JUDGES PROFILES

Giuseppe Quaini - Judge for the Holstein classes



Italian Giuseppe Quaini will judge the Holstein breed featuring eight classes, four championship classes and the Holstein group of four. Giuseppe has spent most of his life within the dairy breeding industry and currently milks 400 cows across 200 hectares in Casterverde near Cremona, Italy.

Giuseppe's judging life started in 1979 - he has since judged almost everywhere in the world: 5 times at the Italian National Show, 4 times in the UK including The National Holstein Show, 7 times in Holland, 6 times in Canada, 2 times in the USA (associate judge at the 2003 WDE Madison), also Argentina, Mexico, Brazil, Azores Islands, 6 times in Spain, 2 times in Ireland, Germany, Swiss Expo and Bulle in Switzerland, Portugal, Croatia, and many others!





Robert Hunter - Judge for the Jersey and Brown Swiss classes

From Lanarkshire Robert has judged numerous herd competitions and many of the major shows including, Yorkshire, Balmoral, Royal Welsh and the Autumn Show on the island of Jersey. His family have had many successes in the show ring predominately at the Royal Highland Show and AgriScot where they have been fortunate to have been champions several times. They have had many awards for production and inspection at national level with their pedigree herds of Letterkenny Holsteins and Clydevalley Jerseys.



Michael Broadley - Judge for the Ayrshire & Dairy Shorthorn classes

Michael works in partnership with his parents and brother in Derbyshire. The 245 acre farm, in the heart of the Peak District National Park, milks 160 Ayrshires under the Whitecroft prefix alongside 60 Holstein Friesians under the Brundcliffe prefix. The herds run together but are milk recorded separately, and their claim to fame is having the highest registering Ayrshire herd at 1100 ft above sea level. Michael has judged across the country including the National Calf Show, the Northern Ireland Calf Show, Balmoral Show, the Royal Norfolk Show, the Royal Welsh, Cheshire, and South West Dairy Show - plus numerous other local shows. A member of the Ayrshire Breed Heritage committee, Michael with his family show Ayrshires and actively encourage young members into showing as they believe this is a win win situation that gets the breed in the public eye.

AYRSHIRE

Animals entered must be registered in the Ayrshire Society Herd Book and be at least 51% Ayrshire for classes 1-3. If Black & White in colour, animals must be 100% Ayrshire.

Exhibitors must be members of the Shorthorn Society of the UK and Ireland. All cattle must be of Shorthorn colour, contain a minimum of 25% Shorthorn blood and be registered in Coates Herd book.

HOLSTEIN

Animals entered must be registered in either the Holstein UK Herd Book or in Class B of the Supplementary Register and born in the United Kingdom.

The classes will be split according to the number of entries.

- Class 13 JUNIOR 2 YEAR - OLD IN MILK:
Born May 2014 & later, aged under 29 months
- Class 14 INTERMEDIATE 2 YEAR -OLD IN MILK:
Born between Nov '13 - Apr '14, aged 29 - 34 months
- Class 15 SENIOR 2 YEAR-OLD IN MILK:
Born between May '13 - Oct '13, aged 35 - 40 months
- Class 16 JUNIOR 3 YEAR-OLD IN MILK:
Born between Nov '12 - Apr '13, aged 41 - 46 months
- Class 17 SENIOR 3 YEAR-OLD IN MILK:
Born between May '12 - Oct '12, aged 47 - 52 months
- Class 18 4 YEAR-OLD IN MILK:
Born between May '11 - Apr '12, aged 53 - 64 months

- Class 19 5 YEAR -OLD IN MILK:
Born between May '10 - April '11, aged 65 -76 months
- Class 20 MATURE COW IN MILK:
Born Apr '10 or earlier, aged 77 months & older

UK DAIRY DAY INFORMATION & REGULATIONS

Please observe the following rules for your safety, the smooth running of the Show and the enjoyment of all who visit in any capacity.

Show Opening Times

Wednesday 14th September 2016- 8am to 6pm

1. Arrival & Departure

Dairy cattle may be admitted on to site from 3pm on Sunday 11th September until 8pm on Tuesday 13th September.

Cattle may leave after the end of the show on Wednesday 14th September and in all instances must be removed from site by 10am on Thursday 15th September.

2. Entry Fees

There will be no cost for occupied stalls at this year's UK Dairy Day. However each individual stall that is booked but remains unoccupied for cattle will incur a charge of £50.00/stall (inclusive of VAT).

All charges for extra stalls will be deducted from prize money before the payment will be made.

3. Stall Reservations, Catalogue Entries and Fees

An exhibitor/ team may reserve at the fee stated above any number of stalls he/she requires.

4. Substitutes

Substitute's entries will be accepted, please ensure you notify the cattle office immediately.

5. Prize Money

Coloured Breed classes - prize money will be distributed as follows in each class;

1st	£100
2nd	£75
3rd - 10th	£50

National Holstein Show - prize money will be distributed as follows in each class;

1st	£175
2nd	£125
3rd	£75
4th - 10th	£50

Rosettes and prize cards are to be awarded down to 10th place, plus tail ribbons for Best Udder, Exhibitor Bred & Highest Production in each class.

All Breed Champions will receive £500 plus a Championship Sash. The winning club of the Holstein groups will receive £1,000 (*Holstein only event)

Prize money will be paid on the day of the show to either your Holstein UK account, or direct to the account details provided below. All charges for extra stalls will be deducted from the prize money before payment will be made.

6. Exhibitor Ticket Allocation

All livestock exhibitors will be required to wear identification wristbands at all times while on site, wristbands will allow 24 hours access to the livestock hall as well as entry to the trade show and 15% discount at the canteen located upstairs in the Ironbridge Suite. Wristband allocation will be 1 per animals and will be issued at the time of arrival.

7. Accommodation

All teams exhibiting will be required to book their own accommodation;

All hotels are within a 5 minute walk of the exhibition halls.

Unfortunately we are unable to offer any camping and caravanning facilities on site.

8. Stockmen’s Catering

The stockmen’s canteen will be located in the Ironbridge Suite at the top of the stairs from the foyer. UK Dairy Day have secured a 15% discount on all food from the canteen for stockmen with a stockman’s wristband. Complimentary tea & coffee will also be provided.

9. Dress

Leaders must wear society uniform when in the ring. Club shirts will be permitted to be worn during the Club Group of Four (*Holstein only event)

10. Bedding

Straw will be provided on arrival and will be available for exhibitors throughout the event. Sawdust/ Fodder and Haylage will NOT be provided and will NOT be available to buy at on site.

Please note - deliveries of the above must be organised with the UK Dairy Day team prior to its arrival.

11. Ventilation

Two Altra Air fans will be installed in the cattle hall kindly sponsored by Wilson Agri. These fans have the capacity to move up to 395,000 cfm over 60 to 70 ft area. Exhibitors will not be permitted to erect their own fan.

11. Acceptance of Entries

The Show reserves the right to refuse any entry without providing reasons. It is the responsibility of the exhibitors/teams to ensure stall bookings are posted well in advance of the closing date. Closing dates are final and will be strictly enforced, entries received after the closing date cannot be guaranteed.

12. Cancellation or Combining of Classes

The show reserves the right to cancel or combine any classes if it is decided that there are insufficient entries or exhibitors. If breed are unable to attract 15 or more stall bookings, classes will be cancelled - all entry fees will be refunded in these circumstances.

13. Checking of Entry Details

Exhibitors/ Teams are entirely responsible for the eligibility of their animals for the classes entered and should check that all details are complete and accurate before submission.

14. Competitor/Exhibitor Declaration

By completing the entry form (in any section), you agreeing to abide by the regulations of the UK Dairy Day. Any exhibitors/team that break any of the show's rules or uses unfair means to win a prize, will forfeit all prizes and prize money and may be barred from attending future shows.

15. Passports

All animals must be accompanied by their BCMS passports and double tagged with official UK Ear Tags.

16. Claims

Holstein UK, its officers or agents (whether negligent or not) shall not be liable for any claims of losses or damages by an exhibitor/ team in relation to the show.

17. Rules

The ruling of the Show Management in relation to any matters concerning the event shall be final and binding to all concerned. At any one time they have the powers to reject any unsuitable animal.

18. Veterinary Inspection

All cattle will be subject to veterinary inspection at the discretion of the show management and show veterinary officer. Any treatment by the vet will be recharge to the exhibitor.

19. Ringworm

All cattle showing signs of Ringworm must have a veterinary certificate showing that they have been treated for at least two weeks prior to the show, and the lesions must be inactive and have hair growing on them. Any animal not adhering to this rule with ringworm lesions will not be allowed into the show.

20. Udder Scanning

Udder scanning will be carried out at the show at the discretion of the organisers.

21. Bovine Tuberculosis Regulations

The show organiser request that ALL cattle attending the event are pre-movement tested despite the location of their holding of origin.

The pre-movement test is valid for 60 days from the date of injection NOT the date of reading. Please be aware of this before attending any Shows and book your test(s) in plenty of time. When attending UK Dairy Day 2016 you will need to TB test on the 17th July (at the earliest) to ensure you are within the 60 day period when departing the showground on Thursday 15th September.

All exhibitors are required to supply a copy of their TB Certificate to the Show Office PRIOR to arrival at the venue. Copies accepted by post, fax or email to cattle

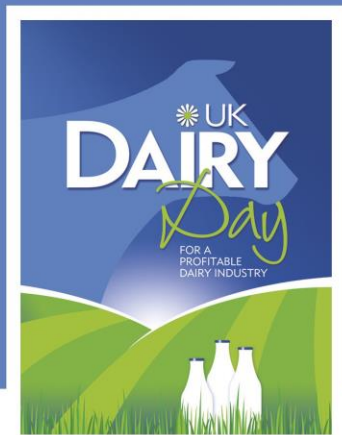
22. Complaints Procedure

Complaints must be given in writing and handed in with £25 deposit to the show office which will be refunded if the complaint is upheld.

DISCLAIMER

The term “Exhibitor” includes persons taking part in any competition or display arranged by the Organiser and the owner of any animal, plant, piece of machinery or anything involved in any such competition or display at UK Dairy Day. The Organiser will not be responsible for death, disease, damage or loss caused to any exhibitor or to his/her employees, nor to any animal, article, plant, piece of machinery, or item of any nature brought onto the showground by the said exhibitor from whatever caused death, injury, disease, damage or loss arises.
