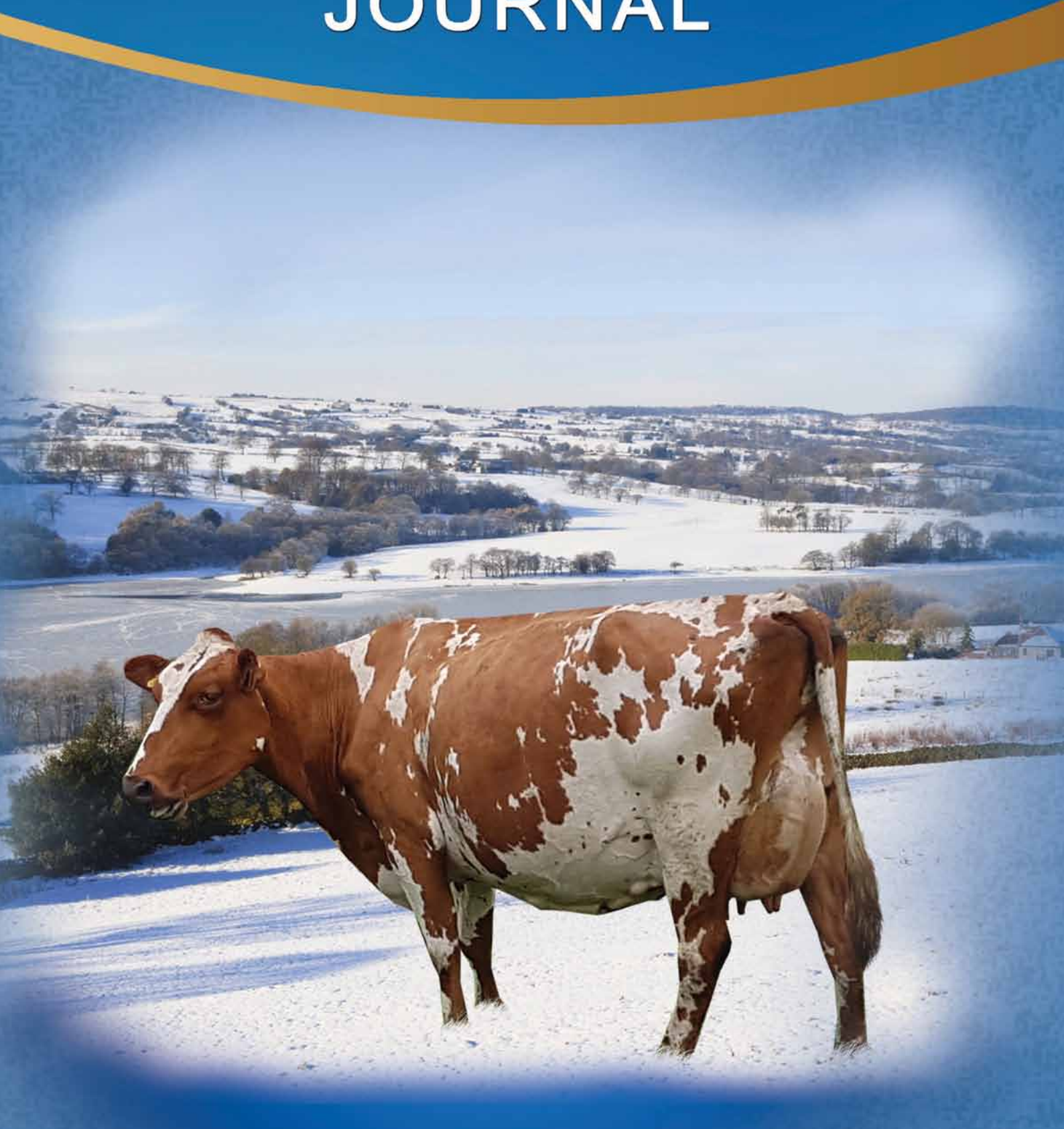

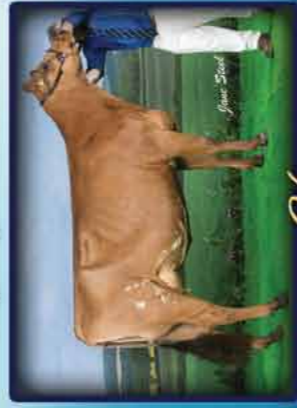

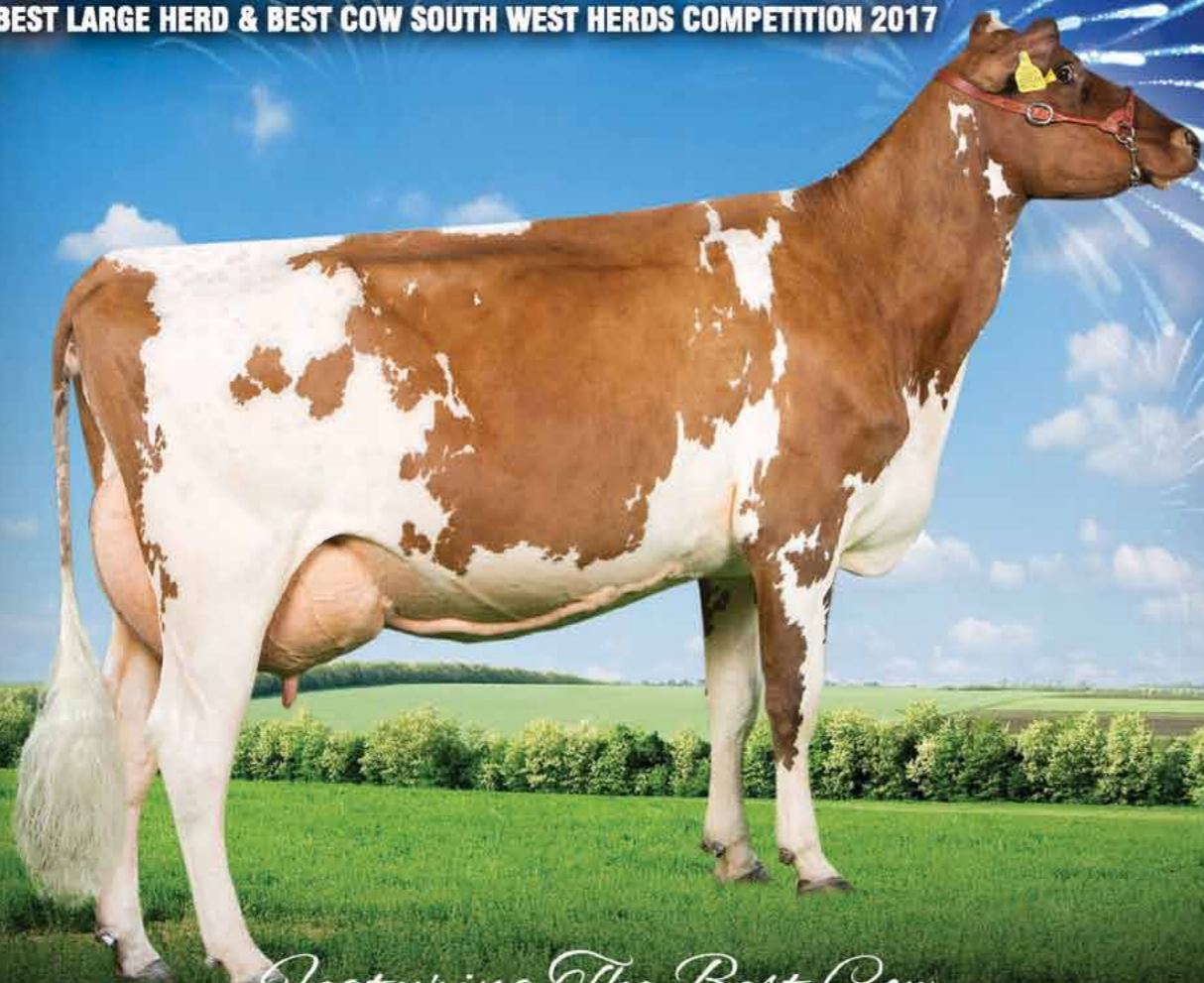

Breed Manager's Update

Winter 2017



To find ourselves at the end of another year gives us an opportunity to reflect on 2017 for the Ayrshire breed. We should acknowledge that it has been more positive than the last two years, with many new members and new commercial breeders buying into our breed, and with enthusiasm from everyone involved. Why? Well, with the economic downturn over the last few years many dairy farmers are focussing more on margins, as they should, as would any business. I continue to hear that managing pastures and grazing cows efficiently is a priority for many of you out there, and we all know our Ayrshire cow is hardy, an aggressive grazer, a great converter of forage to product and has more manageable health traits than many. These traits are enticing commercial dairy farmers to the Ayrshire breed. Let's keep up the good work for 2018!

You will read about much that has gone on this autumn in this edition of the Journal, with successful events continuing to promote us to the fore. I do have to mention the success and dedication of our breeders at both our National Show at UK Dairy Day and our youth at the ABAB, both events saw a wonderful display of Ayrshires in numbers and quality. Make sure you read all about them in this issue.

We have so much planned for 2018 to promote the breed further and to offer new services to our members. A breed open day to be held on Thursday 26th April at Blannicombe Farm, Honiton, Devon, home of the famous East Church herd, by kind permission of Mark Evans. This is an opportunity to promote our breed to South West dairy farmers or indeed anyone interested. Industry partners are already on board to help us run this event successfully. We will be focussing on nutrition, breeding, animal health and much more; everything about Ayrshire benefits. We will be needing volunteers to come along to help run and promote the event, please contact me directly to offer your services.



In June we will be hosting the European Red Dairy Breeds Conference in Scotland. Here we can promote ourselves to all red European breeds. The event also takes in a day at the Royal Highland Show.

The Young Breeders weekend has been moved - for one year only - due to the Open Day being held in April, as we believe the logistics in arranging two major events so closely together would make it difficult to run them both successfully, so it will be in Ayr on 9th - 12th August, hosted by the Ayr Club. I can promise you that YB 2018 will be fantastic!

Genomics is a big discussion point within our industry. As a smaller breed we do have to realise that we need to test animals to build on our data to improve the reliability of the information available to us. We have that much needed base already but must add to it. Testing females not only helps us, as a breed, to get the numbers we need for more reliable information, but it can help you to determine the best breeding stock within your own herds. Early in the New Year those members on the Ayrshire complete service with CIS will have the opportunity to add genomic testing to that package; those not on Complete can test individually. The programming of this is currently being done, with full instructions and pricing available to you very soon, and hopefully a similar offering for NMR customers will also become available.

We will also be working with a well-respected tag company on BVD testing, offering discounted prices to our members, so keep a look out on the website in the New Year to find out more.

Breed Heritage is working well with some wonderful genetics in the females born to our matings for the future of the breed. They come from some great families including Emmie (Whitecroft), Pamela (Rosehill), Punch (Gwynnogg), Rosie (Grove) and Sailor Girl (Hunnington). Adding these animals to the list to follow their progress is so important as they could be future bull mothers. We continue to add new families to work with, more recently we have added the Betina (Caldervale), Honesty (Somerby), Jessie (Rosedale), Lark (Millford), Marigolds (Rosedale), Sandy Rose (Harperfield) and Stella (Rosedale). Breed Heritage continues to work hard to fulfil our breed's wonderful future.

You should also be made aware that the decision was made at Council to no longer run the Northern National sale. From the discussions it is evident that private sales have taken off quite considerably, resulting in a lack of support for the sale, which in turn does nothing to promote our organisation. We will however be working closely with livestock markets around the UK, informing you when suitable sales are being held for you to sell any surplus stock. Keep an eye on the Website in 2018 for details. You must also remember potential customers are directed to our website to look for Ayrshire stock, so feel free to use this free service.

Keep up the great work that you all do, and I will end by wishing you all a very happy Christmas and a wonderful New Year.

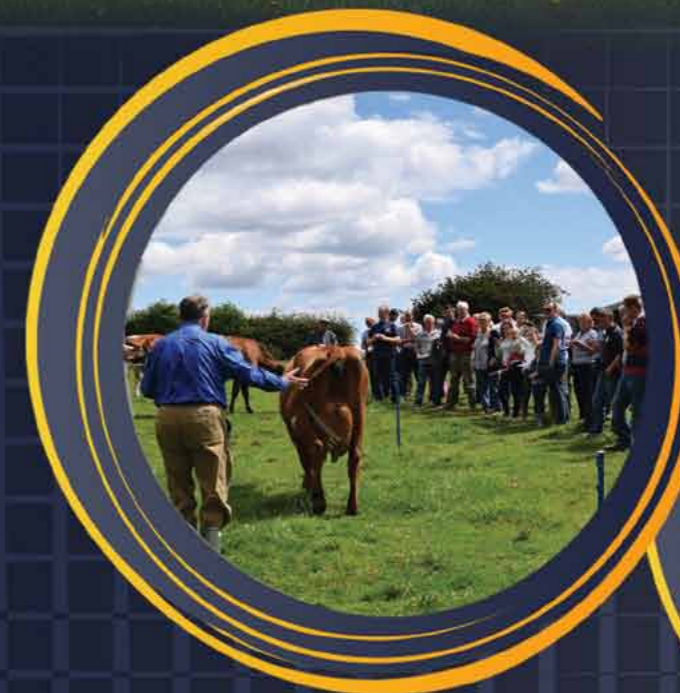

Alongside these exciting young bulls, Cattle Services are also looking at the next generation coming through on the breed heritage programme. I cannot stress how important it is that you contact us if you have an exciting bull calf born – we rely on your support to provide the information early on, to ensure we have the pick of the best bulls of our breed for our young bull proving scheme.

2017 seems to have flown by and, on a positive note, the whole industry has seen better prices than what were being received in 2016. Sales for 2017 have steadily increased on last year, with significant growth in sexed semen sales, and interest for UK genetics continues to be strong worldwide with enquiries being made through the website and the Facebook page.

Throughout this summer and autumn it has been fantastic to see progeny of Cattle Services' bulls performing well. Hilltown Oblique and Rosehill Real McCoy both had their first daughters classify EX; Butterbesley Obliques May by Hilltown Oblique classified EX90 at 4 years and 3 months and Whitecroft Nellie by Rosehill Real McCoy classified EX91 at the age of 4 years and 4 months. At the recent All Breeds All Britain Calf Show Sandford Supreme was the Premier sire, with his brother Sandford Triclo being runner up. Both these outstanding bulls have sexed straws available.

Representatives from Cattle Services recently met with Cogent to agree some changes to our existing working agreement, and despite these changes we can reassure you that any lost confidence is now restored, and we continue to have a good working relationship that is going from strength to strength. Cattle Services will still be using the Cogent stud to collect semen and the distribution team to deliver straws, both domestically and internationally.

We will be entering 2018 with some exciting new bulls becoming available, these all combine great cow families alongside fantastic PLI and Type. They are:

Brieryside Magic - 100%

(Kamouraska Rockstar x EX Reality x EX93 Blackthorn x EX94 Sir Adam x EX Lord Ontario)

A son from the Magenta family with a high PLI, predicted high type, positive components and plenty of milk.

Cuthill Towers Buster - 84.375%

(Hilltown Oblique x EX94 White Knight x VG87 Mr Twister x Nelson x EX Jubilant Scot)

A powerful combination with a son of Hilltown Oblique out of Cuthill Towers Miss Blondie 2 with a massive PLI, lots of milk and the assumption to produce long lasting cows.

Flintstone Elite - 100%

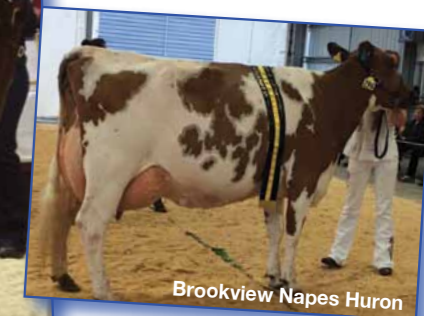
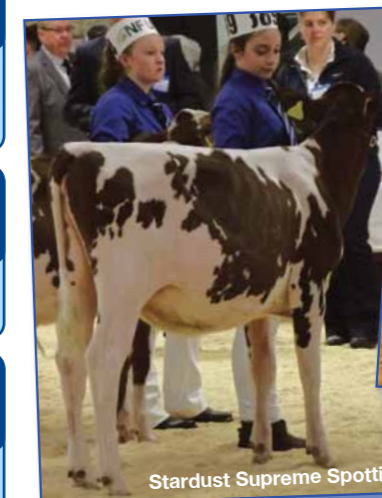

A Switch to Ayrshires

suits system on traditional Devon farm

Robert and Anita Cornish have fallen for the Ayrshire breed for their westcountry, family farm. Ann Hardy reports.

Choosing a new breed for an existing dairy unit is a major undertaking and needs to take account of the desired farming system, the constraints of the farm, and personal preference amongst the host of considerations. On Butteridge Farm, near Tiverton in Devon, Robert and Anita Cornish have plumped squarely for the Ayrshire breed, which they now favour as either a pure or cross-bred animal. They say it is easier to manage than their previous herd and has maintained their milk volume and improved milk quality.

“We tried small numbers of several breeds,” say the Cornishes, who farm the dairy as a family unit which at times includes help from their three children, Kellie (now working for a rural estate agent), Henry (currently on the ‘harvest run’ in the USA), Annabella (who currently milks the herd and also works part time with a local market auctioneer) as well as Robert’s brother, Brian, nephew Mark (full-time), and father, John, now in his 90th year.

“The Holstein is a fantastic animal but was becoming too large for our facilities and was labour-intensive. Perhaps they didn’t really suit our grazing system – they certainly don’t hold their condition on grass as well as some other breeds,” says Robert. “We’ve had a few cross-bred Montbeliardes, Jerseys and Brown Swiss but didn’t think any of these were quite right for us. The Montbeliardes were a bit too temperamental and heavy; Jerseys can be super but those we had were not tidy enough in the udder and didn’t last, and the Brown Swiss were a bit too big for our system and their temperament could be difficult if you changed their routine.”

“We kept hearing stories about how good the Ayrshires were so we bought Kellie an Ayrshire calf for her 10th birthday,” adds Anita. “Each of the other children then had the same and all three of these Ayrshires went on to be high production cows and their bloodlines feature in the herd today.”

“It’s true they may have had a bit of Swedish Red blood in them which will have helped their production, but the Scandinavians themselves are not such tidy cattle,” says Robert.



The family’s journey to acquiring a 420 acre holding on the Devon-Somerset border has been one of hard work and organic growth, with small plots of land purchased at fairly regular intervals over the years. “Dad bought Butteridge Farm in 1959 when it was very run down,” says Robert. “He and my brother worked really hard doing forestry work as well as the farm, and by 1961 he had 14 cows and thought he had made it.”

Every three or four years since, small parcels of land have come up for sale and every opportunity has been taken to add to the acreage. “In 2008, when we had to increase cow numbers because of another expansion, we were on a tight budget and found Ayrshires were not quite as expensive as the top Holsteins,” he continues.

“We bought some hybrid Ayrshires from Holsworthy Market, originating from the Combebow herd belonging to Sandy Loud, and have bought pure Ayrshire pedigree brood cows from Hilltown on Exmoor and East Church in Honiton.

“I am a big fan of older cows as they have done their time,” he adds. “There may have been Holstein in their backgrounds but that does not bother me at all as long as they are good cattle and the type we want. “We went fairly gently into the Ayrshire to size up the economics of the breed and see if they’d produce what we wanted,” he says.

Today, the family milks 245 head on a traditional UK system with year-round calving, an eight month-long grazing season and sand-bedded cubicles. Grazing runs to an altitude of about 650 feet and the herd is both paddock- and strip-grazed as the situation allows. Concentrate use is around 1.5 tonnes per cow per year and the winter total mixed ration comprises grass silage, straights and whole crop wheat.

“In summer, we’ll sometimes get away without buffer feeding the TMR but we’re always afraid of losing protein,” he says.

Production stands at 7,500 litres at 4.4% fat and 3.5% protein, calving index is 390 days, age at first calving is 2.1 years, cell counts are an impressive 110,000/ml, dry cow antibiotic use has declined to just 2% of the herd (98% have sealant only) and mastitis runs at a trifling 10 cases per year across the entire herd.



The low-stress system and Ayrshire breed are both thought to help in maintaining health, with every member of the herd (bar a couple of Jerseys) now carrying Ayrshire blood. Semen use is mainly Ayrshire – with bulls now in use including Rosehill Manderville, West Mossgiel Modern Reality and Terrace Bank Free Beer – and a small amount of Holstein to maintain the cross-breeding.

“A proportion of the herd will remain cross-bred because economically they are such outstanding cattle for our system,” says Robert. “They can compete with the Holstein on production but the milk is slightly better quality, and they’re also about the size we want and maintain their condition at grass.”

“The Ayrshire breed is also hardy; they have better feet and longer lasting udders as well as the right attitude to get on and eat,” adds Anita. “You can see them grazing in the wind and rain when the pure Holsteins are tucked under the hedges.”

A bonus of the family’s breeding strategy has been AI company interest in their stock, in particular a contract mating by the Ayrshire Society’s Breed Heritage Programme to the UK sire, Bigginvale Destination. The contracted dam is the home-bred, Butterbesley Obliques May, a daughter of the Scottish-bred cow, Carston May and by Hilltown Oblique. Showing the cattle has been a further bonus of the Ayrshire breeding, where lasting udders and good, black feet – both breeding priorities – also help in the showing. The family has shown locally and taken the breed championship last year and reserve breed championship this year at the Mid-Devon Show, has also won the South West Ayrshire Breeders Herds Competition and has three-times been the Best Ayrshire Herd in Devon. Competing this September at The National Ayrshire Show at its new venue in Telford at UK Dairy Day, they returned home with a creditable fourth in a keenly-fought senior cow class.

“We have no big expectations when it comes to showing, but as long as our cattle represent the breed well, that’s all we want,” says Anita. “It’s such a good breed, we just want people to know how good and how versatile it is. And we love to have the whole family involved – everyone mucks in and the children really love it.”

Despite the family’s love affair with the Ayrshire, the Cornishes are pragmatic about the breed’s long-term role on the farm.

“As long as the Ayrshire can breed cattle which are in line with the needs of the modern dairy industry, we will keep using them,” says Mr Cornish. “If they fall behind, we will have to think of something different. “For us it’s about ease of management and being comforting to the eye, but if they don’t produce the goods – as they have at times in the past – we will have to think again,” he says.

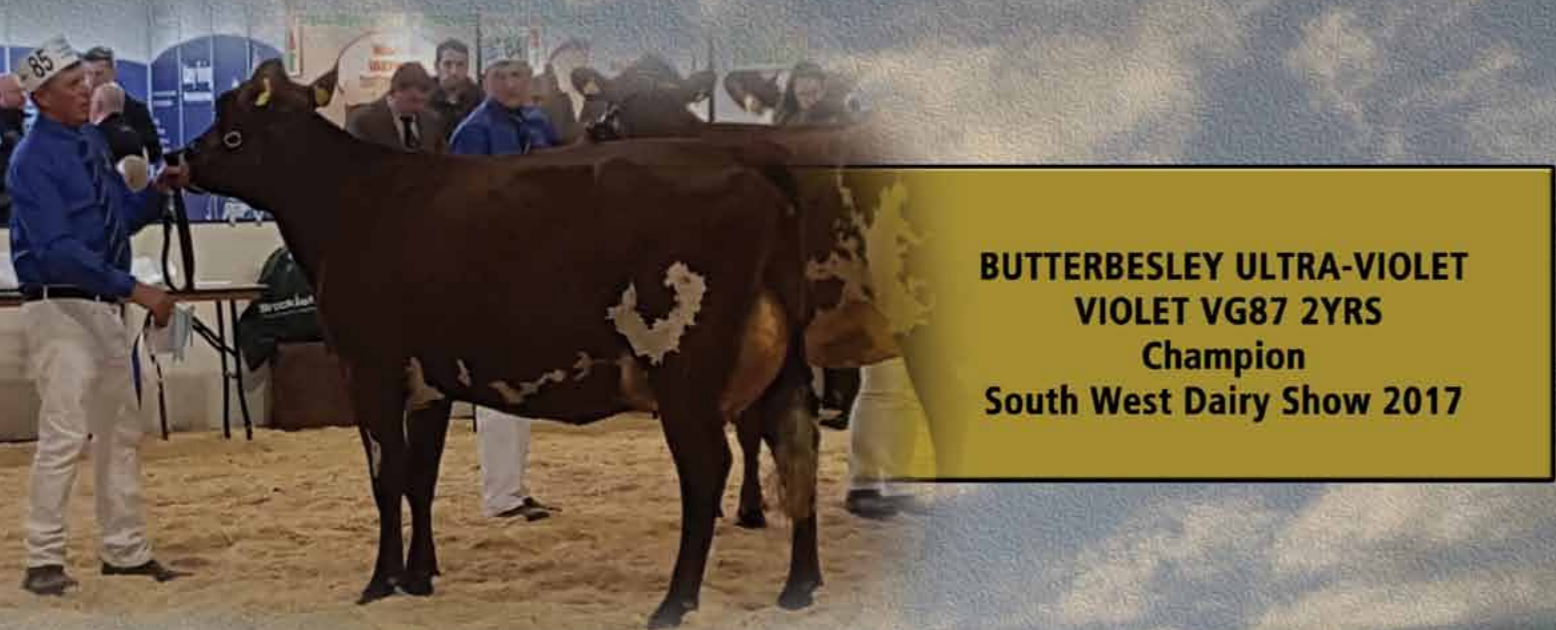

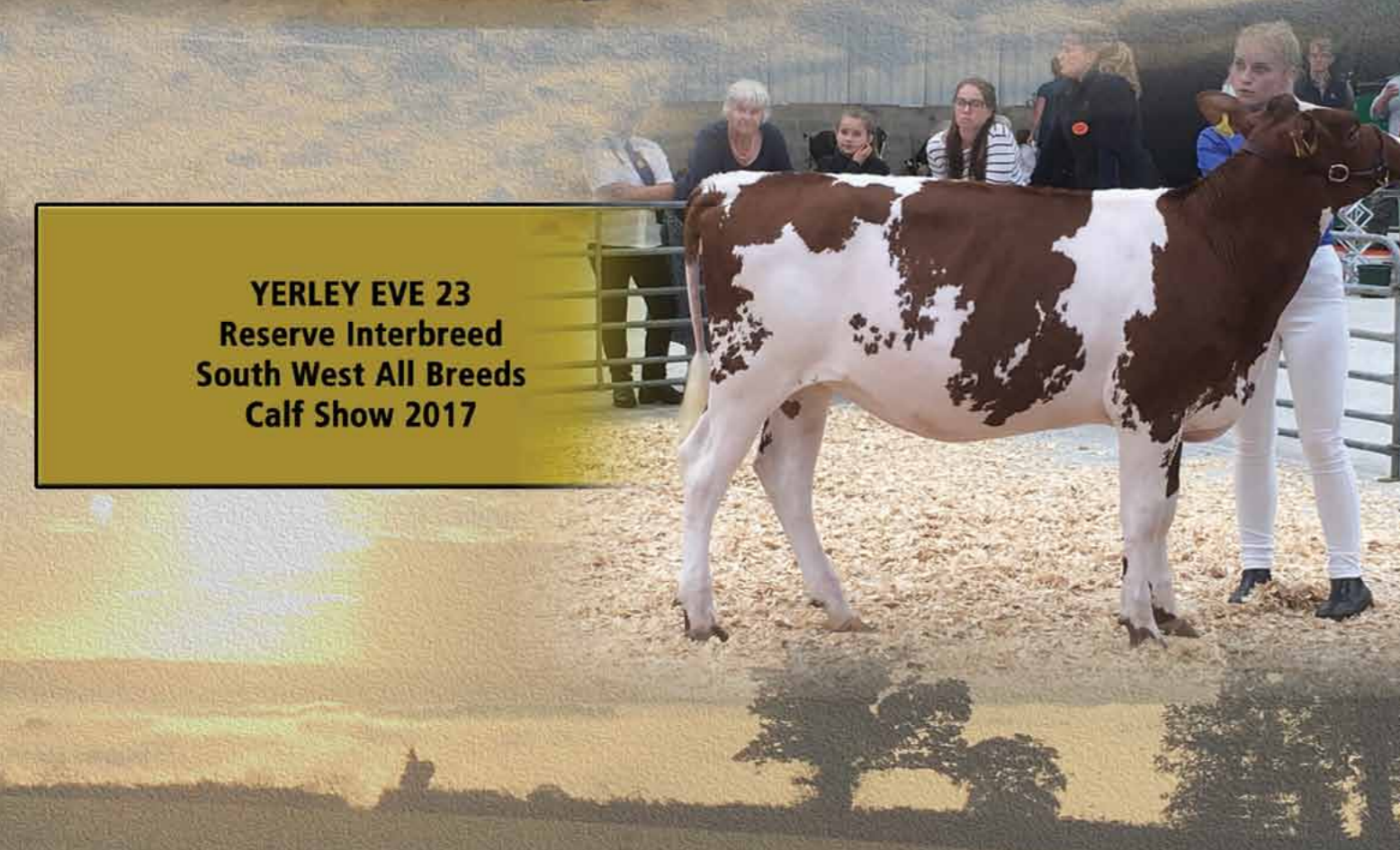

New Zealander - Courtney Davies A Kiwi Visits the UK



The unity of the United Kingdom extends far beyond the name of the borders and well into the spirit of the UK Ayrshire Cattle Society and the incredible Ayrshire Young Breeders team. I was fortunate to be the 2017 recipient of the Shirley Crothers Memorial Trophy as the New Zealand Dairy Youth Ambassador, proudly supported by Brent Crothers and the New Zealand Dairy Event Team, to travel to the United Kingdom in September and attend the UK Dairy Day.

The first week was spent in England visiting, with breed manager Duncan Hunter, some of the herds I had been admiring from afar. This encompassed touring through London and travelling to the Barnes' farm, that supplies milk to make Blue Stilton cheese, before heading on towards Loughborough. As I began to travel north through England we stopped past the Tomlinson's Sandyford herd of Ayrshires. These cows were incredible and the family welcomed me with open arms onto their farm. I was able to see Sandyford Clover 10 – a well-respected cow – along with some younger show stock who were being classified. After a night in Loughborough I caught my first (of many) UK trains up to Glasgow, Scotland, where I stayed with Claire Kimm and experienced a country music festival on the Isle of Cumbrae. The weather was exceptional and the best throughout the whole trip – surprisingly in Scotland!

Later we visited Carnell Ayrshires as well as Lessnessock Ayrshires, and a robotic farm in Ayr. It was exciting to be at the birthplace of the breed of cow I am so passionate about, and the cattle that are bred here today still pay tribute to the classic Ayrshire. I was able to participate in the Ayr County Cattle Club Ayrshire and Holstein Calf Show whilst here and won the All Breeds Senior Showmanship class, placed as Reserve Champion Ayrshire Showman overall. The community spirit of this show was the epitome of what I believe showing Ayrshire cattle should be all about – the older youth were helping the young showman with ring craft, and the older breeders were more than happy to lend animals and advice whenever needed. My travels then took me to Halmyre Urr Ayrshires in Castle Douglas (who make their own ice cream! Yum!) where we got involved in some community work as well as helping halter train some of the Dairy Day animals. Then it was off to Whitecroft Ayrshires, where I met a superb Ayrshire cow by the name of Whitecroft Ruth 130 and helped prepare her for the upcoming show, as well as watching the local Buxton Football Club game. Not only were the young breeders certainly capable and able, but the support provided by more experienced breeders and organisers meant that we were all able to get involved, and as a result ended up with both Ayrshire Grand Champion and Reserve Grand Champion cows in our team, with Swaites Bright Spark 5 awarded Reserve Supreme Champion. Once the ribbons were packed away it was time to relax a bit – but what happens in Telford, stays in Telford! Needless to say, we all had a phenomenal time and it was an adventure I will not forget!



I have met fantastic, knowledgeable people, travelled to some beautiful farms and experienced the kind generosity of those passionate about the breed. 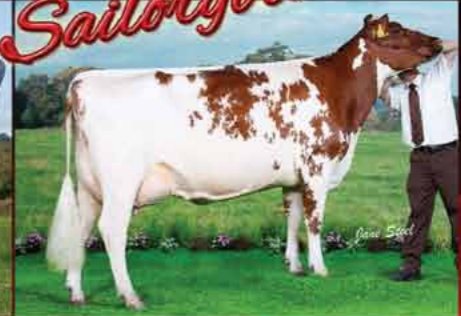

Hi, I'm Jane Barnes, married to Mark Barnes and, with our children Charlotte & Harry, we farm at Somerby in East Leicestershire. Our 180 cow 'Somerby' Ayrshire herd produces milk for Blue Stilton at Long Clawson Dairy. For the past 15 years or so I've also give talks to groups - "Tales from a Dairy Farmers' Wife" - which is all about my life on our family run farm, telling amusing stories and real life anecdotes.

Here in Leicestershire we are well into the autumn season and our herd is still out grazing the fields night and day. They blend in well with the tree leaves now all turning to subtle auburn and crimson colours. Even with the arrival of a batch of autumn born Limousin and Simmental calves fit into the autumnal theme on the farm.

This week saw another sure sign of autumn's arrival, the Cottesmore Hunt's Opening Meet on a neighbouring estate owned by a member of the Weatherby family. Charlotte, our daughter, took my horse Norman (a Connemara - six years old) to his second Opening Meet in a week! It was our pleasure to welcome our International judge, Mr Edmund Els from South Africa, to officiate at this year's event. The day began with two superb classes of heifers; both classes were well supported and were testament to their breeders. When the two class winners and runner ups came together to find our Junior Champion, it was Evie Tomlinson leading Sandyford Marlow Clover 6 from Blaise Tomlinson who took the honours, with her herd mate Sandyford Primed Clover taking Reserve.

The standard was to continue into the Junior cow class with an array of lovely young cows on show. Judge Edmund Els was quite convincing with his selection of his class winner when Swaites Bright Spark 5, who had travelled all the way from Lanarkshire in Scotland, and was part of the Young Breeders Programme at this event, was sent straight to the top of the line. Runner up in this class was Hunnington Lilly 18 from Lisa Window-Walker.



The Intermediate cow class was next, and yet again Swaites Farm was to feature at the top of the class, this time with Swaites Dainty 11, superbly shown by Jamie Keenan. Second in this class was Sandyford Burdette Penelope from Brent Crothers. One thing our Judge did comment on was that all the way down his final line-up were quality cows. A well supported senior cow class, again featuring many quality animals, saw Blaise Tomlinson with Sandyford Mayflower 14 win ahead of Alan Timbrell's Millford Lark 32.

The breeders group is always a spectacle, and this year was no exception. The entire length of the ring with 24 Ayrshires lined up was quite a sight! This year was the first presentation of the new award for this class – The Gordon Timbrell Memorial Award, and Edmund Els selected the Sandyford team from the Tomlinson family as winners of this prestigious trophy.

Our Red and White class had been merged in with the Red Holstein class. With only one entry forward from us the British Red and White winner was Cuthill Towers Classic Sarah from the Lawrie family. The Grand Championship line-up gave Judge Edmund Els the opportunity to reflect on his earlier decisions before making his selection. He tapped out Swaites Bright Spark 5, with James Lawrie on the halter, as his Champion, Swaites Dainty 11 as his Reserve and Sandyford Mayflower 14 as Honourable Mention.

A most amazing day for John Adamson and family from Swaites Farm in Lanarkshire, and for the Young Breeders team, with both the Grand Champion and Reserve being prepared and shown from start to finish as part of our Young Breeders programme so that, even in the absence of the breeder, his cows were able to take the 2017 Grand and Reserve Grand Championship at the National Ayrshire Show.

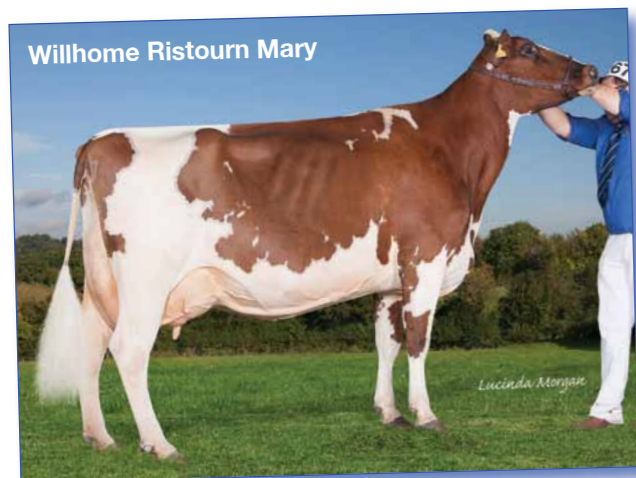

Taking Note...

For this edition of Taking Note we hear from our Presidents committee with some of their opinions of the Ayrshire Cow and the Society, replying to some questions on how both have an impact on their lives and businesses.

What is it that appeals to you about the Ayrshire cow?

Philip: They want to graze even in poor weather which is good for us as we can graze grass virtually all year. Their will to live and aggressiveness at feeding suits our system and generally they're robust and compact cows with that will to milk.

Keith: The world is a more colorful place with red cows in the field.

Michael: An easy-care cow with the ability to produce more from forage.

Gilmour: The Ayrshire's ability to take both forage and concentrates and turn this into high quality milk.

What is the single biggest benefit the Ayrshire cow has brought to your business?

Philip: Running a herd of pedigree cows from two breeds, the benefit that the Ayrshires have brought to us is the reduced calving interval against our Holsteins.

Keith: The biggest benefit to our business is having good components, this not only benefits the milk cheque but we wouldn't be able to make the quality of ice cream we do without the quality of milk produced by our Ayrshire herd at Halmyre.

When Greg Wallace tells you it is the best honeycomb ice cream he's ever tasted you know you are doing something right.

Michael: They are a major factor in growing our farming enterprise, my grandfather brought Ayrshire cows to Northumberland in 1926 and at one point there were three Ayrshire herds on three of the four farms.

Gilmour: The Ayrshire's high levels of butterfat and protein as I get paid by my milk buyer highly on these traits.

Name the three main traits you feel the Ayrshire benefits your herd?

Philip: Dairyness with power, welded on udders and legs and feet.

Keith: Longevity. Having durable cows allows us to sell up to 70 fresh heifers and young cows because our replacement rate is lower. The versatility of the Ayrshire breed means they adapt well to grazing or being housed and can cope with any weather condition or climate – if they can cope with the 'sunny South West of Scotland' they can cope with anything! Vigor allows the Ayrshire to be good foragers and aggressive eaters which contributes to longevity.

Michael: Longevity, components and durability

Gilmour: Feet and legs, udder quality, longevity which gives me the ability to sell my surplus heifers!

How important do you feel registering and classifying is for your herd and why?

Philip: Both are very important as this gives us and others an insight into the herd's progress and gives backing to the promotion of animals.

Keith: Registration benefits marketing our herd and opens up the pedigree world to the show ring. Re-starting classification in 2008 after a lengthy break has been beneficial to us, being able to see strengths and weaknesses of individual cows and the whole herd.

Michael: Doing both is very important to build confidence and accountability when selling stock.

Gilmour: Registering is important to me due to the health issues and disease. Classification is great when done right but my feelings at the moment is there are too many highly classified animals in the breed.

Which society event in the calendar year do you look forward to and why?

Philip: The annual conference, although arranging your own is much more stressful. Gives us all a chance to meet old and new friends.

Keith: All Breeds All Britain Calf Show has been the highlight of the calendar since it started in 2002. It's wonderful to see the quality of the next generation of calves and young members and know the future of the breed is in safe hands. We've started our 'next generation', keep up lads!

Michael: It has to be the conferences when able to attend, 'Ayrshire' people, like the young members, seem to have the ability to mix well.

Gilmour: Conference is my favorite because I just had my own conference, and it was great, and I enjoy meeting new people that share the same passion as me, the Ayrshire cow!

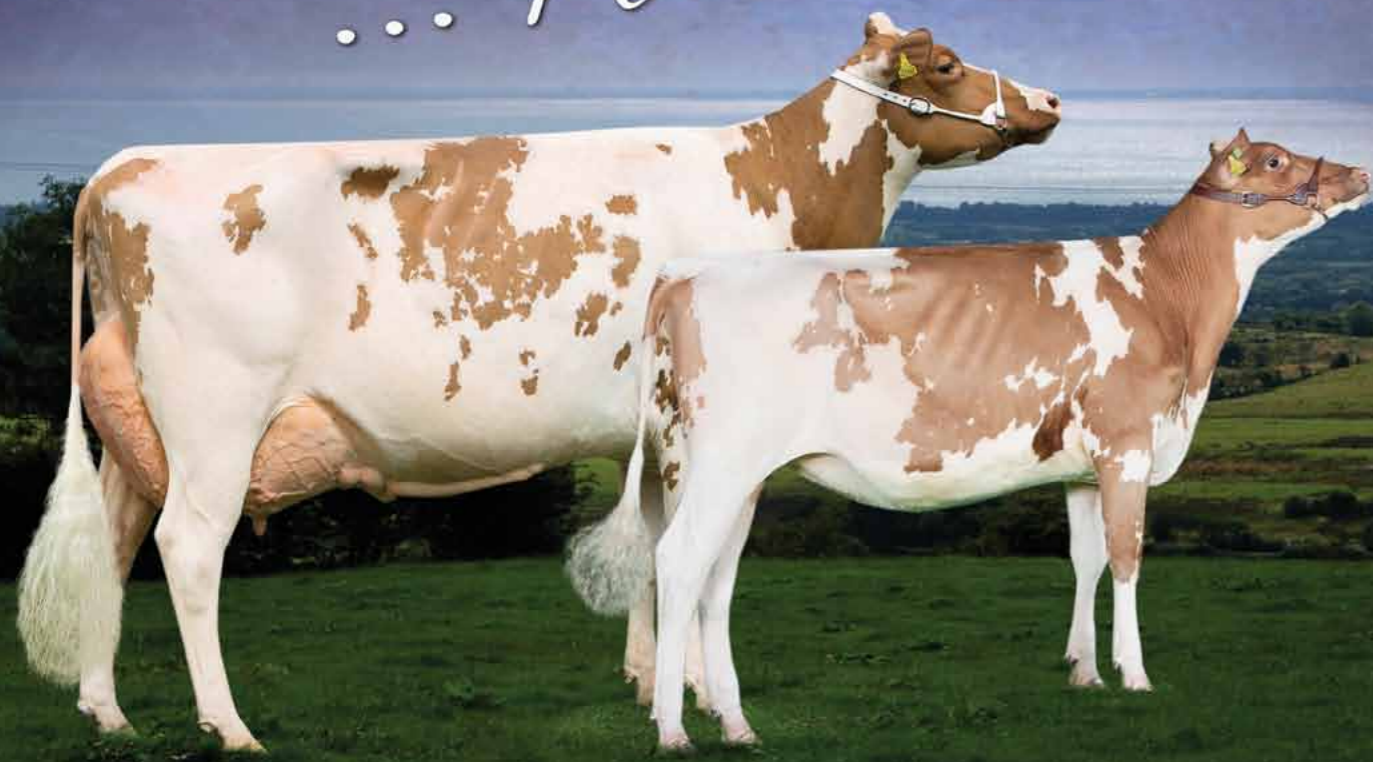

Miss Modern Tops National Ayrshire Sale

The ninth National Ayrshire sale held at Borderway, Carlisle featured animals from many of the leading herds in UK and included outstanding milking animals, bulls and young stock. Trade topped at 3,000gns, to an average of £1558, for a very similar trade on the previous year. It is worth mentioning that the quality on offer was superb, especially the cows (with many giving up to 40kgs) selling to an average of £1752, a considerable increase on the cow trade from a year ago.

The event was sponsored by Almins and the show was judged by John Smith from the Wigbro Wick Ayrshire herd in Essex. His Overall Champion went to West Mossiel Miss Modern 28, consigned by Stuart Gilliland from Castle Douglas. This close to perfect uddered cow has had a number of major show successes in 2016 and 2017. Her son by Modern Reality sold in the 2017 Spring Sale for 2,900gns, and she has

gained many more fans since then. She topped the trade at 3,000gns, going to GG Baynes & Son, Marleycote, Hexham.

The Reserve Champion went to the winning Ayrshire heifer, Plaskett Lucky Charm, consigned by Messrs Armstrong, Plaskettlands, Maryport. She was sired by Cuthill Towers Madison and bred from an EX94 dam with over 60 tonne lifetime yield. She sold for 1,350gns to RC Mitchells & Sons Mirkbooths, Carlisle.

The trade for bulls was very selective with just over half the bulls sold to an average of £1735. Topping this section was the second prize bull, Cuthill Towers Raptor, consigned by A&S Lawrie Cuthill Towers, Kinross. Raptor was sired by Forever Schoon Predator, his dam was the 2015 National Champion Cuthill Towers Radar Ray EX94 who has two lactations over 11000kgs. He sold for 2,800gns to S Allen, Caddy Road, N. Ireland.

The winning Red & White heifer sold for 1,850gns, Swaites Bridesmaid 11 was consigned by John Adamson & Son, Swaites Farm, Lanark. She was giving 31kgs and bred from a dam with over 9000kgs in her second. She now joins the herd of J McCulloch & Son, West High Ardwell Farm, Stranraer.

JA McGarva, Horseclose Farm, Annan sold a number of very milky cows and heifers topping at 2,150gns for Horseclose Bess 32. She was sired by Horseclose Q and bred from a dam with close to 5% butterfat. This very milky cow was bought by PA & JM Astley, Cefn Farm, Powys.

Commenting on the event following the sale auctioneer Glyn Lucas said "...the quality on offer today has been exceptional and a real credit to the Ayrshire breeders from across the UK who have consigned their very best. The National sale continues to be a special event in the Ayrshire calendar and a great event to promote the Ayrshire breed".

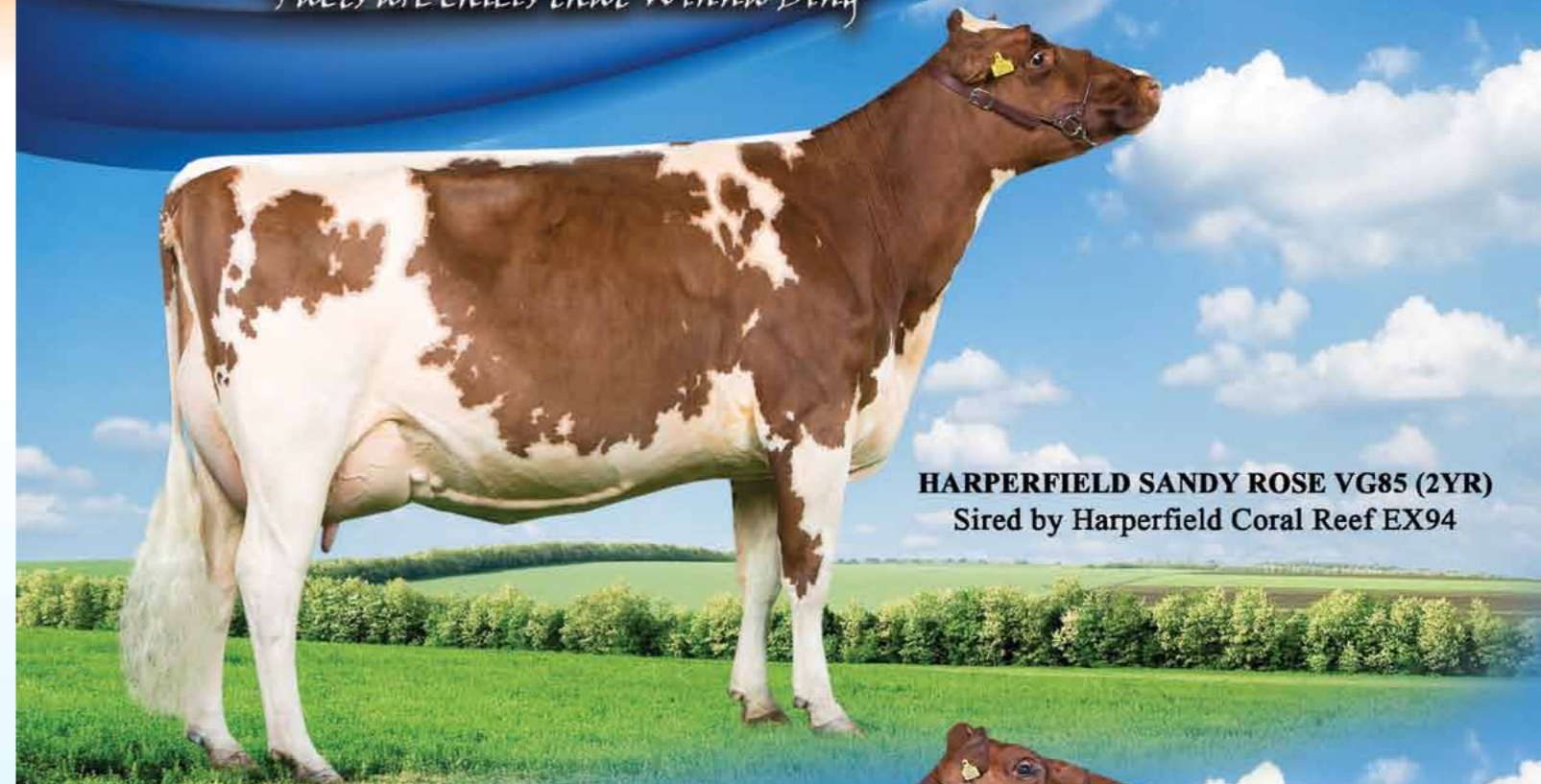

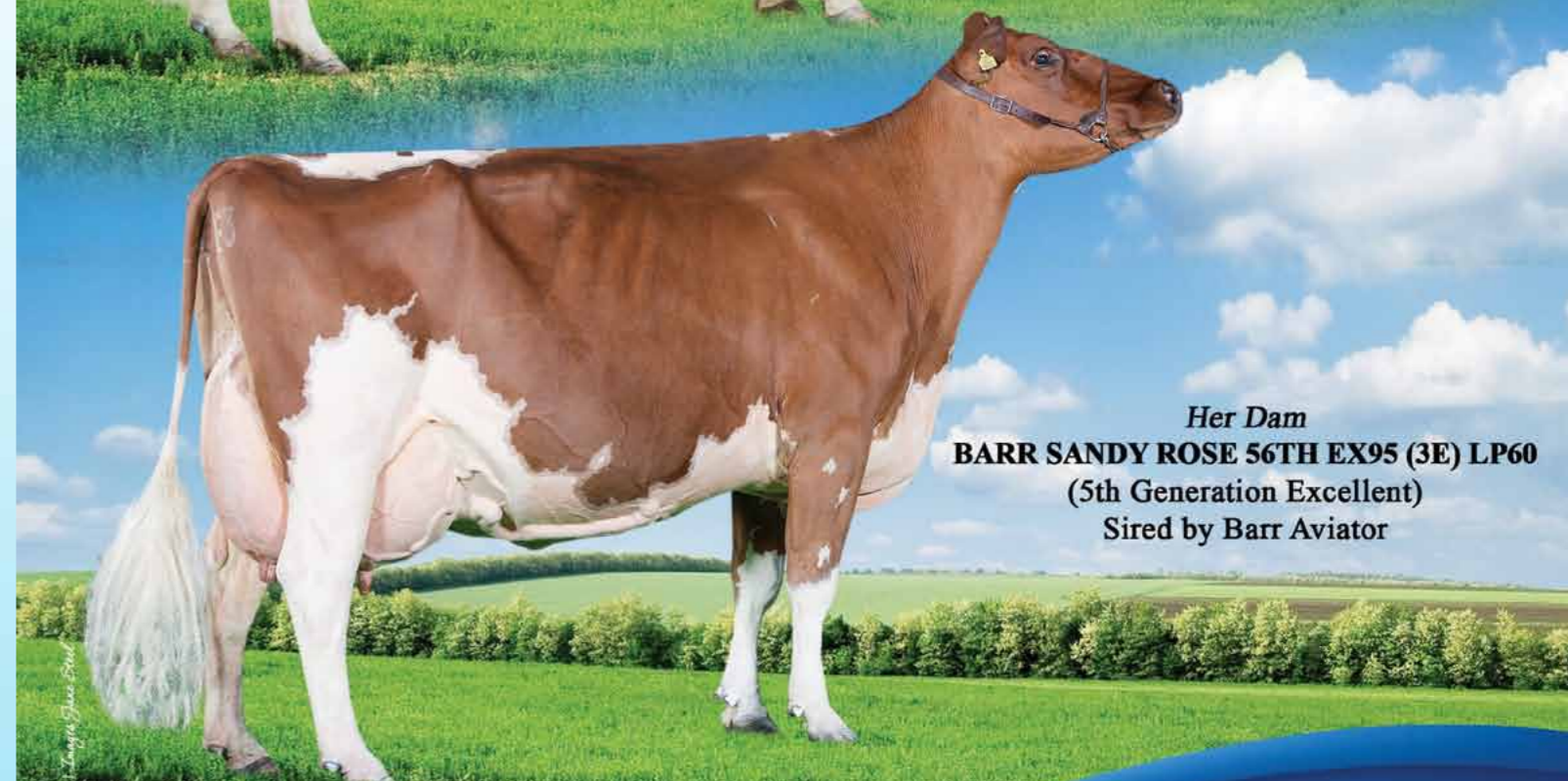
