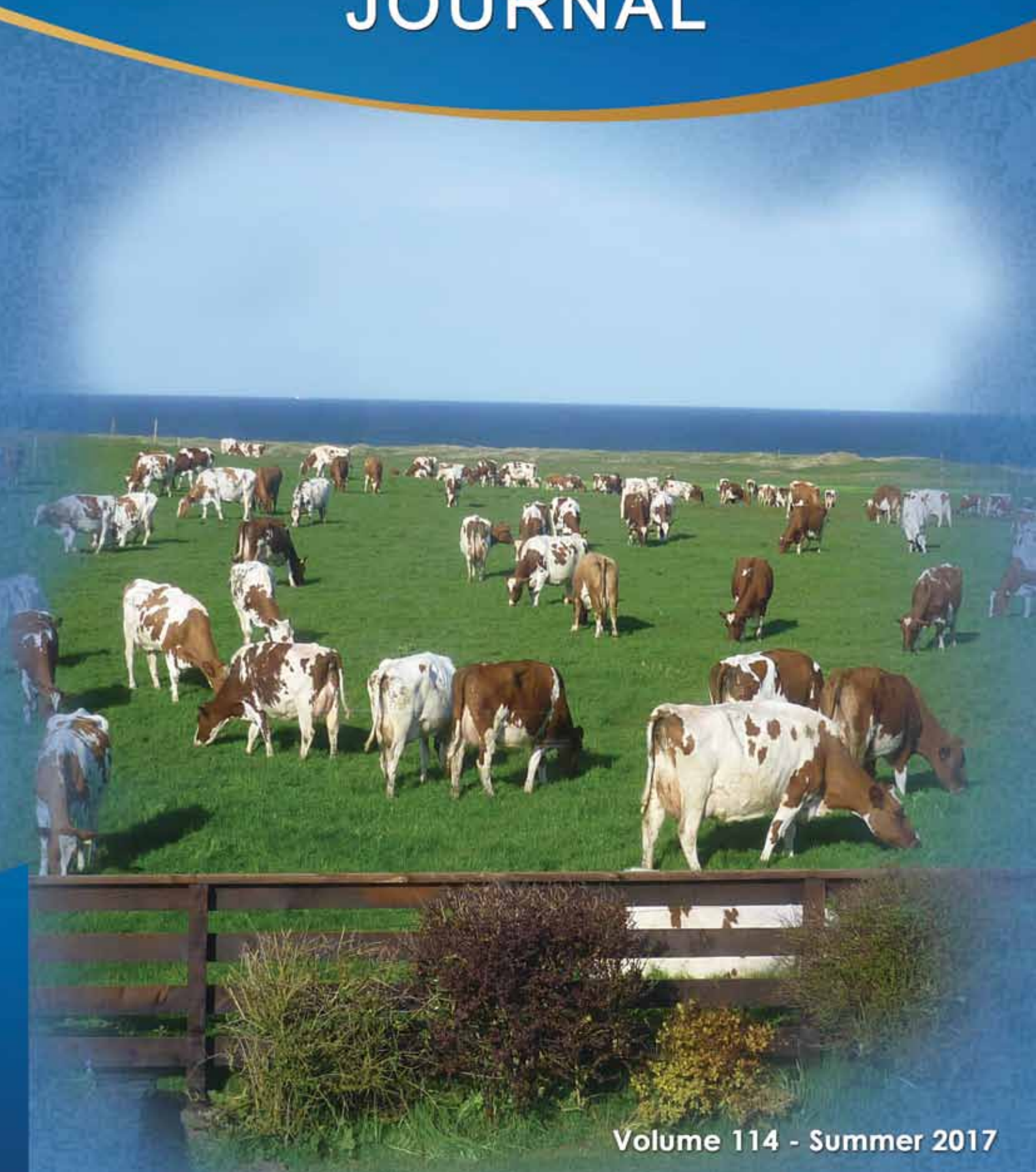
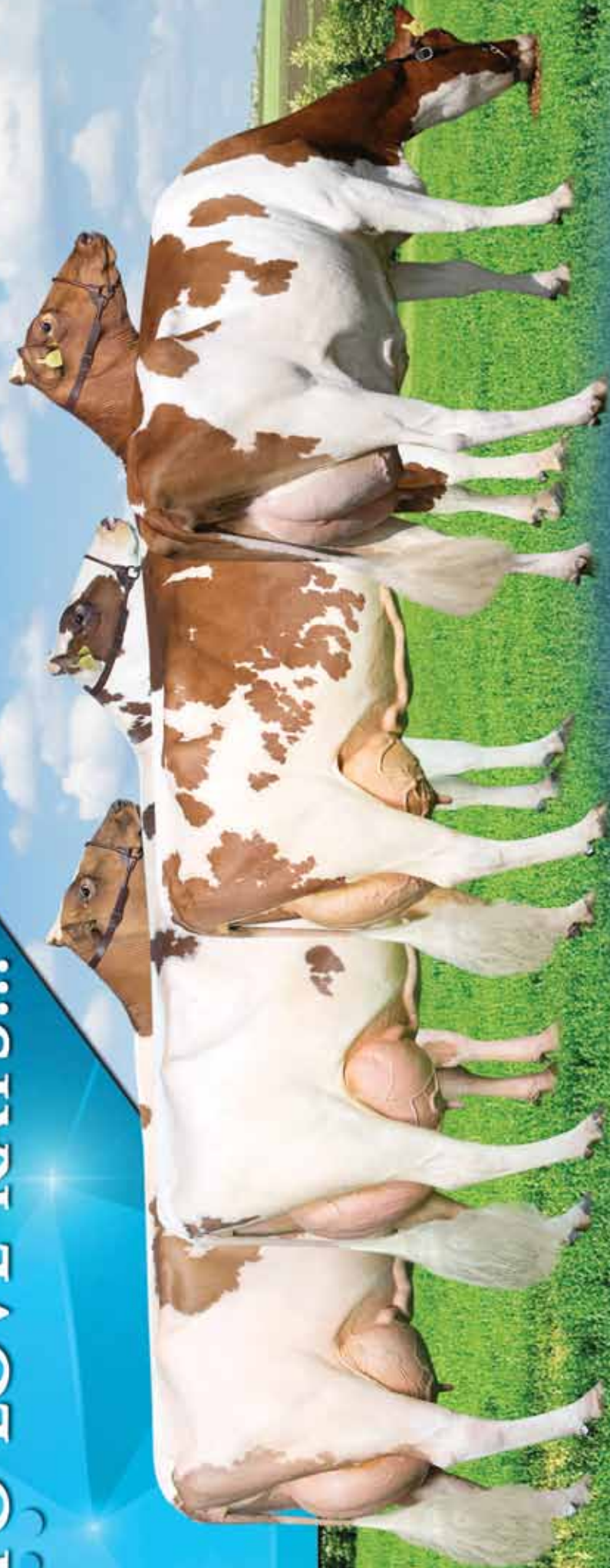

Castle Hill Farm, Harrogate was a lifetime member of the Ayrshire Cattle Society since 3/4/1950 and her prefix 'Woodhouse Grange' will be recognised by many. Honorary President of the Ayrshire Cattle Society

It was proposed at the 2017 AGM that Mr Jim Lawrie of Cuthill Towers be appointed as an Honorary President of our Society. George Templeton, the proposer, stood to acknowledge Jim's role with Ayrshires and the Society.

Jim Lawrie is a man who is a great ambassador and father figure of the breed. In 1981, he was appointed as President of the Society and has served for many years on Council and on the Breed Development committee.

In his early days, he farmed with his brother at Kessington before moving to Cuthill Towers where he established one of the greatest and best known herds in the country. The words 'Autumn Gold' are instantly recognised by Ayrshire Breeders from five continents of the world, taking Cuthill Towers breeding to the highest level!

Jim lets nothing stand in his way (many of you will have encountered this when he speeds along on his scooter), he has always taken (and still does take) a great interest in what is going on at home and in the wider circle of the Ayrshire breed.

He has passed on his passion and enthusiasm for the Ayrshire cow through the generations of his family, through his son Arthur, and grandsons James and David who themselves continue to build on and develop the Cuthill Towers breeding and showing, that Jim had set such a high standard for them to follow.



After George's proposal, Jim Lawrie received a standing ovation from the 120 attendees of the AGM before accepting the honour and thanking George and the Society for recognising him for this position.

George has sat on council for many terms and has also served a long period on the Breed Development committee. He has represented the United Kingdom within the World Federation, where he has travelled all over the world promoting our genetics. In more recent years he has been a Director of Cattle Services Ayr Ltd where his input, enthusiasm and dedication to the company has helped Cattle Services become a major competitor to the large semen companies all over the world.

Anyone who has visited Knowe Farm will know that George is not only a first-class breeder, but a great farmer too. The management and farm surroundings are evident that George puts his all into everything he does. His courage and strength in life and his amazing social ability is the reason he has so many great friends and is admired by so many others.

Accompanied by his wonderful wife Jan, and his lovely daughters, Laura, Claire and Rachel, George received his award from Gilmour Lawrie to a standing ovation. A very worthy recipient of this award!

Breed Manager's Report

Summer 2017

Interest in, and demand for, the Ayrshire breed seems to have reached new levels; a continued stream of new members and requests for Ayrshire stock from all over the UK has resulted in many of our breeders having sold their surplus heifers for the year, but the demand continues, so if you have surplus stock please use our website facility to advertise so we can direct new enquiries to you.

Although we lost three very influential Ayrshire herds earlier in the Spring I find it so encouraging that we have new breeders coming over to our breed, and also that they are enthusiastic in wanting to be members of our organisation and to continue to register their purchased families in our Herd books.

I have asked several members what they would like to hear from me in my journal reports, all have commented that this is where they hear what is happening, and that they would like me to use this column to explain what I and the Society have been working on. Where do I start?

As you continue to read through this issue you will find reports of much that has been happening over the last few months, including breeders' sales, shows, Young Breeders events and the conference. I hope you will enjoy reading about these events in what has been a very busy period.

One of my main areas of work involves encouraging members to register animals and also to join the classification programme. You only need to read through sale reports to see the difference in prices between animals with good solid pedigrees to those that don't in order to see the difference. A £9.50 investment at birth can reward you with hundreds of pounds of difference at the point of selling. Please feel free to contact me if you need help or advice in registering, whether its one animal or one hundred, we can help with both a price plan and doing the work itself.

With classifications, this is an area where we all benefit from the results. From the society point of view the more classified daughters the more reliable information we have about our breed, for Cattle Services the more daughters of their young sires that are classified the quicker they see the results as a proof for marketing, but the main emphasis is for you, the breeder. When selling stock in the future, buyers will want to see how consistently a family breeds, start by helping create that depth of pedigree; this is how they find out! Also, when choosing sires for your herd you want reliable information on those sires, right? Well, if these females are not getting type scored then you are not receiving the information you need for future sire selection, as the information feeds their sires statistics, any score is better than no score, as no classification creates uncertainty in a family line. Think about the logic on this!





For those of you that are not aware we are responsible for running the World Ayrshire Federation office, which involves keeping communication going with the Ayrshire organisations from all around the world. Since taking on this role we have built a new website www.worldayrshirerefederation.com and joined Facebook, so take a look and keep up to date with our breed worldwide.

Genomics is a word which continues to excite some, but at the same time confuse others. Thanks to the work from AHDB, in gaining access to the genomics of many North American Ayrshire sires, we have been able to create an Ayrshire genomic base here in the UK, which allows us to now genomic test UK males and females. Cattle Services and Breed Heritage have funded the testing of a number of older UK sires in order to help with future testing and reliability figures. A number of young bull calves have been selected and tested in order to help Cattle Services with their stud selection process, more as a guide and to gain knowledge, but one thing is clear, there doesn't seem to be much of a variance between the new information available to us to what we have used previously in the Parental average figures, which is a good indication that the information we currently use is fairly accurate. We are still working on a facility for members to test animals within their own herds and we are close to achieving this, in the meantime, if you wish small numbers to be tested contact me for more information.

Recently I hosted Graeme and Michelle Hamilton, from Australia, who work passionately with the Australian Red breed. They were keen to learn about our breed and I spent a couple of days with them visiting herds in Devon. Stunning scenery and great cows and breeders greeted them, leaving them thoroughly impressed with our UK Ayrshires. For those of you on Facebook, you will have seen their

posts copied to the Society facebook page, which I can only say has been very positive for us, with stunning photos and reviews of each farm the visited.

In June I spent a weekend on Jersey Island, having been asked to judge the Jersey Spring show which I enjoyed immensely. Large numbers and the very relaxed surroundings were a tonic for me and very enjoyable. Lovely people and superb Jersey cows! (Don't panic ... it wasn't on Society time). I believe it is known as a busman's holiday!

And to Breed Heritage. I have not spent as much time as I would have liked to recently, but that doesn't mean nothing is happening. I am always reviewing animals on my travels, adding females born from our matings onto our list; recently added families for consideration in our programme include Bloomer (Bruchag), Sandy Rose (Harperfield) and Miss Norma (Plaskett). I think one of our biggest hurdles is bringing in outcross bloodlines - which we are looking to address. Please feel free to discuss any breeding you feel we need to include into our programme and sires you wish us to use on the programme; we are always open to any of your thoughts.

Please all remember that on September 13th we will be holding our National Ayrshire Show at UK Dairy day in Telford. Come along to support us in what will be a superb display of UK Ayrshires. Details are on our website.

Remember I am here to work for you. Contact me directly to discuss any thoughts or ideas you may have on the focus of the Society.

A Trip of a Lifetime, Matthew McLean



Winning the award was the best thing I've ever won, but to discover that I would be jetting off to New Zealand as part of the prize was amazing. My journey from Dublin to Wellington was a long haul but definitely worth it.

My first farm visit was to the renowned Ayrshire breeder and judge Selwyn Donald's stud. During my time there I got to see his show cows and gave Simon Tognola (Toggs) and Paul Murphy a hand to clip some of the cows. Katie Davidson was also staying and working for the Donalds so the craic was mighty.

I travelled to the New Zealand Dairy Event next where it had been arranged by the committee that I was to work with the Cox Family. I enjoyed their hospitality and being part of their show team. I did get a chance to take one of Selwyn's heifers into the young handler's competition and was placed second in a class of thirty. It was a fantastic three day show with some super Ayrshires. All dairy breeds were well represented with about 400 cows/heifers in total but in contrast to our shows there were only a few trade stands.

Selwyn was a great host and showed me all the best aspects of the New Zealand relaxed lifestyle (even had time for a bit of golf). I'm not sure if you know this about Selwyn but his favourite TV programme is Mrs Brown's Boys, so my nickname was Dermott Brown and Paul Murphy was Buster Brady. I can't go without mentioning Lorraine (Selwyn's partner) who was the perfect show mummy washing my clothes and cooking for us so we never went hungry or thirsty!!!

On the next part of my trip I flew down to the South Island and went to Donald Green's farm. It is a large scale dairy unit with 1800 commercial

cows and three milking parlours. It runs like clockwork due to the large number of workers (there was even a boy from Donegal working there).

As a complete contrast I went to see Cheryl Ford's farm one night. She milked eight show type cows / family members!! She had used Ardmore Crown Napier and Haresfoot Elegance on her cows (Cheryl liked the UK breeding style). She was one of the most enthusiastic Ayrshire breeders and I can only aspire to be like her when I'm in my seventies.

My last farm visit was to Jolanda, Tony and David Ackermann's farm. They have 400 Ayrshire cows run on a commercial system. They were putting in silage while I was there and instead of using a silo with walls it was put in a big pile beside the yard and covered.

All the farms had irrigation systems, something we definitely don't need in Northern Ireland.

To conclude my trip I went to the South Island show. It was like a one day county show over here, with about 60 cattle and some trade stands. There I worked with Andrew and Rachel Stewart's Cresslands Show Team.

I would like to thank the Ayrshire Society for not only providing me with a super Ayrshire young breeders rally every year but a competition which is second to none, and a prize which I can only describe as a once in a lifetime experience which I will never forget. I would like to thank all my host families, Ayrshire New Zealand, Duncan Hunter and of course Claire Kimm for organizing and reorganizing my schedule (it wasn't an easy task due to my laid back character).

13th – 16th April 2017

Competitions included Stock Judging, Sire Selection, Clipping, Holding and Showmanship. The main aim of the event is to offer training and tuition for these competitions to the junior members (experienced and beginners alike) whilst the results of each of the competitions go towards the Hugh Stevenson Memorial Trophy (for the over 17 year olds) and the John Cochrane Trophy for the younger competitors.

Competitors arrived throughout the day on Thursday 13th April. Our huge thanks must go to Jayne and Caroline McConnell for the many trips they made to the airport, to ferry our Young Breeders to the hotel. A last-minute plea from the early arrivals to do some herd visits resulted in two, to Thomas Gordon's Grove herd and Raymond Stewart's Fortfield herd, where we saw some great cows and heifers. Following dinner that

evening James Lawrie and Stuart Williams had organised games and entertainment for the delegates to get to know each other better, which caused much amusement for those of us observing!

Friday morning, and it was on the bus to head to Bangor, to the Drummond family's Cottown herd, for the Stock Judging. Lisa Window-Walker kindly gave a demonstration on judging and ring etiquette before delegates judged and gave reasons on two classes, this was followed by the opportunity to view the herd, and for some very welcome refreshments.

It was nearly lunch time we then boarded the bus to head for Templepatrick, to the Beechmount herd belonging to the McConnell family. Here we were treated by the family to a wonderful Hog Roast (with all the trimmings) before getting stuck into the sire selection competition. Those who had done this competition before got straight into the evaluation process, whilst all beginners and juniors were split into small groups for tuition in understanding bull proofs and linears. Thanks to James, Stuart and John McLean for helping me take these groups, which from the feedback was very much appreciated.

Sam's Update

Summer 2017

2017 has seen a slight upturn in dairy farming which has resulted in an increase in sales; the top selling bulls are similar to last year with Hilltown Oblique, West Mossgiel Modern Reality and Rosehill Vitality leading the way, and the newly released sires, Ravenhill Victory and Beeline Santa Rock, have also sold very well. Interest in UK genetics from abroad has also been very promising this year, with export orders and enquires coming in from Australia, New Zealand, North America, Scandinavia and South Africa, and I feel that the rest of the world are now taking a lot more interest in the great genetics that we have to offer in the UK.



West Mossgiel Modern Reality daughter, Calderglen Herd

On farms and at shows Cattle Services sired daughters continue to shine; in the show ring the Champion at Ayr Show was sired by West Mossgiel Class Talent, and the Highland Show saw a daughter of Change Stadium win; Cheshire Show was won by a Stamford High Definition daughter, and the Royal Cornwall Show saw a Barr Regent Daughter triumph; whilst out and about on farms West Mossgiel Modern Reality daughters continue to impress with their great bone quality and super feet and legs. If it is great udders that you are wanting then Rosehill Vitality continues to produce great mammary systems on his daughters. The Haresfoot Simply Perfek daughters combine great width throughout with superb udders, they are getting better with age, the second and third calved daughters are really maturing into great cattle. Another bull of note is East Church Patrolman; daughters are deep cleaned boned cattle with fantastic well attached udders. In the calf pens the Sandyford Supreme daughters stand out, they are upstanding powerful calves displaying great width throughout.

The first batch of UK genomic tests have now been returned. Although the overall reliability is still just below 50% the results are very promising, and they seem to be very similar to the UK predictions. As a trial Cattle Services also tested Haresfoot Panache, who already has a full UK proof, and it was very pleasing to see his genomic and daughter proof being nearly identical; we are now awaiting another batch of results. Please contact Cattle Services if you have a bull calf born that you think may be of interest to us and we can arrange to test him.

In each issue for the next four journals I will profile bulls available from Cattle Services that excel in a certain trait. This issue will be the fat and protein focus, the winter journal will be a type focus, the spring 2018 will be a production issue and the summer 2018 will focus on PLI ratings.

Today, most milk contracts are weighted towards fat and protein. This means that it is important to look at % fat and protein alongside the weight of fat and protein in a bull's proof. Cattle Services have a fantastic line up of bulls that fit these criteria; below are some of the stand out ones that have semen available today.

Jane's Summer Blog



Jane Barnes

Hi, I'm Jane Barnes, married to Mark Barnes and, with our children Charlotte & Harry, we farm at Somerby in East Leicestershire. Our 180 cow 'Somerby' Ayrshire herd produces milk for Blue Stilton at Long Clawson Dairy. For the past 15 years or so I've also give talks to groups - "Tales from a Dairy Farmers' Wife" - which is all about my life on our family run farm, telling amusing stories and real life anecdotes! I am passionate about educating people about dairy farming and regularly Tweet/Facebook pictures of our cows/calves etc. I also have my own pony, Norman, which I enjoy riding across our farm and a lovely black Cocker Spaniel, Beattie. I am also the chief calf rearer each spring, and this year we've had exactly 50 heifers! We run a grass based, spring calving, low input system, and you can see me most Friday mornings with Beattie, walking the fields - grass measuring!

Today is a very wet June day! Finished the silaging; finished the calving; house nice & tidy; everything's been fed and watered including the family; too wet to mow the lawns, so I've found time to sit at my computer and write my first "diary" for the Ayrshire Journal.

Returning home from another fabulous Ayrshire Conference, we had left our son (Harry) in charge, but not for the first time. Last September we left him to it, when we flew off to the World Ayrshire Conference in USA, only relieved he hadn't sold the herd whilst we were out of the country! Once again, our livestock was all present and correct upon our return! Phew!

Generally we're on the "dry" side of the country, so our herd is outside grazing from the start of calving in February to end of November. I see this morning the milkers aren't too happy, all standing under the largest hedge in the field. We milk recorded last night too, and with all the newly calved cows and heifers, (we're a spring block calving herd) we have all been guessing how many are in milk? The answer is 158! Even so, we need this rain periodically, to keep the grass growing for this lot, don't we!

Now calving is over, we're into "bulling season", and this year Harry is keen to use AI to help out our Ayrshire bulls, Billy Beaumont and Quaker (Earthquake due to his mum being called Seismic!) or the backup bull - Eric (a Limousin).

My 'townie' audiences love hearing about the bulls when I give my talk "Tales from a Dairy Farmers' Wife". I learnt my skills as a public speaker whilst in YFC many, many years ago. Now I try to explain and make comparisons of the cows' life cycle to us women! One comment I always use in my talks, that Mark made many years ago, and which always raises a laugh is: **"All the females on the farm should be pregnant EXCEPT the WIFE, the DOG and the DAUGHTER!"** How true!

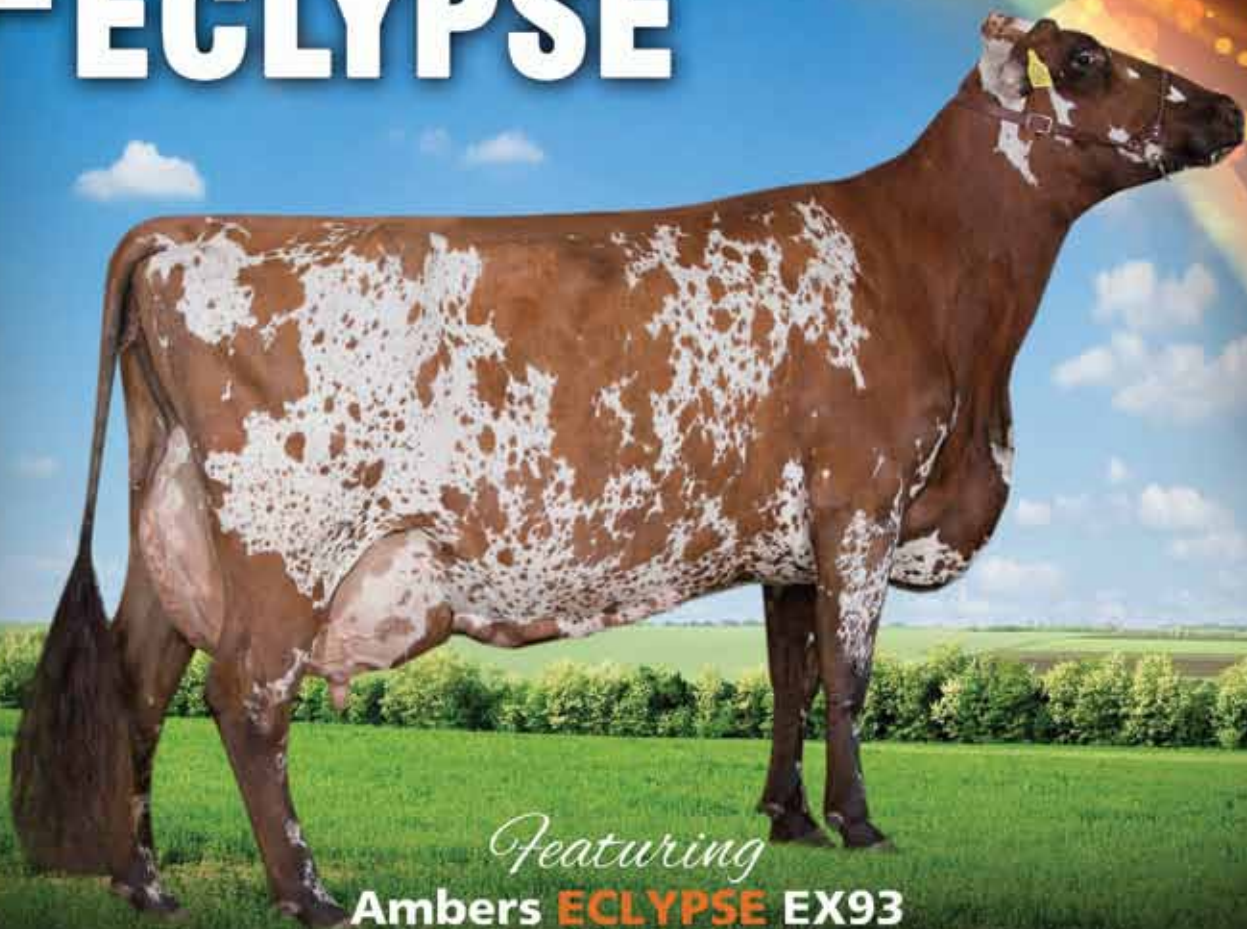
As well as giving talks to various groups throughout the year, I also host groups for farm visits. This afternoon, in the rain and wind, a small group of ten people, from Kettering Scout Fellowship, bravely battled the weather for a visit to the farm on one of my "Farm Walks". Being from the Scout movement, I knew they'd come well prepared for the weather. As all our stock are outside we walked up the fields to view the cows grazing, through the gusts of rain, and saw the weaned calves in the new shed. Back to the shelter of the parlour to watch the first cows being milked, then feeding the baby milk calves. Most visitors when asked what they've learnt from their visit exclaim "what hard work" it is on a dairy farm. I've shown many groups around our farm over the past eight or nine years, and plenty are shocked at the amount of work and ask us how many staff we have? When I say, "just the family", they really have their eyes opened! We finish the tour with the obligatory cup of tea, homemade cakes and, of course, Stilton Cheese and biscuits, and sent them on their way!

This morning I was lucky to have had a call from our daughter Charlotte, who's half way through her three month stint working in Pennsylvania, USA for the event rider Buck Davison. It's amazing how easy she can call us on Facebook! Working very, very hard with 40 horses to ride daily between five of them! She started in Florida, near Orlando, and then drove for twelve hours with a trailer full of horses to Kentucky to their major four star event. After a week of competition, she drove another eleven hours to Unionville, Pennsylvania. She's leaving at the end of June, for a few days in New York, before flying home for a rest! That's what you do when your 22!

Every Friday, throughout the growing season (Feb - Nov) I set off with my "plonker" to measure the grass growth in each paddock and then input the measurements onto the AgriNet computer software to create a grazing wedge! It's a good hour's walk for me and Beattie, who loves putting up pheasants, chasing the odd bunny or trying to catch a hare or two! I love the walk, especially the beautiful scenery of our valley and hearing the munching of the herd, happily grazing in the fields, seeing the hedgerows and trees blossom and bloom (and not another person in sight). It makes me feel happy and contented with my life. What more can I ask for?

Ayrshire Cattle Society 2017 Conference - Ayr

Ayrshire Cattle breeders took over the popular Western House Hotel, near the Ayrshire coast, in May of this year for the annual Conference and AGM. 120 full delegates with a further 100 enthusiasts and locals attended farm visits over our three-day event.

On Monday morning, following the Council meeting, it was time for the conference to start with the Society's Annual General Meeting and presentation of prizes. The agenda kicked off with the finance and Presidents reports and election of officers. The following positions were unanimously agreed.

Junior Vice President – Michael Howie (Morwick) Northumbria
Past President – Gilmour Lawrie (Brieryside) Ayrshire

Jim Lawrie of Cuthill Towers, Milnathort was then awarded the honour of Honorary President of the Ayrshire Cattle Society. In his acceptance speech, he said he was both honoured & humbled to be receiving such a prestigious position.

After the formal part of proceedings was over it was onto the buses for a showcase of local animals at Catrine House, kindly hosted by Willie Templeton. Delegates were shown a selection of outstanding local animals from numerous breeders, all clipped, washed and show ready, whilst being treated to some delicious refreshments, before heading back to Western House for dinner.

It was an early start on Tuesday for a visit to Holehouse Farm in Kilbirnie, with Alastair Logan showing delegates his herd of cows in a facility admired by us all. This herd of 255 cows has huge production averaging over 10,000 kg and are housed all year round due to the average rainfall of around 80 inches! At each farm visit during the conference there was

to be a judging competition with a secret judge and the winners would be announced on the final evening. Two classes kicked off the proceedings at Holehouse.

Luckily the rain held off as the bus crept higher towards Martin McHarg's Crofthead herd at Croftside Farm in Ochiltree. Martin had also turned out two exceptional classes for delegates to judge, followed by a walk around the dairy herd where daughters of the home bred Croftside Jonah really did impress us all.

By now the number of delegates had swelled to uncountable numbers who turned up to enjoy the superb hospitality at 'The Knowe', by kind permission of George and Jan Templeton. Despite a heavy downpour, delegates were keen to view the cow families on show with some 80 years of history and were certainly not disappointed. The aim here is to breed hard wearing, high producing, long lasting cows which was evident with what we saw. Great families and daughters of new young sires created much interest and excitement.

Delegates taking part in the alternative programme enjoyed a trip to Dumfries House which forms part of an estate that was purchased (for £45m) for the country by a consortium headed by Charles, Prince of Wales. A 60 minute guided tour of the house presented the highlights of the furniture collection, the history of the house and its owners. Lunch was provided in the house with delegates having some free time to look round some of the beautiful attractions, the Walled Garden and Chinese Bridge being the main highlights.

All delegates joined together for the final visit of the day, to Pocknave, to celebrate 100 years of Carnell Ayrshires with the Templeton family. The prosecco was flowing and Graham's were on farm offering tasters and ice creams which went down very well with everyone. One of the highlights at Pocknave was viewing the Carnell Snowdrop family, separated out from the herd, to demonstrate what a consistent breeding



family they are, with Snowdrop 258 especially causing interest as she had an embryo package in the conference sale happening later that evening.

Local farmer Grant Woodburn, who is the chairman of Ayr club, and his wife Diane entertained guests at dinner that evening with beautiful singing, and Grant's sister, Jill, showed her talent with some traditional Scottish dancing. An address to the haggis, bagpipes and deep-fried mars bars certainly finished off a wonderful meal. This was followed by the Conference Sale – see separate report.

The first visit on Wednesday was to Myremill Farm, set in a picturesque setting near Maybole, where Kevin Lawrie showed delegates his superb new set up which was two years old to the day. 260 cows are currently milked at Myremill who are contracted to produce 7000 litres a day throughout the year by Nestle. Yet again another superb class of cows for judging was put forward as would continue at each visit throughout the day. A personal highlight was viewing the beautiful young cow and member of the Breed Heritage programme, Brieryside Oblique Cherry, who in many ways is close to perfection.

The sunshine set the scene at Brocklehill where Keith & Shaun Rennie delighted delegates with a display of animals steeped in history and admired by everyone. Their young show cow, Brocklehill Eldorado Waterflower, was there for us all to see and looks like she will continue with her winning ways in the future. Brood cows with production and longevity couldn't fail to impress the delegates, and with the enthusiasm shown from Shaun the Brocklehill herd will no doubt continue to prosper.

The ladies enjoyed a visit to Braehead Cook School for a cocktail & canapés demonstration and got to sample cocktails: Citrus Fizz, Tiki Rum, Hairy Berry, Passion Fruit Gin and President, followed by beetroot and goat's cheese crostini, Thai prawn skewers with chilli and mango salsa, lemon meringue pie and cherry and chocolate mousse. After watching the experts, the ladies got the opportunity to be hands on which proved a challenge for some and a breeze for others; using the blow torch to brown the meringue was definitely scary to watch!





Last but by no means least was a visit to Sandyford farm, home to the conference hosts Gilmour and Caroline Lawrie and family, where numbers had reached over 230 people. The ladies got to test their skills by doing a small painting under the guidance of local artist Jan Laird. Jan had brought along some of her outstanding pieces for the ladies to purchase, which proved popular with many. Another exceptional lunch and display of animals were on show including the recent Ayr Show Champion Bruchag Talent Evelyn. Whilst walking around the herd it was evident that the sheer capacity and strength, and tremendous udders, are the reasons behind the super production and longevity of the herd. The herd can be traced back to Ayrshires first registered in 1896 and will certainly be registering for many more years to come. The sun shone throughout the day and with many sponsors and supporters present it was a fitting end to a fantastic conference, with everyone coming together for some hospitality on the lawn at Sandyford.

200 guests attended the final black-tie dinner and dance with speaker Robbie Duncan providing an entertaining speech. The winners of the judging competition were announced and awarded cash prizes which I believe were spent in the bar afterwards! In first place was Alan Timbrell, second was Grant Woodburn and third was Peter Berresford.

One more award was to be presented at this point for a lifetime achievement and work for our breed and the Society. Gilmour Lawrie paid a fitting tribute and announced the award winner, George Templeton, to a standing ovation.

The last item on the agenda for Gilmour before the dance was the handing over of the president's badge to incoming president Philip Williams from Haverfordwest, Pembrokeshire.

Gilmour's wife Caroline and children Louise, Emma and Kevin couldn't be prouder of Gilmour for the conference vision he brought to fruition and for being an inspirational ambassador of The Ayrshire Cattle Society.

2017 Ayrshire Cattle Society Conference sale

Each year at our Society conference, it has become tradition to hold a semen and embryo sale of interesting and popular genetics. Cattle Services (Ayr) Ltd offer for sale a selection of semen packages and Ayrshire breeders are asked to offer embryo packages of interest.

This year's sale was held following a drinks reception hosted by Cattle Services Ayr Ltd with John Barclay taking up the role of auctioneer and Society Breed Manager, Duncan Hunter, promoting each package.





First up for sale were the semen packages which averaged £50 per straw. Top price was £60 per straw for the package of 10 doses of Morwick Sand Ranger purchased by Mungo Bryson, Ayrshire. Mark Nicholls from Devon paid the second top price of £58 per dose for a mixed package of two sires, Forever Schoon MM Cornelius and Ben Ferme Amigo.

An exciting package of embryos, with a bonus of a guarantee of a heifer calf, created lots of interest and furious bidding from around the room. The offer from the Lawrie Family at Sandyford Farm was for the successful bidder to take five embryos from any cow with the Brierside Prefix from either Sandyford or Myremill Farm and mated to a sire of choice. The final bid was for £5800 for the package of five embryos (£1,160 per embryo) from a syndicate of Colin Mair (Townhead), George Templeton (Knowe), Arthur Lawrie (Cuthill Towers) and John Watson (High Mark). The second top priced package was purchased by Gilmour Lawrie, Sandyford Farm for five embryos out of Carnell Snowdrop 258 EX92 3E sired by Hilltown Oblique (sexed) or West Mossgiel Modern Reality, consigned by the Templeton Family at Pocknave, for £520 per embryo.

Ayrshire Success

The 2017 show season kicked off in Carlisle at the Dairy Expo. A strong show of Ayrshires was forward for the judge, Blair Weeks, to assess and place. Mungo Bryson took the honours of the day when his fifth calved **Changue Martha 49 EX95 2E** by Changue Stadium, she took the eye of Mr Weeks with her youthfulness, balance and style giving her the advantage over the Reserve, Andrew Rimmer's three-year-old Holmeswood Elegant Bella VG86.



The first of the spring shows was Balmoral in Northern Ireland. John and Michael Hunter's Ardmore herd were on top form, winning every class they had entered and taking the Champion and Reserve Champion. Their shrewd purchase at the Sandyford reduction sale payed off as judge Robin Barr awarded **Sandyford Honest Blizzard EX94 2E** (Heydale Blizzard) the top honour of Champion, with their home bred two-year-old Ardmore Prime Ella VG87 in Reserve. Honest Blizzard then went on to take the Reserve Interbreed Champion ending a memorable show for the Hunter family.



There was a good turnout at Ayr Show this year, where Alex Kirkpatrick tapped out as his champion **Bruchag Talent Evelyn VG89** (West Mossiel Class Talent) from the Lawrie and McAlister families.

Breeders at Devon County Show put on another strong display of Ayrshires, where the judge, Tom Crawford, selected Chris Creeper's **Gargus Jemima 3 EX93 2E** (Palmyra Tri-Star Reality) as his Champion with Chris and Nicki Lockyer's two-year-old Hunnington Toni 3 in Reserve.

Robert Gray from Goldstone Ayrshires had great success when **Goldstone Mabel 140 EX92 2E** (Visserdale Stealth) won the Interbreed Champion at Surrey County Show. Having had five calves and only six years old, Mabel 140 has won here before and looks certain to be back another day!

A wet and windy start for the Royal Cornwall Show did not dampen the spirits of the exhibitors, although judge for the day Geraint Thomas needed some assistance in drying out! The Walters family were out to repeat last year's success, and this time it was Becky Walters who won the Championship with **Reid's Crimson Tulip VG87** (Barr Regent) and Hunnington Toni 3 repeated her Reserve Championship run from Devon County for Chris and Nicki Lockyer.

Cheshire Show unfortunately lacked numbers this year, but judge Steve Bailey still had several to contend for champion. The two-year-old Stamford High Definition sired **Stamford Western 44 VG87**, from the Ultram family, took the honours of the day.

The Royal Highland Show was one of the best for a number of years. Quantity and quality were in abundance for this year's judge, Lisa Window-Walker, to deliberate over. The day started with the British Red and White Classes, where Junior Champion was awarded to Eastford Atomium Kiwi Red from the Yates and Lawrie families, with the overall Champion going to Brian Weatherup with **Parkend Dictator Scarlet Red**.

The Ayrshire classes were witnessed by big crowds around the ring, with tough classes for Lisa to place. Her Junior Champion was awarded to the milking heifer, from Arthur and Susan Lawrie, Cuthill Towers Elpaso Easy Lady VG87 by the homebred Cuthill Towers Elpaso.

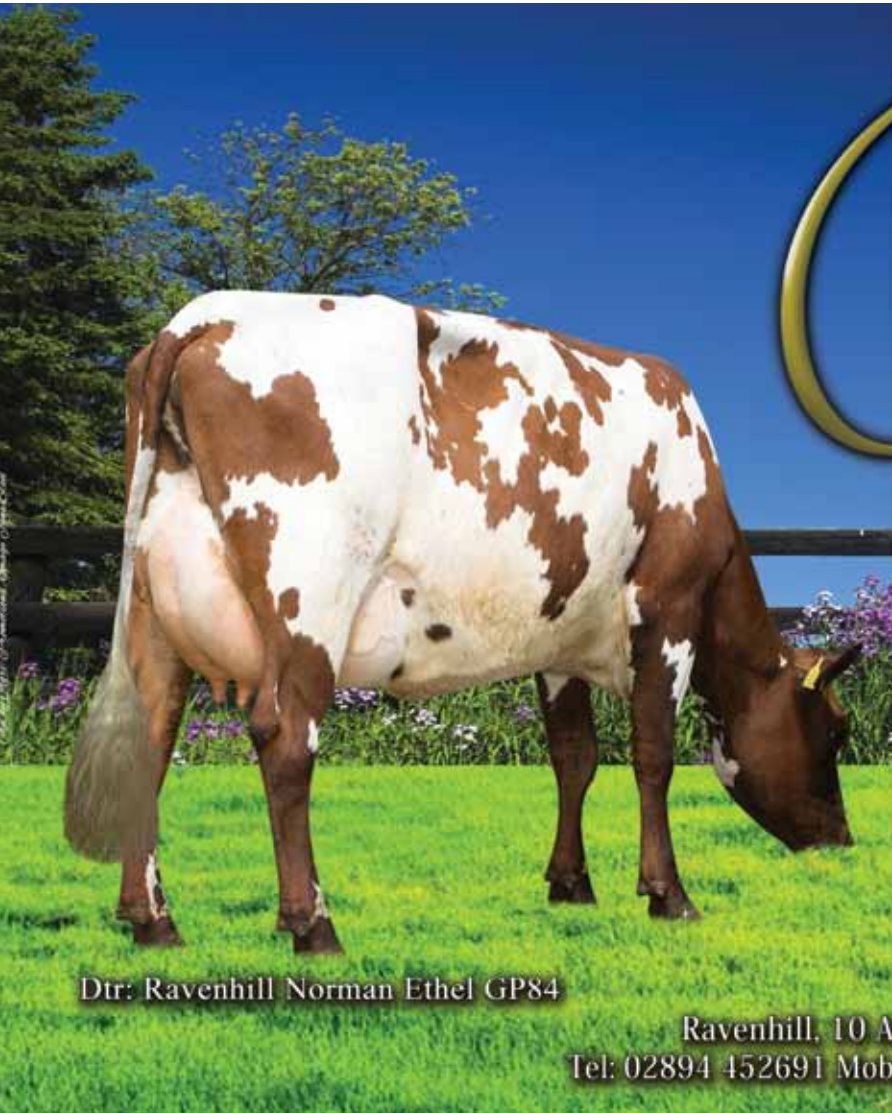
The cow classes continued to impress throughout the day, and with the Championship line-up displaying such great quality it was a tense wait in anticipation of the results. Lisa tapped out **Changue Martha 49 EX95 2E** repeating her Expo win for Mungo Bryson, Swaites Dainty 11 EX90, from John Adamson, was in Reserve and Troutbeck Burdette Jess 3 from the Mattinsons was Honourable Mention. Changue Martha was later awarded Reserve Interbreed Dairy Champion. Congratulations should also go to Jay Adamson with Swaites Beauty 24, who on the Sunday went on to win the Interbreed Calf Championship.

The final show to report on in this issue is the Royal Norfolk Show, and the Interbreed Championship for the Ayrshires rounded off a clean sweep for the Tomlinson family's Sandyford herd. **Sandyford Mayflower 14 EX94 2E** (Mapleburn Remington) fought off all the other breeds to take the show's top honours under Holstein judge, Mike Winters. In the breed classes Judge Alan Timbrell placed Sandyford Burdette Penelope in Reserve.

Sales Roundup



The spring of 2017 unfortunately saw the dispersal of three Ayrshire herds. All three sales were full of quality which appealed to many of our existing breeders and also to the many new members and breeders who have joined our Society this year.

The Dispersal sale of the **Longwood Herd** of Ayrshires, the property of Tom Crawford and family took place at Beeston Castle Auction on Friday, 28th April following the Month End Dairy Sale.

The herd was established in 2003 with the purchase of a pedigree calf as a present to Tom from his family. The herd grew and ran alongside the family's pedigree Topcroft herd of Holsteins, but the decision to reduce numbers in the milking portion substantially has resulted in the dispersal of the Ayrshires, and what great support they had, as the herd was dispersed to all corners of the country. Amazingly this small herd of cattle was distributed to purchasers resident in 22 different counties from Ayrshire to Cornwall and from Essex to Pembrokeshire.

The top seller was the superbly bred Longwood Remington Bella ET, a daughter of Mapleburn Remington and out of one breed's most prolific dams, Haresfoot Bella 6th (Ex95-7E) 3* who has bred progeny to gross well in excess of £20,000. This February '15 heifer was due to calve in June and sold for 4800 gns to Andrew Rimmer for his Holmeswood herd.

There were then three animals that achieved a figure of 2300 gns each; the first was Longwood Crown Margot (Ex90-2E), a fourth calved cow who freshened in January, she was sold, giving 53 kg, to John Smith of St Osyth, Essex. Also at this price was the very next cow in the ring, Longwood Regent Trixie (Ex92-4yr) who had calved her third in December and was giving 41 kg daily, she sold to Philip Jeffries of Welshpool, Powys. The third at this figure was the first in-calf heifer to be sold, Longwood Kellogg Tapioca ET who was imported as an embryo from Canada, she was purchased by Brent Crothers of Pulverbatch, Shrewsbury.

The young stock were a tremendous group of cattle and sold extremely well. The leading maiden heifer was Longwood Gentle Marie, a 100% pure daughter of Duo Star Gentleman and out of one of the herd's foundation cows, Moorside Marie 7th (LP80) (Ex94-7E), who had earlier in the sale sold for 1500 gns carrying her ninth calf. Gentle Marie sold for 2100 gns to Philip Jeffries. The top priced calf was the 10-month-old Longwood Rockstar Sandy Rose, by Kamouraska Rockstar and out of the show cow Longwood Woodrow Sandy Rose. She made 1800 gns to Philip and Stuart Williams of Haverfordwest, whilst the mother went for the same price to Brent Crothers. Another member of this family, Longwood Barrel Sandy Rose, an in-calf heifer maternal sister to the top priced heifer calf, earlier sold for 1900 gns to Robert McConnell of Templepatrick, Northern Ireland.

It was the end of an era when, on the 10th May at Borderway, Carlisle the **Bailiffscourt** pedigree Ayrshire herd was dispersed in front of a huge

crowd of buyers who had travelled from the four corners of the British Isles to be part of this special event. These famous Ayrshires, from the Mulgrave Estate, owned by the Dowager Marchioness of Normanby and managed by Keith Thompson, has had many successes over the years at the Great Yorkshire Show and in the County herd competitions.

Topping the trade was an in-calf heifer from their leading Hortense cow family sired by Haresfoot Khan, Bailiffscourt Hortense 284 was bred from two Excellent 91 dams with her grand dam being the famous Hortense 267 (by Horseclose Jubilee) who featured in an Ayrshire Journal publication a few years ago. This well grown heifer displayed a lot of potential and sold for 1,600gns to JA McGarva from the Horseclose herd near Annan. The Horseclose herd also purchased Bailiffscourt Dawn 3 (by Stamford Missing Link) for 1,550gns, Dawn was half way through her first lactation and had recently classified VG 86 and was due with her second in October. Bailiffscourt Thyme 12 sold for 1,500gns to J & J Kinloch, Walton Farm, Dumbartonshire, she was a VG 85 heifer sired by Haresfoot Khan and due again in October to Ardmore Crown Napier.

Heifer calves sold well and topped at 880gns for a daughter of Ardmore Crown Napier from an EX92 Horseclose Jubilee dam. This ultra-stylish calf was purchased by Peter Berresford for his Heydale herd in Derbyshire.

The McAlister family have been land holders on the Isle of Bute as far back as 1506, and are the only farmers in the British Isles to have won National Dairy Shows in all of the past three centuries. The dispersal of their pedigree **Bruchag** Ayrshire herd at Borderway, Carlisle on the 10th May was to say the least an historic event, and featured some of the best Ayrshire cattle to be sold at Borderway for some time.

The trade topped at 6,200gns with fourteen animals selling for £2000 and milking heifers average £2162, the trade of the day was for the young heifer calves with 36 averaging £742 and topping at £2200.

The top price went to Bruchag HP Bloomer sired by Brieryside High Profile and bred from a Bankend Brown Bomber dam. Bloomer was a freshly calved heifer with a close to perfect frame and fancy udder, she was purchased by R Danforth, Walton Lodge Farm, North Yorkshire for 6,200gns with contending bidders from Ayrshire and Northern Ireland. Another impressive heifer was Bruchag Burdette Mara, by Palmyra Tri-Star Burdette, she was Grand Champion at last year's Rothesay Show, due again in September to Bruchag Starman, Mara was a powerful framed animal with a cracking mammary and sold for 3,600gns to J&J Kinloch, Walton Farm, Dumbartonshire.

Topping the trade for the cows was a herd favourite; Bruchag BR Jewel Queen (by Barr Regent) due with her third in early October, and is a great prospect for Agriscot in November, she was purchased for 5,000gns by G Lawrie, Sandford Farm, Ayrshire. The Reserve Champion from the 2016 Rothesay Show, Bruchag Bloomer 3 (by Poos Stadel Classic) and due again in September, sold for 3,200gns to R Danforth, Walton Lodge Farm, N.Yorkshire. A world class young cow that we will see in the show rings later this year was Bruchag Talent Jewel Queen (by West Mossgiel Class Talent), placed second in the heifer class at Rothesay Show in 2015 to the two times All Britain winner Bruchag Talent Evelyn, she now joins the Marleycote herd in Northumberland for 2,800gns. Her heifer calf sired by Bruchag Starman sold for 2,200gns going to the Lessnessock herd of Adam Montgomerie in Ayrshire.

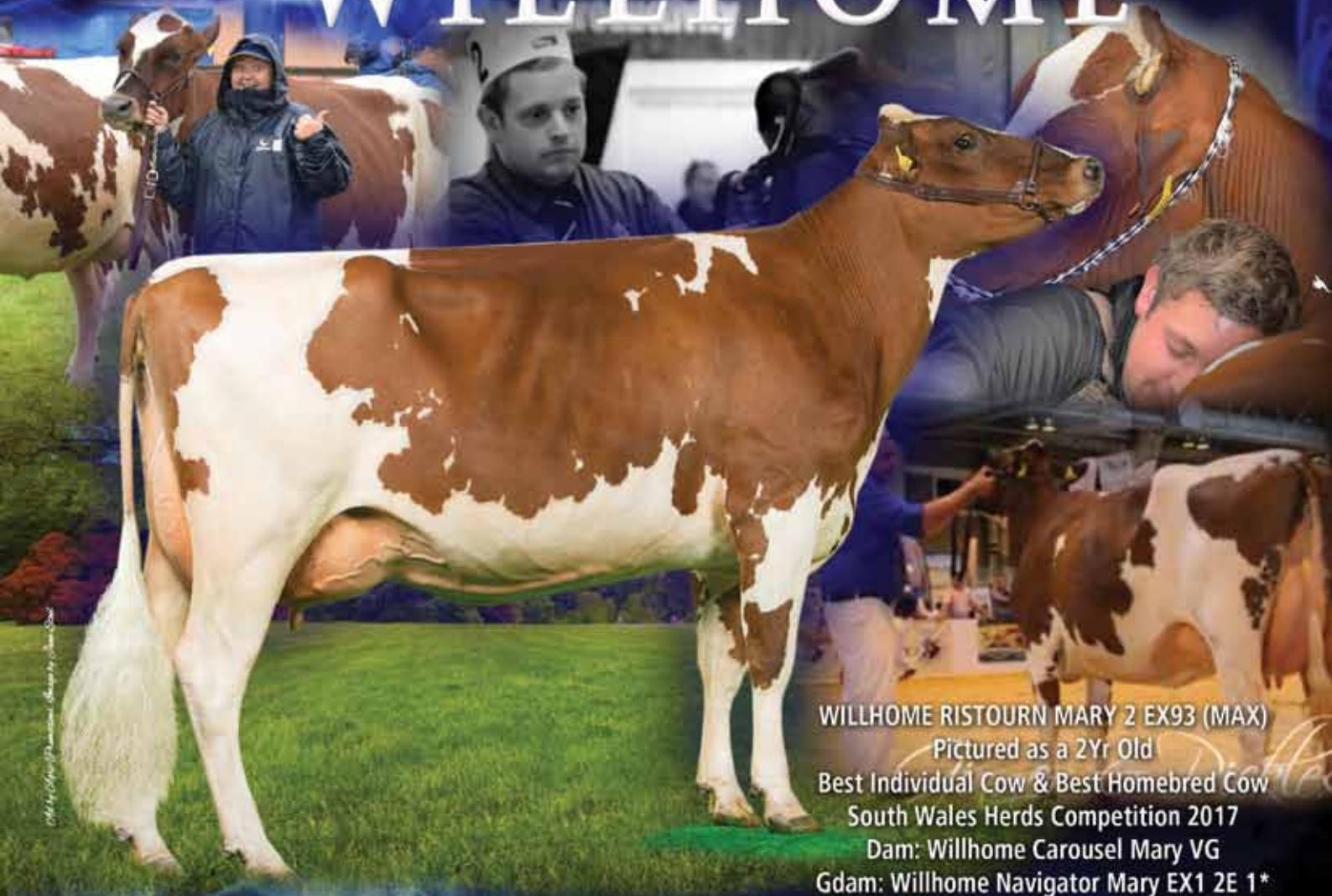

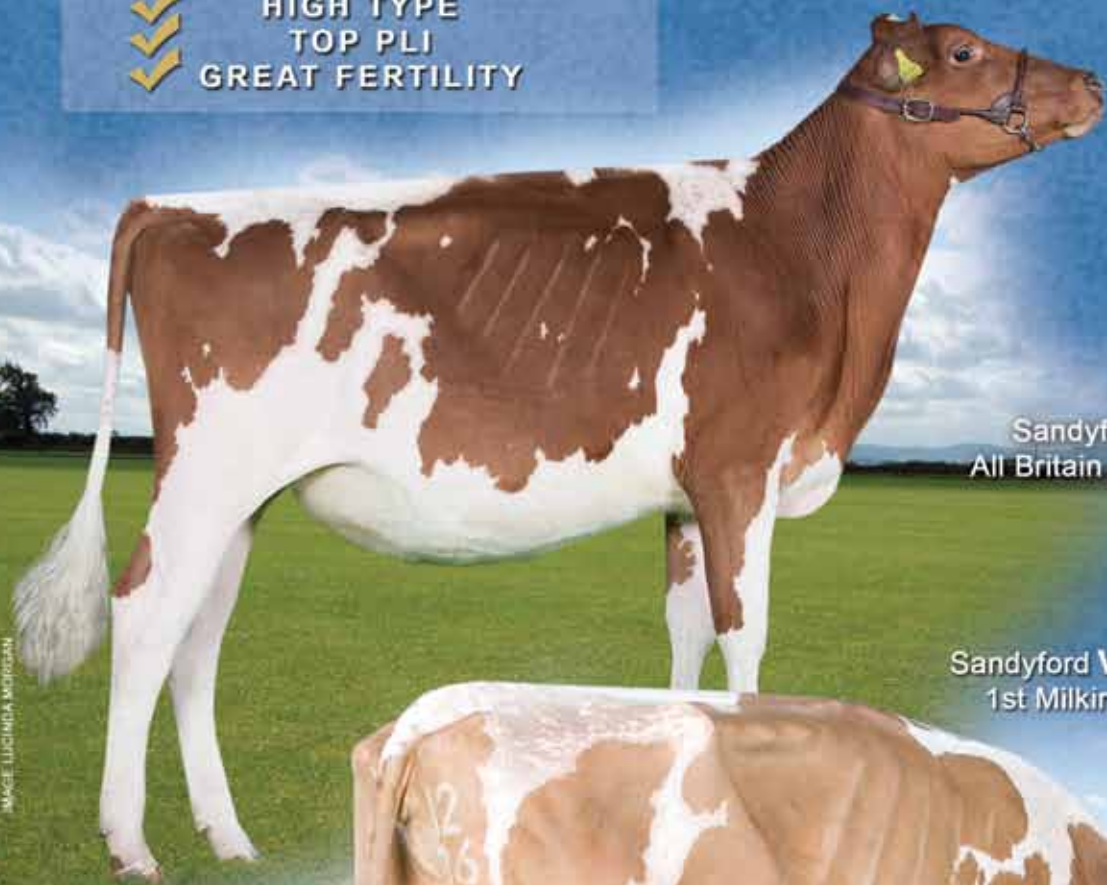

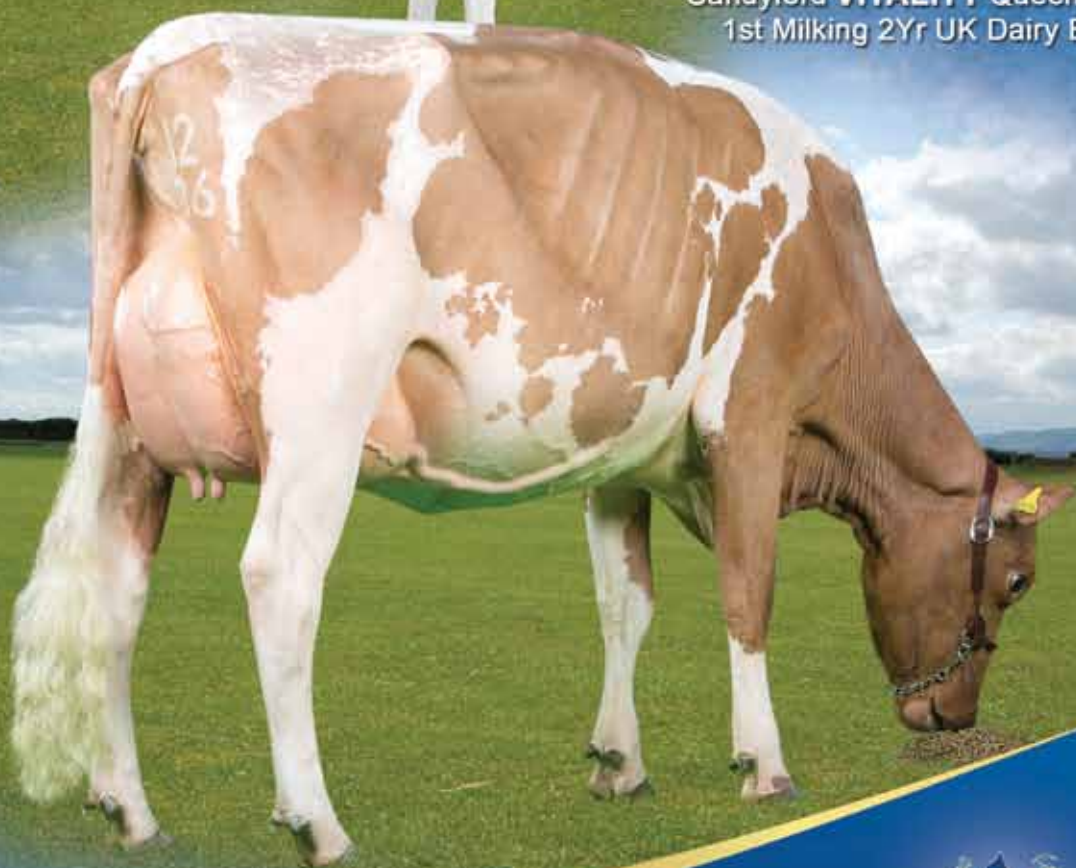
