

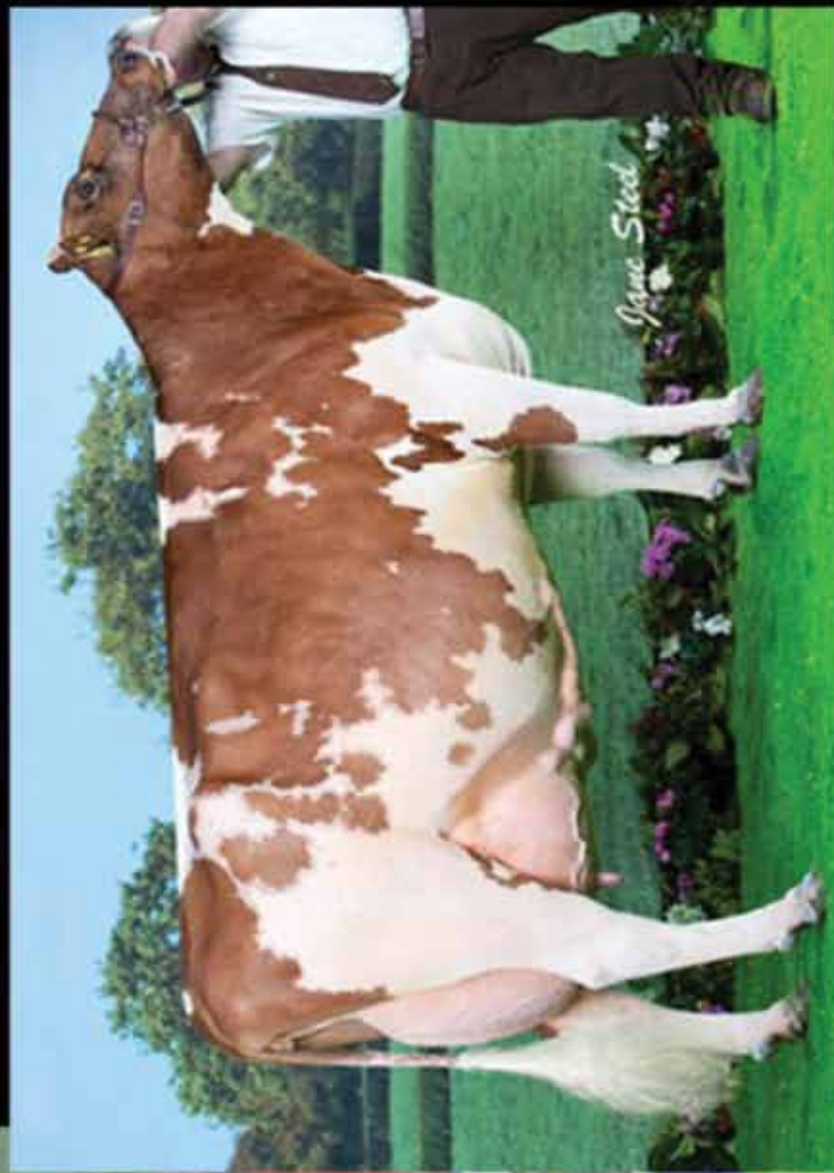

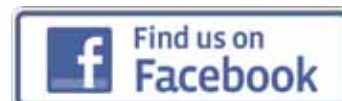

Obituaries

Robert Carruth

The sudden and unexpected death of Robert Carruth has robbed the farming world and the Ayrshire breed of one of its great philosophers. Robert, the seventh generation to farm at High Auchensale, was deeply interested in his fellow human beings, and instilled the same values in his own family of three sons and a daughter. Although we think of him as a very successful breeder, and he was immensely proud to have five bulls in AI, all at the same time. He had always been involved in politics and education, and at the time of his death was still involved with the NFU as well as the project nearest to his heart, the education of children on farming, and he was often to be seen in class rooms all around Renfrewshire, where his work with the Royal Highland Educational Trust gave him great pleasure. Predeceased by his wife Margaret in 2008, Robert was aged 76.

John Gregson

John Gregson died in January aged 68 years. He lived and farmed at Slate Farm, Mawdesley all of his life. He was married to his wife Margaret for 47 Years and had three children, nine grandchildren and two great grandchildren. A keen member of the North West Ayrshire Club, he was Chairman in 1972, while his wife Margaret has been Secretary of the club since 1995. He was a great supporter of the club and hosted the first few of their calf shows at Slate farm. These were wonderful family occasions, with calves for anyone to show, a game of rounders and a splendid hog roast provided by John. The Mawdesley herd was about 80 strong, winning many of the herd competitions and shows in the North West and also having lots of success nationally. With daughters of his famous stock bull, Pant Wizard, he won the Hindmarsh Trophy on two consecutive years, with different sets of cows. At the Royal Show, he won the progeny and open groups and at the Scottish Winter Fair he was reserve champion on two occasions, whilst at the Dairy event, he won breed champion on three occasions. John's whole life was centred on farming and family, and even though in later years they milked black and white cows, his heart was always very much with the Ayrshire cow – but it had to be a good one.

John Lamb

John Lamb who developed the famous Richhill herd in Co Armagh, has died in his 88th year. Along with other pioneers of the breed like Ian Duncan of Lennymore and the Suffern boys of Ballyclan, he was one of founding fathers of the breed in Northern Ireland. In the early fifties, John purchased a 200 acre farm near Richhill and it wasn't long before the predominantly Shorthorn herd was replaced by Ayrshires with great success, with bulls being sourced from famous herds in Ayrshire like Willoxton, Hobsland, Parkmill and Balig. Along with his flare for cattle breeding, John served on many public bodies, like the Milk and the Wool Board and he also served terms as Chairman of the Ulster Club and was a staunch supporter of the Y. Farmers movement and his local church.

Janet McWilliam

Well known and respected breeder and judge, Janet McWilliam, has died after a short illness. From small beginnings, along with her husband Hugh, they developed the Low Barnultoch herd with hard work coupled with a large amount of skill, until the Low Barnultoch herd was well known, not only in its homeland but around the world. Over the years, the successes were impressive, whether winning Society competitions,

Club competitions or their local or county show. Being a woman in a man's world was no barrier to Janet, and when she judged the Ayrshire section at the Royal Highland in 1991, she broke the mould by being the first woman to do so. A similar judging assignment in the Ayrshire ring at the Royal Ulster gave her immense pleasure, as she had a soft spot for Northern Ireland and its people. She shared with them the ability to be totally honest whether giving praise or criticism which was always constructive and never negative. She had a special gift of summing up a cow, a situation or person with a shrewd comment that was spot on. When the time came to take things easy, with the sale of the herd, Janet and Hugh had time to enjoy life, and they became interested spectators at shows and sales both in Scotland and Ireland. In 2008, their immense contribution to the Ayrshire breed was recognised when they were presented with the Society's special achievement award, fittingly at Brocklehill, source of many of their herd sires. Her other big passion was growing and exhibiting roses, and their retirement to Stranraer gave her more time to indulge that passion. Unsurprisingly, she was even more successful, and she denominated the prize list for many years. Her presence and personality will be sorely missed at Ayrshire events.

Breed Secretary's

News... By John Cochrane

It is hard to believe that this is my ninth year of writing this page, and sadly, this will be my last one as your Breed Secretary as I have decided to relinquish that post after this year's AGM. It is always hard to decide on the right time to bow out, but for me, now is the time. I have always been my own biggest critic, and it became very apparent at the last Council meeting that my ambitions for the Ayrshire breed and its future are at a different level to those of others.

My wife tells me that I expect too much of people, and she is probably right, but I make no apology for making my priority the promotion and improvement of the Ayrshire breed as, in my view there is no other reason for having an Ayrshire Society. If you just want to register ancestry and performance we have that facility, and I am happy to provide as good a service as is possible for my members benefit, but that very much takes second place to promoting Ayrshires.

However, I don't think that I am asking too much of my members or colleagues by asking them to put the Ayrshire breed first and their own interests second, either in the Society or in our cattle breeding company. That is not a situation I personally can live with or ignore. Time is everyone's enemy, and in an endangered species like the Ayrshire, the sands are running out fast, if the breed is to have a future.

I have been lucky to have worked with eight great Presidents, especially Willie Adamson and John Broadley, who had the foresight and courage to introduce and implement the use of CDI programmes in the face of well meaning, but misguided, opposition from a small minority of breeders. Change is very hard for some people to accept, and I realise that, but when you come to a crossroads in any walk of life, you have to make a choice on whether to be brave and go down an unknown route or turn back, but one thing is for certain is that unless you choose to go forward, you are going nowhere. For me "turn" back does not even enter my mind.

Through my work, I have made so many great friends who share my passion for Ayrshires, I am sure they will be equally there for Duncan

when he needs them too. Please keep that passion going so that other generations can enjoy the Ayrshire cow. Yes, she too has to change, but not to the extent of losing her identity.

One of the great thrills for me has been the friendship and support of my Young Members, who have been incredible, and I have often found myself buoyed up and carried along by their enthusiasm and energy. If they are given the opportunity to express their potential, the breed will grow and prosper, and I look forward to watching that happen.

Most jobs have a downside and an upside, and for me the upside has been the many friends I have made, both here and around the world, whose passion and enthusiasm for the breed has helped me on many occasions, when it would have been easier for me to walk away. You have been an inspiration to me especially my other Breed Secretaries and Presidents from the World Federation countries especially Becky Payne, Linda Ness and Mirja Koljonen, who kept me afloat when the waves threatened to engulf me. I also have to mention Maggie Howie, Colin Christophers and especially Arthur Lawrie for all their help and support when I needed it most.

Duncan has a big job in front of him, but he is one of the most talented and capable young men in the cattle breeding world, not only here but around the world. I cannot think of a better man in whom to entrust the future of the Ayrshire cow. Lastly, I must thank the many members who have befriended me and believed and supported me in what I have tried to achieve, and I hope that I have not let you down.

I still mean to continue to work for a brighter future for the Ayrshire cow whenever the opportunity arises, whether it is here, Europe or the other side of the world, and who knows, we might yet see the breed receive the popularity and credit it deserves.

Conference Sale

Cornwall 2014

Here we are yet again, with another conference sale offering several lots of semen and embryos that I am sure will appeal to many! The semen sale is kindly sponsored by Cattle Services and included are many favourites from the past and more recently.

Rosehill Blackthorn EX - Sired by the great Blackadder BBK Kellogg, and out of the Brocklehill Happy Spirit daughter Rosehill Bramble, Blackthorn has certainly had a huge impact within our breed over recent years. Showing an impressive +1.7 on type, and being a protein improver, he has made quite an impact in many herds. Use Blackthorn to improve legs and feet and to tighten up foreudder attachments. He has sired some great progeny including the EX 96 Rosehill Black Velour, the world renowned Rosehill Black Magenta EX 93, and the young sire that is making a huge impact in the Knowe herd, Richaven Provider EX 95.

Bankend Nucleus EX - Another sire that has made the headlines over the years! From the great Wren family at Bankend, and sired by Pant Great Scot, there is not much in this pedigree that one cannot admire. Nucleus daughters are known for their fantastic temperament and great udders with super attachments. Famous daughters of Bankend Nucleus include - Hunnington Fragrance 25 EX 92, East Church Ambrosia EX 92 and McCormick Ila 9 EX 93.

Langside Impact - Born in 1975, this P. Scottish Welcome sired son, out of Langside Bloomer 29, has made an "Impact" in many breeders herds. He shows to be a positive improver for protein and will improve somatic cell counts. Again, this sire has a good number of excellent daughters with many in the Langside, Killoch and Croftside herds.

Townhead Dahlia's Juror EX - From three generations of Excellents including his dam Townhead Dahlia, this "fella" has been a favourite for many over the years. As well as being a component improver for both butterfat and protein, he will also dramatically improve on somatic cell counts. He also scores well on his linear traits for both foot angle and udder depth. Probably his most famous daughter has to be the great Hunnington Sailor Girl 29, classified Excellent, a four star brood cow, and having achieved well in excess of 100,000 kg of milk in her lifetime. He also has had an influence in the great Lark family from Millford.

Celandine First Lord - This Bankend Lord Ontario son, out of the four star brood cow Changue Celandine 21, optimises what many believe as an ideal breeding tool. He shows a plus on milk production and butterfat improvement and carries a very respectable PLI of £70. Most impressive of all he is a massive somatic cell count improver with -24!! His linear shows that his daughters will inherit a better foot angle, stronger foreudder attachments and improvement in udder support over their dams. Temperament is also desirable in his daughters. A number of excellent daughters of First Lord are evident in the Devas herd, and of course the much admired Wroughtton Janet 2 EX 94 is a tribute to these facts. **If one of these sires has worked for you in the past then why not purchase a batch of 10 straws.**

Again we have a very exciting consignment of embryos for you to choose from, from both the UK and overseas. With home families forward such as Janet, Magenta, Ella, Winsome and Sea Lily, and from Lashburn Ayrshires in Canada we have a real treat in a descendant from the great Mona family.

Three Embryos - Wroughtton Janet 2 EX 94 X Haresfoot Panache (Eligible for Export) : 94% Ayrshire If you are looking for a family to inject some longevity into your herd then look no further. The last four generations of this family have averaged over eight lactations. Behind

these embryos we have two generations of EX 94 and a sire stack of Celandine First Lord x Mawdesley Bright Beam x Pant James Bond x Brocklehill Bank Book. Wroughtton Janet 2 herself has been a contract cow and of course bred Wroughtton Lord Winston. Wroughtton Janet's dam, Wroughtton Ruby 2 EX 94, has bred four Excellent daughters, is a three star brood cow and has produced over 90,000kg in her lifetime. Another interesting fact is that Janet scored EX 95 for legs and feet in her seventh lactation and her dam Ruby scored an amazing EX 97 for legs and feet in her **twelfth** lactation. On the sire side of these embryos, we have Haresfoot Panache whose predicted figures are quite impressive. +474 kg +0.06% bf and a massive PLI of £131! He is a son out of yet another EX 94 cow, Haresfoot Enigma Pamela, whose type, production and components can't fail to impress. Make sure you take the last bid!



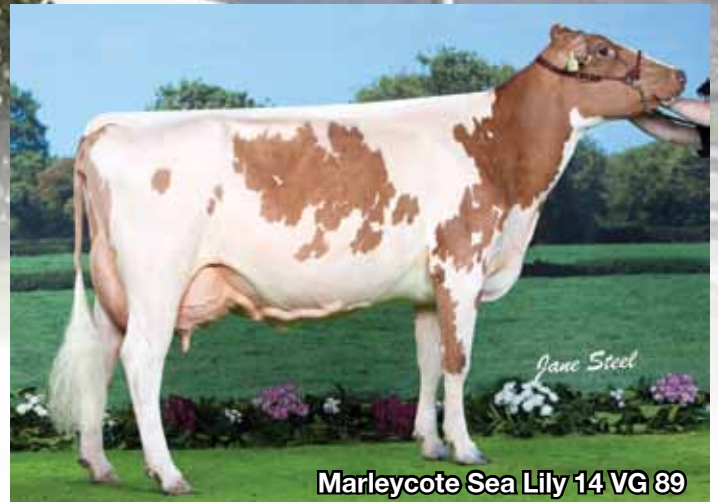

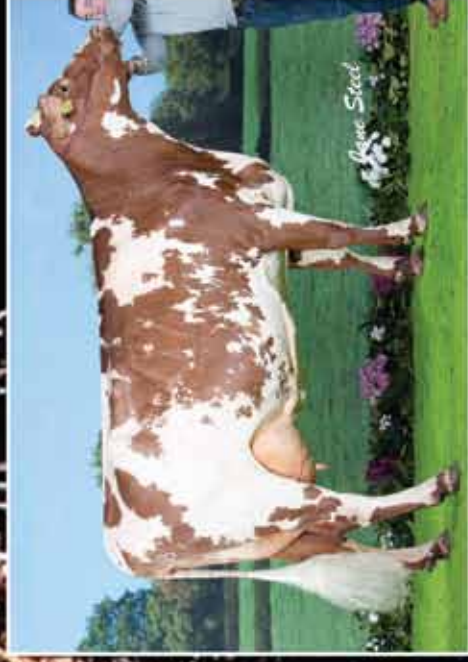

Breed

Heritage Report

by Alan Timbrell,
Breed Heritage Chairman

I sit here writing this report just minutes after a very frank and constructive council meeting, with many things being discussed both in the meeting and in the bar. During the last ten months, since I was appointed as Breed Heritage chairman, it has become apparent to me and others that our breeders do not fully understand the restrictions we have when trying to find bulls of adequate quality, with the required health status, for breed heritage to recommend to Cattle Services.

It is with this in mind, that we would ask our members to be more proactive in the way that we achieve our aims and goals in breeding the next generation of bulls for our breeding program. At this time, I would like to put into practice an eight point plan to help our breeders with what is needed of them to achieve success in putting young bulls on to centre.

1. To contact a member of the Breed Heritage committee or Society staff to inform them of a cow or cows in your herd that may be of standard for a potential bull mother. (Ideally before she calves if pregnant so that we can evaluate the mating).
2. If the cow is of sufficient standard, the calf needs to receive sufficient colostrum in the first six hours of birth. (Ideally a minimum of three litres of high quality colostrum).
3. If your herd is prone to IBR, we would ask you to feed replacement colostrum to your new born calf in the first six hours, and also isolate the calf to either a calf hutch or a building away from the milking herd. I suggest that if you need to use replacement colostrum, you should contact Graham Shepherd Animal Health on 01772 690131 and use First Thirst IBR Elite colostrum powder.
4. House these potential bulls in well ventilated areas away from other calves, and the dairy herd to stop any cross contamination of diseases which they may pick up.
5. Register these calves within days of being born so we can obtain a DNA sample to authenticate the parentage of the calf as soon as possible!
6. At three months of age, and if all criteria have been successful, any chosen bull will be taken on to the collection centre, but only if all the criteria has been reached.
7. The bull will be housed on centre until nine to ten months of age when semen will be taken to check if it is fertile and freezes.
8. The aim will be to sell the first batches of semen one month, on average, after the semen is collected.

Another point I would like to raise with our members is that, as Chairman of Breed Heritage, it would be very beneficial to be able to access your individual milk recordings to evaluate cows in your herd that in the past may have been over looked, or you as breeders have not recognised the potential of these animals to the breed.

All this involves is for you to give me access to your login details to your milk recording supplier, and then leave the rest to me. I see this as a step forward for us to fully understand your breeding policies and your goals. Please contact me if this is possible!

In the past the Breed Heritage Committee has received comments that maybe we don't listen to, or have not taken on board comments from the breeders. I can assure you that my aim is to work along with Cattle Services at this exciting time in the dairy industry to make a difference for our members and our future members. Let's all get together and bring the Ayrshire breed to a place which we can all be proud.

I, for one, am looking forward to visiting Cornwall for this year's Conference to see what I am sure will be some outstanding herds, and talking to many of our Ayrshire breeders. I shall also be visiting herds in Northern Ireland during my visit there to speak at the Ulster Club AGM.

Please don't hesitate if there is anything you wish to discuss with me or any member of the committee. We need information from you, as information and knowledge is the key.

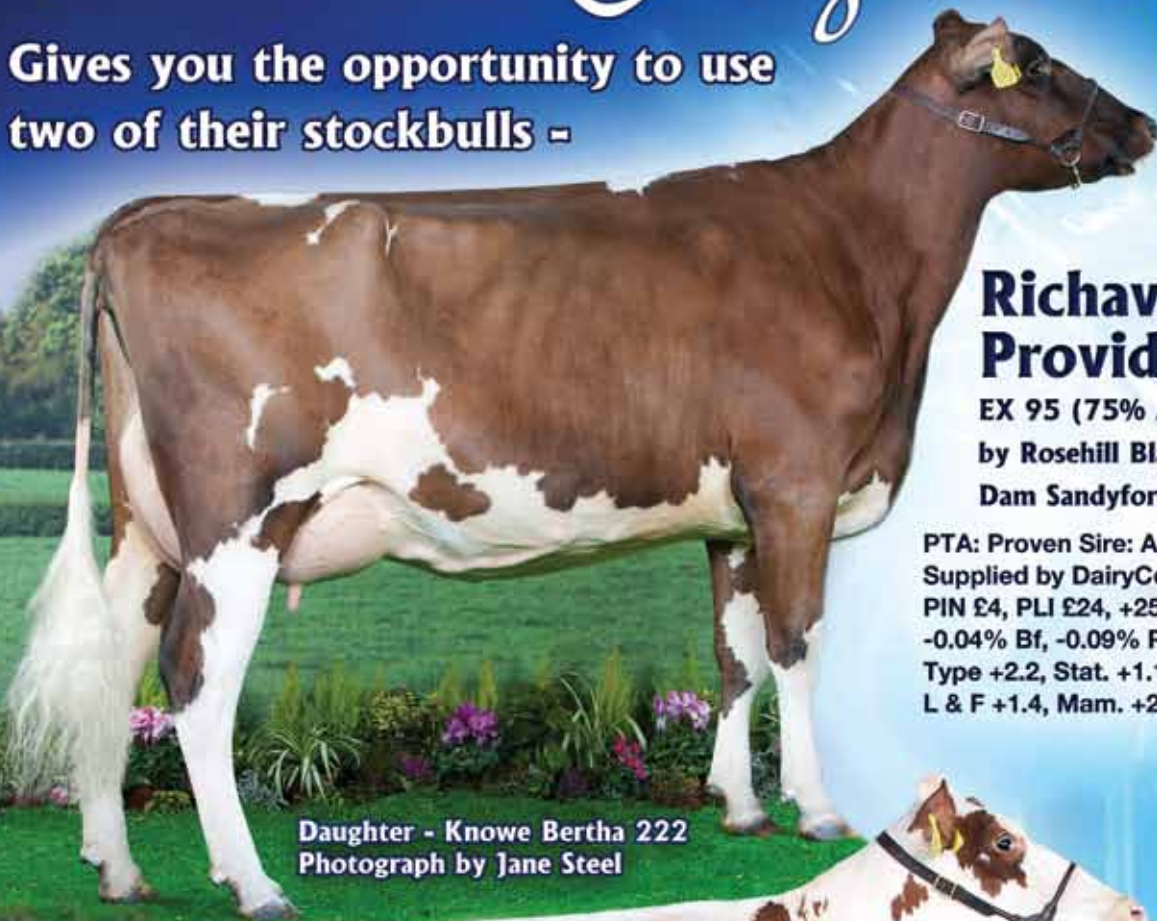

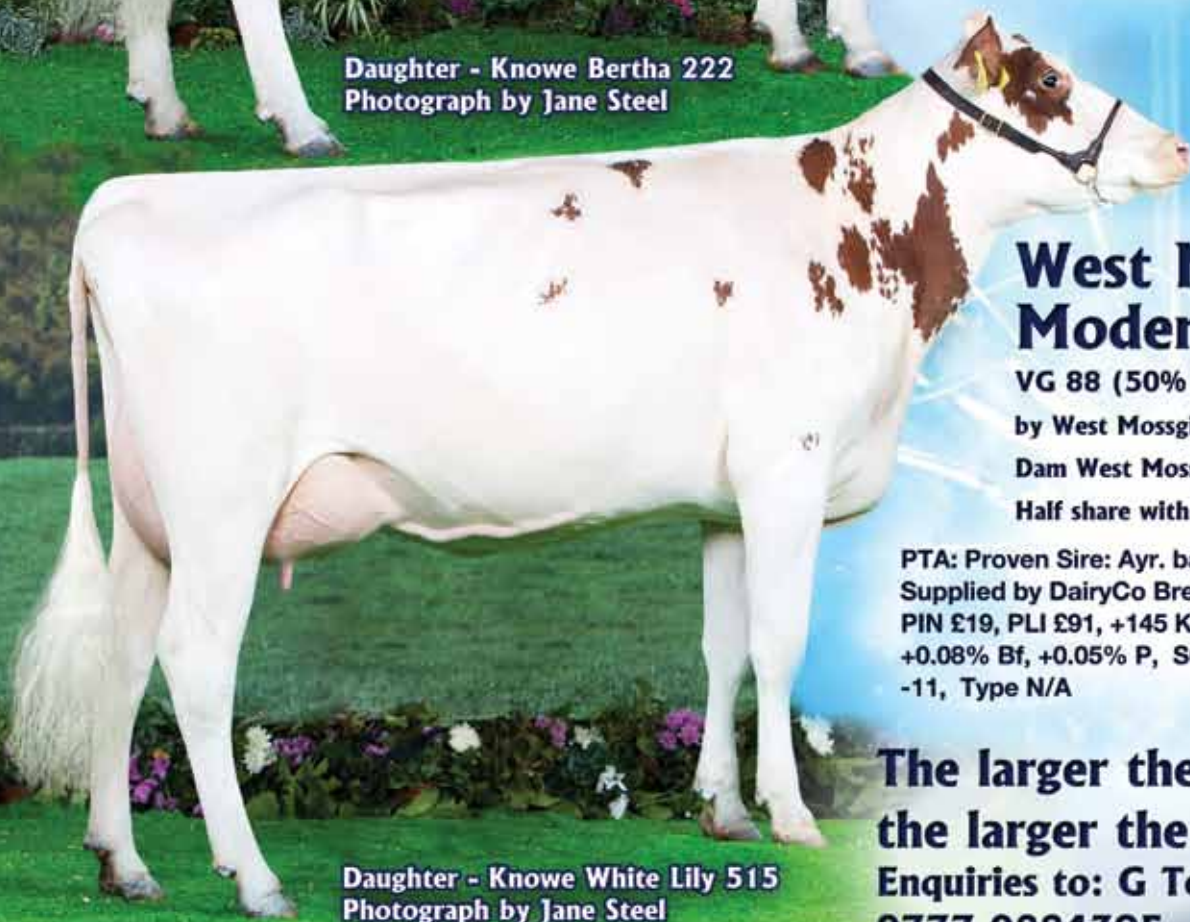

Peter Judges Finland's Ayrshire Winter Show

When I was asked back in September to judge the handling classes at Ayrshire Finland's Winter Show I was very quick to accept. After a two hour delay to my Manchester flight on the Wednesday night, and a stay in the nearby hotel, I set off for Finland on the Thursday morning. When I landed I was told a girl called Linda would meet me in the airport to get me to the train station, along with the three Swedish girls who were doing the Nordic showmanship. Linda found me eventually and all the transport plans that had been organised for me got me to Seinäjoki, where the show was taking place at around 21.30 local time. That night, myself and those taking part in the Nordic showmanship and David Mayo from Australia, were treated to an excellent dinner in the hotel before we all took an early night before the show starting the following day.

The Friday was my spectating day, with David overseeing the judging of the stock. All the classes were an excellent standard. The calves at the top of the junior classes all demonstrated dairyness, clean bone and excellent open frames. Sires dominating the top placings in the classes were Burdette, Dreamer and a Finnish Poker son called Erwin. The Junior Champion came from the final class, the junior two year old heifers, with Laura and Jouko Laiholahi's Joukolan Jamacia (Oblique x Pardner). This heifer was an easy winner in the championship with its stature and power. The Reserve Junior Champion was again from Laura and Jouko Laiholahi, this time with Joukolan Julietta (Erwin x Calimero). Following the junior championship was the Nordic showmanship. This competition comprised of three handlers from Finland, three from Sweden and two from Denmark. Each was allotted a calf, which had been shown that morning, to compete in a showmanship class, with the winning nation hosting the competition the following year. This year's winner was Marie Arvidsson from Sweden – being allocated the junior champion from the mornings show was certainly a slice of luck that is needed when you get no time to prepare for the class.

After lunch it was the in milk classes. The two year old class was lead off by two extremely well balanced Burdette daughters. These were the first Burdette daughters in milk I had seen shown and few could be disappointed with the quality of the two at the top of this class. Both were Burdettes out of Poker dams, a cross that clearly seems to be working. The first placed two year old, owned again by Laura and Jouko Laiholahi, went on to be Honourable Mention in the championship.

The Grand Champion and Reserve came from the four and five year old classes respectively. In Reserve was Korkiakosken Remi Elegance, a cow with tremendous length, dairyness and clean bone (Remington x Pardner) owned by Anu and Jari Ahlholm. As good as the Reserve and Honourable Mention were the Grand Champion really did stand out quite easily as the cow of the show. The Grand Champion cow was AT Havisamanda, owned by Tia and Jyri Tanner and was sired by Palmyra Jerry Bendig, out of a Poker dam. As soon as she walked into the four

year old class she was the one to beat. She had dairyness, power, super locomotion and easily the best udder in the show.

Friday night was the breeders party held at the arena. After dinner there was an unexpected question and answer session with the judges, thankfully it didn't last too long and it was quickly followed by a Finnish rock band. With my judging on the Saturday, I had another early night to keep a clear head for the job in hand the following morning.

Saturday morning was the junior handling with four classes and 23 competitors in total. The standard of the handling was very good, with the top placings in each class being on par with the best in the UK. My Champion Handler was Iiris Nissila, with Suvi Keinanen in Reserve, and Lilli Laiholahi Honourable Mention. Having taken a bit of advice from David the night before over a beer and a bit of cricket chat, I soon got used to giving reasons with a translator. The key to it is, just keep them short!

After the junior handlers was the Sale of Stars with 10 lots sold averaging around 2,000 Euros. With the sale over, I was back to the ring to judge the finale of the show, the Senior Showmanship. This is a class open to anyone over 18. There were 17 entries and to build the atmosphere I was told to drop the worst out one at a time until I was down to the final five. The five then had to be placed in reverse order, down to the last two. With this, the lights went out in the arena apart from those over the show ring, the music built to a climax and the smoke machines came on, that was my queue to tap out my showmanship winner, Sanna Savikko. You would certainly say it was a different way to judge, some might say harsh, but for me it was quite an enjoyable class that drew in the crowd as it came to the end. As for the competitors - everyone has to learn to lose sometime; it's only a bit of fun!

On Sunday, David and I visited three farms on our way back to the airport. It was obvious on all of the farms that the production was high and that the main aim at present is to improve type. You also learn very quickly about the Finnish people's passion for their cows and I believe there would be a good market for UK genetics in Finland. From just the three visits we saw a number of animals that could also have been at the show, to bolster the already impressive 90-100 animals that were present. Sires that stood out were Palmyra Bet On Me and Palmyra Poker Riggins.

To finish, I would just like to thank the Finnish Ayrshire Breeders for my invitation to judge. Everyone was extremely helpful especially Minna Kotila who deserves a special thanks for organising all my transport. For anyone in Finland reading this article, you are more than welcome in the UK anytime and anyone who gets the chance to visit Finland should take the opportunity to do so, summer might be better – it would be at least 30°C warmer than winter!

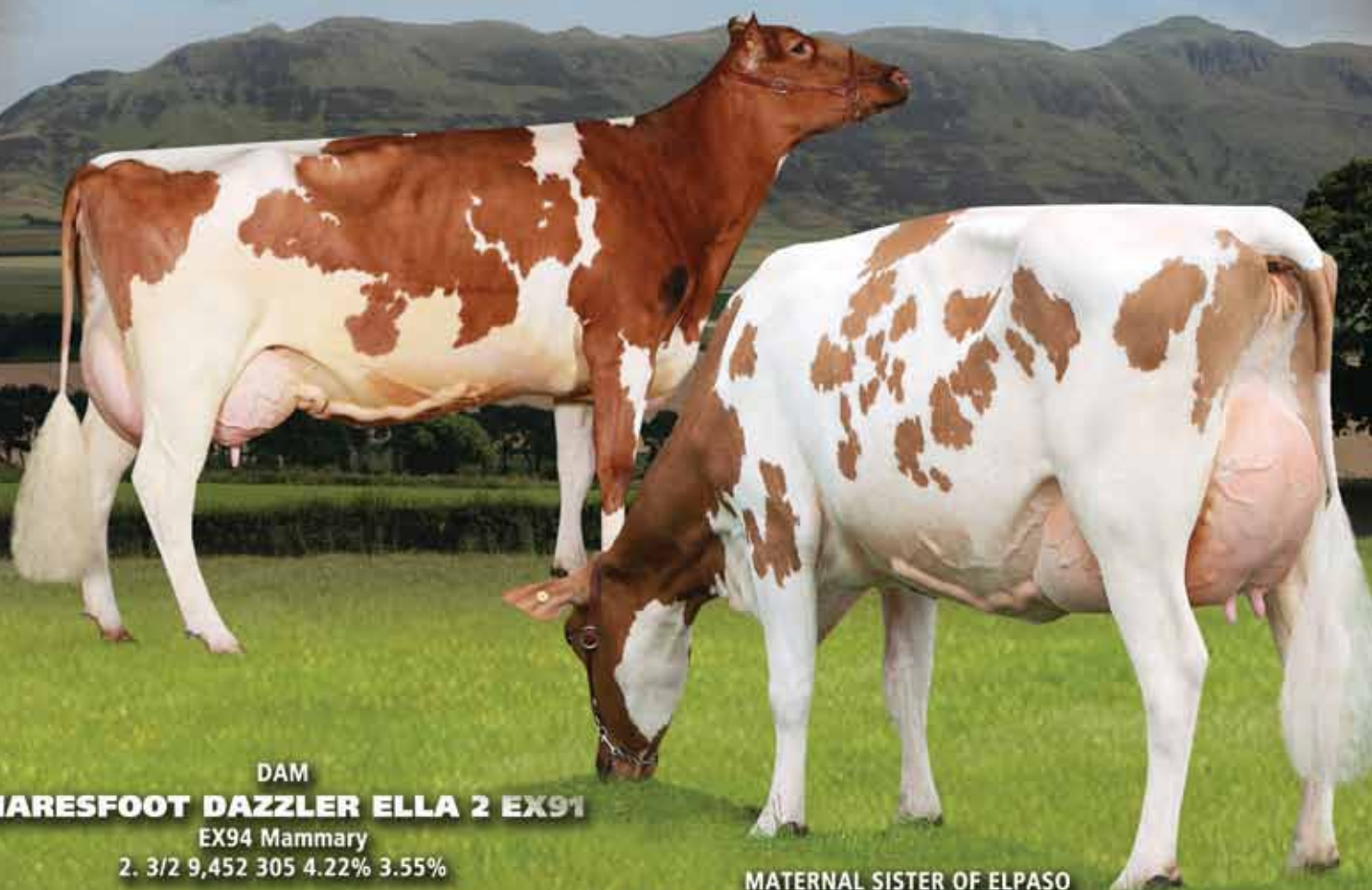

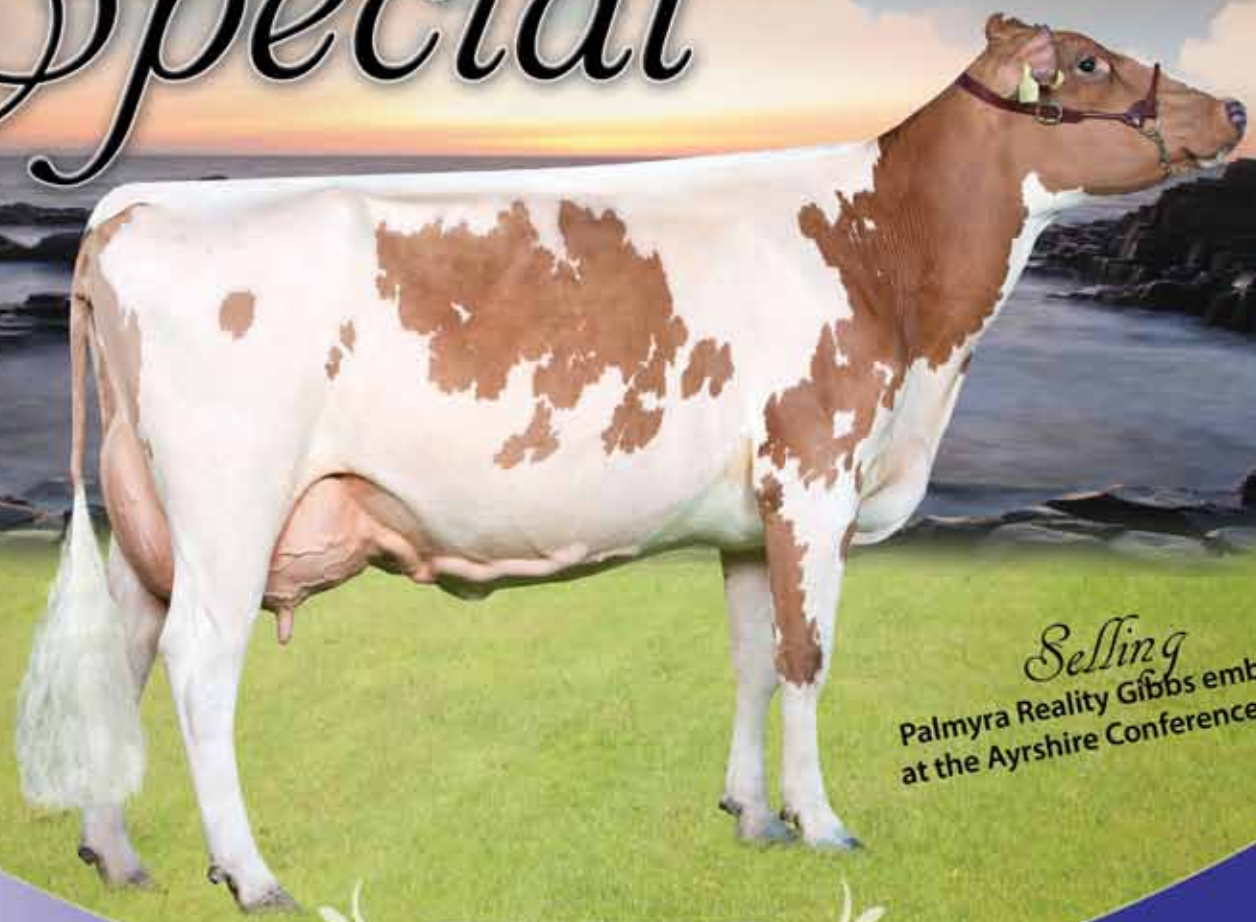
Well that's it for another journal, two down one to go! The last one arrived in time for us all to sit down around the Christmas tree and see what was happening in the Ayrshire world.

I have to admit that as per usual, copy date for my contribution to the journal arrived before I had found time to give it much thought! However, the superb quality of each of our breed's exhibits at the Northern Dairy Expo last weekend, the 7th/8th March, really concentrated my mind, in particular the successes enjoyed by progeny of Cattle Services sires winning four of the five Ayrshire classes. The first successes came on Friday afternoon, when a very correct "Napier" daughter was placed first in the i/c heifer class, and a superbly stylish "Simply Perfek" calf won the maiden heifer class, going on to be junior breed champion. She is one of many quality daughters of this sire I have seen on farms around the country, and I have recently secured an order for his semen from Australia.

The milk classes on Saturday continued in the same up beat vein when a "Mandella" daughter "Cuthill Towers Radar Ray 13" took top honours in the three year old class – a previous show winner, she oozes quality from nose to tail, one of many "Mandella" daughters turning in top performances both here in the UK and abroad. The line up in the senior cow milk class was most impressive - cows with capacity, bone quality and super udders. Taking top spot was the "Easlad" daughter "Sandyford Diamond 45", going on to breed champion - she typifies so many of the positives her sire transmits. We offer our congratulations to exhibitor Blaize Tomlinson and family – securing the breed and junior breed champion with daughters of different sires is some achievement – well done! Apart from the class winners, there were other real quality daughters by different Cattle Services sires, each competing for top honours in their respective class. Our sincere thanks to the breeders for bringing them out and in many ways re-enforcing the point I have continually tried to get across – if you are breeding Ayrshires, pure or blended, it has to make sense when needing semen to make Cattle Services your first point of call – for this is a win, win situation: (a) we offer a comprehensive choice of quality genetics – the majority of our

bulls being bred and proven in the UK; and (b) any profit Cattle Services makes is used for the benefit of the breed in a variety of ways – giving financial support to the Society; advertising and promoting the breed; sponsorship; a presence at shows; returning commission payments to breeders; sourcing young bulls; etc, etc. Our end of year financial report for 2013 shows that we have paid all our bills, met our commitments, and have a small cash surplus to carry over to 2014.

Different sires have different strengths, and different breeders have different priorities. This was the thinking behind our "one price fits all" semen offer, which has proved to be very popular. I am currently at home compiling these notes on the evening of 10th March, and during the last hour I have taken two phone calls with orders for 120 straws from members keen to take advantage of the offer before it runs out on the 28th. We have a Directors meeting scheduled for the 18th when the effects of this offer will be analysed, and used to influence our future marketing strategy.

We are currently collecting semen from a "Burdette" son, out of a strong UK family line. If all goes to plan, we hope to have this semen available by mid summer. Details will be published once we have qualified semen. Much time and effort is also being expended on analysing pedigrees and inspecting young bulls with a view to having a test team to present to you all in the autumn. The ongoing TB situation continues to complicate this work – we are very hopeful that the team will contain a spread of bloodlines and include cow families new to our testing programme. Orders for last autumn's list are still coming in, these are welcome and appreciated, but for a testing scheme to meet its objectives, this semen needs to be used as soon as possible following its release – semen in the tank tells us nothing.

Plans are currently laid for a presence at the same shows as last year. Having a stand at a show is expensive, but gives a great opportunity to meet with members and customers alike, to be able to offer hospitality, do business, and hopefully attract new faces. Please find us at one of these events, and if possible introduce or direct new contacts towards us. Our sincere thanks for your past business as we look forward to this continuing in the future.

Raising Herd

Profitability Through Better Breeding

DairyCo
Breeding+

DairyCo Breeding+ carries out genetic evaluations for all breeds and all traits (excl. B&W type), using data recorded through Milk Recording and type data collected by the breed societies. All the available information is analysed to produce official UK proofs which predict how much of the recorded differences between individuals come from genetics rather than feeding, management and other environmental influences. These indexes get recalculated every three months (Apr, Aug, Dec).

Genetic indexes are available for production, for health, for lifespan, for conformation or for any trait that is inherited and can be measured. Although we are most familiar with genetic indexes for milk, fat and protein, it's a common misconception that indexes relate only to production. Genetic indexes are far more than this and their application for non-production traits is becoming increasingly important.

This short glossary gives a brief description of the most commonly used terms and can be used as a quick reference guide, for information found in AI bull catalogues or on pedigree certificates.

PTA (Predicted Transmitting Ability)

A PTA indicates the amount of a particular trait an animal is, on average, predicted to pass on to its offspring compared to the breed average which is set at zero. For example, a milk kg PTA can be of value +1000 kg. This indicates this animal, on average, is expected to pass on an extra 1000 kgs to its progeny. NOTE: As each breed has its own reference base, across breed comparison of bull indexes is not possible without a conversion.

Reliability

Reliability figures give an indication of how confident you can be in a bull's indexes (Low reliability <55%; high reliability >90%).

Production PTA

Milk, Fat, and Protein kgs; Fat%, Protein%: Predicts the additional yield a daughter is expected to produce in a standard 305-day lactation.

LS (Lifespan)

Predicts the number of lactations a bull's daughters are expected to live,

compared to the breed average and generally fall within the range of -0.5 to +0.5 (i.e. a full lactation difference in survival of daughter of bad vs. good bulls).

SCC (Somatic Cell Count)

Predicts the somatic cell count of daughters during a lactation and are expressed as a percentage, generally falling within the range +30 to -30. For every 1% in a bull's SCC PTA, a change of 1% in his daughters' SCC is predicted. It is important to note that a negative %PTA SCC indicates a reduction and is therefore good.

F.I. (female Fertility Index)

Predicts how fertile a daughter will be and generally fall within the range of -15 to +15. On average, for every point increase in a bull's FI, an improvement in his daughters' calving interval of just under half a day is predicted as well as just under half a percent improvement in non-return rate at 56 days.

Linear Type traits

Predicts the sort of conformation a bull will transmit to his daughters. A bull's type proof is expressed on a scale of -3 to +3, but it is most important to be aware that, because linear assessment measures the degree and not the desirability of each trait, the highest score is not necessarily the most desirable.

Composite type traits

The two composite traits of 'legs and feet' and 'mammary' also appear on a bull's bar chart but unlike the 17 linear traits above, these are described in terms of desirability rather than degree. Based on the type evaluator's observations, they are also expressed on a -3 to +3 scale, with the highest scores indicating the best overall quality in these three areas.

Type merit

Type merit is a prediction of a bull's ability to transmit overall type and is based on a combination of his daughters' scores for mammary, legs and feet and body conformation, in order of importance.



£PLI (Profitable Lifetime Index)

Represents the financial improvement an animal is predicted to pass on to its daughters in its lifetime. Although genetic indexes for the many individual traits now measured can reveal a great deal about an animal's breeding expectations, their detailed study can be time-consuming and is often impractical on many farms. This is where the £PLI index comes into play. This financial index brings together a variety of economically important traits into one figure which can be used as a simple screening tool to identify the bulls that on average breed the most profitable daughters.

Breed Codes

As part of registering an animal, they are assigned a breed code which precedes the animal's herdbook number. The breed codes indicate the breed and origin of the animal. For the UK only three breed codes are assigned; 03 (Ayrshire), 14 (Red & White Ayrshire) and 22 (UK born Scandinavian red). The full list of breed codes used in the Ayrshire breed is:

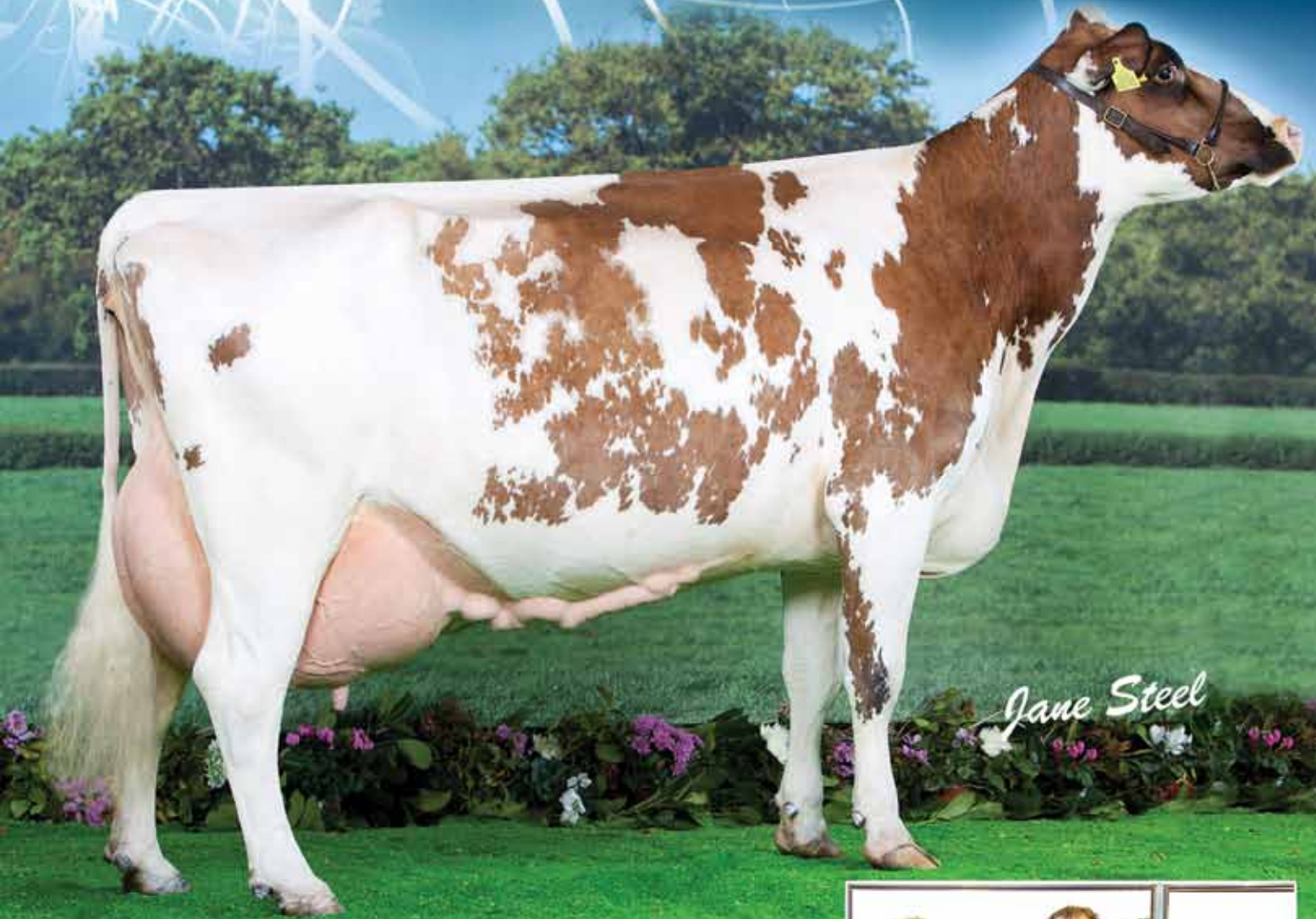

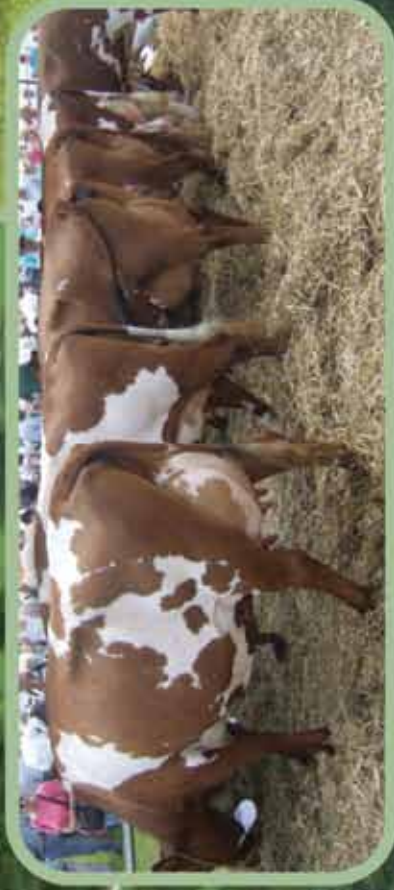

The Future Looks Promising

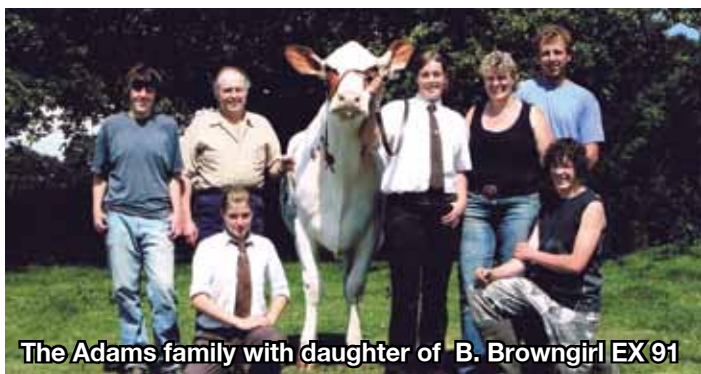

Robert Adams is very pragmatic about the Ayrshire cow. With over 60 years of history in the breed, it has been the mainstay of his farming life, and has enabled him to build the family business into what it is today. Robert admits to having never known anything other than farming, with his father Ben and mother May milking Shorthorns and Ayrshires initially in Biggin-by-Hulland in Derbyshire, the Bigginvale herd was first registered back in the 1950s. At four and a half years old, he moved with his parents, and sisters Mabel and Margaret with 30 cows to what was then the 96 acre Shirley Old Park Farm, on the edge of Rodsley near Ashbourne.

The cementing of Ayrshires as the breed for the Adams family to work with came just a few years later, when the scourge of TB reared its ugly head. Ben Adams was grading up his cows to Ayrshire pedigree status, but TB struck with 18 animals on the farm going down. Mabel, Robert's elder sister said she liked the Ayrshire cow and that was how the farm was restocked, with the herd being 100% Ayrshire ever since the 1960s. TT Attested cattle were bought from the Sheriffhales and Ellerton herds as well as some locally from Tissington. The young stock were also saved at this time, with cow families such as the Butterflys and Cherrys in the herd today developed from Shorthorn crosses. TB has unfortunately affected the herd again since with nearly 50 head lost around six years ago, while the herd has currently just gone clear.

Fast forward to the here and now, and the family is still very much involved with the Ayrshire cow and farming. Robert and Jennifer are partners in the operation, which has grown with addition of both tenanted and purchased land to encompass nearly 1000 acres, with their four children all involved with the farm. Ironically now mentions Robert, the same number of people are farming 1000 acres as were farming about a

tenth of that acreage 60 years ago, with all land work except combining done 'in house'. Elder daughter Joanna and sons Richard and Andrew alongside Robert and Jennifer make up the daily farm team, while younger daughter Nicola is a local veterinary nurse, but is still involved with the sheep enterprise of 100 early lambing Dorsets at the home farm. While Ayrshires have been attributed with bringing profitability to this farming business due to their ability to graze pasture and be a low maintenance dairy cow, the two businesses, 12 miles apart are very diverse, to maximise the topography and land which is farmed. Belted Galloways are also an integral feature of the hill farm, as are 360 in lamb ewes, both of which have their own niche. The Belted Galloways arrival is down to daughter Nicola, who at a sale said to her father 'would you do something for me' - well how could I refuse goes on to say Robert; 'I never imagined she'd ask me to buy that stripy calf, seen in Castle Douglas market the night before'. The rest they say is history (and daughters having their dads wrapped around their little fingers!). This year, 32 of the Belted Galloways will be calved, descending from two families. A Belted Galloway has also been used on some Ayrshire heifers. All the farm's bull calves are finished, with some of the pure Belted Galloway meat sold direct by Joanna as boxed eighths of a carcass, through word of mouth. With quite a bit of National Trust land rented - this hardy traditional breed is ideal to graze some of the sparse and hilly terrain of the Derbyshire Peak District.

The sheep also fit well alongside this mix, again traditional breeds have proven to be the most successful, Swaledales were first introduced with the Derbyshire Gritstone now the favoured breed. It will soon be time for Joanna to move up to the hills to the mobile home alongside them to see through lambing and calving. The sheep and beef cattle are a separate business, which began when Robert sold his house to buy the first 46 acres of hill land back in the 1970s. This now extends to 300 acres, a combination of owned and rented land, which was entered into an organic scheme at the same time as the home farm at Rodsley.

When it comes down to breeding Robert has always been very much a purist, wanting a profitable Ayrshire. He is keen to say that cow families are imperative, believing that the female carries more weight in the mating, with a strong female line capable of carrying mistakes. The Ayrshire is also an ideal grazing cow which suits the system at Rodsley. The 120 cows graze from the end of April through to late October



generally, and milked twice a day, with no buffer feeding in summer. On an organic system they are averaging 6500-7000 litres at 3.8% fat and 3.4% protein, with a bactoscan of 12 and a SCC of 59. With milk sold to OSMCO, there is no milk quality payment. The herd has been organic since 1999, at which time there was a grant to facilitate conversion, although this did not require huge changes in farming practise, except perhaps the children becoming a tribe of dock pickers during the school holidays- "happy memories" chips in Joanna across the kitchen table! The success of the organic system Robert feels is because he undertook the conversion gradually over a few years. 15 years on and the organic milk price is 40ppl, with Robert saying there needs to be a 6ppl differential with feed costs £100/tonne more than conventional. However organic and grazing suits the farm with maintenance plus 20 litres a cow derived from forage during the summer the aim, and great care taken to compost a quality manure on farm as fertiliser. Red clover leys are also an important characteristic of the organic system as they enable good silage crops, and work well in the arable rotation. Cereal yields tend to run at 1.5-2 t/acre with whole crop made if weeds are an issue, otherwise barley is crimped in the field and stored in an old silage clamp ready to be fed back to the cows.

Robert and Jennifer took over the operation from Robert's father in the late 1980s and at that time he briefly considered a move to Holstein breeding. However the reasons for staying with the Ayrshire were multiple - a higher milk protein, the steady trade for surplus stock sales, a grazing cow which has few feet problems, great udders and a straighter leg, were all attributes of the Ayrshire Robert was familiar with and wanted to harness as a means to profitability. Ultimately the cow suits the farm Robert says, so why fix something that's not broken.

Over the years Robert has had the opportunity to see the wider industry, and draw from his experiences there to grow his farming operation. During his twenties to earn extra income, he did some agricultural proficiency testing. This then led to instructing for Broomfield College. As time went on, he developed a grocery round- which grew into supplying vegetables as well as locally sourced eggs and he supplied three large local hotels, one of which taught him a valuable lesson. It was a steep learning curve when he was undercut by another supplier and shown no loyalty - making Robert realise that all the time you must watch your business. In addition to this experience, Young Farmers is another avenue that all the Adams' feel have helped them develop. One of Robert's highlights was winning the dairy judging at the London Dairy Show while representing Derbyshire three years running, and gaining three silver medals. His local club is Ashbourne and all the family have held offices within that club, where Jennifer is now President.

Although the Bigginvale herd has always registered, it wasn't until Robert went into the partnership with his father that breeding took on a tailored approach. Up until then it had principally been Bull of the Day from the MMB. However Robert remembers fondly travelling to Scotland for Ayr week - to attend the National Ayr Bull Sale, where there would be several hundred heifers, and around 30 bulls to sell. This was enhanced by on farm visits to see stock, descendants and family members and resulted in Robert purchasing his first stock bull in the late 1970s, **Knowe Brown Nave** from the Templeton family.

Since then, a number of bulls have been bought to augment the herd; most successful of which were **Killoch Powerdrill**, who although not the biggest milk bull has bred tremendous wearing cattle with great feet



and legs and conformation, and **Killoch Propeller** who put milk into the next generation. Robert says you could be working in a field, look across the valley and admire a heifer - and it turned out to be a Powerdrill daughter time and time again. Powerdrill also sired the dam of the herd's best homebred bull so far, **Bigginvale Marvellous** by Monteith Star Jewel who was used at Bigginvale as well as in David Gibson's herd and in Robert's eldest son Christopher's herd (who farms locally and has the Tessvale herd of Ayrshires) to great effect. Robert's eldest daughter Victoria lives in Wales and is married to a beef and sheep farmer. When it comes to breeding, Robert says that it is a case of him trying to match and fix in the next generation. **East Church Ambition** latterly has had the most effect in the herd. Walking the herd, there is a mass of mature cows showing breed attributes - great mobility, tight well attached quality udders and durability and none of these exemplify that more than the nine year old Ambition daughter, **Bigginvale Black Cherry 7 EX 91**, who will hopefully breed a Partner son to take over the mantle. AI and stock bulls have always been used, with Robert a staunch supporter of the young sire programme run by Cattle Services (Ayr) Ltd. He always samples all the bulls as he feels it's imperative to keeping the gene pool as open as possible. **Bigginvale Destination**, another Ambition son is also on test with Cattle Services (Ayr) Ltd.

Robert and Jennifer have over the years travelled extensively and made many friends on the back of the Ayrshire cow. Robert has judged many shows, including the Royal Show and the Royal Welsh, and herds competitions, and they have now attended many World Conferences. Robert says he is appreciative to the late Jim Rennie who took him under his wing as a young Ayrshire enthusiast and he is grateful for the enormous support Edward and Margaret Evans have given the breed over the years. Herds competitions have been supported for many years by Bigginvale, with the most recent success being 2012 Derbyshire Ayrshire Club herd winners, while showing is also done albeit predominantly locally, although **Bigginvale Browngirl EX 91** was Supreme Champion at the 1998 Dairy Event.

The future for their family looks promising. Robert and Jennifer are lucky to have the next generation engaged in agriculture and the farm continues to develop and evolve with more land recently added and plans for a new parlour in place. Robert has made many friends due to his passion and enthusiasm for the Ayrshire breed, and going forward as your breed President, he is honoured to be at the helm and delighted with the opportunity this affords.

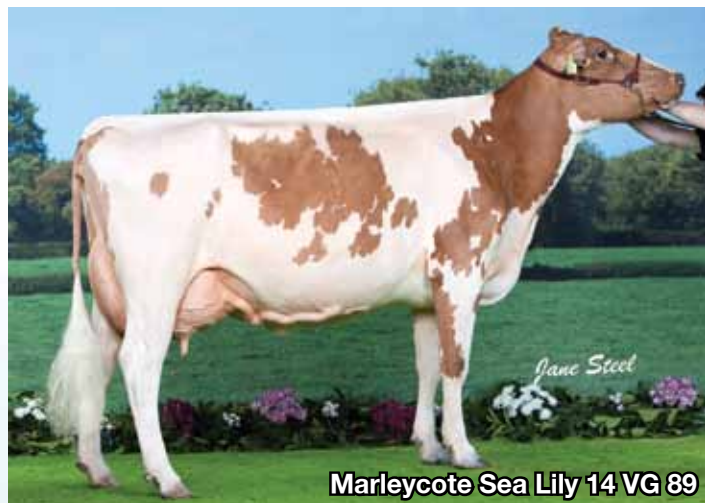

Dairy Expo 2014

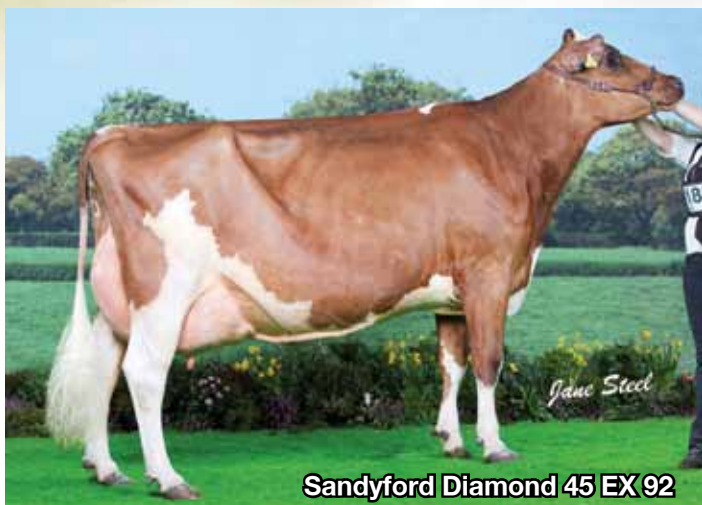

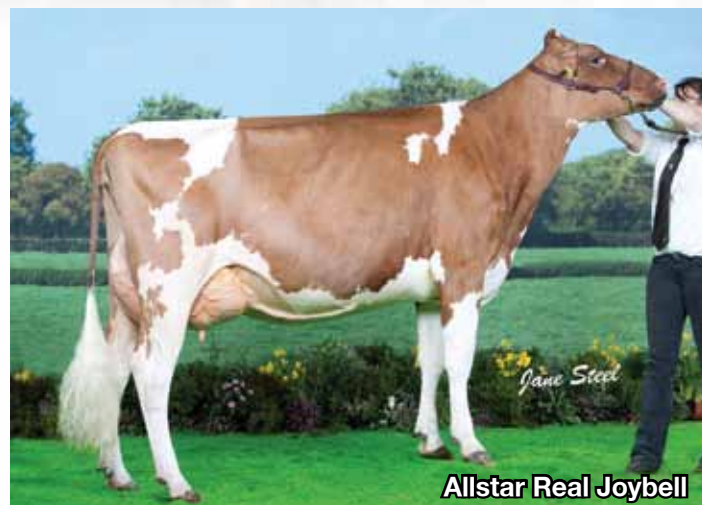
