ROBERT T SLOAN

Robert T Sloan, of Townhead, has died in his 90th year. One of four boys born to Bryce And Agnes Sloan, he and his wife, Anna, were themselves parents to four sons.

Robert was one of the earliest chairmen of Mauchline YFC, where he made many lifetime friends and had great success in the Stockjudging and Cattle Dressing competitions. He got a lot from the Ayrshire breed but also gave a lot. He judged all the major shows and he loved meeting breeders and friends up and down the country. He and Anna travelled to many countries with the Society, with a trip to Canada being one of his favourites.

Robert loved the first week in November each year, when breeders from all over the world would converge on Ayr to purchase stock bulls and heifers. He loved the excitement, the anticipation, the expectation, the friends, the banter, the competition, the atmosphere and enthusiasm of the packed ring as breeders tried to purchase new stock bulls. The 1972 sale saw Robert attain a record price (3200gns) for a bull, the highest for 24 years, and in 1977, when the World Ayrshire Conference was held in the UK, with hundreds of breeders from around the world, climaxing at the Ayrshire sale week, where Robert was proud to sell the top priced bull during the week of sales at 4800gns.

In 1983 he was honoured to be president of the Ayrshire society, and visited clubs all over the UK and Ireland, a role he was very proud of. He also was one of the first directors of Cattle Services (Ayr).

The Townhead herd, which was one of the oldest herds in the world being established in 1779, pedigree since 1910, milk recorded since 1919, was dispersed in 1994 at the first Ayrshire dairy sale in the new Ayr market. The top price was 3400gns, and averaged 2000gns per life, a price which would be hard to beat 25 years later. So drew a close to his working life with the Ayrshire cow, one which he relished and got great satisfaction from, making many lifelong friendships. It may be just a coincidence, or not, that he passed away on the 8 November, Ayrshire sale day, his favourite day of the year.



GAVIN LAWRIE

I would like to say a few words about my wee brother Gavin, who died on 28th November 2019 aged 86. We had great fun as boys in the late 1940s. Gavin excelled in the Boys Brigade and was awarded the coveted King's Badge. He then moved on to enjoy an active time in Loch Lomond Young Farmers Club.

He married Nan in 1958 and set up home at the family farm at Kessington, Bearsden. In 1962 they gave up the tenancy at Kessington and moved to Nan's family farm, at Brieryside in Ayrshire, with their young family. Gavin quickly expanded the herd, his pride and joy then was Kessington Stately Lass who excelled at various Glasgow Dairy Shows in the early 1960s.

Gavin and I always enjoyed the competitiveness and fun of the shows, and at one particularly good Highland Show a certain Andrew Dunlop christened us Nero & Zero. Nero always stuck as Gavin's nickname with his friends. Gavin enjoyed much success at the Highland Show through the years, winning the Championship seven times. Brieryside Swan and Bankend Wren were also two of his favourites who in different years won Ayr, the Highland and Agriscot consecutively.

He was a very active member of Ayr Cattle Club and sat on the Council of the Ayrshire Cattle Society. He rose to be President of the Society in 1990 and received the prestigious award of Master Breeder in 1992.

Gavin was very much a family man and at his happiest at family events. Gavin and Nan were a great couple, and Jessie and I had so much fun with them over the years, Gavin missed Nan but kept strong and was always very proud of the achievements of his four children and their families. He was much loved by them all and will be missed dearly.

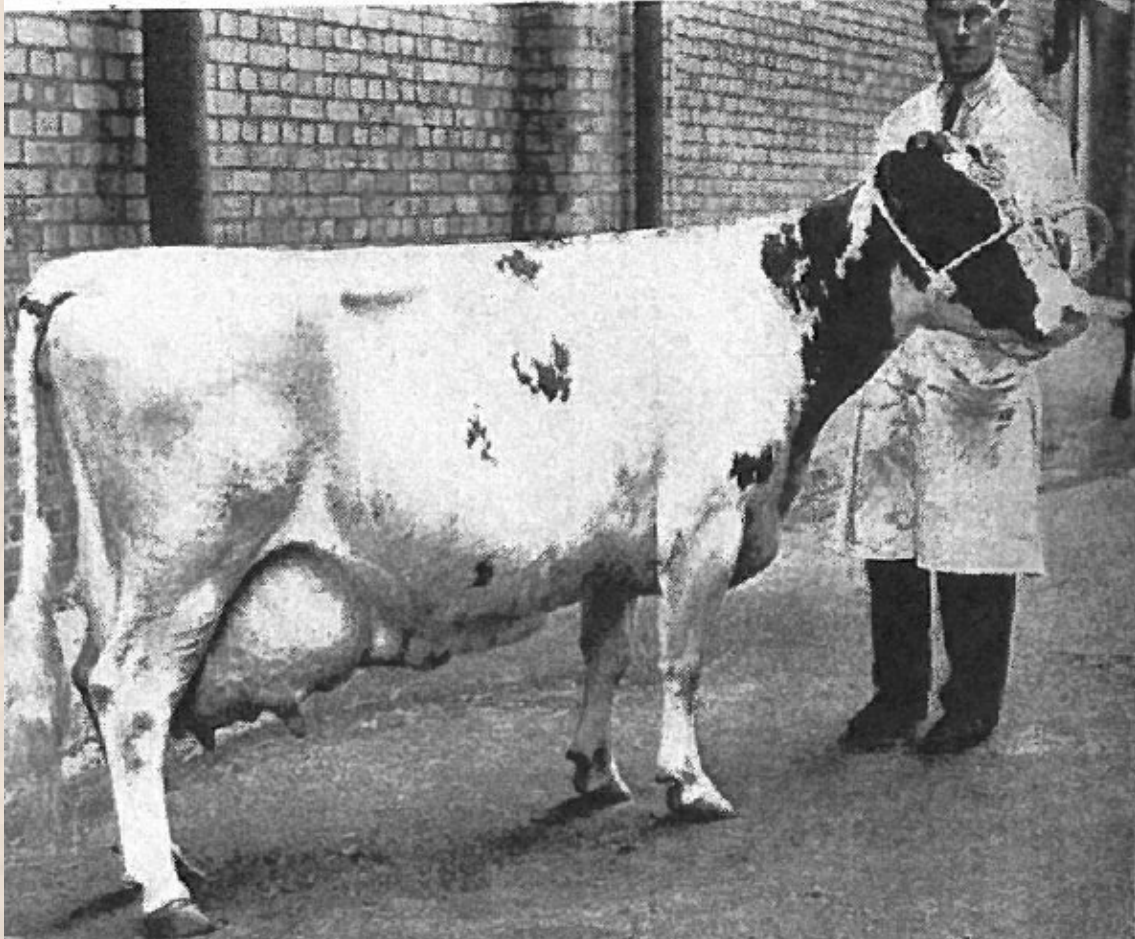

YOUNG BREEDERS

I'm really looking forward to the Young Breeders weekend as I'm sure you will realise this is the future of the breed, so any young people out there, if you're not booked in you really are missing a great opportunity to learn new skills and make new and lasting friendships. This year's gathering is being held in Yorkshire and the three herds we are visiting are Richard Danforth's Moathouse

CONFERENCE SALE

There are some great offerings at this year's Conference sale, and I encourage you all to have a good look at what's on offer. These animals are of a very high standard with great cow families i.e. Punch, Ethel, Rae, and Petula, and also two embryo packages with such great families as Jess and Sandy Rose and all from top bull breeding dams with outstanding production, what else could you ask for.

CLASSIFICATION

We had our first EX97 7E pure bred Ayrshire cow classified, and I must say what a stunning individual she is, it's a great accolade to her breeder, the late Chris Window. We also had a classification workshop with NBDC classifiers and I felt the day was very constructive



throughout. We touched on the importance to record milking speed and temperament when scoring your animals and I urge you all to make sure this is recorded properly. Last year saw roughly the same number of animals classified as the previous year with a slight rise in the scores given.

REGISTRATIONS

Registrations for the year were back on 2018 and I know there are herds out there that perhaps need some help with catch ups. Please don't hesitate to give me a ring, my phone is always on, number 07889 044070.

GENOMICS

We have had quite a good uptake in Genomic testing, and if you want odd animals tested both Sam and I have kits in our cars. So, if we are in your area and you want them done just let us know. The cost is £29 per sample and results are back in around four weeks. It is hoped in the near future to offer in this package DNA parentage testing also but there may be a slight extra cost involved.

AHDB DAIRY

Sam and I attended a meeting with the staff at AHDB Dairy, and had what I would like to think was a very constructive meeting. We asked Fern Pearston of AHDB to come to the March council meeting to inform the members on the Genetic and Type Merit trends of the Ayrshire Breed for the last decade. It was decided that we needed to look into this more and with the help of AHDB formulate the strategy for the next decade.

PHOTOGRAPHIC COMPETITION

Once again, we had a great entry with 120 photos forward, with the quality again being of the highest standard. If you read on in the journal you will see the results. There is going to be two new classes for this coming year, an under six month class, to bring us into line with the World Ayrshire Federation competition, and also a scenic shot of Ayrshires, and the winner of this class will be the front cover of a future journal.

BREED HERITAGE

Breed Heritage is truly coming up with the goods, with another great Heritage mating going into Cattle Services for sale in the coming months, Moathouse Monopoly is sired by Whitecroft Dr Foster who's daughters are calving right at this moment and are doing very well. Monopoly's mother, Pylon Minty 12 EX95 6E by Highway Billy Ruffian, is a real eye catching individual and with her depth of pedigree it gives you real confidence in this outstanding bull. The dam of Minty 12 is Pylon Minty 8 EX90 2E, by Hunnington BBK Easlad, with records in excess of 8500kgs and very high fat and protein. The third Dam is Pylon Minty 5, by Pylon Nimbus, with yields of 9170kgs with 4% fat and 3.3% protein and the next three generations back are all VG.

We also had a Breed Heritage meeting in February where matings were discussed and new families were added to the list of cows that we will be working with. They are the Kirstys from Morwick, Fables from Sandyford and the Heather Honeys from Jamara, Sandyford and Priestland.

BEST PRACTISE TO REDUCE ANTIBIOTIC USE

In the battle to reduce our reliance on antibiotics, one of the target areas has been dry cow therapy. In an attempt to remain ahead of the game, a group of seven European experts in bovine mastitis recently undertook a best practice and information sharing exercise.

After much discussion, the group arrived at the statement below¹:

“We recommend administering an internal teat sealant (ITS) at drying off, to all cows, on all farms”

Qualifying the statement, they added that those animals that are likely to be infected need to receive antibiotic dry cow therapy (ADCT) in addition to a teat sealant. The group was convened by Boehringer Ingelheim Animal Health and was timed to link to the introduction of its teat sealant, Ubroseal®.

Various studies have shown that using an ITS reduces the risk of new intramammary infections and reduces the risk of clinical mastitis after calving:

Analysis of published papers² showed:

- 25% reduced risk of new infections
 - 29% reduced risk of clinical mastitis for cows receiving ITS plus ADCT compared with ADCT alone
- Against the backdrop of targets to reduce antibiotic use³, adopting ITS for all cows could significantly help. It is estimated that currently, around 29% of the UK's herd is dried off without an ITS, so there is huge room for improvement⁴.

The expert group went on to advise on how to develop a herd

plan, classifying herds as “low risk” or “high risk” and having a different approach to each. “For “high risk” herds, the priority should be to improve udder health management during both the lactation and dry period,” says Kath Aplin, veterinary adviser at Boehringer Ingelheim. “Any decision to abandon ADCT should be made with care and a full risk assessment. In reality, it may be prudent to continue blanket ADCT until udder health has improved.”

Meanwhile, for the “low risk” herds (<250,000 cells/ml in four out of the last six months) the group agreed that they would do well to actively strive towards selective ADCT, supported by ITS for all cows.

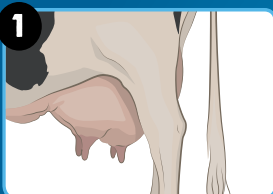

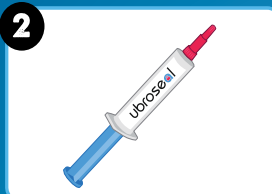

HOW TO ADMINISTER INTERNAL TEAT SEALANTS CORRECTLY*

Please follow these steps for optimal protection



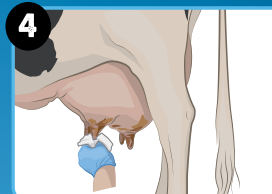
1 Ensure animals are appropriately restrained in a **clean environment**



2 Keep syringes clean and **DO NOT immerse in water**



3 A separate pair of **clean disposable gloves** should be worn for the treatment of **each cow**



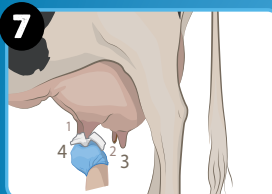
4 If teats are obviously dirty then **clean off dirt** with moistened towels and dry thoroughly



5 **Dip teats in a rapid acting pre-dip**, leave for 30 seconds, then wipe each teat completely dry with separate disposable paper towels



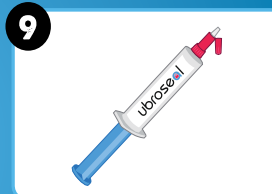
6 **Strip fore milk** into a strip cup and discard



7 Thoroughly **disinfect the whole surface of the teat** with a disposable swab soaked in surgical spirit. **Clean the teats** furthest away from you first



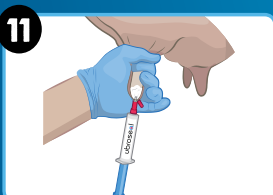
8 **Gently scrub each teat end** with new individual, disposable, surgical spirit swabs or teat wipes provided, until both teat end and swab/wipe are visibly clean



9 **Remove the cap** from the teat sealant intramammary tube, being careful not to touch the nozzle



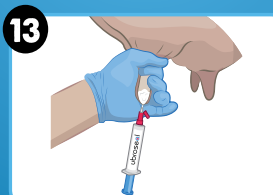
10 **Pinch the base of the teat** where it joins the udder



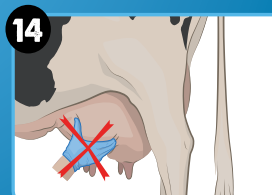
11 **Infuse the contents of the syringe into the teat** avoiding contaminating the teat end



12 **Infuse teats in the opposite order** to cleaning, i.e. treat the quarters closest to you first



13 **Deposit a small quantity of sealant** in the teat canal as you remove the syringe. **The Ubroseal syringe is fully expressed** with 1 inch of the blue plunger still showing.



14 **DO NOT massage** the product into the udder



15 **Apply a post-milking teat disinfectant** and confine the treated cows to a yard where they should stand for at least 30 minutes to allow the teat canal to close

* When an internal teat sealant is used in combination with an antibiotic dry cow treatment, please administer the antibiotic before the teat sealant.



A Busy Start To The New Year



Well what a February that was! I think everyone felt the effects of storms Ciara and Dennis and the relentless rainfall. Our farm is on sandy land and a couple of days' worth of rain usually disappear quite quickly, but not at the moment, the ground is sodden and now needing quite a bit of time to drain. We like to plant the

new potatoes in early March but that isn't going to plan this year, we still need to get the muck on the field as I write this, so the season may be a little later than normal. Once things dry up and warm up work will begin and usually ten weeks after planting the earlies will be ready. They are 'chitting' in trays nicely at the moment and ready to go when the land is dry.

We are still doing a couple of markets a week, selling the ware potatoes we have in store. We have always grown and sold potatoes, they were sold from the farm and wholesale to local shops and businesses. When Foot and Mouth took hold in 2001 we couldn't sell from the farm due to a neighbouring farm having the disease and restrictions being put in place, so we decided to take our product out to a local car boot sale. This was to be the start of our trips to the local street markets, and we are now in our twentieth year. We now do four markets a week in the summer and that goes down to two in the winter months. I must admit it's a less appealing job in the winter, but wrap up warm and away we go. 'There's no such thing as bad weather, just bad clothing' a customer once told us.

All our markets are outdoors so we have to take what comes. Lovely sunny days to start with, that fast turn to long cold windy and wet days in the autumn. Our main market is in our local town of Workington, where we have a prime pitch and stand right outside Marks and Spencer and the best butchers in town. The first earlies are all handpicked and sold within 24 hours to keep them fresh.

DESCRIPTION OF CURRENT JOB/STUDY/POSITION/FARM SIZE ETC.:

IIDA ~ At my parent's farm which is located in southern Finland, we have 30 milking cows, both Ayrshires and Holsteins. At home I help with all dairy farm works and I also take care of the breeding with our amazing processing adviser Heidi from Semex Finland. I have been interested about cows, breeding & feeding them my whole life.

OLIVIA ~ I work on a farm with 250 milking cows (Holsteins), and on the weekends I go home and work at my parents' farm with 70 milking cows. At my parents farm we have 90% red cows (Swedish red/Swedish Ayrshire) and the other 10% are some Holstein and some Jersey crosses.

Gabrielle ~ General dog's body, farm assistant on 150ha milking 360 cows at peak.

Lachlan ~ Dairy farmer milking 300 cows on 600 acres.

Olivia ~ If I compare to the SRB or Ayrshires in Sweden with the Ayrshires in the UK, I would say our cows are more compact and not so tall as we saw at some farms.

Gabrielle ~ The Ayrshires in the UK all had tremendous fore udders while the ones in NZ typically have a better rear udder. Other than that, they are fairly similar.

Lachlan ~ I feel like you have been true to the Ayrshire breed in Australia we have started to put in red Holstein and have lost some of good traits of the breed. Saying this we have some amazing Ayrshire

Once-a-Day feeding lays foundation to calf health in premier herd



A once-a-day calf feeding system is allowing a premier Ayrshire breeder to devote more time to keeping his heifer replacements in tip-top health.

A once-a-day calf feeding system is allowing a premier Ayrshire breeder to devote more of his time to keeping his heifer replacements in tip-top health.

The Whitefords father Jack moved from Scotland in 1947 and established Middle Ayrshires and in the 1980s the family introduced Red and White bloodlines to the herd.

The herd of 400 Ayrshires are based at Middle Farm, Carlisle, where Willie farms with his brother John and nephew Stephen.

Six years ago, they introduced Shine- Once- a- Day milk replacer to calves at 28 days old. The system has been so successful that the family say there is no going back.

“I wouldn’t go back to twice a day feeding from 28 days of age because feeding once a day gives me more time to spend with the calves. It means I can ensure the health of the animals is the best it can be,” says Stephen.

After calves are born they are given 4 litres of colostrums within four hours and then transition milk for seven days. Thereafter, they receive Shine Once-a-day twice a day until day 28 when feeding frequency is reduced to once a day to increase rumen development and cake intake; this approach makes weaning easier and ensures there is no fall in cake intake post- weaning.

The calves are housed individually at first then in groups of 7 or 8 at 28 days.

To encourage earlier meal intake, calves have continual access to rearing nut, water and straw from day one.

After weaning the calves continue to receive the rearing nut and are fed straw to ensure a gradual change in diet.

The herd is continually developing and is currently yielding an average of 7,000 litres annually.

The Whitefords champion the Ayrshire as a breed that is long lived and easy to care for.

They also have good mobility and are easy to manage, he says.

They have customers for cows and calves all over the UK, as far afield as Pembrokeshire and also Ireland. They have had five reduction sales in the past.

They believe Shine Once-a-Day allows calves to do well and grow to their full potential, ensuring that heifers that join the herd are of equal size and can continue to progress and thrive, allowing longevity.

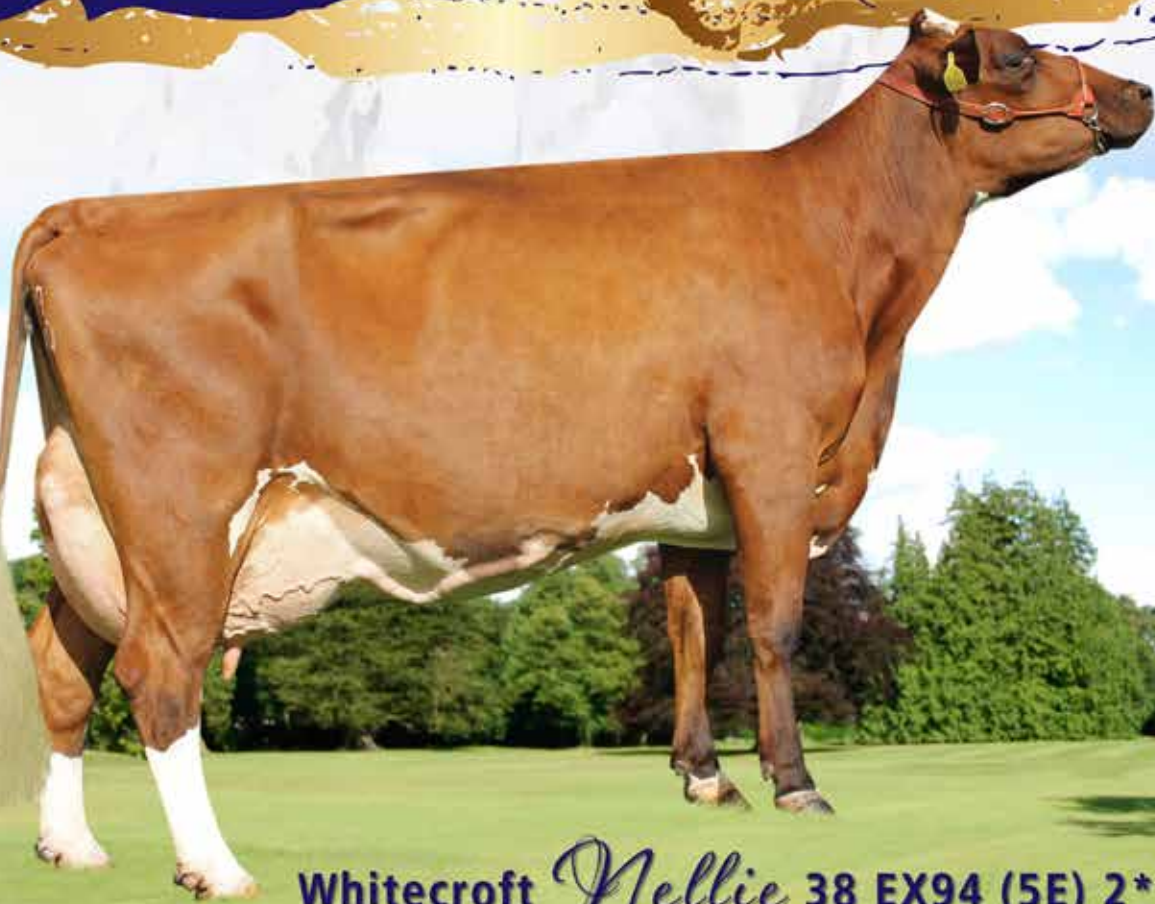
Shine Once-a-day contains skim milk, buttermilk and five plant oils. These, along with vitamins, form a soft curd in the calf’s stomach and are broken down over many hours. This gives the calf a sense of fullness and contentment, says Selina Field of Bonanza Calf Nutrition.

“Calves also eat about 15per cent more dry feed so there is no weaning check,” she explains.

“In trials, calves perform better and are under less stress, especially at weaning.”

Shine Once-a-Day is as time efficient as using an automatic feeder but costs nothing to implement and calves can be kept in small groups to minimise disease.

LOOKING BACK

Breeder Linda Batty, shares, a nostalgic look back at 1969 the year of the first World Conference in Canada.



1969 was a notable year for the Ayrshire breed, not only did it see three great cows winning three of our major shows for the second year running, but it was the year of the first World Conference in Canada.

The British party's verdict of the cattle was that some displayed American growth, which produced a leggier type early in life, but became less noticeable when mature. Those who had used British blood appeared tidier and more of a type.

The tour began in Toronto, where there were over 260 head of Ayrshires

Finland hosted the second World Conference in 1972, followed by Britain in 1977. This must have been some conference, as there were some eleven buses of delegates. One of these visited my fathers "Mercaston" herd on Sunday 30th October at 2.30pm!

World Conference number four was in New Zealand in 1981. The British contingent was around 95, and had a five day stop in Australia on the way. It appears that New South Wales had suffered drought conditions for over two years back then, similar to some regions we visited this year.

at the Winter Fair, with classes of up to 50 – all of which had to be placed! The judge was Wallace Montgomerie of Lessnessock, in what was Lessnessock's centenary year. The champion female was Glencameron Beau's Belle, owned by MacGillivray Brothers.

The exhibitors wore white jeans and jackets, with cardboard topless hats with their exhibit number displayed in triplicate...no "tickets and string", according to Mr M.A.R Hindmarsh in his report on the tour, in the Spring edition of the 1970 Ayrshire Journal.

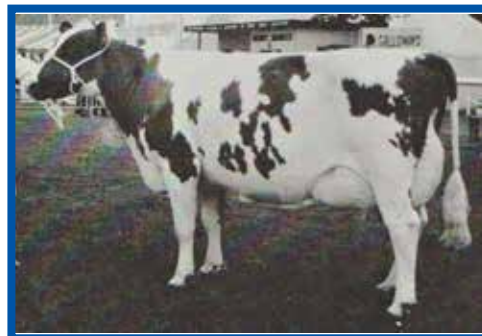
Whilst in Australia, on a muggy night in New Plymouth, a delegate from Scotland, while looking for the ventilation switch in his room, managed to set off the fire alarm by mistake, evacuating fellow delegates in the middle of the night!

At a banquet given by the Ontario Government the world record breaking Ayrshire cow, Indian Lake M Lady Diane, made an appearance. She was brought up to the function in an elevator, with two tail attendants, and was owned by Mr Lampert of Meredith Farms, Massachusetts.

After the show, the tour visited 24 herds which had qualified to be visited on a production basis. The tour covered 1,300 miles in seven days in frosty conditions, along with some four inches of snow.

In all the herds apart from one, the cows were "byre and yoke tied", with electric scrapers. The byres were low roofed with extractor fans for ventilation, and the top storey of the barns was used for food storage. Maize haylage or silage was fed, some contained chopped cobs, while other had the cobs removed and stored separately.

Information about the cows was displayed above them on boards. It appears to have been rather a shock to arrive at the one farm, where the cows were loose housed, and not have the information readily to hand!

In the Kenya World Conference's Brochure of 1984, a page entitled "Home of the International Dairy Breed" showing "A typical group of Ayrshire cows in the home of the breed" from the Ayrshire Cattle Society of Great Britain & Ireland, features a photo showing a group of cows sired by Pant Red Heather at East Drumlemble, owned by the Ralston family.

Every tour vehicle carried refreshments including beer, soft drinks and biscuits...hopefully not all for the driver!

Further World Conferences were U.S.A. in 1988, Sweden in 1993, Canada in 1997, and Britain in 2000. Since then host countries have been New Zealand, South Africa, Finland, USA, and of course, Australia this year!

ABOUT YOUR FARM AND LOCATION?
We farm a solely dairy farm on the Cheshire, Shropshire border covering 470 acres (316 owned, the rest rented). Milk sold to Mullers, seven miles away at Market Drayton. The cows are grazed on paddocks as long as it is dry enough for them to be out and fed a TMR ration based on grass and maize silage in the winter.

BREEDING POLICY?
The milking herd of 330 cows are registered with the Ayrshire Cattle Society and bred using a variety of sexed AI sires, with some Aberdeen Angus and British Blue used on the lower 25%.

TELL US ABOUT YOUR MOST PROLIFIC COW FAMILY?
There are a few cow families that always seem to breed well, the Swans, Ellas and Brindles always milk well and look good; we look forward to working with the Clover family.

WHAT DO YOU LOOK FORWARD TO THE MOST IN BECOMING PRESIDENT?
Travelling around the country and meeting fellow Ayrshire breeders

IS THERE ANYTHING YOU WANT TO ACHIEVE AS PRESIDENT?
To try and increase the use of Ayrshire sires in commercial cross breeding herds.

WHAT HAVE YOU DONE SO FAR AS PART OF THE PRESIDENTS COMMITTEE?
I was part of recruiting Alan Timbrell to the role of Breed Manager and was involved in getting the 2024 world conference

to be held here.

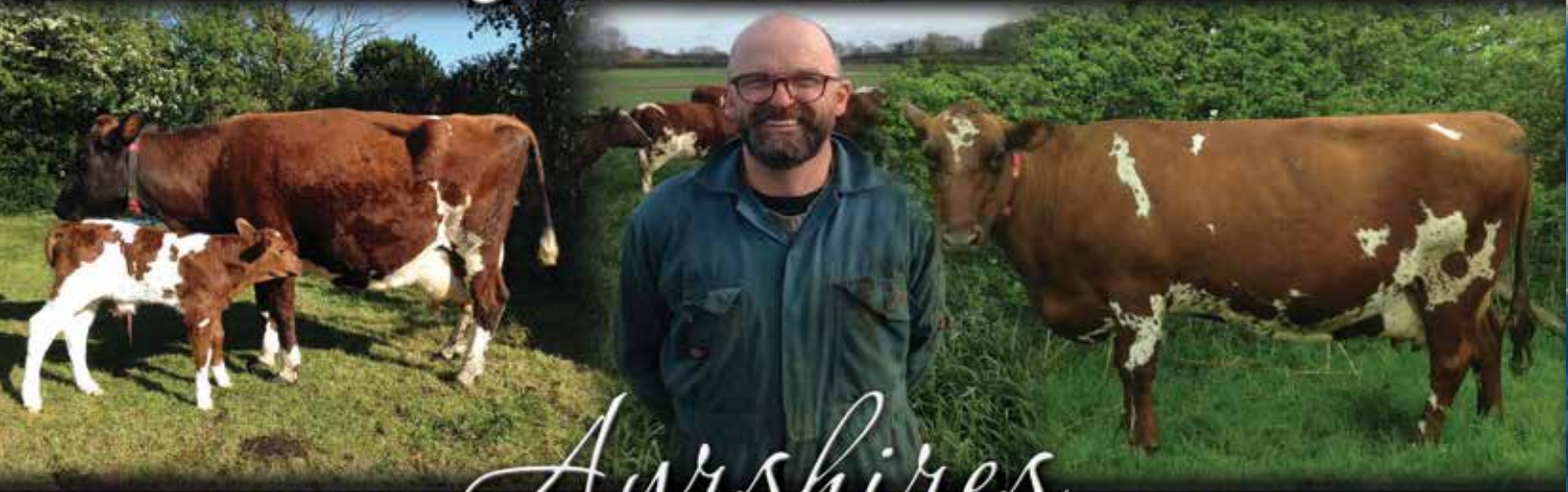

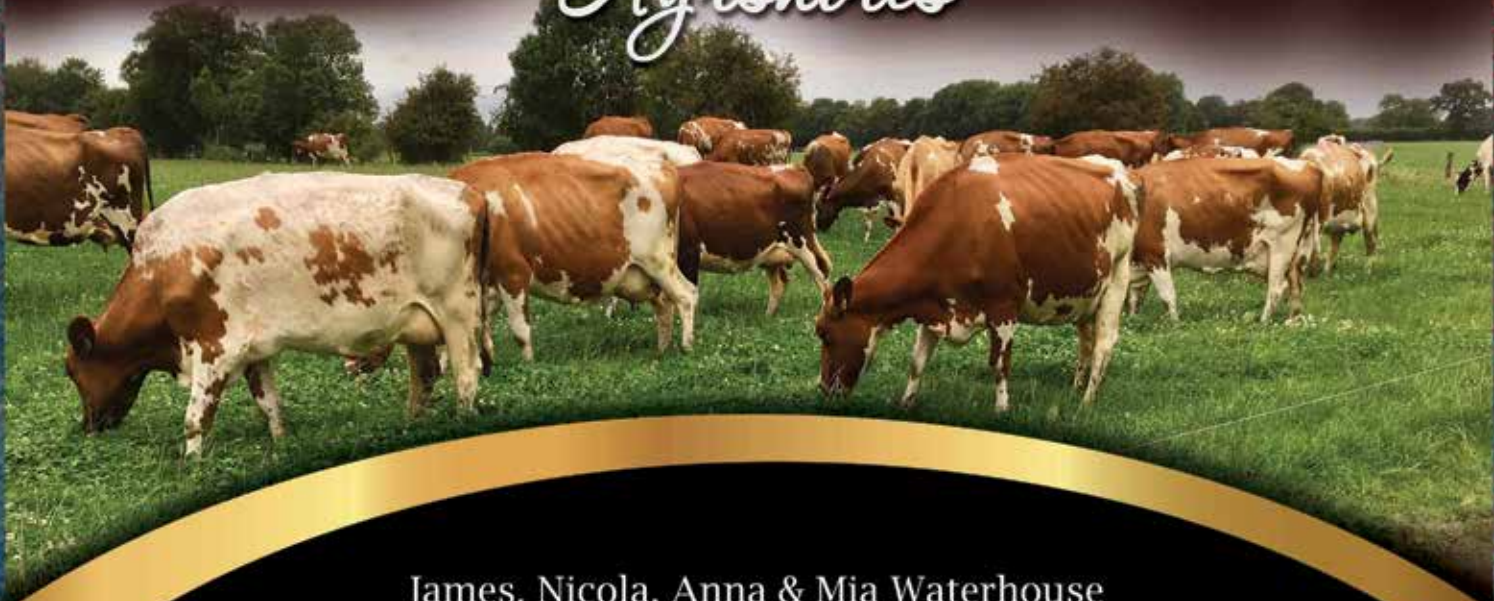

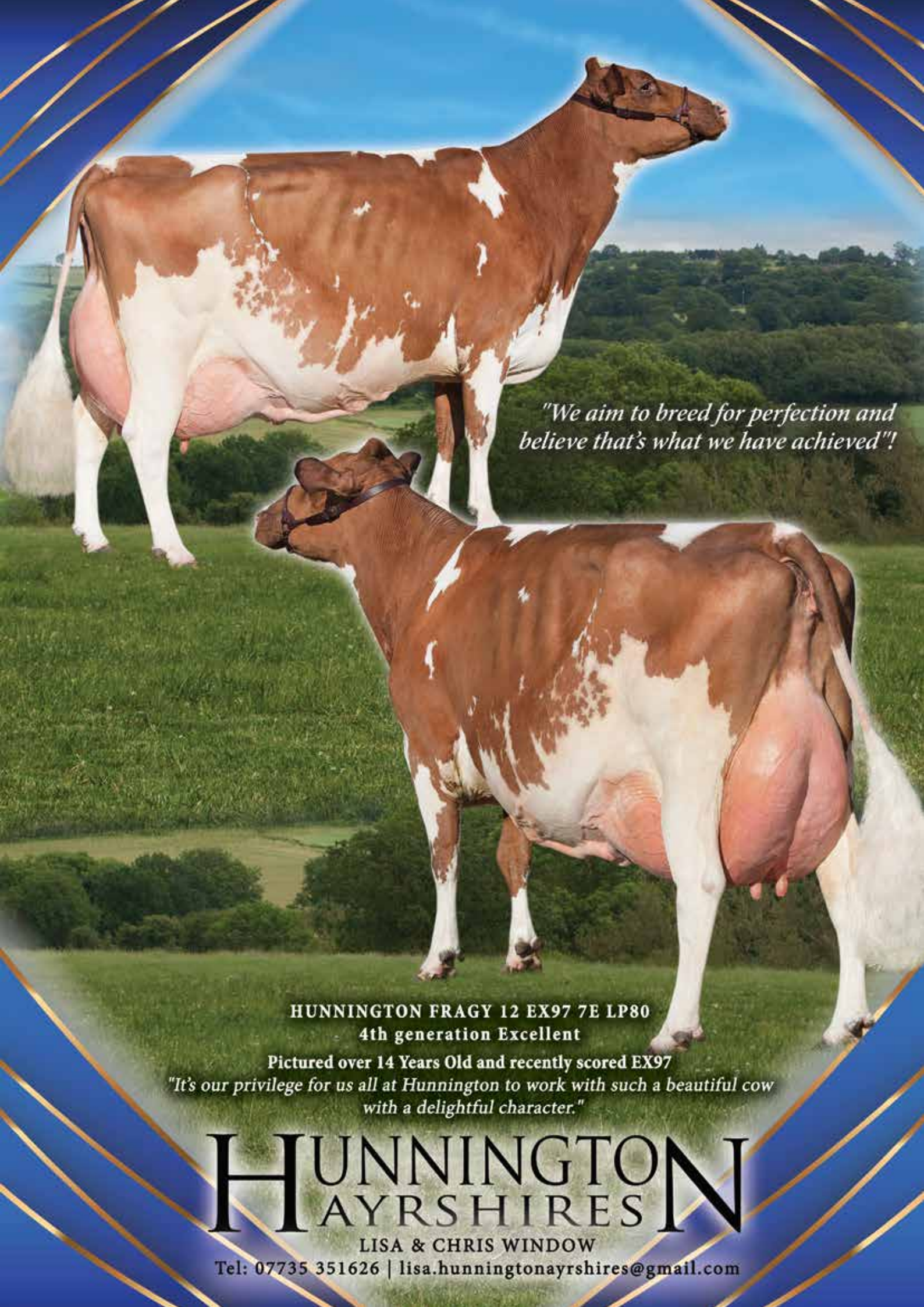

The FRAGY Family

Six decades of dedicated breeding by a master breeder brought this family of cows to its pinnacle, on the 31st January 2020, when Hunnington Fragy 12 was classified EX97 7E. Although Chris Window passed away some three years ago his legacy lives on in his cows and his family. Fragy 12 was always a

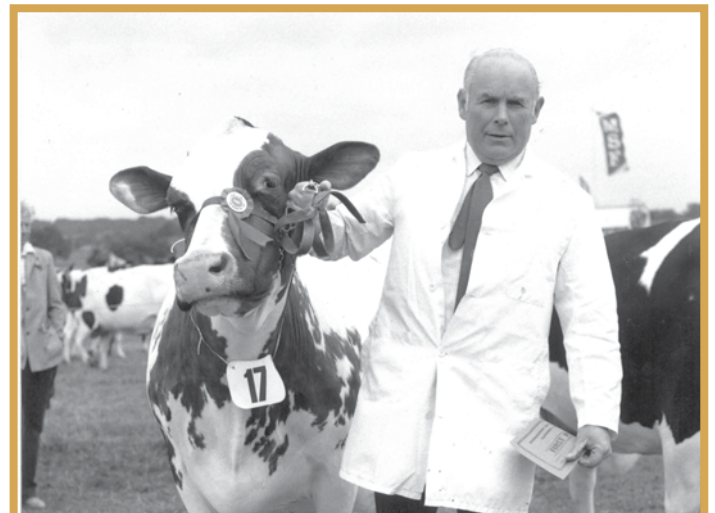
cow that Chris felt had a great future right from when she was born - on the 4th of September 2005 - and then when she calved in as a heifer he knew he had a real star, as she scored VG 88 as a first calved heifer.

It all started in 1955 when Chris began working at Lord Plumb's Southfield herd near Coleshill, Birmingham. From the start Chris warmed to the Fragrance family (as they were then known) because of their nature and will to milk. After sixteen years of working for Lord Plumb, Chris and Hazel got the chance to farm in their own right, and they purchased a number of heifers for the nucleus of his Hunnington herd from Southfield. Lord Plumb remarked that Chris was quite insistent that he had Southfield Fragrance 26 (a Flodder Hall High Spirit daughter) as one of the purchases, but in Lord Plumb's words she wasn't the best-looking heifer of the group, but Chris wanted her.

Her first daughter was Hunnington Fragrance, sired by the sire of the period Pant Outlaw, a Pant Dictator son, Chris decided to line breed Fragrance to her sire Pant Outlaw, producing Hunnington Fragrance 3 EX who produced over 80,000kgs lifetime and two Excellent daughters, Hunnington Fragrance 7 by Townhead Diadem and Hunnington Fragy by Brocklehill Happy Spirit, and this is where the family splits apart, with the Diadem line staying as Fragrance and the Happy Spirit line take the name Fragy. Hunnington Fragy was Chris's favourite cow of all time, as most breeders accept there is always one cow that they call special and this was it. Fragy was a powerhouse, you could drive a bus through her front legs. She was no slouch in the show ring winning many prizes including first prize 50-ton class at the Royal show 1999 and she was a top production animal too, with a lifetime yield of over 80,000kgs in nine lactations. She bred two EX daughters, one by Langside Impact, but her most notable daughter was Hunnington Fragy 4 EX94 3E.

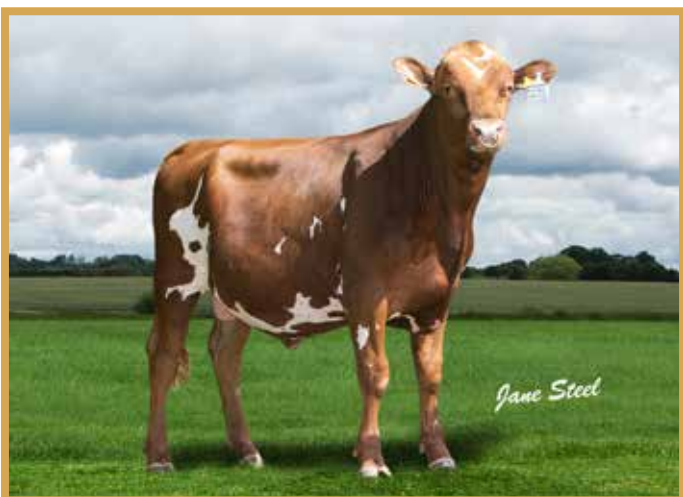
Fragy 4 was by Brocklehill Harvest Gold (a Pant Blue Lagoon son out of Pant Sea Breeze EX) and she bred three Excellent daughters, Fragy 12 and Fragy 15 by Hunnington BBK Easlad and Fragy 13 by Rosehill Blackthorn. She also had one VG son by Blackadder BB Kellogg used in the Beeline Herd and an EX McCornick Nelson son used in the Blackrock herd. Fragy 4 was also no stranger to the show circuit in the UK and had many successful days in the ring, winning many Breed Championships and Supreme Championships and she produced over 90,000kgs of milk lifetime in eleven lactations.

Hunnington Fragy 12 EX97 7E is the oldest living daughter of Fragy 4 and she has followed in her mother's footsteps. Sired by the Blackadder BB Kellogg son Hunnington BBK Easlad who is out of a cow (Pylon Easled EX95 6E by Brieryside Superman) that Chris purchased at the Society Conference sale of 1998. According to Lisa, her Dad said Easled was almost identical to the original Fragy in so many ways and he felt that BBK Easlad would leave him something special, and how right he was.

Fragy 12 has left her mark in the show ring, winning many prizes, and has produced over 80,000kgs lifetime to date. She has bred three daughters, the oldest, Fragy 16 EX95 3E, is the dam of Hunnington Tornado Fragy VG88 who was Honourable Mention at our National Show 2019, and Fragy 24 by Rosehill Prestige is yet to be classified. Her two-year-old Fragy 29 will calve in a few months, she is by Hunnington Jester, a son of the great Joybell family - but that's a story for another day. Fragy 12 has three sons, one is being used in the well-known Plaskett herd, Hunnington Flash EX92 by Castern Tornado, Hunnington Famous EX94, a De La Plaine Prime son, one of the most heavily used AI sires over the last few years, whose daughters are calving out very well. Her latest son who is causing excitement within the breed is Hunnington Fantasy by Sandyford Supreme, semen will be drawn from him later this year. As you can see from her photos Fragy 12 still looks so youthful at 14 ½ years old and is now to be put on a flush program in the coming months.

On Tuesday the 12th May the Howie family, Michael, Angie, Will, Peter & Ben extend a warm welcome to delegates of the Ayrshire Cattle Society for day two of the 2020 Ayrshire Conference at Morwick. The Howie family have farmed at Morwick for 75 years, at present three generations are active on the farm, father, David, still turns up at 6am every morning, not bad for a 90 year old.

Morwick

In 1926 grandfather, Allan Howie, moved south from his family farm in Ayrshire. He settled at Eshott Brocks, near Felton, and farmed Ayrshires under the Brocks prefix. Nineteen years later, in 1945, the family moved five miles east to Morwick, a 560 acre Duke of Northumberland farm. The Brocks cows were sold and the young stock was used to start a new Ayrshire herd under the Morwick prefix.

Today the farm milks 200 cows, a mixture of Ayrshires, Ayrshire hybrids, Red & White Holsteins, a few Jerseys and black and whites. The farmed area is approximately 950 acres, 600 arable and 350 grass. The herd are housed for six months of the year and TMR fed, with no concentrates fed in the parlour. In the grazing season, mid-April to mid-October, the cows are outside full time and receive TMR after each milking. The herd is averaging 9000 litres at 4.35 butterfat and 3.45 protein with a calving index of 405. Milk is sold to Arla under the Arla 360 scheme.

The ice cream parlour opened in 2003 and has become a successful farm diversification. The idea behind Morwick Dairy Ice Cream is to provide a fresh, quality product that can be sold direct to the public. An ice cream trailer attends local shows and events and will be situated in Alnwick Castle during the summer. An ice cream counter and bike attends weddings and receptions. Ice cream is also supplied to local coffee shops in individual tubs. Raw milk has been sold for four years, and more recently a raw milk vending machine has been installed. An Education Room to host school visits allows pupils to see for themselves how a modern dairy farm works, and more specifically where ice cream hails from - the milk's journey of 20 metres from cow to cone.

Cow families to look out for include the Brown Girls, Tulips, Ruths, Peggys, Kirstys and the Fawns, the stand out cow family are the Queens, who can be traced back nearly 80 years. Winning the Royal and the Highland interbreeds in 2002 with Morwick Sand Queen EX96 was a very proud moment.

At present sexed semen is predominantly used, with Belgium Blue used on the bottom end. Service sires include Lyner Oblique Focus, Pam Ayr Hawaiian, Biddesden Hector, Swaites Dermott and Pie X Yellow. Conventional semen includes Gwynnog Primetime and Troutbeck Skyfall. On the Tuesday morning we will be hosting a Judging Seminar from 10:00am until lunch time, non- Conference delegates will be most welcome to attend.

CONFERENCE

Park Farms

Park Farm extends to an area in excess of 3000 acres encompassing predominantly permanent pasture, intersected by woodland on the banks of the River Aln. The majority of the land is within the walled boundary of Hulne Park, an area located to the front of Alnwick Castle forming part of the landscape designed by Capability Brown.

Park Farm is the centre of the estate's livestock enterprise, with the current farmhouse and steading dating back to the 1820s. For many years the estate ran the renowned herd of Alnwick Castle Dairy Shorthorns, which won both national and international acclaim, with bulls being exported as far as Argentina, South Africa and many parts of Europe. Today, Park Farm runs a flock of 1450 ewes and 42 suckler cows, managed by one full time farm manager.

Prior to the building of the current Park Farm, a site on the edge of Alnwick known as the Duchess's Dairy was established in 1920, which housed a herd of Ayrshire cows and signalled the family's great interest in developing their own 'home farm'.

In addition to farming, Park Farm works hand in hand with other enterprises such as forestry, sporting, and nature conservation, and also provides several miles of permissive public access.



Marleycote

The Marleycote herd of pedigree Dairy Shorthorns dates back more than 90 years. The dairy herd was established in 1932 by the late Geofrey Baynes and is now managed by his grandson Richard assisted by Lewis Short.

The herd comprises of 20 Dairy Shorthorn and 90 Ayrshire cows and their dairy replacements, alongside bull beef. Marleycote Walls runs to 165 acres, along with nearby Woodnook Farm of 120 acres. Cropping is mainly grass with 40 acres barley and 20 acres wheat for whole crop silage. Although breeding the right type of cow is more important than her blended percentage, the show ring plays an important part in the breeding decisions, so if possible the aim is to keep the percentage over 50%. The aim across the herd is for a cow to last seven to eight lactations with an average yield of 8000 litres whilst getting straight back in calf with minimal health problems.



The herd is nationally renowned for quality and over the years has an impressive show record at the country's top agricultural shows, including Northumberland County, The Royal Highland and Dairy Event. Cattle from the Marleycote herd are also regular and successful competitors at the North East All Breeds Dairy Calf Show and the All Breeds All Britain Calf Show. The Great Yorkshire Show remains the family's favorite show, successes there include:

- 2011 Marleycote Barrington Iris winning Shorthorn Champion and Reserve Interbreed Champion.
- 2012 Morwick Fawn added to her long list of show successes with the Ayrshire Championship.
- 2012 Marleycote Apricot VG86 Heifer Champion and Marleycote Sea Lily 21 VG87 was awarded reserve Ayrshire Champion.
- Marleycote Songstress 20 VG86 was heifer Champion and Reserve overall in the Shorthorn classes.
- 2015 Marleycote Brown Nell 20 EX93 took the Ayrshire breed Champion at the South West of Scotland Dairy Show.

A sale of note during 2013 was the Ayrshire - Marleycote Sea Lily 14 - and the Shorthorn - Marleycote Princess Jill 31 - selling to the Mclean family in Northern Ireland, both cows have won many breed and interbreed championships with Lily scoring EX94 and Jill EX95. We currently sell 70% of the milk which our cows produce, in bottles. Milk is delivered to over 150 customers throughout Northumberland and Tyneside. Customers include shops, coffee shops, restaurants, ice cream makers and bakeries. The latest innovation is the placing of the first milk vending machine in a suburb of Newcastle. This is proving very popular with the customers and is selling considerable volumes of milk.

In 2009 the Baynes family decided to invest in two Lely Astronaut robots, along with a new purpose-built shed. This was designed with cow comfort and ease of management in mind. There are 124 cubicles, a slatted floor with eight months slurry storage beneath and a straw yard for up to 20 cows. The cows are fed a simple diet of grass silage, wholecrop wheat and brewer's grains in winter with an 18% nut in the robots. They are grazed through the summer and buffer fed silage. Current Classifications: 17EX, 34VG, 30GP and 10G.

The next class, the senior milk cows saw the big guns in the ring with two cows shown that had previously taken breed champion at the show, Ardmore Janet 136 by Sandyford Supreme and Sandyford Honesty Blizzard by Heydale Blizzard, both from John & Michael Hunter, who had to settle for second and third respectfully to the winner Sandyford Lucky Honey, by Sandyford Lucky Charm, from the McLean family.

When it came to the Championship it was a fantastic spectacle in the ring and Aussie judge Rob Anderson tapped out his senior milk cow, Sandyford Lucky Honey, for his Champion and Reserve was Threemile Bella, who was also the exhibitor bred champion.

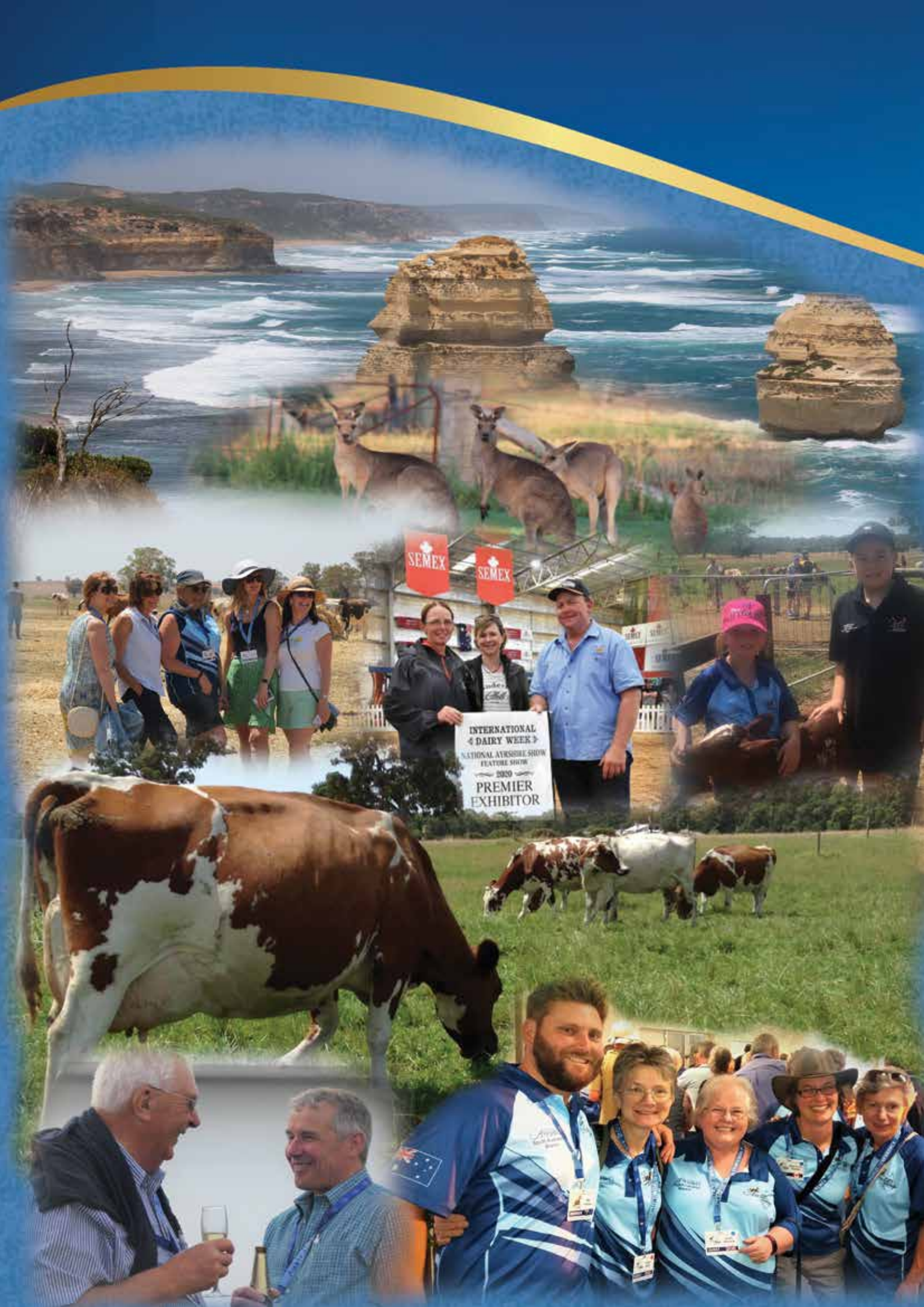
