# ALAN AND BRENDA COUTTS

Alan was born on the 20th Dec. 1929 and lived at Beeches Farm all his life. He had one sister Marie who passed away earlier this year. Alan attended Ollerton School, his children and grandchildren all attended that same school. He then went on to Altrincham Grammar School and on leaving school he worked on the family farm with his father Norman.

Alan married Brenda at Marthall Parish Church in 1954 where they have had a long and happy marriage of 64 years. They had 3 children Brian, Linda and Steven and 4 grandchildren Jodie, Hayley, Emma and David.

Alan joined the Ayrshire Cattle Society in the 1960's and started the famous "Knutsford Herd" of pedigree Ayrshires which he built up with great success. The herd won the Cheshire Ayrshire Club Herd Competition on numerous occasions and the NMR Cheshire herds competition. He had the highest yielding Ayrshire herd in the UK in 1995 then followed two years later winning the National Costings Competition within the Ayrshire Breed.

He enjoyed attending a lot of local shows with Brian and Steven with lots of success. In 1990 he was awarded Supreme Champion, and in 1991 reserve with Knutsford Pansy 18. She was the cow who put the Pansy family on the map and they became very well known within the Ayrshire breed. Knutsford Pansy 69 was a favourite and the dam of the bull Knutsford White Flash with semen sold through Cattle Services (AYR) Ltd, who went on to have over 300 daughters registered with the society.

Surplus heifers were sold at breed Sales at Uttoxeter, Crewe and Beeston and past president Philip Williams founded his Willhome Herd with stock from the Knutsford Herd. The milking portion of Alans herd was dispersed on the 14th September 2012.

In 2015 Alan was delighted to be presented with a Lifetime Achievement Award for his services to the Ayrshire Breed. He was a member of Cheshire Ayrshire breeders club for over 50 years being Chairman on many occasions. He was on the Ayrshire Judging panel and judged herd competitions and shows around the country and was honoured to have judged at the prestigious Royal Highland Show in Scotland. He also served on the Ayrshire Council representing region 9, Lancashire, Cheshire and the I.O.M

Alan's real passion in his life was for Brenda followed by his cows. Alan and Brenda attended the annual Ayrshire Conferences all over the country from Campbeltown to Falmouth and this event was the highlight of their year where they met and made many friends over the years. They also used to have an annual trip to the Ayr Bull sales each November.



Alan and Brenda were both avid followers of cricket and watched test match specials on T.V. Alan also attended Test Matches at Old Trafford and was present at the match when Jim Laker took the world record of 19 wickets in a test match. They went to Lords for the 1989 Village Cricket final in which Brian played and Steven was 12th man for Toft. Brenda's favourite player was Alastair Cook.

Alan loved his bowling and was in the first team for many years bowling for Chelford NFU club at Siddington, winning many competitions, and playing for fun. He loved his garden and greenhouse growing vegetables and his speciality was tomatoes of which he always gave many away.

Friends for over 30 years, Alan a true gentleman in every sense of the word, farmer and ambassador of the Ayrshire breed and Brenda a placid, independent, beautiful lady both inside and out.

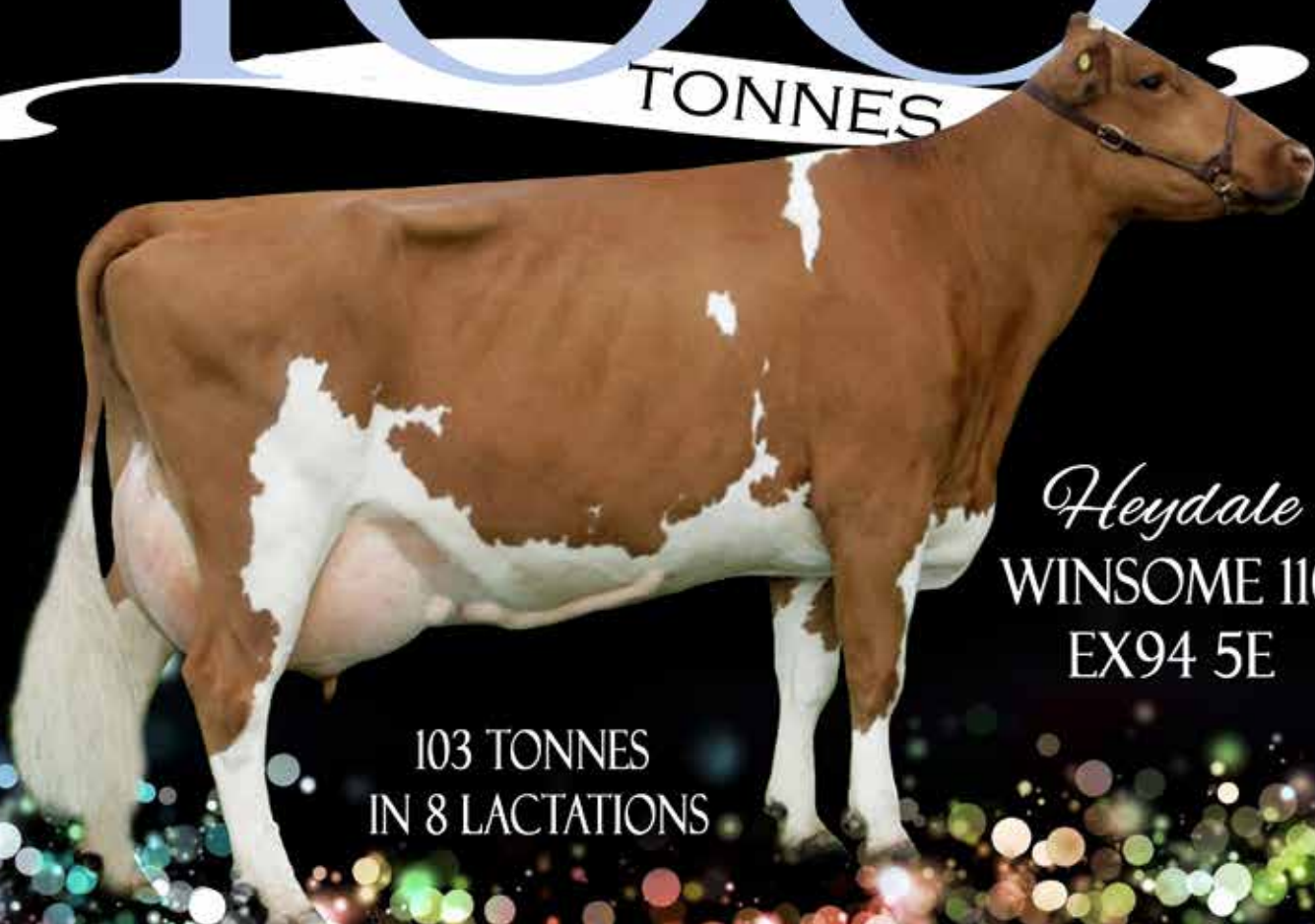

## GOING OUT ON A HIGH

Ayrshire Breed Manager Duncan Hunter writes on the genetic opportunities and a positive outlook in 2019



Looking back at the past year many of us will remember 2018 for different reasons. Maybe for reasons weather related or maybe a family birth, marriage or special birthday has made it memorable for you. As far as our organisation is concerned 2018 has been positive with several new breeders, registrations exceeding expectations and the breed progressing all over the United Kingdom. We have held several successful events and breed days during the year. Back in April, at East Church Ayrshires in Devon, we held a successful Open Day. In May we saw another wonderful conference in South Wales. Then a great turn out of members at Ravenhill Ayrshires in Northern Ireland for our Judging seminar in June. Our Young Breeders gathering in August in Ayr was again a fantastic event followed by the National Ayrshire Show in Telford in September which gave us world recognition. October saw the ABAB Calf Show, again a special event.

### POWER OF POSITIVITY

Council meetings this year have been very progressive, and I thank all Council members for their attendance, positivity and forward thinking. All of you are represented at Council by nominated members from your region. They are there to represent you and should be used to bring subjects to the table and to report back to you. Our recent meeting included several subjects including Classification, BVD tagging, Genomics and events. We made the decision following the success of our past two open days to hold another one in 2020. Work will commence on this early in the New Year.

### 2019 EVENTS

Preparations are underway for events in 2019 including the ACS Conference in Dumfries in May. With the conference

comes the annual conference sale. We are looking for consignments to that sale of live animals and embryos. If you have anything to offer for consideration, please contact me at your earliest convenience or by the end of January 2019 at the latest.

The All Britain and Ireland photographic competition will run again under the same rules as last year. Make sure we have your entries by Friday 18th January.

We will be holding two judging seminars next year with one in the North and one in the South. Again, we are looking for venues for both events, so please contact me with any offers to host one of them.

### GENOMICS

Genomics in our breed has been recently progressed. Female testing is now available, and several members have started testing their females. At our recent council meeting it was agreed that through the Frank Renshaw fund the Society would provide free of charge 100 genomic starter kits on a first come first served basis to encourage participation. Starter kits include ten TSUs and the device for taking samples. Extra TSUs can be purchased at your cost. Please contact

Claire at the office to receive yours. Female testing in your own herd will give you information on the production potential of those animals to help you with future breeding decisions. Numbers tested will also help strengthen our breeds genomic base. Look on the website in the Breeders section for prices on genomic testing.

### INTERNATIONAL

Several International appointments have been asked by UK members this year. Michael Broadley travelled to Kenya to judge the Ayrshire breed in Nairobi. You can read his experience of this further on in this journal. I went to Finland to judge at the Finn Dairy Expo at the beginning



in the reference population. For now, the type is of interest, but we are advised we should not rely heavily on this information. At the recent World Federation meetings there has been a committee set up to work on sharing of information of all Ayrshires around the world. If a database can be set up our reliability will be considerably higher going forward.

Breed Heritage have been working with breeders over the years and as an example of what we do I would like to share with you some recent births of young bulls born to our selected mating. Twin bulls by De La Plaine Vicking out of Brieryside Oblique Cherry EX93. We had hoped for a female from this mating, but these youngsters are also attractive as males and come out at 82.81% Ayrshire from a cow who has a 3-lactation average of 9,375kgs 5.00%bf 3.50%ptn.

of October. It was a pleasure to see so many good cows and I was delighted that the Ayrshire Champion cow Ranta Gun Valerie from Aaro and Mirja Koljonen went on to win the Interbreed dairy Champion. A first for an Ayrshire in Finland! I then travelled to Sweden to judge the Elmia show which took place during the visit of the World Federation delegates for their Mid Term meeting. Again, some good cows and a very worthy champion from Leif Larsson with the junior cow 1299 Pasta. Peter Berresford as I write this article is on route to Toronto to be associate judge to Andre Richard at the Royal Winter Fair. In November Stuart Williams headed overseas to Denmark to Judge the Danish Reds. It is always a pleasure to be asked to judge abroad. Not only do we go and do the job that is asked but we also use it as an opportunity to talk on our UK bloodlines and build future relationships.

A Stretton Triple Prime bull out of Bailiffscourt Hortense 267 EX91 LP60 SP. Many of you know this great cow and how she excelled against her herd mates at Bailiffscourt. Her 8-lactation average is 9,012kgs 4.30%bf 3.40%ptn. The sire stack is Triple Prime x Jubilee x First Prize x Bionic Boy x Precious Gift x Blue Lagoon. This bull is 100% Ayrshire, a complete outcross and although older bloodlines he still comes in with a PLI £143.

A Boldview Obliques Far bull out of Haresfoot Napier Punch EX94. Punch has averaged 8862kgs 4.20%bf 3.50%ptn. Obliques Far will maintain production whilst adding capacity and strength.

Flintstone Brazen Myrtle EX94 is a cow we really admire from a great family. This cow is breeding consistently well at Flintstone and has already 4 milking daughters all VG or EX. She has averaged 6 lactations 8138kgs 4.30%bf 3.60%ptn. She has a bull by De La Plaine Vicking. 93.75% Ayrshire.

## **BREED HERITAGE**

Breed Heritage have taken several genomic samples from females on the watch list to find out what information we can gain from the information. We will use this information as a breeding tool but please be aware its cow families we concentrate on. I can tell you that the reliability on the production side is generally between 38% and 48% depending on what ancestry is

# JUDGING ASSIGNMENT: KENYA

Micheal Broadley and his partner Diane, writes on their judging assignment to Kenya



On August the 7th Diane & myself set off to go to Kenya, to judge the Livestock Breeders Show in Nairobi. In preparation we had to have countless injections and anyone that knows me well will know I'm not too good with them!

We left from Manchester airport at 10.30 am to fly to Istanbul to then catch a 7 hour flight to Nairobi, we arrived at 2.30am minus my suitcase! Fortunately for all concerned Diane had hers. Arriving at the hotel was welcome after our long journey.

Dr Muchemi Kariuki, our host came to meet us later that evening and helped track down my case which was delivered to our hotel 45 minutes before we needed to leave the following morning. Dr Muchemi did assure me that if my suitcase didn't arrive in time he would take me shopping at 5am for a suit. I had to be smart because the president of Kenya was attending the show and as it was, I wasn't suitably dressed in my T shirt, jeans and trainers!

The following morning Dr Muchemi and his driver Joseph picked us up from the hotel at 5am. We had to leave so early because if we were 30 minutes later it would have taken two and a half hours to get through Nairobi, instead of the 45 minutes it did take because of the amount of traffic. We were both astounded at the amount of traffic and people on the roads at that time of the morning. We were taken on a tour around the financial part of the city, then on to a viewing point that overlooked the city. It was a fantastic sight!

We arrived at the show and much to our amazement it was cold! When we left the UK it was 30 degrees, so we hadn't been used to such low temperatures.

Judging commenced at 9am with a large entry of 120 Ayrshires forward, by far the largest breed represented. Blood lines from the cattle shown were a mixture of native, Canadian, Finnish and Swedish and one pedigree going back to Bankend Lord Ontario.

The junior champion came from ADC Olgatongo farm, from the young cow class over 3 years and under 5 years in milk by a bull called Humour. The reserve came from the young dry class sired by Maakiou Orkko Coffee, a Purolan Orkko son from Gicheha Farm Ltd. My overall champion again came from

Gicheha Farm. She was in the mature cow class over 5 years under 7 years old in milk and sired by Palmrya Jerrys Cannon, a Kildare Jerry son. Reserve was my junior champion. Following all of the production classes, best handler and groups etc. there were 34 classes in total judged.

On the final day of the show we were taken to the Kenya animal genetic resources centre, where we met the managing Director, Dr David Kios who was keen to know my view on the bulls we were going to see. We were taken to a grassed area where we took a seat while the bulls were paraded one by one in front of us. The bulls were of good confirmation and many of them were up to 8 years old. The centre was collecting on average 700 straws per week from each of them. Demand from the domestic market meant they were using them all. We were shown about 12 Ayrshires, 15 Holsteins, a couple of Jerseys and a Boran.

We then returned to the show where we chatted with people keen to learn about the Ayrshire Society in the UK and it was good to hear the familiar name Jack Lawson brought up by so many breeders. This also gave us the chance to thank all of the lovely people we had met for their kind hospitality.

The following day Dr Muchemi and his son Jean-Paul picked us up to take us to the Rift Valley. We were taken 8000 ft above sea level, words nor pictures can explain how amazing and breath taking the views of the valley are! We then travelled down through the bottom of the valley to Nakuru National Park where we were taken on a safari, to see White Rhinos, Water buffalo, Zebras and many more beautiful animals.

After the safari we visited ADC Lanet Feedlot, a mixed breed herd of 100 animals, 20 of them being Ayrshire. They were milked by hand by 12 people! Although the Ayrshires were small in numbers they were very desirable types. On our final day Dr Muchemi collected us to take us to Maakiou Estate Ltd which was located on the outskirts of Nairobi. Here they were growing coffee and milking 100 Ayrshires. The farm was a little more modernised as they did milk with dump buckets and a vacuum line, and there were a number of bulls standing from this farm at the AI centre we had previously visited. They were feeding fresh maize which had been chopped by hand with a stationary chopper, then bagged up and fed to the cows by a human feeder wagon! As we left the farm we saw a family sat with cows in a field and were told it was their job to stand with the cows all day to make sure they stayed in the grazing area.

The whole experience was phenomenal, breath taking and although at times we felt a little out of our comfort zone, we cannot thank Dr Muchemi and his colleagues enough for their very warm welcome, hospitality and the overall experience myself and Diane received.

# What is working the most hours on your farm?



The Cattle Information Service (CIS) is a leading milk recording supplier providing data from milk samples to support dairy farmers to make informed decisions about the future of their herd from feeding to breeding.

# The DANETTE/DILLY Family

Another new release in the Cattle Services (Ayr) Ltd stud is a bull called Swaites Dermott. We are delighted to be able to present to you a small feature behind the family of this exciting new sire.

In 2005, the Adamson family from Swaites Farm in

Lanark purchased Strathavon Danette from the Millera family in West Lothian. Strathavon Danette was an ASR registered daughter sired by Badenheath Elsie's Edmonton. It was in that same year that she gave birth to the Bankend Celebration sired Swaites Danette. That name today is regarded as one to remember by the Adamson's, as today her name carries many accolades. Swaites Danette EX94 4E LP80 1 Star Brood cow.

Swaites Danette is the cow who has really laid the foundation of this family. Scored EX94 4E its interesting to note that on both Body Conformation and Dairy Strength she scored EX97, demonstrating her power and strength and correctness through her body. Production was certainly her forte! She completed eight lactations where she averaged 10,523kgs 3.83%bf 3.11%ptn. Danette has produced six daughters. A VG88 Swaites Magnus, a VG86 Hawkesfield Blue Sky and a GP83 Shady Walnut Marc Anthony along with a Rosehill Real McCoy, Whitecroft Furtado and a Haresfoot Simply Perfek still to enter the herd. She also has a Son who has been used heavily at Swaites, called Swaites Dynamite who has 52 registered daughters including nine of which are VG or EX, and we are assured there are more great scores to come.

The daughter from Danette who has taken the family to the next level is Swaites Dilly 2, the VG88 daughter by Swaites Magnus who was a son of Bankend Mavis 77 EX90, and a cow who has been worked with by Breed Heritage. The superior production has passed on to the next generation along with a notable increase in components. In five lactations, Dilly 2 has averaged 10,521kgs 4.28%bf 3.39%ptn. As we have indicated, scored at VG88, its interesting to see that the Dairy Strength continues as she is scored EX96 for this trait. Swaites Dilly 2 has seven registered daughters including an EX91 Des Prairies Potter, Swaites Dilly 4 and the others include two daughters by Rosehill Real McCoy and two ET daughters by Haresfoot Simply Perfek.

Swaites Dilly 4 EX91 who is also on the Breed Heritage watch, also continues with the traits that the family are known for. Again, a superb Dairy Strength score of EX95, a four-lactation average of 9,092kgs 4.44%bf 3.23%ptn and is producing special progeny. She has a 2016 born daughter by Sandford Triclo and an August 2018 born Ravenhill Victory heifer. In 2017 she produced a Son by West Mossiel Modern Reality. Swaites Dermott is his name and is now on stud where semen is being drawn for Cattle Services Ayr Ltd in both conventional and in SexedUltra 4M. Dermott currently has the

## COPING WITH LOW FORAGE

Carrs Billington Chief Technical Officer, Duncan Rose offers expert advice to breeders low on forage and how to best manage this winter.



This article is for those that have come to the conclusion that their farm will be short of conserved forage and are looking to fill the gap. If there is any uncertainty on the size of this gap we will be pleased to help, calculate the amount of forage dry matter in store and determine the farms requirement from the number and type of stock to feed and the time period over which the forage has to last.

The priority is to know that there is enough “Forage NDF”, not simple fibre, but long fibre to facilitate good rumen function for all ruminating youngstock and dairy cows. We all know that in an intensive bull beef finishing system for example that are fed ad libitum concentrates and straw that 10 % of the diet must be straw. However, in this example this level of “long fibre” is far too low for healthy rumen function in growing heifers, and dairy cows that are expected to live more than 1.5 years! Some high yielding cows are already fed quite “concentrated” diets with a concentrate to forage ratio of 60:40 and in these cases one has to be careful not to take out large amounts of forage from the diet and replace it with more concentrates, whether dry or moist, and assume that is safe to do so. In cases where a good proportion of silage must be taken out of the diet then modest levels of chopped straw work well because straw has a high Forage NDF content e.g. 815 g Forage NDF / Kg DM compared to 480 g / Kg for a typical grass silage. Simply replacing NDF for NDF is a dangerous mistake at low levels of forage intake. Some alternative feeds and straights such as brewers’ grains and soya hulls may have high NDF content but have no “Forage NDF” because NDF particle size is too small.

So, in cases where available forage supply is likely to be very low then simply replacing the dry matter gap with any dry matter is a mistake and some forage must be purchased whether that be, another silage, hay, straw or dried Lucerne.

For farms that do have forage shortages but perhaps not as severe as the scenario described above then there is more flexibility with respect to the types of feeds that can be considered to fill the dry matter gap. The dairy herd and followers must all be fed well-balanced diets, but it is important to prioritize the highest quality forage to the dairy herd.

This year the availability of “alternative moist feeds “such as brewers’ grains, pressed pulp etc. are already tight and prices are likely to rise as winter progresses. Be very careful to evaluate all alternative feed options not only ensuring that the diet is well balanced but also that the feeds being considered are of good value. First of all evaluate them on a simple cost per tonne of dry matter. For example, let us say silage is being sold at £45 per tonne and it has a dry matter of 25%, this would equate to a value of £180 per tonne of Dry Matter. However, this simple rule of thumb takes no account of the energy and protein content of feeds and we strongly recommend feeds are evaluated using our Relative Feed Value Calculator which takes into account dry matter, nutrient composition and cost. Also remember to include any other costs e.g. transport, storage and allow for wastage in store. All sorts of alternative feeds are appearing

on the market now and may appear cheap per fresh tonne but are they good value on a dry matter basis?

This year’s silage is quite dry on average, and if other dry feeds such as hay, straw and dry blends are also going to be fed then diet “sorting” is likely to become more of a problem, so extra water or water and a liquid feed such as molasses should be added to the TMR to help prevent this. A sensible target dry matter for the overall TMR is around 40 % DM however those that practice “ Compact Feeding “ often take the TMR down to 38 % DM.

For a number of reasons the risk of TMR diets heating up after being fed out is higher this year which can be overcome by adding a preservative to the TMR as a dry additive or via the liquid feed.

As has already been mentioned the supply of alternative feeds could be very tight and whilst this was the case with respect to straw earlier on this summer supply pressure seems to have eased and it is likely a lot more straw will be fed to fill the forage dry matter gap. Many farms will be looking at dry cow and heifer-rearing diets to be based on straw saving precious higher quality forage for the transition and lactating cows.

## REPLACEMENT STOCK

Detailed below are some example diets progressively replacing grass silage. Assuming a target growth rate of 0.8kg per day and an average live weight of 350kg, the following diets using Lifetime Rearer would work well assuming there is adequate drinking water with the much drier diets.

There are a wide range of options possible to feed replacement stock and still achieve the desired animal health and growth targets.

## LACTATING COWS

Most dairy diets fed in the UK are based on grass silage which sometimes include whole crop and or maize silage topped up with concentrates. However this winter there may be a need to reformulate alternative diets with a significant reduction in the contribution from grass silage.

Where previously commonly used forage replacers are difficult or impossible to find, Carrs Billington have formulated a high fibre Forage Extender Blend which can be used as a partial replacement for grass silage. Of course bespoke custom blends can be formulated to incorporate other feed materials along with high fibre feeds to meet farm and animal requirements.

The recent bulls, Brieryside Magic and Lyner Oblique Focus have both sold very well in the new SEXED Ultra 4M straws. Another sire Swaites Dermott has recently been released in SEXED Ultra 4M straws and is available for you to use today. Moving forward there are hopefully another two exciting young sires due to enter the sexing stud over the winter period which will mean another two sires will

be available in this sexed product line in the spring. Another exciting sire that we recently have put onto centre has a PLI of £374, predictions of 348kg milk with positive fat and protein % who's three nearest dams average 93 points on classification. He is due to be released at Christmas time, he will be available in conventional straws only.

In Early October Michael Broadley and I visited the World Dairy Expo in Madison, USA. We were part of the UK tag stand which was in the International lounge, as well as Cattle Services being on the stand there was other businesses from the UK there who all had the same aim as us which was to promote UK products to the world. The Cattle show was very good with deep classes in the milking cows. It was also very interesting to speak to American breeders who were very interested in what the UK Ayrshire was doing and what genetics we have available. Out and about on farms progeny of our bulls continue to impress up and down the country, daughters of Hilltown Oblique and Rosehill Manderville now have 3rd calved daughters. 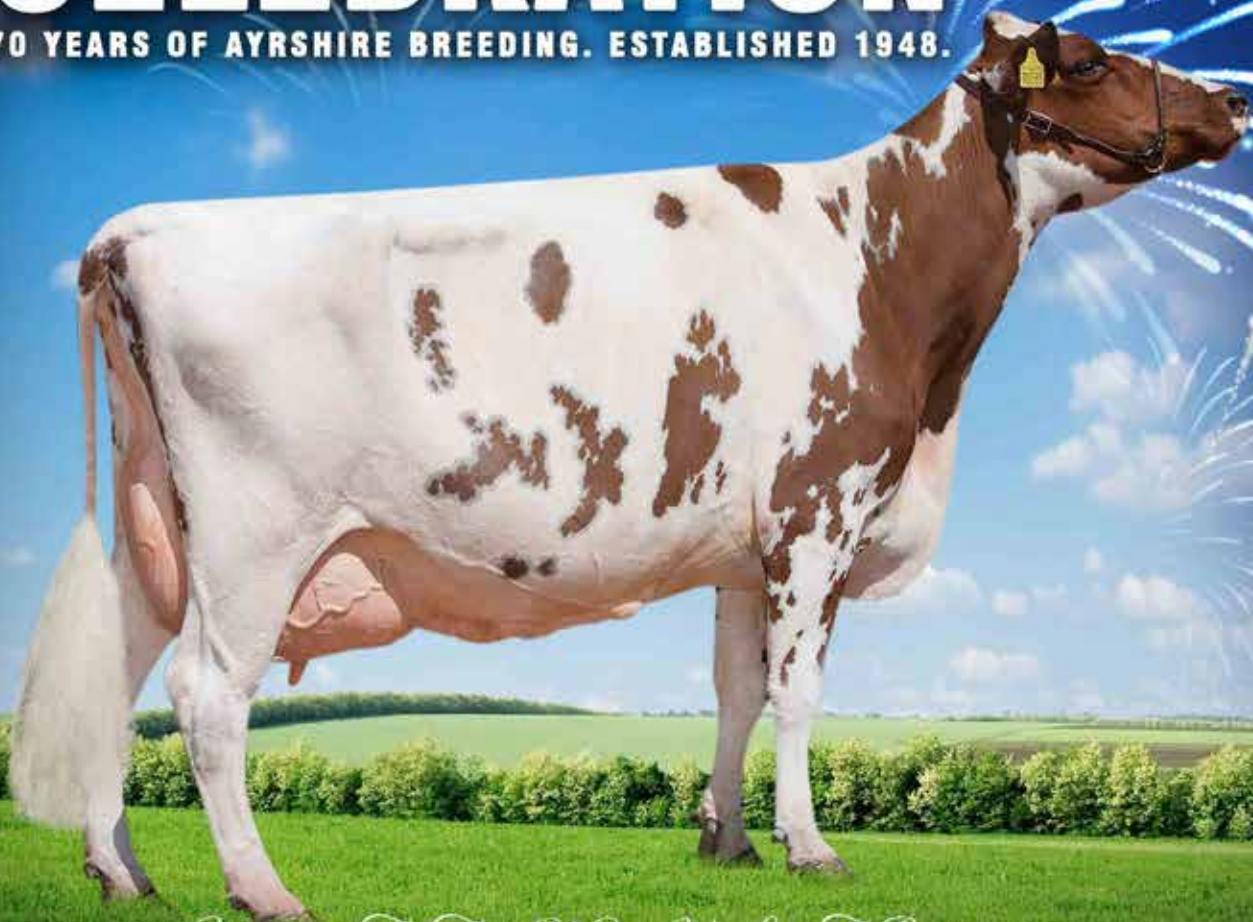

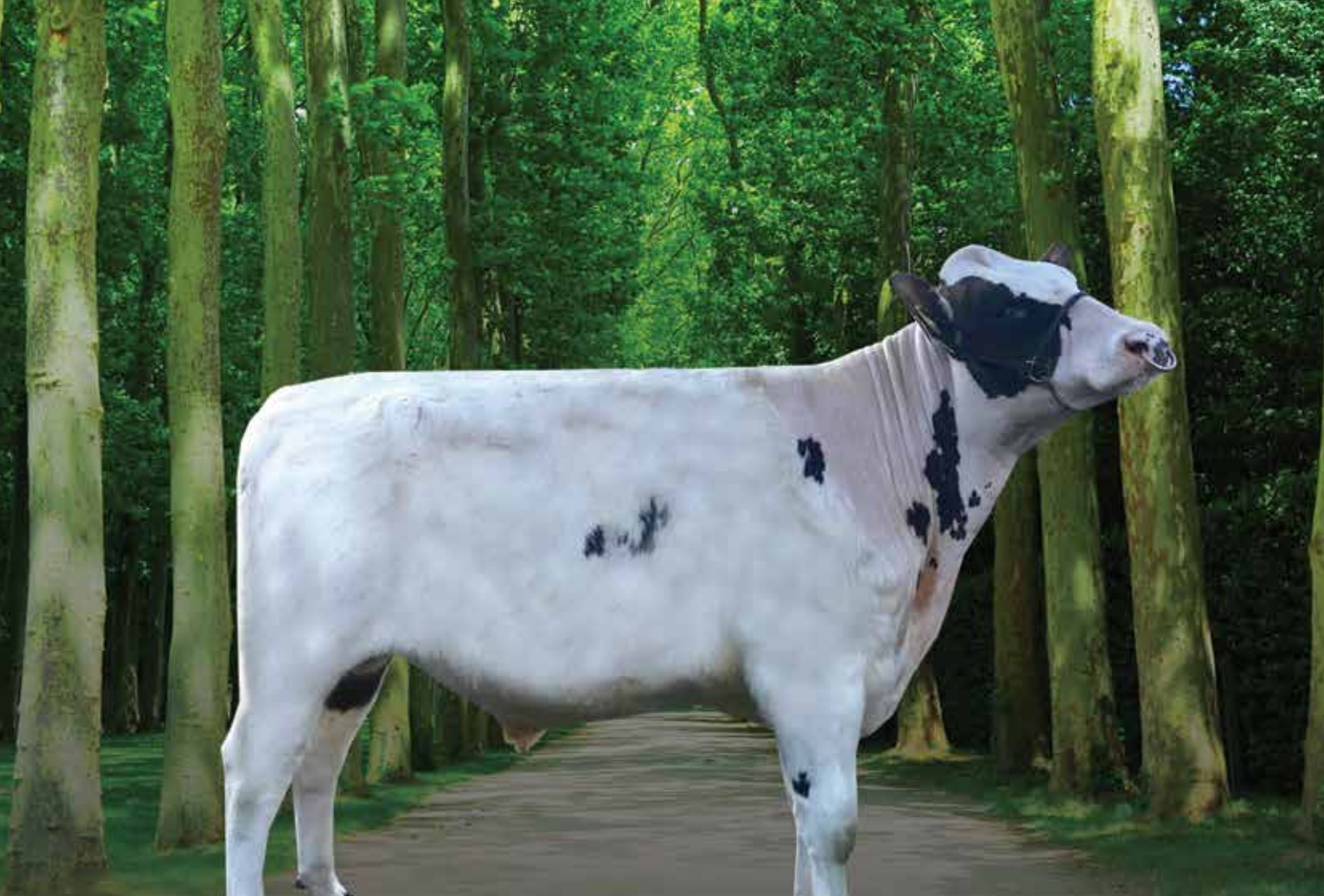

## HALLOWEEN NIGHT IN THE NEW PARLOUR!

Hi, I'm Jane Barnes, married to Mark Barnes and, with our children Charlotte & Harry, we farm at Somerby in East Leicestershire. Our 180 cow 'Somerby' Ayrshire herd produces milk for Blue Stilton at Long Clawson Dairy. For the past 15 years or so I've also given talks to groups - "Tales from a Dairy Farmers' Wife" - which is all about my life on our family run farm, telling amusing stories and real life anecdotes.

Just yesterday, as I write this blog, we began evening milking through our new parlour! It was with great excitement that all our builders, parlour fitters, bulk tank fitter & family etc were all on site to watch this momentous event. With last minute temporary gate hanging (farmer style) and re-arrange the electric fencing to make a new entrance, we introduced the cows to the new enormous collecting

moment, is hot water for the calves, as they've yet to move the water heater from the old dairy and reconnect for calf feeding). Not long to go when it's all connected and then the dog (Beattie) and I can enjoy the walk to and from the new farm, which I'm positive will help me loose that 'muffin top' that's crept up on me lately!

All in all, we're shocked at how well the first milkings have gone and how wonderfully clean, spacious, airy & light the whole farm feels, compared to the tight limited access and confined space in the old farmyard in Church Lane. We're so excited about the future of our dairy business too. Me, Mark and Harry are committed and positive we've made the right decision to build a new place and how luck Harry is, at just 21 years old. Even Harry's Grandfather, Robert Waterfall, (a retired dairy farmer) keeps popping over to lend a hand, share his knowledge and help us with the move. It's been a real family affair!

yard!

We are very grateful to Mick Grimes & team from G&B Contracting who have guided us throughout this project with their knowledge and expert advice. They've built many more dairy buildings than we have and we're so glad they could do ours too. We think we're milking around 170 cows presently, so with 24 cows aside (sometimes 26 due to smaller heifers), we're milking them in no time at all. Although everything is new, clean and shiny, the cows walked straight in, ate plenty of cake, hardly messed about and walked out just as keenly - straight to a feed of new silage - which meant walking through the brand new foot bath!

Not a problem for these wonderful Ayrshires, they simply took it all in their stride. I think keeping the cows tight for fodder was the key! Although we've let them eat the silage inside the new feed shed for the past couple of nights, they've always had the choice to return to the paddock or stay in. On Saturday night it poured down with rain, and most of them staying inside having to stand all night as the cubicles weren't quite finished. However, last night they had access to the cubicles and the paddock so slowly they're coming round to the idea of staying in, after the chilly frost we had last night too.

So it's been a momentous event in our lives and for Mark it's his first move, having worked in this village all his life. As he walks about the old farm buildings, which immediately look dead and forgotten, he is reminded of all the past generations who erected them, seeing and hearing all his past memories of time well spent within their walls. And how they're being raided of all their reusable equipment and slowly being dismantled. It's now scarily eerie and desolate and would make an ideal venue for a ghost tour. Quite relevant as its Halloween tonight!

So solving one problem often brings up many others! For instance, the journey from our village home to the new farm is only a matter of 500m as the crow flies across the fields. However, the battle to jump straight on the quad bike (Marks preferred method of travel) or the Land Rover, going through the busy village High Street and past the shop, school and church, making that route the slower one, between the three of us continues. The walking route should only take 5 minutes, but the drawback is, can't carry a lot of "stuff" as well! (The stuff I mean, at the

There's the other side of the cubicles to complete and a slurry lagoon needs building and more concrete needs laying outside the sheds. Then there's all the new fencing & tracks that we need to do before spring turnout. But we feel we're on the home stretch now.

Not a lot else has happened in my life since my last blog, other than what's going on at home. Although I've managed to keep up with all my Farm Talks I had booked in over this summer. Having cancelled Farm Visits due to the building project, I'm steadily getting more bookings for the new farm tours due to start next spring. That's if I get my Cow Classroom finished over this winter too!

We didn't plan any holidays this year either, but just had a night or two away locally. Mark and I had a lovely couple of days going round the wonderful herds for the Cumberland Herd competition in August. That was a first for both of us and a real pleasure. We felt very honoured to have been asked to Judge that competition this year. In September we had fabulous weather whilst visiting The Queens Norfolk home, Sandringham House and Gardens which was a rather nice break from cows and building sites! We visited and stayed over with our daughter Charlotte in Suffolk a couple of times. Then Mark and I ventured over to visit Sue and Tom Crawford one Sunday for a delicious lunch and took a look around their marvelous robots systems.

Even though the weather has now suddenly turned wintery, this year couldn't have been better conditions for building. We've done all the earth moving, laying stone & concrete in the dryer weather and now working undercover, the weather can do what it likes! At the end of some hard weeks of concreting, we've been supplying our builders with small treats such as Fish & Chip lunches on the colder days or cakes and biscuits with cans of Cola and Ice creams on the hotter days. There's definitely been a good community spirit on site and everyone's kept on smiling through. We've still got a long way to go but then "Rome wasn't built in a day" either!

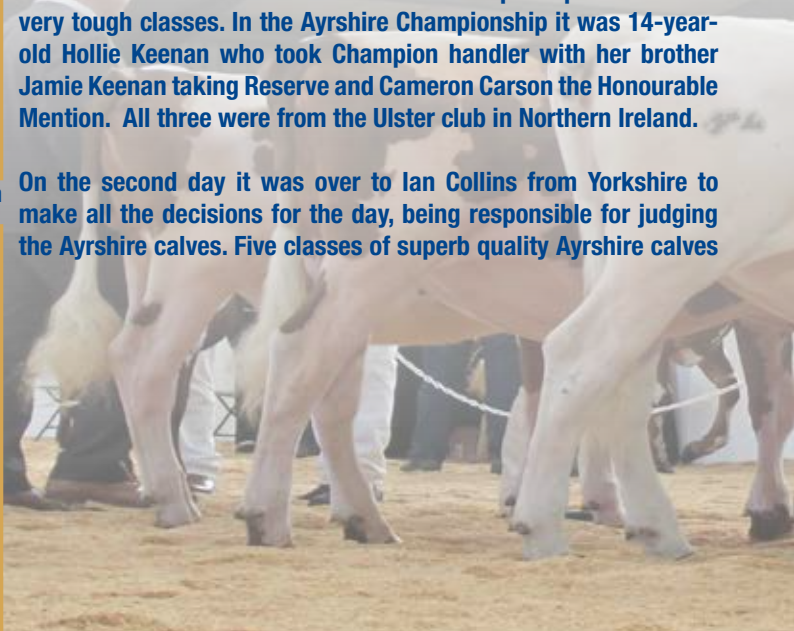

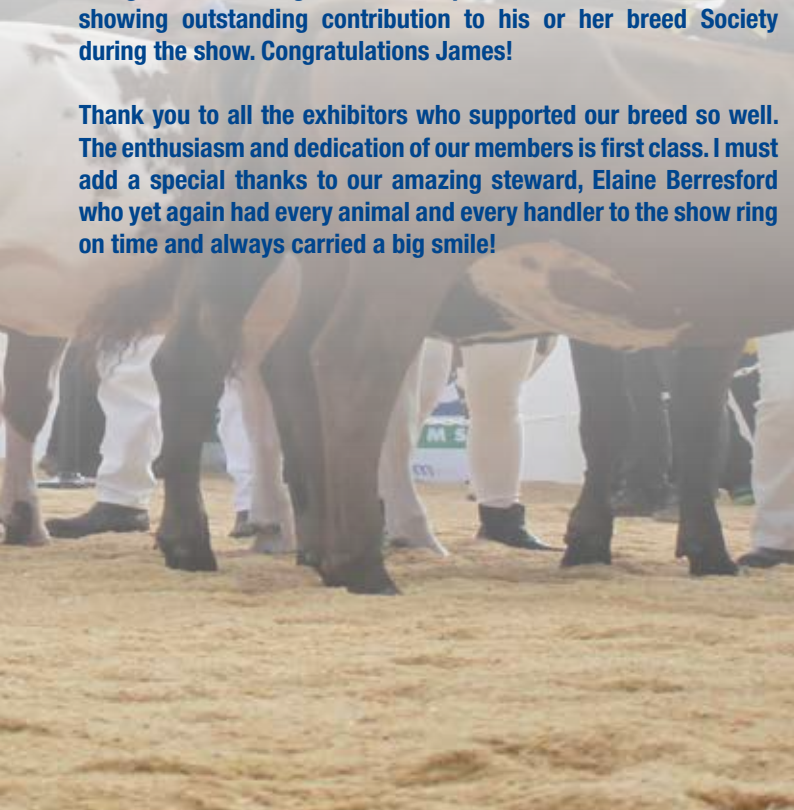

## FAVOURITE COW FAMILY IN YOUR OWN HERD AND WHY?

**Thomas** - The Rosie family is a favourite because they have high components and that's something I look for when breeding cows.

**Martin** - My Margie family. Originating from Middle K SPW Margie is EX93 5E. At her last recording she was 299 days in milk in her 7th lactation and has done 10,743kg, taking her LP to 68,818 kgs. She has 3 Prime daughters. The first is dry with her 4th and is EX91 with 26,222 kgs. The other two are twins and are milking in their second lactation. One is VG86 and the other GP83. They are a no bother family and with production like that it makes them my favourite family at home.

**John** - Mine would have to be the Ethels for their consistency, good type and ability to milk well for many lactations.

**Christian** - My favourite cow family would be the Pam family. Strong long-lasting cows with style, body and plenty of power with balance, great productivity and look great in the show ring.

## FAVOURITE COW FAMILY IN THE UK AND WHY?

**Thomas** - The Punch Family from Killoch. Although maybe not so widely known now, they did well at shows, milked well and lived a long time.

**Martin** - Very hard choice but would go with the Ray family at Cuthill Towers. I haven't seen as many as I would like, but any I have seen are my sort of cow.

**John** - The Fragy family at Hunnington would have to be my favourite for consistently good cows no matter what the sire. Strong families work!!

**Christian** - The Fragy family. Lovely clean boned stylish cows which are the type of cow I try to breed.

## SIRE WHICH HAS HAD THE BIGGEST INFLUENCE WITHIN YOUR HERD?

**Thomas** - I would be torn between two. Meikle Laught Triple Crown for their traditionality and longevity, and Brieryside Jubilant Scot for their body capacity.

**Martin** - Stamford Prize Winner EX93. (Stamford First Prize x Stonehills Madonna EX93). He has bred 5 EX and 5 VG cows. All his daughters have consistently and have been high producers and good breeders. Kirkinriola PCB Joy who won the ABAB Calf Show in 2017 is out of one of his daughters.

**John** - Ballyclan first command must be the sire with most influence in my herd. Good udders, legs and feet and last forever,

plus they were cows that bred great daughters.

**Christian** - Ardmore pot of gold (Des Prairies Potter x Ardmore Gay Lady 30 VG89 LP60)

## CURRENT SIRES IN USE IN YOUR HERD?

**Thomas** - Rosehill Manderville, Hilltown Oblique, Rosehill Vitality, Lyner Oblique Focus, Troutbeck Skyfall, Brieryside Magic, Brieryside Jubilant Scot, Boldview Obliques Far, Palmyra Calimero Blackjack.

**Martin** - Rosehill Manderville, Marbrae Bigtime, Hunnington Famous and current stock bull Cottown Aftershock (Marlow from the Amelia family), Brieryside Magic and Lyner Oblique Focus.

**John** - Ravenhill Victory, Ravenhill Stormin Norman, Nexus Dreamer, Lagace Ristourn, Rosehill Manderville, Troutbeck Skyfall, Haresfoot Panache and Hilltown Oblique.

**Christian** - Kamouraska Rockstar, Hunnington Mandella, Sandyford Triclo and West Mossgiel Modern Reality.

## TELL US ABOUT THE ELDEST COW IN YOUR HERD?

**Thomas** - Grove Primrose 3 EX93 3E is 17 years old and by Ardrossan EV Kates Trident was one of the first heifers I ever showed and that was at Antrim Show in 2004. My daughter Katie calls her "The Boss" as Primrose 3 is eight months older than she is!

**Martin** - Kinninmonth Cindy EX90 2E. Humestone Reddish x Brocklehill Happy Spirit. Born 10/12/06 currently carrying her 10th. LP 73,820Kg. There are many descendants of this cow at home. The favourite at the minute is an EX94 (2E) granddaughter by Brocklehill Buccaneer.

**John** - Ravenhill Ethel 344 by Ravenhill Quandry. She was 15 years old in March and is in her 13th lactation. Not my highest ever yielder but has been EX 8 times and averages 7,500 and her latest cell count was 60.

**Christian** - Eldest cow in herd is Cuthill Towers Bella 16. She is sired by Cuthill Towers White Knight and is EX93. She was the very first cow we showed and now in her 8th lactation has given over 60 tonnes of milk.

## WHAT COW WITH WHICH SIRE FROM ANY BREEDING IN THE WORLD WOULD YOU SEE AS AN IDEAL MATING FOR YOU?

**Thomas** - A cow I admire greatly is Middle Punchs Emerald Blend EX95 8E. The longevity of this cow, regular calving, production

and milk solids is amazing. The dairyness and frame of this cow I really like and if bred to Hiltown Obilque in my eyes, would be a great mating which would still maintain the great milk production and solids. A pedigree with 2 and 3 generations of EX from dams on both sides and a high PLI.

*Martin* - Again a tough one. Something along the lines of the Mandella Radar Ray from Cuthill Towers with Hunnington Famous. On paper that is as good as it gets for me.

*John* - the mating that worked a dream for me was Ardrossen EV Kates Trident on to my Torpane tulip cow. Excellent every time.

*Christian* - For me the best cow that I would use is Sandyford Clover 10 EX97 8E. The sire I would use for mating with her would be Cuthill Towers White Knight. Both families have superior chest width, strength with dairyness and great style for the show ring.

### I MILK AYRSHIRES BECAUSE ....

*Thomas* - "they are easy managed, have good health traits and production wise have quality milk from simple rations".

*Martin* - "they produce a lot of good quality milk with low cost and are no bother in our system".

*John* - "they are what I have always milked and what I will always milk them. They last forever and have plenty of milk and I see no reason to change"!

*Christian* - "I milk Ayrshires because I have a great love for the breed. They have great temperament, health traits and longevity. To me they are the best fit to cross with over Holstein. But most of all they are the most pleasing on the eye".

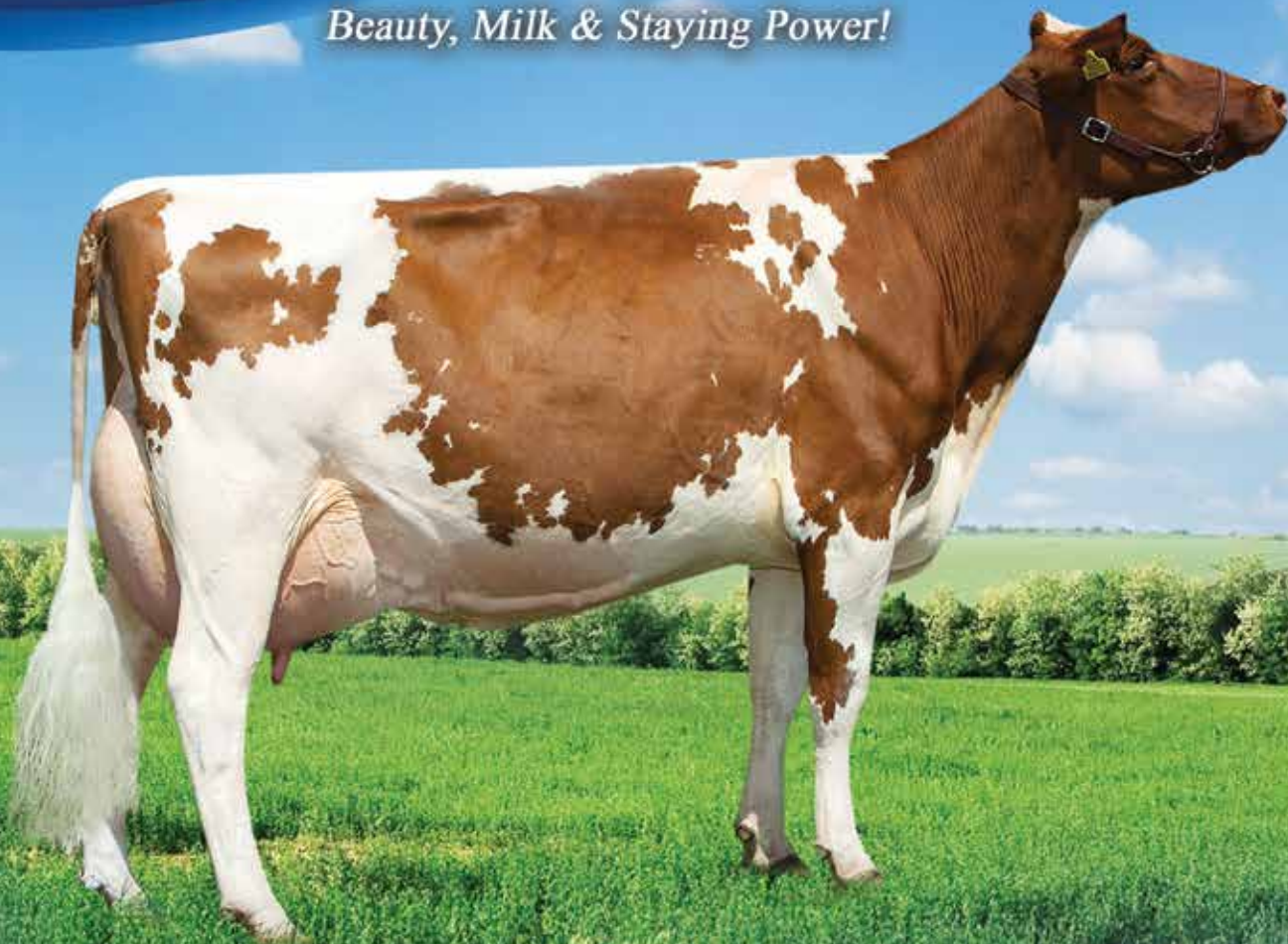

## LP100 COWS



### Ravenhill Tulip 68 EX91 3E LP100 – J Suffern

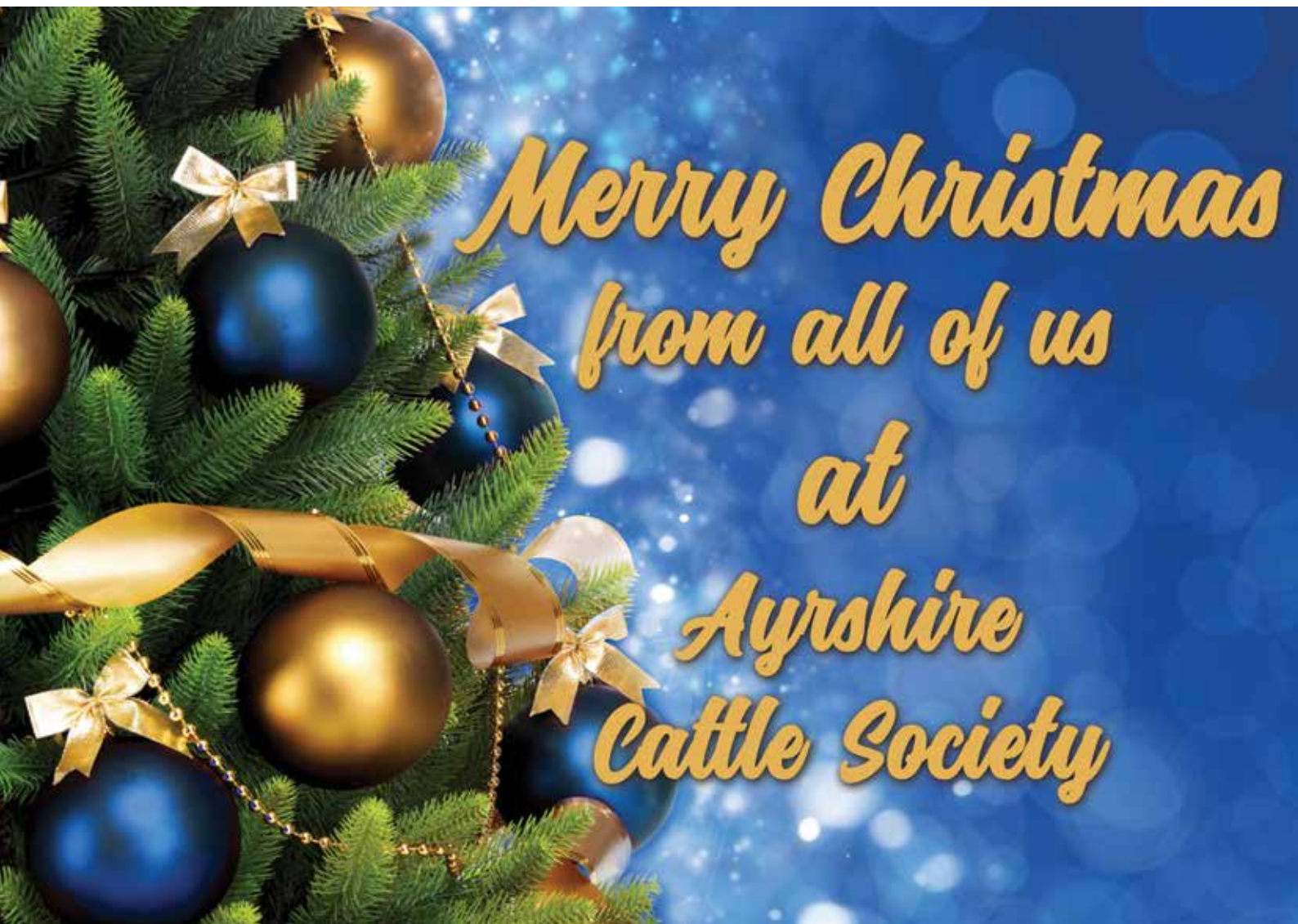

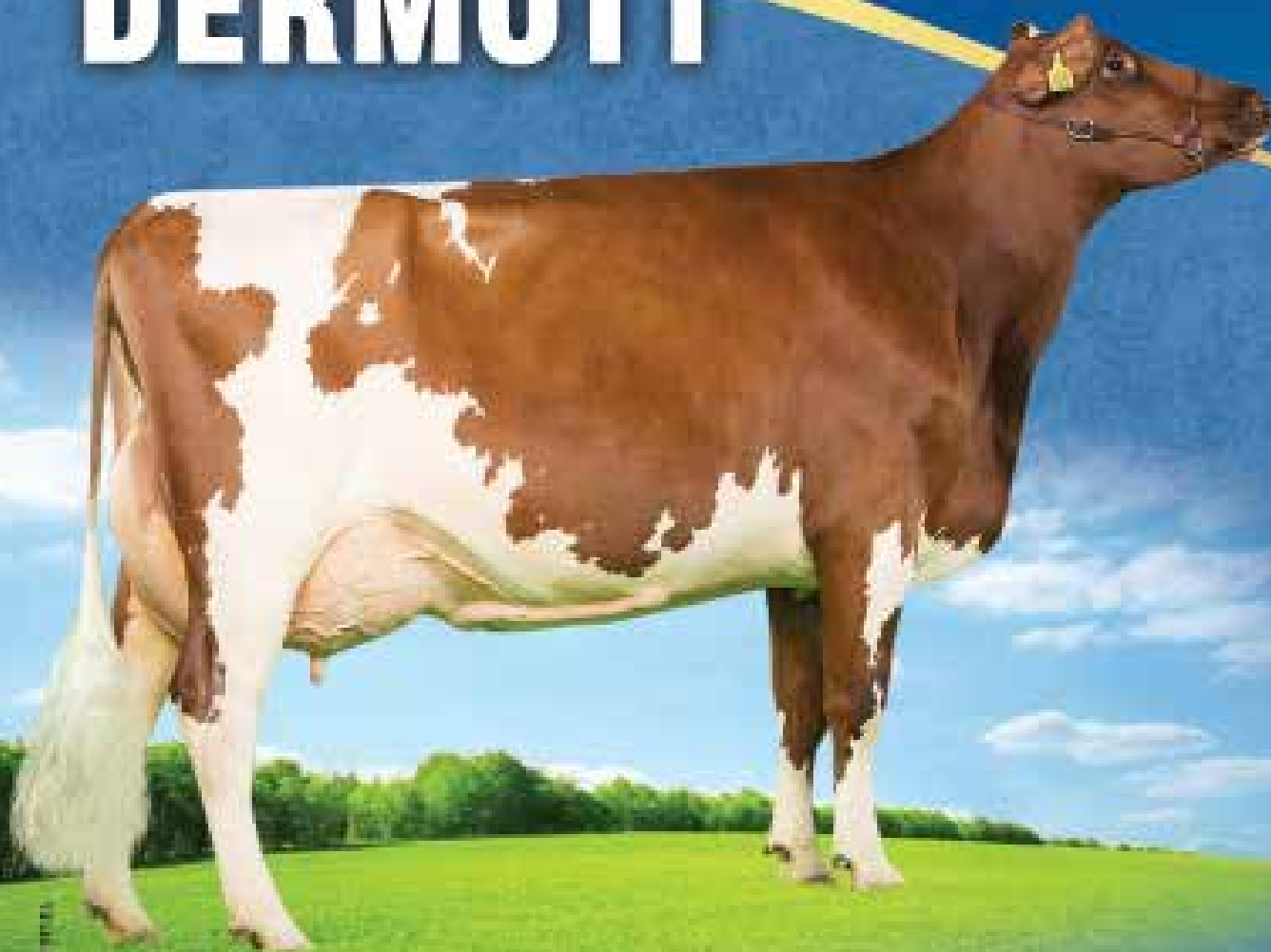
