking to using sexed semen on the milking herd in the autumn.

Sires currently used are Hilltown Oblique, Boldview Oblique's Far, Sandyford Triclo, Gwynnog Primetime and are looking to use Cuthill Towers Buster.

The Gwynnog herd has had much success in local and national shows, the best to date are supreme interbreed, with Haresfoot Betty 6, at the 2006 Welsh dairy show and Ayrshire champion at the National Show 2011, with Gwynnog Remington Sailorgirl.

We hope you enjoy your first visit as delegates to south wales, and look forward to showing you the best scenery in WALES.

# Drisgol



Seimon, Eleanor, Sion and Hanna welcome you to Drysgolgoch to view the Drisgol Herd. We started our journey 24 years ago with 47 cows and youngstock after the retirement of my parents, Leslie and Megan. We currently farm 404 hectares (1,000 acres), with the grazing platform consisting of 140 hectares (346 acres). The herd has increased to 700 milking cows, and 400 youngstock, with some beef.

The herd calve 60% in spring and 40% in autumn with shorthorn bulls used through A.I. and natural on heifers for the first 6 weeks, then beef bulls are used for the next 4-5 weeks. Bulls currently used are Llandoverly Prides Prophet, Hoffman, Roadway Ronson, Redford and Wild Card as well as the homebred Drisgol Enrique, Rocky, Bruno, Scott and Gelli Pendulum. Over the years, the Watson and Madonna's Prince have been valuable assets to improve the Drisgol Herd. There have been significant breed improvements to the dairy shorthorn cow over the past two decades. They are natural grazers, with excellent legs and feet, which have the capability to convert grass to milk efficiently. Our network of tracks and layout for grazing allow the cows to graze for an average of ten months a year, and their longevity has helped us grow the herd to 700 cows.

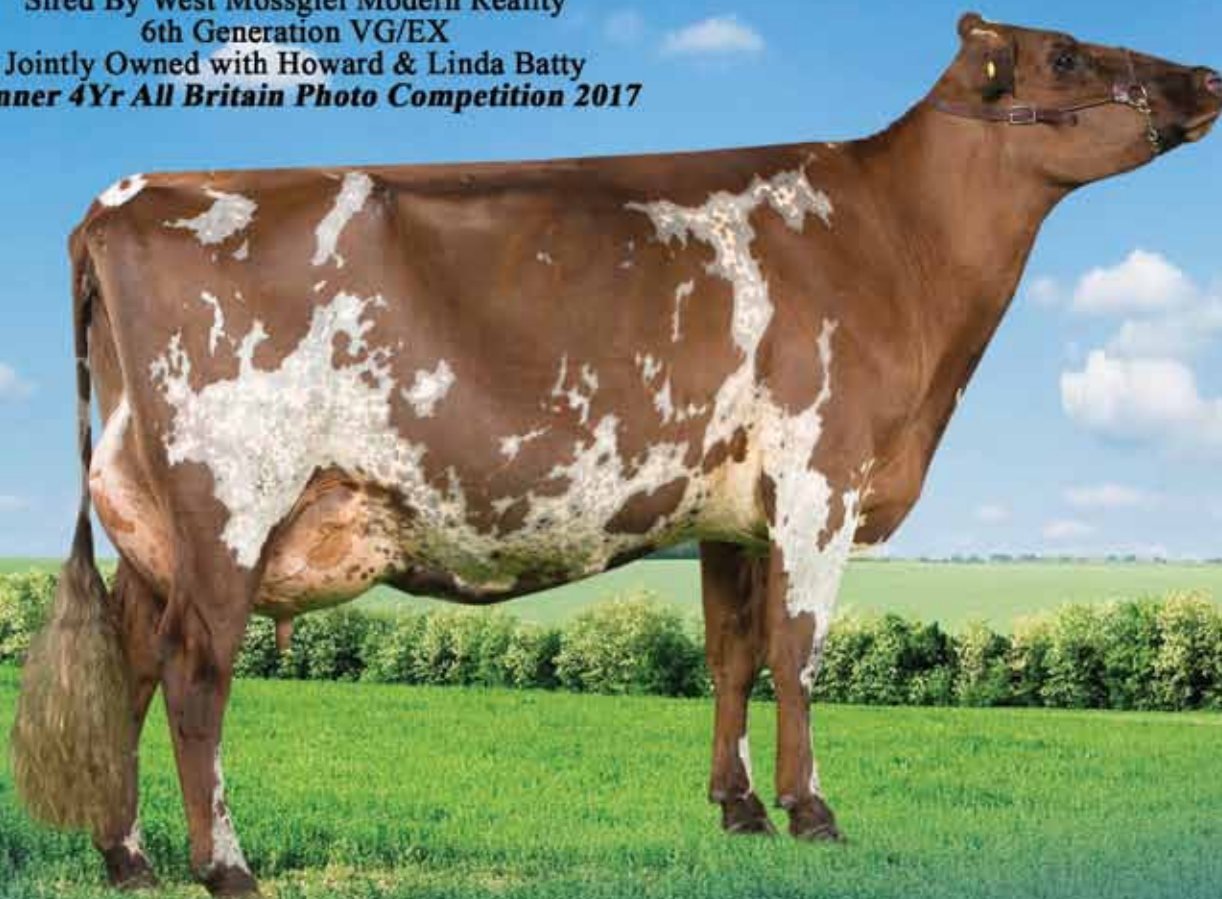

In the past two years Keith has been promoted to 'Papa' with Colin and fiancée Nicola Adams having a little girl, Isla; and Kyla and husband Scott Wilson have a little girl, Amelia, and in February a son, Charlie.

Following education at Hardgate Primary and Castle Douglas High School, Keith went to Auchencruive College where he gained an OND in Agriculture.

He returned to the family farm at Halmyre, and since then the herd has increased to 200 cows with a rolling average of 8295kg at 4.12%bf and 3.30%p on twice a day milking through a Delaval 18:18 parlour. Cows are fed a TMR and topped up to yield in the parlour, from April to September low yielding cows are grazed in rotation on a paddock system, with fresh and high yielding cows grazed during the day from May to September.

The herd also comprises 210 followers; they are turned out to grass from April to October, or November, depending on the season.

In 2014 the purchase of a further 70 acres, one mile from Halmyre, has increased total acreage to 445. This has allowed for plenty of forage to be taken as pit silage, whole crop, big bale silage and haylage, while still having enough grazing for young stock, without having to graze heifers away from home in the summer months.

Alongside the farm Jane makes Glen Urr Ice Cream using the milk and cream produced by the herd. Ice Cream is retailed through the family's business, The Toffee Shop, in Castle Douglas, as well as hotels, restaurants and events.

**What have you enjoyed most so far in your time as Junior-Vice and Vice President?**

It has been really enjoyable meeting new people, visiting new places and herds across the country. I've been very impressed by the cows I've seen and the enthusiasm for the breed is very encouraging.

**What are you most looking forward to in your time as President?**

It is an honour to have the opportunity to be President for the Society. My family and I have had a lot out of enjoyment and support from the Society in the past and I hope to be able to give something back. I am looking forward to meeting more breeders and also being involved in the breed as it continues to move forward and progress. It is an exciting time for the Ayrshire breed and we should all take pride in this.

**Breeding Policy:**

We use a mixture of pure Ayrshire, hybrid and Red and White Holstein sires to achieve our goal in breeding replacement heifers that are an improvement on the previous generations, both in terms of type and production. We always try to be mindful of today's market, with around 50 surplus heifers each year it is necessary to have heifers that are marketable.

**What is your current role at Halmyre?**

Still the boss, but not sure anybody listens! Calf rearing, breeding, routine daily chores, paper work.



**What do you find the most challenging part of farming?**

Like everyone, the volatile price of milk is definitely the biggest challenge we face. There are always other challenges, like any industry, I think our weather is the second biggest challenge, finding consecutive dry days to cut forage is always testing.

**What is the most rewarding part of farming?**

Seeing the next generation coming through, and always seeing the rewards of hard work, whether in the herd or in the fields.

**What is your biggest achievement as an Ayrshire Breeder?**

Winning Ayr, The Royal Highland and Dumfries Shows in 2008 with Halmyre Urr Louise 175 EX94-3E, beating brother Brian twice to be Interbreed Champion added to the success.

**What has been the most memorable moment?**

The 2005 All Breeds All Britain Calf Show when Katie, Kyla and Colin were Champion, Reserve and Honourable Mention Ayrshire Showmen and Halmyre Urr Louise 175 was Champion Ayrshire Calf.

**If you weren't farming, what would you do?**

When I left school I was keen to join the Police Force, if I'd done that I'd be retired, with a pension by now!

**Favourite celebrity?**

Brendan O'Carroll, 'Mrs Brown', guaranteed a laugh!

**What age do you wish you could permanently be?**

Around 40, old enough to have had experience, but young enough to carry it out.

**Favourite meal?**

Peppercorn Steak, medium, with mushrooms, chunky chips and vegetables.

**What's your favourite drink?**

In the morning I enjoy coffee, especially a Latte. But later in the day I enjoy a Bacardi and Coke!

**Favourite subject at school?**

Maths and Engineering Drawing

**How do you spend your time off?**

Selling ice cream, visiting Kyla, Scott and their family at Ayr or sometimes a weekend break away with Jane.

**What hobby would you get in to if time and money weren't an issue?**

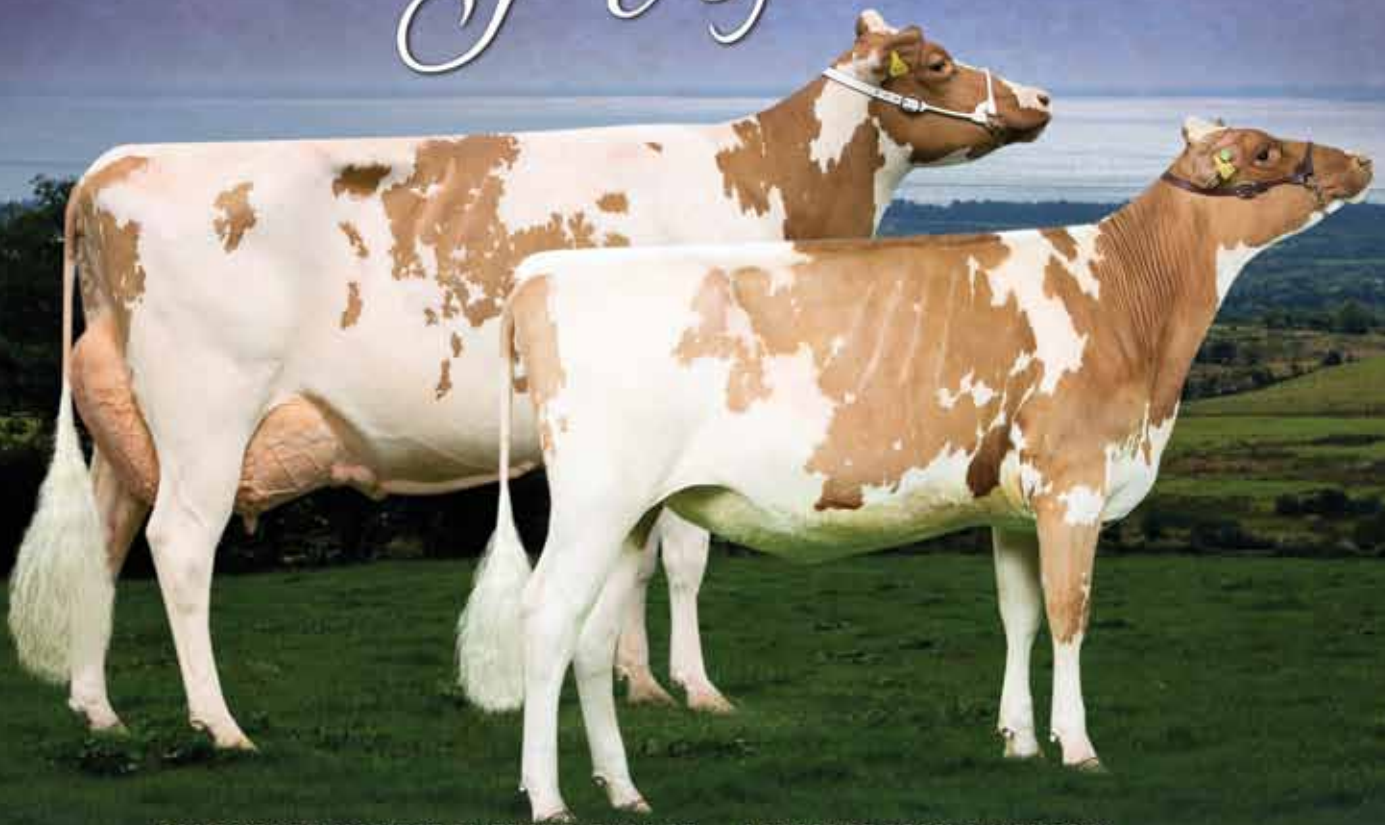

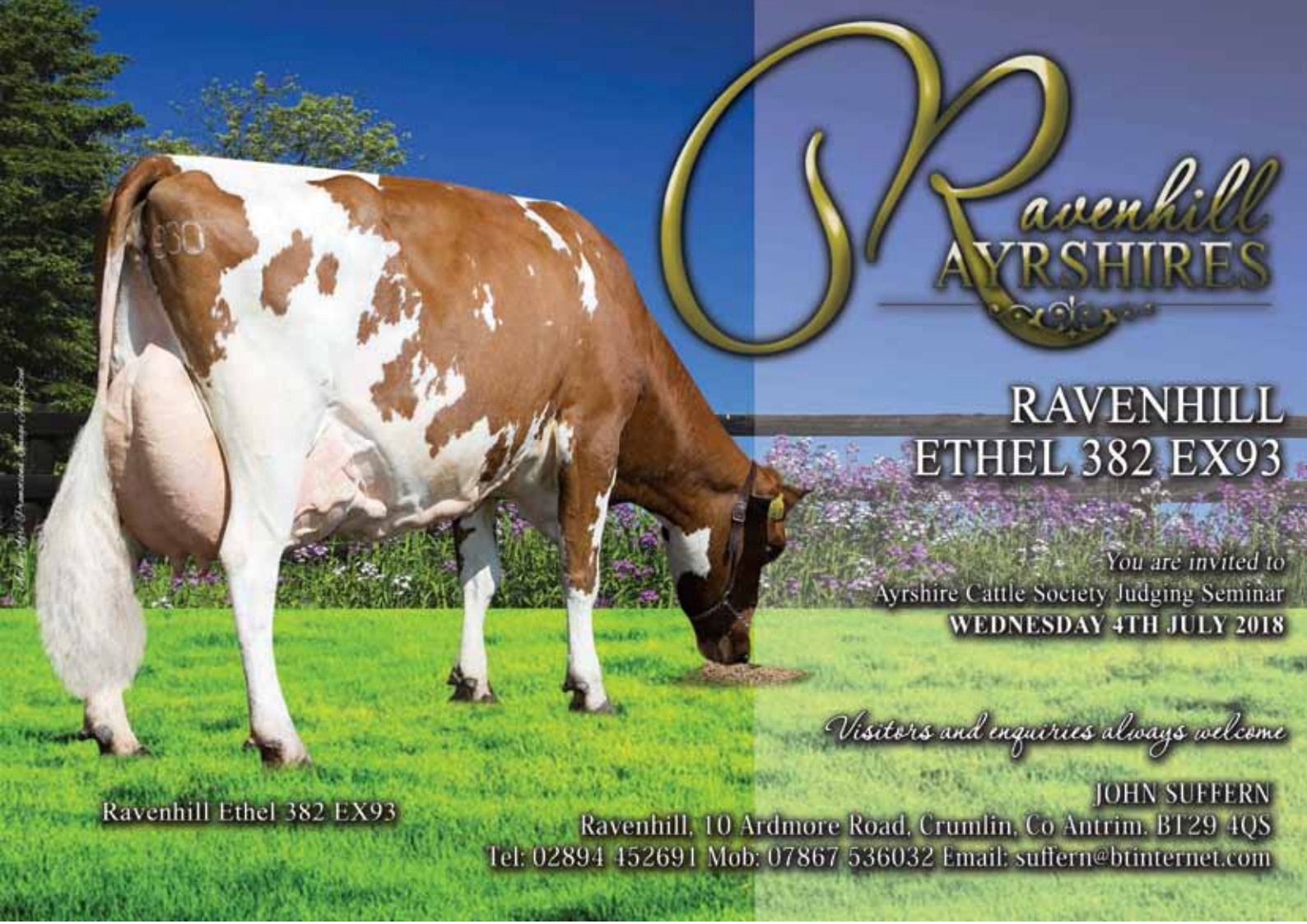
